

## PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE

The 1964 Convention is over now and what a whopper it was. I understand that the entries topped 4,150. Laura and I had a wonderful time, and we'll both carry many fond memories of this Convention.

There were several items of business taken care of that should be of great benefit to the membership. The Standard Committee have completed their work, and the Standard will be submitted shortly to the membership. It will be presented as a package deal. Although we all felt that this was not the most satisfactory method we could think of no feasible solution as there are so many changes to be made. Most of the changes are minor or clerical, however there are a couple of changes that are major so I suggest that you read it carefully so that you may make an intelligent vote. Don Reid and his committee have worked long and hard and they certainly deserve much credit for their efforts.

Don Guthrie submitted an editorial policy for the Dutch Reporter, which was accepted by the Board. This editorial policy should be of great benefit to the club. It should help to provide interesting reading material and will relieve our secretary of sole responsibility for the content matter of the Dutch Reporter.

Bill Hobin has been elected to the Board of Directors leaving me with the necessity of appointing a new Publicity Director. I have asked Stanley Goeglein of Indiana to fill this important job as of January 1st., 1965 and he has assured me that he will do his best to make this committee go. We have discussed this Committee and will be making several changes designed to make each member of this Committee a full working partner. January 1st. of this year our membership stood at 384, today it is almost 500. A phenomenal growth yes, but with a little effort from each of you we can reach 600.

There are three people that I would like to publicily acknowledge for their work at the Convention. I would like to thank, for the membership, Art and Helen Osmon who took care of the Dutch at this Convention. Through their efforts the rabbits were well fed and watered, and the judging proceeded efficiently. I would also like to publicily thank Bill Hobin for a well decorated booth. I personally thought that we should win the booth award as it was by far the most original.

The ARBA meetings were satisfying.g You will all be interested to know that a method of solution to the compulsory membership clause in the new Constitution is to be submitted to the general membership for a vote in the very near future. Further information on this will undoubtedly be furnished the Small Stock and the other trade journals. Attendance at all meetings was high and the most satisfying phase of the ARBA meeting was that ANYONE who had anything to say of a pertinent nature was given the floor and discussions were open and free for all. Time alone will prove whether it was all worth the effort.

Our own meeting was well attended and one of the important things that was accomplished was the appointment of Don Lovejoy as "Specials" Chariman for the Dutch at the 1965 ARBA Convention to be held in Pomona, California. A complete report of the success of his efforts will be reported on another page of this issue. The minutes of the Board of Director's meeting held the previous night were read and approved and appear on another page of this issue. I do hope the membership will forgive me for not publishing the minutes of the General Meeting until next month. You have no idea that amount of clerical work involved in booking all of the business handled at this Convention, in prepartion for publishing this issue which made it impossible to have these minutes in shape for publication. All other reports are herein published.

Mr. V. L. Casper was very busy at this Convention collecting specials and catalog advertising for the 1965 National Dutch Show which has been awarded to Atlanta, Ga. and will be held the last week-end in April. You will be hearing more from this group in the very near future.

There are only a few more shows to be held in 1964 and I guess it is a good thing because the back-log of show reports that has been already returned to me from shows for this fall would fill two or three issues of the Dutch Reporter without putting a single other item in — I know you will all be patient and wait for me to catch up on them. More shows were sanctioned for Dutch Sweepstakes in 1964 than in any other calander year since I have been putting out the Dutch Reporter. This is good — maybe we will again break the record in 1965.

Board of Director's Meeting
Springfield Illinois Sent

Springfield, Illinois; Sept. 26, 1964

The meeting of the Board of Directors of the American Dutch Rabbit Club was called to order at 11:55 EST, by President Bill Summers.

Officers present were: President Bill Summers, Secretary-Treasurer, Jessie Weinhardt Directors Tom Shufflebotham, Wm. Stedman, Don Reid, and Don Guthrie. Absent were: Vice-President, Jack Boughton and Directors Clinton Dennis and E. R. Parks. Incoming Directors Don Lovejoy and Bill Hobin and new Publicity Director Stan Goeglein, sat in at

request of President Summers.

The minutes of the last Board Meeting held at Sedalia, Missouri were read and the secretary was questioned as to whether she had ever written to Vern Ashton, Chairman of the ARBA Standard Committee as instructed therein. She replied that she had and further question was raised as to the validity of the action of this Board as regards that Standards at that time. It was pointed out that proper proceedure on the proposed changes had never been taken -- way back to the meeting in Colorado Springs, but that an attempt to do so was being made at this time. Don Reid and his committee have put forth extensive effort in this direction, along with much re-wording of the Standard for the purpose of clarification of the meaning. He requested a ruling of this Board as to how these proposals should be voted on -- if each individual change was to be voted on it might require as many as 50 individual x's to cast a ballot. There was a motion by Vm. Stedman, seconded by Don Reid that the reworded Standard be submitted to the membership for a single vote either to accept or reject in its entirety. Motion carried.

A further motion by Wm. Stedman, seconded by Don Guthrie that the secretary be instructed to mail out, by first class mail, a ballot on such proposed rewprded Standard, according to the rules set up for the mailing of election ballots, except copy for this ballot be mimeographed with vote to be returned to election Chairman, Al Meier, Jr., within two weeks after date of mailing. Motion carried.

At this point it was requested by President Summers that the reading of the previous Board meeting minutes be accepted as read. Carried.

Don Guthrie requested certification of his appointment to this Board. President Summers reported that after his error of precedure in this appointment had been pointed out to him he had polled the Board and all but one member had voiced full approval of the appointment.

Don Guthrie presented copy of an editorial policy drawn up by his committee as appointed at Sedalia, Missouri, and stated that the reason for the long delay in the submission of such report was due to the fact that action of this committee had hinged on certain stipulated conditions of acceptance of the appointment, and these conditions had never been met by this Board. Regardless of the failure of the Board to cooperate, he was now submitting his report at request of President Summers. After some discussion and a few minor changes to insure application of this policy to cover advertising as well as other material, it was motioned by Wm. Stedman, seconded by Don Reid that this "Policy" be accepted and written into these minutes to appear in the Dutch Reporter. Carried.

#### DUTCH REPORTER EDITORIAL POLICY

NAME: The official organ of the American Dutch Rabbit Club shall be known as the "Dutch Reporter".

OBJECTIVE: The object of the Dutch-Reporter shall be to assist the American Dutch Rabbit Club promote the Dutch rabbit, encourage the breeding of better Dutch, serve as entertaining and educational media for the membership of the American Dutch Rabbit Club and provide a necessary link between the executive body and the membership.

CONTENT: The Dutch Reporter shall contain only those articles, reports, news items and advertising that can properly be considered pertinent to the American Dutch Rabbit Club, its members and the rabbit it sponsors. All material that appears in the Dutch Reporter shall be judged by whether it is educationa, informative, constructive and/or newsworthy. It shall never be used for personal promotion, personal attaks or articles that would tend to reflect unfavorably upon the American Dutch Rabbit Club and/or the Dutch Rabbit.

The preceding paragraph shall not be construed to mean that articles of a controversial nature be rejected. To the contrary, controversy sparks interest, thought and participation. However, all articles must reflect good taste, be constructive in intent and absolutely free from personalities.

All articles used in the Dutch Reporter shall be correctly identified as to author.

DUTCH REPORTER COMMITTEE: The Dutch Reporter shall be the proper business of a committee of three. The charman of the committee shall be the editor of the Dutch Reporter. One Committee member shall be the duly appointed publicity director. One Committee member shall be appointed from the Board of Directors by the president.

DUTCH REPORTER COMMITTEE DUTIES: The chairman shall receive all articles, news, reports and advertising. Any articles, advertising or item that might be considered in conflict with the content objective of this publication shall be submitted by mail to the other committee members for ruling. It shall take a 2/3 vote of approval for it to be published.

The publicity director as committee member shall constantly and actively solicity advertising to help defray the expense of publishing a necessary and worthwhile Dutch Reporter.

The board member as committee member shall be responsible for at least one article in each issue of the Dutch Reporter. In addition he shall solicit one article from each elected official during each calendar year. The articles should be of an instuctional and educational nature.

ADDITIONAL PROVISIONS: Should any committee member neglect the responsibilities of his office or fail to follow the intent of this editorial policy, he shall be asked by the President to resign said office. In case of failure to do so, the board of directors by two-thirds vote shall declare the office vacant. It shall then be the duty of the President to maek an appointment to fill the vacancy.

This editorial policy shall not be considered restrictive or censorship in any form. Rather it provides an outline for the editor and committee members to properly provide the type of official organ that will aid the growth of the American Dutch Rabbit Club, the promotion of the Dutch rabbit and the usefulness of the Dutch Reporter.

There was some question as to the type of "quarterly report" the secretary is required by the By-Laws to furnish the Board, as this was rather loosely worded. It was decided that a report such as that submitted for the March through June quarter of 1964 would be satisfactory with a detailed, audited report to be submitted at the semi-annual meetings with copies to be furnished the officers in advance of these meetings for approval. The secretary agreed to this.

The question was raised as to whether the Guide Book Committee had ever been formally discharged. Bill Summers stated that with the arrangements for the collection for the ad of the ARBA the duties of this committee had been completed and he here-by discharged them.

The secretary reported the receipt of two hids for the 1965 National Dutch Show. One, on September 28, 1964 from the Decatur (Georgia) Rabbit Breeders Assin and one on October 14, 1964 from the Ohio State Dutch Rabbit Club. The secretary stated that with the knowledge that Director Clinton Dennis and Vipe-President Jack Boughton could not be present at this meeting, a request for their mail vote had been made. Due to his name not being listed in the Guide Book, Mr. Dennis had not been aware of the Decatur bid, hence he should be considered as not having been polled, along with the absent E. R. Parks. The vote was as follows: Ohio, Jack Boughton: Georgia, Don Guthrie, Tom Shufflebotham, Wm. Stedman, Jessie Weinhardt and Bill Summers. These clubs to be notified by the secretary, with the hope expressed that Ohio would consider some future date.

A letter from Bob Ernst of Kansas concerning the proposed formation of a Kansas State Dutch Rabbit Club was read by the secretary, along with her reply as to their proceedure for procuring a charter. It was voted unanimously on a motion by Wm. Stedman, seconded by Tom Shufflebotham that the "blessing" of the ADRC be extended to the budding Kansas State Dutch Rabbit Club through Mr. Ernst and the ARBA be so informed so that they might apply for their charter.

The secretary reported that a rising number of clubs were failing to list the required specials as listed in our Sweepstake Rules in their catalogs. She made a motion seconded by Wm. Stedman that the following sentence be added to our required printing in the catalogs of shows holding an ADRC Sanctioned show to take care of this in the future. "Sponsors of this show agree to abide by ADRC show rules, including the

payment of a minimum of \$1.00 on Best of Each Variety as listed above." It was agreed unanimously that the Board had the authority to alter these rules and it was so ordered.

The secretary presented a letter from Carl Nagel, secretary of the Silver Marten Rabbit Club requesting an exchange between the various sepcialty clubs, of ideas and materials, including all publications for the possible benefit of the various clubs. The secretary pointed out that a precedent had been established whereby such delivery to non-members was subject to the approval of the Board. It was re-iterated that Guide Books were not to be furnished to anyone, save on the regular payment of dues, but she might be permitted to use her own discretion with regard to the Dutch Reporter.

President Summers brought up the question as to the form of the nomination ballot which had recently been mailed. The By- aws call for a "commercially printed" ballot and this one had been mimeographed in order to cut expnses, precedent having been established by the previous administration. There was a motion by Don Guthrie, seconded by Don Reid that in the future we abide by the By-Laws regardless of cost. Carried.

A motion to adjourn at 1:50 A.M., EST was made by Don Reid, seconded by Bill Stedman, carried.
