PROCEDURE FOR PICKING BEST OF BREED DUTCH AND SPECIALS

(Altho this article is printed on page 31 of your 1956 A. D. R. C. Guide Book, it would seem in view of the fact that one out of three show reports are coming in with such errors, that they must be returned to the show secretaries for correction, it can't be repeated too often. I would like to add a few notes of my own. The directions that are sent out with our blanks for sweepstake show reports are very explicit, and easily understood. Much work has gone into making them that way, and in devising the simplest, clearest possible blank for filling out. If you are show secretary, be sure YOU read rules 7, 8 and 9 very carefully and then perhaps we can save some of this money that is being spent on postage for sending show reports back and forth, and what is far more important perhaps we can save some time and cut out some of the delay in getting your exhibitors Special Ribbons and Rosettes to them. Your Secretary)

When picking "Specials" in Dutch with six varieties involved, it is very easy to become confused. This not only results in a most embarrassing incident, but detracts from the overall impression of our excellent A.R.B.A. Judging system. The complete cooperation of the Show Secretary and the Show Superintendent is necessary. Many new Judges and Show officials will find the following procedure very helpful. This is not necessarily the only system, but it is efficient and if followed, will eliminate unnecessary mistakes.

Most important, we want to impress upon you, the necessity of developing this, or a similar system, to prevent mistakes.

No. 1; First, pick best of variety in each of the six different colors. Compare the first place junior buck against the first place senior buck and pick the best buck. Then compare the first place junior doe against the first place senior doe and pick the best doe. Then compare the best doe of variety against the best buck of variety. The resulting winner is best of variety. The other is best opposite sex of variety or color. Best of variety is entitled to a Grand Champion Let., providing all requirements of the A.R.B.A. are met. Best opposite sex of variety is NOT entitled to a Grand Champion Let.

No. 2; Since most Shows offer "Specials" for best junior and best senior, it is desirable to place

these "Specials" as you go along. Naturally, the best of variety will be either best senior or best junior of variety. If the best of variety is a junior it will be the best junior of variety. Then compare the senior doe against the senior buck for best senior of variety. If the best of variety is a senior, it will be the best senior of variety. Then compare the junior doe against the junior buck for the best junior of variety.

No. 3: This same procedure, as outlined above, should be followed on all the six varieties.

No. 4: When "Specials" are awarded to the animals, their holding coops should be properly tagged to make it easier to find your winners later. If it is necessary to return the winners to their show coops before picking the best of breed "Specials", have the Secretary make an accurate list of the winners so they may be brought back to the table efficiently. Also be sure that the Show Secretary has the placements all properly recorded on the judging sheets.

No. 5: The next procedure is to pick best of breed. Place the best of all varieties together (all colors) and select the best of these six. The result is best of breed or best Dutch.

No. 6: Pick best opposite sex, by comparing the six animals of the sex opposite to that of the best of breed winner. In other words, if the best of breed is a buck, remove from the table all the bucks in the best of variety class. Then choose the best opposite sex from the remaining animals, which in this illustration, would be does. If the best of breed is a doe, reverse the above procedure. The best opposite sex is entitled to a Grand Champion Leg, providing all requirements of the A.R.B.A. are met.

No. 7: The best of breed is automatically either best senior, (all colors), or best junior, (all colors). If the best of breed is a junior, pick the best senior, (all colors). If the best of breed is a senior, (all colors), pick the best junior (all colors), by comparing the six animals that won best senior of variety.

#### YOU CAN'T BEAT THE DUTCH

#### IS THE DUTCH A FANCY OR MEAT RABBIT?

This is a question that some inexperienced (?) breeders are asking the officers of the A.D.R.C. It would seem that most of the people who know the answer, through personal experience, do not want to stick their necks out by saying YES! to both parts of that question. Dutch are certainly as fancy a rabbit as any of you could want to raise. To get the good or better marked Dutch is as much a challenge to the old-time breeder as it is to the newly come EXPERT.

One of the most frequent questions asked is "Doesn't it take a lot of feed to get a Dutch up to butcher size?" No, it does not! I am not the perfectionist that many breeders are, in that I do not count the pellets, nor weigh them either, nor do I weigh the water, but through years of raising Dutch and several larger breeds, it is perfectly obvious, that when a single Dutch in a pen requires only about one-fourth as much feed to keep in condition as one individual of a larger breed, it is bound to require less feed to put a pound of meat on the Dutch. You also learn how quickly you can butcher, to get the required pounds of meat out of the fryers.

Here in my state, one and three quarters to two and one quarter pounds seems to be the weight of fryer meat in demand by our consumers. How heavy, and how old does your Dutch have to be to dress out to that weight? Call me a liar, if you want to, but on nothing but a 20% pellet and water, we have butchered nine weeks old Dutch, consistently, that dressed out two pounds per carcass.

The next time you dress rabbits, weigh each one alive and then weigh them dressed. For comparative purposes dress out a three pound Dutch and a four pound "other breed". When you compare the carcasses "by sight", if you don't say the same thing I did, "Why did I dress out those Dutch?" I'll miss my guess. BUT, put those carcasses on the scale and you will see! You will have as much or more Dutch meat

as you have "other breed" meat!

If time is of the essence, then do not raise Dutch for meat. Commercial breeders are getting four pound fryers in eight weeks out of other breeds. Dutch will take you nine to ten weeks, but you will not feed as many pellets in ten weeks as the other breeder does in eight. Of course, to offset the element of time, you will have to have a few more does in production, but you can keep three Dutch does in the space that two larger does need. That of course, gives you better odds to get that "Perfect little fellow" we are all looking for in each litter.

So, my answer to both parts of the question is a great bit "YES". I have never had more than five hundred rabbits in my rabbitry, but I believe I have raised enough of them over the years, to know wherefore I speak, and I heartily agree, that for all around sport and a good profitable hobby, YOU CAN'T BEAT THE DUTCH.

But We Try

QUESTION: One thing I would like to know, as a new breeder, are Chocolate Bucks rare?

ANSWER: Tom Shufflebotham, Chmn. ADRC Educational Committee.

My Dear Mr. Hanlon:

We welcome you to the membership of the ADRC and feel certain that you will find most of the information that you need in the Dutch Guide Book, which you have received by now. We of the American Dutch Rabbit Club feel that it is the finest treatise on the Dutch rabbit ever published in the world - a MUST in the library of any Dutch fancier, be he veteran or novice.

Scanning the show reports in the Dutch Reporter will give you the answer to your question, "are chocolate bucks rare?". You will note that there are localities where the chocolate seem very popular and other localities where they are in the minority. Blacks and blues lead the entries at almost all of the shows, with the balance divided fairly evenly among the other four colors - chocolate, tortoise, gray and steel. The balance of does versus bucks varies - as it will in any livestock shown.

Defining the word "Rare" to mean "uncommon", I suppose you might say that the buck is a rare specimen, taking in view the entire rabbit population. However, as chocolate bucks are usually shown in an entry field of Dutch rabbits, we could safely and truthfully say that they are not "rare"; and the fact that the Dutch rabbit is among the leading breeds shown in the very great majority of our shows tends to add further limitation to its "rare-ness". Although the chocolate is one of the newer developments of the Dutch fancy, it is a popular color and one well known to the Dutch breeder.

Should you decide that the chocolate will be the variety that you select, you will find it a very definite challenge, as I feel that it is perhaps one of the hardest colors to breed to our standard of perfection. This is due to the fact that there are so many different shades of chocolate - getting the right and desired shade of chocolate, and holding it, is quite a task for one who has the patience to work with this fascinating variety of our breed.

I hope that these few notes will clarify your thoughts and answer your question to your satisfaction. The educational committee are always glad to be of service to the new breeder of Dutch.
