PERTAINING TO DUTCH SWEEPSTAKES POINTS

Before any Dutch Fancier should decide to be a competitor for the higher ranking in a Dutch Sweepstakes Series the fancier should have an adequate comprehension of the demands necessary to qualify one for competition. I will strive to point up a few basic thoughts.

Initially the maximum number of sweepstakes points in any class is 16 times the number of individuals in the class. These points can be as low as zero. Barring elimination or disqualification the points awardable are as follows:

> class of one total or 6 average Class of two-----20 total or 10 average Class of three 39 total or 13 average Class of four 60 total or 15 average Class of five------80 total or 16 average

In short 1st rabbit in class has 6 point value, 2nd in class has 12 point value, 3rd in class has 19 point value, 4th in class has 21 point value 5th rabbit in class has 20 point value, 6th or more rabbits in class has 16 point value.

An individual should decide beforehand the goal he seeks to attain. For example, if he wishes to attain2,000 points he should plan to exhibit between 150 to 175 animals in shows that have average competition. Naturally if the competition stiffens the number of rabbits to be exhibited will increase and you might find that you need added exhibits to accumulate the desired points. An individual who pursues a high sweepstakes recognition has a multiple of obsticales to consider such as: excessive showing places restriction on the animal being in peak condition, secondly the ratio of quality animals on exhibit, leaving one open to losing faluable points to the competitors, who naturally, may be showing only very select exhibits.

It costs for exhibitors only approximately, 10¢ per sweepstakes points or \$200,00 to attain an anticipated 2,000 Sweepstakes points.

One must have a good knowledge, of the number of Dutch Shows that will be sweepstaked in the exhibitors area. For example, if ten shows will be tentatively sweepstaked in one's area, one must average at least 15 to 20 animals at each of these to tally the approximate 2,000 points anticipated.

The simple rules to consider in participating for sweepstakes recognition are: Don't be afraid of being beaten again by the rabbits you lost to at previous shows, understand the method by which points are valued, never hesitate to show at a particular show because you might have a personality clash with the designated judge. Don't anticipate any financial rewards on your sweepstakes points. Be vigilant to have the show at which you antici ate to exhibit at least be a Dutch Sweepstales Show. Lastly remember that the more you exhibit your Dutch the more your desire to win, the greater your efforts will become to produce the winning Dutch Rabbit. Incidentally one can not raise the winners unless you have the ability for a good reproduction in your The best Dutch Sweepstakes competitors raise their own Dutch Show Power.

If I have been successful in educating the would be Sweepstakes Competitors in this particular phase of rabbit pleasures I am most happy for this opportunity to have visited with you.

As a thought disrupter, what if our sweepstakes recognitions were reflected to each of the six beautiful standard varieties? Couldnn't we have fun in seeing the many new faces in the Who's Who of the Dutch Rabbit Sweepstakes? After all, we have many many American Dutch Rabbit Club members that have but a single variety

The drive for convention specials has just recently ended, and the National Dutch Show will soon be around again. Why is there such a need to be repeatedly asking for . Specials from the membership, and why is the response usually from the same few supporters? If EVERYONE would just kick in with onlyONE DOLLAR total for the two shows, this would be somewhere around \$350.00, based on a membership somewhere around 700.

But, alas, everyone doesn't support their DUTCH, so those faithful few who do usually end up having to contribute five or ten dollars to make a worthwhile specials list. How about doing something about this? I'll probable get tarred and feathered for this idea, but I don't think that it is new, and yet, perhaps it is worthwhile. Let's raise the membership to \$4.00! Then take the extra dollar and split it between the National Convention and the National Dutch Show. I know that this would alienate some of our membership, and a few would let their membership lapse, because of this, but the true boosters would remain.

Perhaps this is a hard line to take, but perhaps we would be better off woth fewer, more interested, members. From Doris Leibel, Director ADRC & Editor of the Dutch Reporter.....

At the suggestion of President Don Reid I am publishing the following letter to the Board of Directors of the American Dutch Rabbit Club........ Sent out on Dec. 5, 1969

As you must realize by now, I am having a problem with time and am just beginning to see my way over the top. The Sept. issue is in the mails and the October issue is partially assembled. I hope that it is realized that I do have to attempt to work on a schedule and this is hard to do when no attention is paid to getting matieral to me with any degree of regularity for publication. Over the summer show season I have been doing the best that I can with what I have had to work with. I must depend on articles and observance of publication dates on others. I might add that Mr. Reid has been most cooperative and Mrs. Weinhardt gets her things to me when she has "time"

In my inexperience with the inner workings of the Dutch Club, I didn't realize what a furor I was causing with eht Dutch Reporter until I received a letter from Jessie of Nov. 30th, quote, "Comments heard from all over Ohio, Mich. and Indiana and by mail from Maine to California, dissatisfaction is running rife. The Dutch Reporter has always been a matter of extreme pride among the members of the Dutch Club—Always first with the best (aside from the lateness, which has been going on since way back and we both know the reason) other complaints about the beautiful covers, show reports etc." unquote

I am very conscious now that this reflects on all of us and it is my responsibility. I have made several errors in judgment, but I know what they are and they won't happen again.

To repeat, I had allowed myself to run out of matieral, covers, paper etc. (beleive me it won't happen again) thinking that I should have some guidance on the spending of Dutch Funds. I have since purchased paper (40) cases to take advantage of the price reduction, ink and had the machine cleaned in order to change inks. The A.B. Dick people informed me that the Jet-Dri ink that I had inherited with the machine was causing the holes to clog. Now I am not that experienced with mimeograph to know if this was true or not, but it sounded reasonable. This leaves me with about \$148.00 in the D.R. fund and two months postage coming up very soon. (Keep this in mind as you read on)

Then I was faced with the problem of not publishing the D.R. until I could have covers printed, or to make do and get caught up, which I have been trying to do. I had hoped to solicit covers from some Feed Company and try to save a little money after hearing that the last three year supply of D.R. printing cost over \$400.00 including back pages and title page (I think) Well, in any ovent I have now taken the time and priced the covers and find that the best deal that I can get is; 8,000 (one year's supply) at \$60.00 or 24,000 (3 year's supply) at \$149.00, covers only, 24# test ass't colors, mimeograph paper. I HAD PROMISED DON LOVEJOY AT CALGARY THAT I WOULD CONTACT YOU BEFORE I SPENT THIS MONEY. Paper, ink and machine maintenance is needed, covers could be mimeographed, or allowed a little time, might get them denated.

I was not trying to change the format of the D.R. without permission. As to complete show reports in the D.R. I just simply do not have the time that it would take to do this amount of typing. I can type an article in 10 minutes, but show reports take 20 to 30 min ea. There's a difference in straight typing and having to decipher these report sheets. With the number involved it is time consuming. Linda, our #1 daughter likes to do the ads, and that is her department, but she won't do any other typing.

Those of you that were at Pueblo will remember that I took this job with the understanding that there would be a trial period of one year. I have enjoyed doing this work and am willing to continue and try to do better, however, if you are not satisfied with my efforts it is your perogative to replace me with someone that has

more time to give. There would certainly be no hard feelings on my part.

I am going to hold off on this cover situation until I hear from Mr. Reid and you but am going to try to get caught up on the D.R. issues.

As I have explained to Mr. Reid, I have worked three years as City Manager for Avon Cometics and seven years as manager for an insurance agency until I decided to take a rest this past year. This work has geared me to making money for the company and earning my wages. I suppose that some of this has held over in my Dutch Reporter reasoning. I am certainly willing to be guided......

NOTE: All Officers with the exception of one has responded to this letter, your President, Mr. Reid has copies of all responses and it has been decided to order one year's supply of cevers at \$60.00. This has been done. Your Officers are trying to work together for a better, more active Dutch Club.
