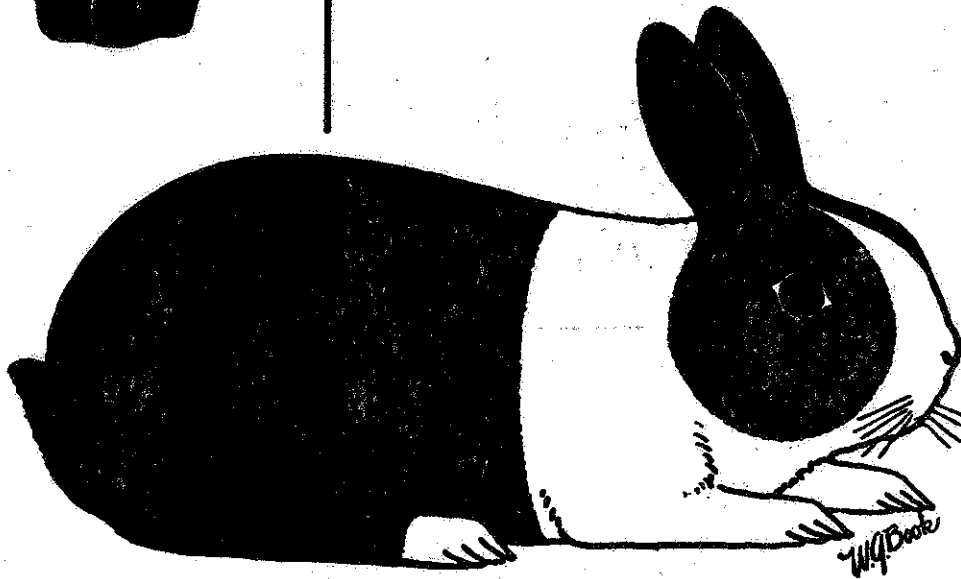

## SECRETARY'S CHIT-CHAT

One more AREA Convention is only a memory, and what pleasant memories! The old-timers who told us what a fine Convention city Springfield, Illinois is, were completely underestimating the story. We had a wonderful time! Plenty of praise is due the fine people who were responsible for making it all so easy for the rest of us. Believe me it was not easy for them! Officials of the 35th. AREA Convention, we give you our deepest THANKS!

The Dutch rabbits, and the Dutch breeders also outdid themselves. There were a total of 337 Dutch rabbits shown. These were of outstanding quality, and it really kept Judges Bayliss and Grables busy placing them. The awards were much more widely distributed than in most years - the biggest winner - award-wise was L. W. VanHorne. He placed three best of varieties as well as Best Dutch. Congratulations, Lew!

One little matter came up that I think should be brought to the attention of those of our members who are interested in the development of the Gold Dutch as a new strain. You will find elsewhere a copy of the official letter from Vern Ashton of the AREA Standards Committee reporting that no action was taken on the Gold Dutch again this year. The reason - This may come as as much of a surprise to many of you as it did to me - I guess we don't read our AREA Guide Book as carefully as we should. In order for a new breed or variety to be acted upon, either to accept or reject there must be a display exhibited at an AREA Convention Show, consisting of Seniors and their offspring to demonstrate what, if any progress the breeders are making to achieve their objective. Next year, at Buffalo, things are going to be different - I am offering a trophy to be awarded as follows: "Best display of Golds - to be awarded to the breeder gaining the most total points on get of Sire and Dam. Such display to consist of a Senior Buck, a Senior Doe and two of their offspring, one being a buck and one a doe." It is conceivable that all four of these animals could be seniors as the breeders have a full year to produce the best possible Gold Dutch. If you want these Golds accepted, then right now is the time to get busy on them.

As you will notice at the bottom of this page, we now have a full slate of officers again. Mr. J. Russell Hall has been appointed to fill the vacancy created by the resignation of G. C. Leisenring as Publicity Director. All of you who have had the pleasure of meeting Mr. Hall know that he will do a fine job for the American Dutch
