



### LARGE AND SMALL DUTCH Laster C. Wells

Inasmuch as many of you have expressed your opinions in The Dutch Reporter, I guess I will stick my chin out for once and see how many critics I can get to write to me.

First, on my mind, is that too much has been said from the standpoint of knocking good Dutch fanciers. This only creates sore spots and hard feelings and doesn't help our Club membership or Dutch

Whether you raise small Dutch or the larger ones, we all like our Dutch and the Standard covers both; so, inasmuch as we are all human and have a right to raise the size we like best, why should we do so much knocking?

The fancier, who raises small 3-4 lb. Dutch gets letters from breeders praising his Dutch, while the breeder of the larger 4-5 lb. Dutch says he gets mail praising his larger Dutch.

This is only natural and I believe both sides for the simple reason that the breeder of small Dutch doesn't want large Dutch and vice versa.

Weight does not have anything to do with type as so many breeders seem to think. You can have type on a  $5\frac{1}{2}$  lb. Dutch and you can have type on a 3 lb. Dutch, but, too many of our 5 to  $5\frac{1}{2}$  lb. Dutch are too long in body, head, ears and neck and weak in the shoulders, consequently they look large and coarse which is not the good cobby type our Standard calls for.

If these Dutch had full cheeks, short head and neck and cobby type bodies, they would look a lot smaller and place better in the show room and also would dress out more meat.

Now, as for the 3 lb. Dutch, they are too small for the show room,

or for meat, as a rule.

Most of these extremely small Dutch are too flat in body type, they are blocky instead of being cobby. Again, you see a 3 lb. Dutch which is slab sided or just doesn't have any meat on it. These are no good because they do not have the proper type.

However, the small 3 lb. blocky Dutch have a very good place but it is at home being used to reduce the size and weight of the Dutch over 12 lbs. to help them in getting the proper weight and type.

I have been criticized plenty of times for placing the smaller Dutch over the larger Dutch when marking was evenly balanced. I believe I can explain why to most of you. I find the smaller Dutch as a rule have better type than the larger ones, also the breeders of the smaller Dutch usually have their Dutch in better condition for the show room, which means more than a lot of breeders realize.

I often hear breeders say their stock is out of condition but that condition carries only 10 points, forgetting that, when a Dutch is out of condition and moulting, the markings are ragged, color is bad and usually the flesh condition is off enough that the rabbit is not filled out properly and spoils the appearance of its true type.

This is often the reason a breeder may win first at a show one week

and the next week not even place.

In closing, I will say I believe more good type Dutch are found that weigh 4 to 42 lbs. These are large enough to make good small fryers and small enough for most fanciers; also, the does, I believe, produce and raise better litters.

I also believe that 3 to  $5\frac{1}{2}$  lbs., which is a  $2\frac{1}{2}$  lb. gap, is too large a gap for a Dutch with a 42 lb. ideal weight. I believe if we were to make our weights  $3\frac{1}{2}$  to 5 lbs. with a  $4\frac{1}{4}$  lb. ideal, we would eliminate a great deal of our arguments and also raise better Dutch. You seldom see a 31 1b. or a 5 lb. Dutch win in the larger shows, so, why have such a large gap in their weight.

I am not in favor of any radical changes in the Standard but I do believe that the above suggestions should be given some consideration due to the fact of so many differences of opinion. Let's hear from

To Fellow Fanciers:

I have read with interest the articles which have created such a dissension among the club members, and, as I see it, it is all wrong because there is always room for improvement. As some will say the Perfect Dutch hasn't been Born - now, tell me, who is qualified to pass such judgment on such a Dutch. I believe that we, the Dutch members, should make such changes so that we can stress the importance of what correct type really is. COBBY is the word. Then, to have it, one will find that Dutch not over 42 shows much better type than those which crowd the top weight. Now, take the Himalayan Breed - ever notice how the breeders stressed the importance of correct Type, which is snaky. So, what has become of those

4 to 6 1b. Himmys? And consider the job the present judges are doing with that breed. Just why do so many of our present judges prefer Perfect Markings to Type in our Dutch? Try saving your remark cards on one certain Dutch Rabbit for one season, then compare them and see what a mess they are. So, if there is that much difference on the same rabbit, just how can the judges agree on what the Standard calls for. I have yet to hear or see a judge say Very Bad Type refer to condition. I do admit that the smaller toy type is more on the cobby side than the larger sizes as some appear too long for the width to balance up as cobby. Too many of our Dutch are on the Himmy type or too snaky. I think it would help our breed to adjust our point in scale of marking in favor of Type, then I think your larger will soon disappear in the showroom. As to the article about Polish, I believe they are about due for a boom as they are being shown more the past few years while some of the larger breeds of the commercial type. As to losing some members - well, if they are the type I assume they are, clubs are better off without them.
