Since winter is quickly approaching, I decided to write an article dealing with the ways to prepare your rabbitry for the cold weather ahead, hoping it will help someone. When my brother and I first started out in rabbits, we had wooden hutches with wire bottoms which sat out unprotected from the elements of weather making it rough on both the rabbits and ourselves. Towards the end of November or early December we would always staple plastic or cardboard to the open sides of the wooden cages, thus protecting the rabbits from the cold, but mainly from the draft. I personally would use a plastic of somekind to allow for sunlight to get to the rabbits. When the weather was forcasted to be bitterly cold, we would place cardboard over half of the bottom wire and place enough straw in the cage to allow the rabbit to burrow into it. The cardboard served two purposes; it kept the straw in the cage and not on the ground, and allowed the rabbits to get off of the cold wire floor.

When it came time for a doe to kindle it never fails to be on the coldest night of the week. When we had wooden cages we would carry them up the hill to our patio and run electrical cords to them. My brother would hook up 60-100 watt light bulbs over top of the area the doe was to kindle. We knew nothing of nest boxes since no one in our area would give much advice to two kids. It was helpful to place aluminum foil behind the bulb to serve as a reflector and a guard make of hardware cloth around the bulb so no one would get burnt. When we started going to shows in Ohio, we finally were told about nest boxes by the Dutch breeders and I now have roughly 30 different sizes. Several of the nest boxes are made for nest box warmers while others have a plywood shell and a layer of insulation between it and the inner shell of cardboard. Several books that I have read dealing with nest box warmers recommend using them during the time of extreem cold weather or until the babies have their fur. I also recommend that if the temperature warms up, it would be a good idea to disconnect the nest box warmer so that you don't have cooked rabbit. In our barn we are lucky enough to have the nest boxes regulated by thermostates. Both types mentioned above have worked very well in my rabbitry.

During the winter months I often supplement corn into the rabbits diet to provide extra body heat. The major problem during winter isn't the food, but keeping the water crock thawed. I can't offer any methods to keep the water from freezing, unless you are lucky enough to have a heated building, then you wouldn't have to worry about the cold. I often have to carry the frozen crocks up the hill to thaw out by the fireplace whick takes several hours. Another method that I use is to carry buckets of hot water down to the rabbitry and place the crocks in them. This may cause the crocks to chip and eventually crack, but it does result in quick thawing.

I hope someone has found this article helpful in someway. For those of you who have ideas to winterize the rabbitry, please send them into the editor so they can be published in the Dutch Reporter. If anyone has a question dealing with the Dutch or rabbitry, please also send it to the editor so it may be printed and hopefully answered by someone.

NEWS FROM TEXAS

The members of the Texas State Dutch Rabbit Club are busy attending to last minute details and preparing for the '87 NDS to be held April 3-5, 1987 in Euless, Texas. Sharon and I have just returned from the ARBA National Conv. and we are very excited about the enthusiasm and support the Dutch members gave us. From all indications we will have a large exhibitor turn out. If this is true, then it will be a show to remember. We in Texas will provide a fantastic show, but only you, the exhibitors, can provide a large quality NDS.

The show will be held at the Western Hills Motel in Euless, Texas. The motel is 5 miles from D/FW Airport and furnishes shuttle services to and from the airport. The motel restaurant serves three meals daily at very reasonable prices. The showroom is air conditioned and has plenty of light. outside the showroom is a lounge area with sofas, chairs, and Adjacent to the showroom and lounge area is a wing with approximately 45 rooms which will be blocked off for the Dutch exhibitors. We cannot get room prices at this time, but have been guaranteed a discount off of the regular prices. The current price is \$38 for a double room. When you call for reservations be sure to tell them that you are with the National Dutch Show. We are planning to hold the general meeting early Saturday morning before the judging. The banquet will be held in the motel Saturday evening. The meal will be a "Texas Style B-B-Q Buffet". Award presentation and social hour will be immediately following the banquet.

LETTER FROM COLUMBUS

Your reporter and fellow Dutch breeders had a wonderful time in Columbus, Ohio, during the 63rd ARBA convention on November 3-6, 1986. It was an awesome event by any standard. The Buckeye Rabbit Shows organization had everything well planned and effeciently managed. It was the largest show ever. There were over 13,000 rabbits and cavies in the glittering state fairgrounds building, and 1,123 ARBA members registered from 43 states, England, Canada, and New Zealand. Our Dutch speciality club was represented with 76 exhibitors from 24 states. Some 385 Dutch were entered: 129 black, 90 blue, 42 chocolate, 58 torts, 31 steel, and 35 gray. Evenberg and Stearns took best of breed with a junior black buck and also won the best display. Other major winners are listed at the end of this report. A black New Zealand won best of show.

Scott Williamson and Al Butler judged, and the large classes of perfectly splendid animals challenged their skill in discriminating and deciding upon the good, the better, and the best. Judging was not without risk. Al's hands had bleeding gashes (as did many judges), and a senior buck nicknamed "the wolf" sank his fangs into Scott's coat sleeve and would not let go. (Jimmy Carter was not the only person in recent history to get attacked by a rabbit.) We Dutch breeders should be especially grateful to Scott and Al for their remarks and comments on each animal as they judged, as they were very instructive to the exhibitors. Judges of other breeds sometimes gave only cryptic reasons for their choices; spectators were often in the dark as to why one rabbit was better than another. On the other hand, one specialty club held a post-show seminar on judging, using several animals as examples. This would be a great help to breeders of any variety, for the standards of perfection have to be interpreted by the experts. To the more inexperienced Dutch breeders, the better animals look pretty much alike and subtle differences are not always readily apparent. Many would be grateful if our judges and "old hands" would instruct the others on the fine points of typical animals on exhibit. We should consider scheduling such an activity at our ADRC show in Texas next April, after the judging has been completed, and we can gather informally to watch, listen, learn, and ask questions.

The seller's class brought in good money for the club and owners. Top dollar went to a Tom Dietrich junior blue buck (\$360) and an Evenberg and Stearns senior blue buck (\$300). Scott Williamson was once again the auctioneer. As a matter of comparison, the top winners in a popular larger class, the satins,

were going for less than \$100. Thanks to the breeders who made their animals available for sale.

There were many interesting events as the show went on. On Sunday a number of pickets stationed themselves at the fairgrounds entrance to protest "cruelty to rabbits" and the whole idea of eating them or using them for lab testing. Apparently they are a regular feature at every ARBA convention. The media did not take them seriously, and they left after the first day. Some of the classes were huge, often more than a hundred, requiring careful accountability. And some animals hardly looked like rabbits: the French Angoras were a mop of fur and looked like dogs, or toys. Some of the dwarfs had such short ears they almost resembled cavies. It confirms that our beautiful Dutch are real rabbits and not novelties. The youth were well represented throughout the breeds (and certainly in the Dutch), and it is encouraging to see their interest and enthusiasm.

Our club meeting was very lively. After spirited discussion, it was confirmed that we would mail ballots for voting on the proposed changes to the constitution. We also discussed whether to continue using ribbons as awards, as they frequently are tossed away afterwards by the recipients. Suggestions are solicited as to what our members would like as awards when their rabbits place in a class.

And now to look ahead. Our 1987 ADRC show is scheduled for Texas on April 4th. Bill and Sharon Reid told us about the plans, and they are exciting. It will be an exhibitor's dream. The air-conditioned showroom and motel will be under one roof about five miles from the Dalias/Fort Worth airport. Transportation will be provided, so no one need rent a car. There will be a cash prize of \$500 for best in breed and \$100 for best opposite sex. Other attractive specials are solicted and others are already in place. Our Texas hosts are going to great effort to make this a wonderful event, and everyone is encouraged to attend with the kind of animals that will make it the best show ever. The airport is a major hub and air fares should be reasonable.

And now your reporter would like to acknowledge some of those who made the Columbus show such a success. (If I miss someone, it was unintentional, so please do not be upset if your name is not included.) Jack and Ruth Wireman were the focal point and seemed to be everywhere, especially during the long hours at checking in. Larry Nixon headed up the carriers, who included Bill and Becky Przybylowicz, Glen Morgan, Steve and Sally Esterly, Kevin Hooper, the Billips brothers, and Andy Barton, among others. The writers were Ruth Wireman, Marti Dill, Vicki Bogan, and Bonnie Kirker. Jean and Tom McMurray fed and watered the animals. Tom Dietrich

Minutes of the Board of Directors' Meeting, November 3, 1986

The meeting of the ADRC Board of Directors was called to order by President Scott Williamson at 8:30 P.M.

A Roll of Officers was taken; those present were: President Williamson, Vice-President Wireman, Directors Dietrich, Williamson, Billups, and Eich. Secretary/Treasurer Hart was also present. Those absent were Directors Carlton and Geitzenauer.

Vice-President Wireman made a motion that we dispense with the reading of the minutes of the previous meeting as they were published in the May-June issue of the Dutch Reporter. Director Billups made a second to the motion. M.C.

REPORT OF OFFICERS:

Vice-President Wireman stated that it has been a pleasure serving the ADRC and working with the officers. He also stated that he would continue to work for the organization and to promote the Dutch rabbit. He noted that the number of Dutch shown in Ohio this year just about balances in comparison with that of last year.

Director Eich reported that Dutch are picking up at the lowa shows and Dutch sales are up at this time.

Director Wiliamson stated that he hasn't attended enough shows this year to know if Dutch are increasing in the area. He expressed that his office of Director for the American Dutch Rabbit Club has been an experience.

Director Billups stated that he's been unable to attend many shows but he realizes that Dutch are on the raise along with several new members to the Dutch club. He expressed that he has been confronted with the growing problem of cowhocked rabbits crossing the tables and suggests that the next standard have the problem addressed.

Secretary Hart noted that we are in need of a pasphlet on the Dutch to send out when information on the breed is requested. Many people want to know a little about the Dutch, along with information for requested for 4-H before a decision to join is made. Membership at the present time totals 227 youth, 89 husband/wife, and 410 single adult memberships. We have 32 judges listed as ADRC members.

President Williamson noted that the quality of Dutch in his area are high. He also stated that they are in the process of forming a new club called the Great Western Dutch Rabbit Club.

REPORT OF COMMITTEES:

Youth Chairman Marti Dill, accompanied by youth representative Todd Uran, gave a report on the youth quizs and contests available to our ADRC youth membership. If anyone has any input for the youth committee they should contact Marti Dill.

Director Eich gave a report on the audit of the ADRC books. The Secretary/Treasurer's books, the Publicity Department's books and those of the Dutch Reporter Editor were audited by Roger Eich, Nike Stinehelfer and Eric Mixdorf. All books were found to be in order.

Secretary/Treasurer Hart gave a financial report.

A motion to accept both the Audit Committees' report and the Treasurer's report was made by Jack Mireman and seconded by Tom Dietrich. M.C.

Vice-President Wireman gave a report on the membership committee: he stated that there has been no response to articles and each ADRC member should try to sign up a new member at the local shows. He also noted that Evenburg & Stearns from Indiana won both B.O.B. and B.O.S. at the Convention.

Vice President Mireman is to check on a breed secretary and chairman for the '87 ARBA Convention in Portland, Oregon and have the forms from that Convention Committee filled in and returned to the proper parties.

Director Dietrich stated that the Sellers Class would be held after the General Membership meeting. He noted that it has been a big financial boost to the organization. There is both an open and youth Sellers Class held.

Director Billups volunteered to chair the Guidebook Committee for the 1998 edition. Committee members are Roger Eich and Marti Dill.

Al Butler gave a brief summary of the financial status of the ADRC Publicity Department; items ordered and the possibility of new items.

#### UNFINISHED BUSINESS:

A discussion was held on who would take over the position of Dutch Reporter Editor. There were two possible candidates, Icele Case and Kay Stearns both of Indiana. There was a ballot cast for the position and and Kay Stearns will be the new editior. Kay will take over for the January/February '87 issue of the D.R. There was a motion made by Director Williamson and seconded by Director Billups that we pay the D.R. editor a flat fee of \$200.00 per issue. M.C.

Director Williamson wished to express a big "THANK YOU" to Dianne Williamson for the fine job she has done as editor for the past two years. The Board would also like to express their appreciation at this time.

#### NEW BUSINESS:

The write-in candidates for District #1, #2, and #7 did not receive the required amount of votes needed to enter the office of Director, therefore, President Williamson requested Board approval to make the highest votes accumulated by the candidate in those respective districts an appointment. A motion was made by Roger Eich and seconded by Wilbur Williamson that the Secretary notify George Parmer, Charles Christ and Howard French to verify that they will accept the appointments. M.C.

There was a proposal addressed to change our balloting system to omit the nomination procedure. This was discussed . primarily due to two reasons; 1) we would get serious candidates running for an office and 2) to let people know within the district that they are a candidate and desire the position. It was discussed and proposed that a petition be

requested from the secretary to run for an office. The petition must be returned to the Secretary by June 1st. prior to election with a required fifteen signatures, all of whom are ADRC members. All candidates must be current ADRC and ARBA members. Those signing a petition may only sign one (1) petition for the office of Director within your district.

Bill and Sharon Reid were present to give a report on the 1987 National Dutch Show in Euless, Texas. Bill stated that alot of work had been done on the preparation for that show but due to some unfortunate circumstances, it had a set back. However, all is well and the show will go on as planned. The Texas Dutch Rabbit Club needs our support to make this show a success. It was stated that shuttle service is available and there will be no need for car rental. The building is also air conditioned.

President Williamson expressed the need for budget committee to loook into the possible cost of expenditures in certain areas as sweepstakes. Secretary Hart will act as chair to this committee with members Rick Billups and Tom Dietrich. Secretary Hart is to solicit the rest of her committee if needed.

Officers requesting reimbursement for ADRC business by phone or mail correspondence may do so by submitting copies of their expenses and bills to Secretary Hart.

President Williamson stated that in regard to membership services, he is doing a video on Dutch that will be available for use from the ARDA.

Director Billups discussed a separate contest for B.C.B., B.D.S. and Best In Show. This would be called "Quality Points" and would count as 2 points for a B.O.B. win, 1 point for a B.O.S. win and 5 points for a Best Fancy and/or a Best In Show win. A motion to implement the quality point contest was made by Director Billups and seconded by Vice-President Wireman. N.C.

Vice-President Wireman is to work on a possible membership contest, it's rewards, and come up with guidelines for same.

There was some discussion on the sweepstakes variety ribbons and whether we should continue to send them with the sanctions or send them out only to those who request them. Discussion was also held as to whether we should do away with the variety ribbons and possibly implement a different type of award for these wins. There will be a poll taken regarding the opinion of the membership on this matter.

Some discussion was held on the proposed changes that were listed in the past issue of the Dutch Reporter. District changes are to be listed in alphabetical order before printing.

Being no further business, a motion to adjourn was made by Director Eich and seconded by Director Dietrich. M.C.

#### Seneral Membership Meeting, November 4, 1986

The meeting of the General Membership meeting was called to order by Vice-President Wireman at 18:39 A.M.

Secretary Hart read the minutes of the Board of Directors meeting. With a correction from Director Eich that the results of the balloting for Dutch Reporter Editor were omitted from the minutes; four (4) votes cast for Kay Stearns and three (3) votes for Icele Case; a motion was made to accept the minutes by Jessie Wienhardt and seconded by Bill Reid. M.C.

#### REPORT OF OFFICERS: (NONE)

Marti Dill gave a report on the youth committee. She stated that participation in the Quiz Bowl at the '86 NDS was up, but we are having some difficulty getting are youth to participate in voting for youth judges. She also noted that next year the achievement contest would be divided into three areas to accomposate the ages rather than the two we now have. The judges for next years contest have already been set.

The Quality Points were brought up and Dick Behr questioned the logic in the way the points would be awarded. He stated that it would be more justifiable to award 1 % the number in the breed for B.O.B. and 1 % the number of opposite sex shown for a B.O.S. win. He felt that this would be more fair to each exhibitor as in some cases a rabbit winning B.O.B. with only one Dutch shown would receive the same amount of points as a rabbit winning B.O.B. with 200 animals being shown in the breed. Dick Evenburg and Mark Pecaric agreed with Dick Sehr. Don Reid made a motion to appeal the Board to rescind the quality points as listed from the Board of Directors meeting. The motion was seconded by Martin Preede. M.C.

A discussion was held on a pamphlet for the Dutch Club. Dianne Geitzenauer felt that this was an excellent idea as

other breeds provide this type of material to potential members. A sample of one that it given out by the New England Dutch Rabbit Club was submitted as an example. Secretary Hart was appointed chairman of a committee to draw up a pamphlet. Stan Goeglein made a motion that the Secretary be authorized, at her discretion, to make up a pamphlet to pamphlet to potential members and those requesting information on the Dutch. I've had some the basic problems in Dutch breeding - wall eyes, one case of buck teeth (butting), low cheeks, and long stops. I've also had my share of diseases like one case of snuffles, abscesses, and rabbit syphlis. In Ohio this year, fly warbles were quite common. Out of six years raising Dutch, this year was the first I had ever seen a fly warble. The warbles I found were only on my young bunnies.

The maggots were easily removed form their holes and it then healed up nicely. If at times raising Dutch is frusterating, just think, you probably had more good times than bad and you can't beat the Dutch!







### PROPOSED CHANGES TO THE CONSTITUTION & BY-LAWS



#### CONSTITUTION Article V:

Be it resolved that: Section 1 of the Constitution to strike the Accept Reject sentence: Each of the nine (9) Directors must reside in a different district.

Accept Reject

Be it resolved that: Section 1 of the Constitution amend to read:

The elected officers of this association shall consist of a President,
Vice-President, and nine (9) Directors who shall be elected for a three
(3) year term, by and from the membership. The Secretary-Treasurer
shall be appointed by the President, approved by two-thirds majority of
the Board of Directors, excluding the Secretary-Treasurer. The appointment
of the Secretary-Treasurer will be for three (3) years. Any member, to
be eligible for office, must be an owner and breeder of Dutch rabbits.

Accept Reject

Be it resolved that: Section 2 of the Constitution amend to read:

The Secretary-Treasurer may be reappointed by the Board of Directors,
who may also remove him/her from office, for cause, by a two-thirds
majority, during any term of office. The Secretary-Treasurer will be an
active voting member of the Board of Directors, except in the appointment
or removal from the office of Secretary-Treasurer. The Board of Directors,
therefore, consists of the: President, Vice-President, Secretary-Treasurer,
and nine (9) Directors. The term of any office shall begin on January 1
of the year following each election.

Accept Reject

Be it resolved that: Section 3 of the Constitution amend to read:

The President and one (1) Director representing each district will be elected for a three (3) year tenure. The Vice-President and one (1) Director from each district will be elected the following year for a three (3) year tenure. Finally, the Secretary-Treasurer will be appointed and the final three (3) Directors each from a different district will be elected the third year to serve a three (3) year tenure. Directors may be from the same state and district as other officers: President, Vice-President and Secretary-Treasurer. The Directors representing each district will be elected by a vote of only those members living in that district. Directors may be nominated by any member of the American Dutch Rabbit Club.

Accept Reject

Be it resolved that: Section 5 of the Constitution amend to read:

Directors shall be elected from the three (3) districts divided as follows:

DISTRICT 1: Connecticut, Delaware, Florida, Georgia, Maine, Maryland, Massachusetts, New Hampshire, New Jersey, New York, North Carolina, Ohio, Pennsylvania, Rhode Island, South Carolina, Vermont, Virginia, West Virginia.

DISTRICT 2: Alabama, Arkansas, Illinois, Indiana, Iowa, Kentucky, Louisiana, Michigan, Minnesota, Mississippi, Missouri, Tennessee, Wisconsin.

DISTRICT 3: Alaska, Arizona, California, Colorado, Hawaii, Idaho, Kansas, Montana, Nebraska, Nevada, New Mexico, North Dakota, Oklahoma, Oregon, South Dakota, Texas Utah, Washington, Wyoming.

*Note: No foreign member will be eligible to hold office.

CONSITITUTION Article VI, ..... add Section 2A:

No one person can run for more than one (1) office during any election.

Accept Reject

BY-LAWS Article III, Section 2A to read:

Accept

An annual allotment of \$500.00 (five-hundred dollars) from the General Reject Fund shall be awarded to the sponsors of the National Dutch Rabbit Show, with further stipulation that the American Dutch Rabbit Club receive recognition for this allotment. Said money to be sent by the Secretary-Treasurer to the sponsors on or as near to January 1 preceding the National Dutch Show for that year. Show sponsors must have all National Dutch Rabbit Show judges secured before any A.D.R.C. allocation is made.

BY-LAWS Article III, Section 3A to read:

Accept

The Publicity Chairman shall be paid \$100.00 (one-hundred dollars) Reject for each annual National Dutch Rabbit Show and American Rabbit Breeders Association, Inc. Convention which he/she tansports American Dutch Rabbit Club publicity items for sale at the club booth; such funds to be paid from the Publicity Funds.

BY-LAWS Article III, Section 1A add to read:

Accept

The sweepstakes chairperson shall receive \$1.00 (one dollar) per open Reject show sanction paid from the open show sanction fee as remuneration to compensate for time and effort spent by said chairperson in calculating, tabulating, and reporting all show results. The sweepstakes chairperson shall provide the Dutch Reporter editor with a typed copy of each show report listed chronologically and sweepstakes standing for both open and youth divisions listed numerically; top 20 open and youth divisions as well as the top 5 youth from each district.

#### ELECTION PROCEDURE CHANGE

Accept Reject

A petition shall be requested from the sectetary of the ADRC by any member who wishes to run for an ADRC office. The petition must be returned to the Secretary by June 1st, prior to an election with a required fifteen signatures, all of whom are American Dutch Rabbit Club members. All candidates must be current American Dutch Rabbit Club and American Rabbit Breeders Association members. Those signing a petition may only sign one (1) petition for the office of Director within your district.

**Please Note: You must be a current ADRC member to vote. Husband and wife memberships are each eligible to vote, single memberships may use only one ballot. Youth memberships may not vote on these issues. Send ballots by March 1, 1987 to: Norma Hart


