
----- BIG EASTERN DUTCH SHOWS -----

HOPE SOME OF YOU CAN MAKE IT TO SEATTLE OR TULSA.

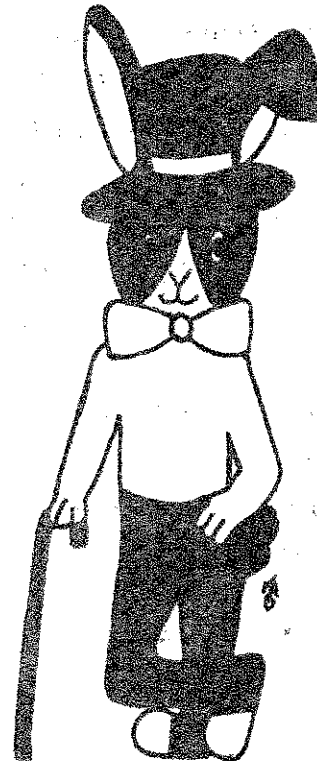

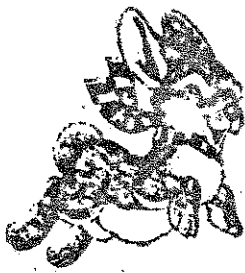
Dear Jeanine,

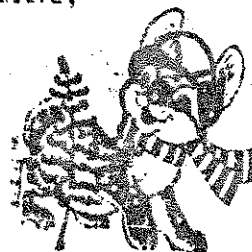

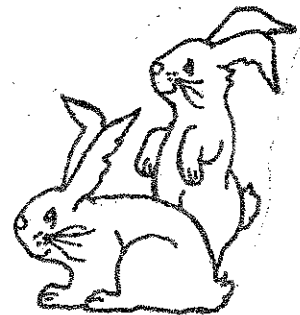

Minutes of the General Meeting
ARBA National Convention 1988 Madison, Wisconsin

The ADRC General Membership meeting at the 1988 ARBA National Convention in Madison, Wisconsin was called to order at 1:00 PM Tuesday November 15th.

Officers and Directors roll call; Those present were Vice-President MacKinnon, Secretary-Treasurer Hart, Directors Pecaric, Wireman, Simonson, Gehr, Reid, and Farmer. Those absent were President Dill. Directors Mullinax and Christ.

Dick Gehr made a motion to dispense with the reading of the minutes from the previous General Membership meeting as they were printed in the Dutch Reporter. Motion seconded by Mark Pecaric. Motion carried.

Reports of the Officers and Directors: (It was noted that these reports could be read under the minutes from the Board of Director's meeting).

Tommye Simpson made a report for President Dill and stated that she does not have a phone at the present time for the membership to contact her. Any correspondence should be done by mail. Mrs. Simpson also stated that there is a new Dutch Club in the Carolinas and the number of Dutch seem to be picking up. There was a show in North Carolina that was a double show, having over 100 Dutch exhibited.

Wenton Carlton reported for Director Christ stating that the Dutch in New Mexico and California are up in numbers, especially in New Mexico. Arizona is slowing down a little. There will be a joint specialty club show in Yuma with the San Diego Club in December.

Report of Committees: (It was noted that these reports could be read under the minutes from the Board of Director's meeting).

Dianne Geitzenauer remarked on "flesh spots" and asked if it is a disqualification. It was determined that at this time, it is up to the judge. "Flesh Spot" is not defined in the ARBA Glossary of Terms, but the ADRC Standard Committee is addressing this situation.

Unfinished or Old Business: The Youth show coats have not been awarded. President Dill is to check on this matter. The clubs apology was extended to those that should have received the coats. There was also no report concerning the sweepstakes awards.

New Business: The 1989 NDS location has been changed. Due to a more active working force, and improved facilities the Northwest Dutch Rabbit Club asked to change the site location from Portland, Oregon to Seattle, Washington. The Board was in agreement with this request. The dates will remain April 21st - 23rd. There is the possibility of some specialty shows on Sunday after the Dutch judging on Saturday, but this has not been determined for sure yet. Glen Carr will be the Open judge. The facilities are an inactive school gymnasium. If a second judge is deemed necessary for the Open show, one will be added. The Northwest Dutch Rabbit Club is asking for donations to support this show. Contact George and Maxine Farmer.

Tom Buell stated that the Bengtsons had worked all night long getting

the results sheets from the judging ready for everyone. They also put up a nice display board with all of the placements listed on it in the ADRC booth. The clubs appreciation was extended to Tom, the Bengtsons, the Guetschows, and all else that helped. The awards will be passed out at the banquet tomorrow night, but ribbons and rosettes should be picked up at the booth.

The 1990 NDS was awarded to the Eastern Dutch Rabbit Fanciers and the New England Dutch Rabbit Club. This is a combined effort by these two clubs. The show will be held in North Haven, Connecticut. Dianne Geitzenauer spoke on the 1990 NDS stating that it was fairly central in location between New York City and Boston. It is in a very pleasant area, and there is a tremendous amount of participation between the breeders in those areas for the show. The dates will be April 27th - 29th, 1990.

Good of the Order: Jeanine Powers said she would take articles and ads for the Dutch Reporter. The membership may send her articles at any time. The Officers and Directors commended her for her efforts.

Al Butler stated that the Publicity sales have been down. Possibly due to a saturation of the present articles. Some new articles are being investigated. Postage and handling have gone up cutting into the profits received.

Banquet tickets are still on sale at the ADRC booth.

The Seller's Class will be held after the adjournment of this meeting.

Karl Ehnis reports that the Michigan area is in the works of starting a Dutch Club.

Floyd Dopler spoke of the Dutch breed in general being an excellent choice for Youth exhibitors.

Being no further business for the ADRC General Membership meeting Dick Gehr made a motion to adjourn. Motion seconded by Bill Reid. Motion carried.

The 1988 ADRC Board of Director's meeting held at Madison Wisconsin was called to order at 7:30 PM by Vice-President MacKinnon. Those officers and Directors answering roll call were; Vice-President MacKinnon, Secretary-Treasurer Hart, Directors Pecaric, Wireman, Simonson, Gehr, Reid and Farmer. Those absent were President Dill, Directors Mullinax and Christ.

Director Gehr made a motion to dispense with the reading of the minutes from the previous Board of Director's meeting as they were printed in the Dutch Reporter, motion seconded by Director Wireman. Motion carried.

REPORT OF OFFICERS:

Director Farmer - Dutch are starting to come on in the shows, but are not as prominent as in the past. It seems Washington is showing more Dutch with an average show being around 60, but Oregon has less shown than normal.

Director Gehr - The quality of Dutch in the Midwest is good, but the number shown is down. There are more Youth showing Dutch than there has been for quite some time. The IDRC is settling down after the 1988 NDS and owes a lot of Thanks to breeders and exhibitors from other areas that helped with the show. Our State and local clubs are very receptive to Dutch specialty shows held in conjunction with their shows.

Director Simonson - There are a few new Dutch breeders in his area, but the numbers shown are down as in other areas.

Director Wireman - Spring shows seem to be holding their own with possibly a few less animals shown. More Youth are building up. There are some complaints regarding the \$1.00 payback for best of varieties.

Director Pecaric - The number of Dutch shown are either holding their own or increasing with 60 - 100 per show average. There are a few new breeders, with several showing 10 - 20 head each. A couple of Dutch have taken Best in Shows at regular shows which pleases him a great deal.

Director Reid - In his immediate area the Dutch are holding their own in numbers, but the quality could be better. The Oklahoma and Houston areas seem to have some new breeders exhibiting good quality animals. He doesn't get to attend many shows because of work and time conflicts. His area has lost some Dutch breeders. There is some concern having two Dutch specialty clubs in the same state. The clubs are trying to have more Dutch shows each year.

Vice-President MacKinnon - Shows are way off in his area. Several breeders have been lost due to various reasons. The trend seems to be leaning towards specialty shows and he is hoping for some new breeders to begin showing Dutch.

REPORT OF COMMITTEES:

Director Parmer - His group is very enthusiastic about holding the 1989 NDS. If the Board approves, the location will be changed to Seattle, Washington.

Director Wireman made a motion to approve the change of site location for the 1989 NDS from Portland, Oregon to Seattle, Washington. Motion seconded by Director Reid. Motion carried unanimously.

There is the possibility of having some specialty shows on Sunday following the NDS on Saturday. This will be left up to the discretion of Director Parmer. Information regarding motels etc. will be forth coming. No arrangements have been made as it had not been determined whether the site location change would be approved.

History Committee - Summer has put the actions of this committee on hold. They are starting to compile past NDS reports, etc.

Publicity and Promotion Committee - Al Butler asked that the 12 1/2 % from the General Fund be reinstated for this committee due to expenses. There is the need for some new items as the membership has most of the old ones. After some discussion, it was the consensus of the Board to reinstate the 12 1/2 % to the Publicity and Promotion Department as of the first of the year.

Director Gehr stated he felt Al and Barb were doing a great job with much dedication. Al stated that he and Barb enjoy doing it. It is a big help when the Directors and Officers help out in the booth during the convention. He Thanked the club for the cards and flowers when he was ill. Al asked that the members in attendance support the club raffle.

There was some discussion regarding the Youth coats that were to have been purchased. President Dill is to contact our Youth Committee Chairman in regards to same.

Dutch Reporter Committee - Jeanine Powers stated she is fighting a losing battle with the equipment. So far she has spent about \$300.00 for repairs since she has had the equipment. She suggests checking on getting the DR printed commercially. This was tabled until New Business. The consensus seems to be that a new photo for the cover is not wanted.

Convention Committee - Tom Buell said that everyone has chipped in and helped. He has received tremendous cooperation. The Bengtsons and Guetschows have put in much effort and time working together for the convention. Vice-President MacKinnon commended Tom, the Bengtsons and Guetschows for a job well done. Director Wireman stated that they did an excellent job getting the rabbits to the table for judging. Director Pecaric was impressed that everything went so smoothly without the use of carrying cases.

Seller's Class - Director Pecaric will take charge of the Seller's Class since Tom Dietrich is not here. The Seller's Class will be held

at approximately 3:30 PM at the table where the Holland Lops were judged. Larry Bengtson will judge the Seller's Class rabbits before the sale starts. There is a small entry, so the Class may not have that many animals. Mark will make an announcement as to the exact time of the sale in the showroom.

Director Gehr stated that each year we seem to have a conflict with the Seller's Class and the other convention activities. At the NDS it is a bit different as we have control over all the activities and time frames. He is for discontinuing the Seller's Class at the National Conventions. If someone sells a rabbit and wants to donate some of the money to the ADRC that is fine. There could be problems with moving the Youth rabbits at this convention for the Seller's Class as they are housed in a different building.

Standard Committee - Vice-President MacKinnon, chairman of the Standard Committee, introduced the proposals of the Standard Committee and entertained discussion on each.

The subject of asking the ARBA Standard Committee to reinstate "severe cowhocks to disqualify" into their General Disqualifications was supported unanimously by the Board.

Freckles were discussed, and it was decided that more work needs to be done regarding the wording of this before going to the membership for a vote.

Changing the description of the head to "oval" was discussed, with the Board voting unanimously to keep the present description.

Excluding the word "short" from the present ear description was passed unanimously by the Board.

Regarding the "spots in cornea", the Board felt that since it was already listed under General Disqualifications in the ARBA Standard of Perfection, it was not necessary to include this in our breed standard.

Chairman MacKinnon asked for the Board to make any possible suggestions regarding the Standard for future proposals.

Several other issues are being discussed by the Standard Committee regarding our present Standard. Included in them are a definition of the body color on Steels, the judging order, words to be added to the ARBA Glossary of Terms.

Regarding the judging order of Dutch, Director Gehr stated it was his interpretation from the rule in the guidebook that it is "requested" to judge in the order listed. This area will be addressed in the next guidebook when printed.

Flesh spots were discussed, and it was felt that since they are basically interpreted as "bare spots" that wording "flesh spots" be eliminated from our Standard.

There will be a ballot upcoming regarding those items voted on by the Board regarding the Standard.

Tom Buell stated that he has someone to photograph some Dutch at this convention from the University of Wisconsin. Tom asked for \$50.00 to be allocated for this endeavor.

Director Gehr made a motion to allocate up to \$100.00 for the photographing of the Dutch at this convention for possible use in the Standard, or where beneficial to the membership. Motion seconded by Director Wireman. Motion carried unanimously.

UNFINISHED BUSINESS:

The topic of the Youth show coats was brought up again with the determination that President Dill will contact Nick Dyer regarding same.

Rules and regulations regarding new Dutch specialty clubs was discussed. It was the consensus of the Board that we shouldn't tie ourselves down with a lot of rules regarding such. We may discourage new clubs if rules too stringent. As the Board has the control over accepting new clubs it was felt the Boards actions should prevail.

A discussion was held regarding the \$1.00 payback requirement. The Board felt that the individuals should first contact the local club regarding such. If no satisfaction is realized, the District Director should be contacted. A poll of the sweepstake rule regarding the payback will be addressed to the membership.

The sweepstake ribbons are costing the club a considerable amount of money. Many exhibitors do not pick them up at the shows, and many are just thrown away. Introducing a pin or badge as some of the other specialty clubs have done is to be investigated.

No billing has been received from the sweepstakes chairpersons yet in regard to the trophies.

NEW BUSINESS:

The bid for the 1990 NDS was presented by the Eastern Dutch Rabbit Fanciers and the New England Dutch Club as a combined effort. Director Simonson made a motion to award the 1990 NDS to these groups. Motion seconded by Director Wireman. Motion carried unanimously.

Director Gehr volunteered to contact M & D Printing regarding our Dutch Reporter. Vice-President MacKinnon made this an official appointment. Jeanine is to only purchase those necessary supplies for the upcoming issue.

TREASURER'S REPORT:

The Treasurer's report was given, and it was suggested that the Life membership account be moved to the money market account. After some

discussion, Director Simonson made a motion to move the Life membership account to the General Fund. If it is determined that it is not needed in this fund at some time to stay fluent, it will then be transferred to the Contingency Fund. Motion seconded by Director Pecaric. Motion carried unanimously. Director Gehr made a motion to accept the Treasurer's report. Motion seconded by Director Farmer. Motion carried unanimously.

AUDIT REPORT:

Sharon Reid gave the audit report, and stated that she, Stan Goeglein and John Bach acted on this committee. It was found that the books of the Secretary-Treasurer, the Publicity Department, and the Dutch Reporter Editor were all in good order, and the committee commended them all for their efforts. Director Gehr made a motion to accept the Audit Report. Motion seconded by Director Wireman. Motion carried unanimously.

Being no further business of the ADRC Board of Directors, Director Pecaric made a motion to adjourn. Motion seconded by Director Farmer. Motion carried unanimously.

Meeting adjourned.
