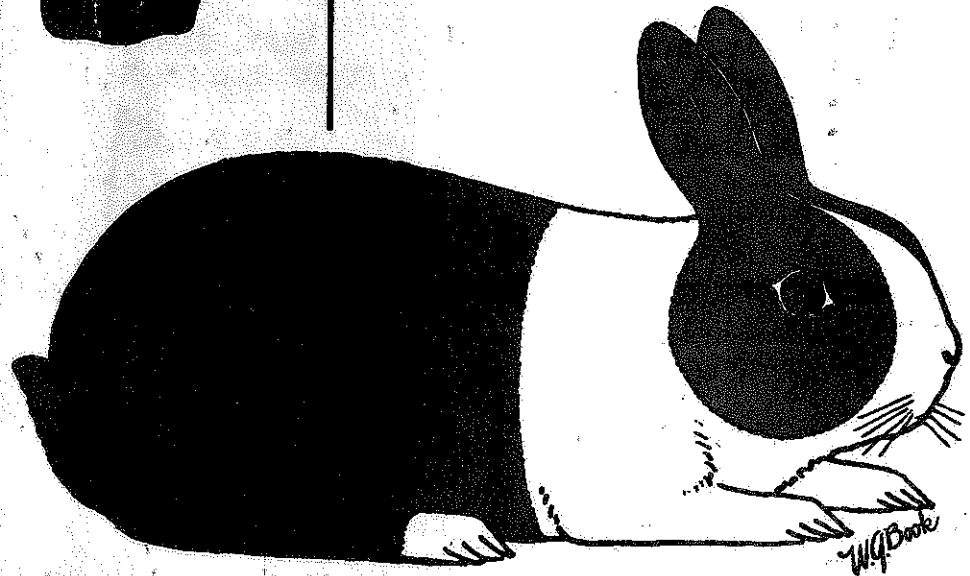

REPORT OF A.D.R.C. STANDARDS COMMITTEE
Pomona, California - October 26, 1965

The proposed standard that was mailed to all members was approved by A.R.B.A. Standard Committee EXCEPT the two Gray Varieties. The counter proposal (as printed in the Dutch Reporter) was also turned down by A.R.B.A. Standards Committee.

The A.R.B.A. Standards Committee has approved the following Gray Dutch Standard. This Standard will not be in effect 'till the new book of Standards is published.

Gray Dutch

Body Color:

A uniformly ticked, medium dark shade of gray; agouti-coated, carrying distinct bands which are visible when blown into; under-color next to skin to be slate-blue, Fur to carry a distinct ring color when blown into. Slight sandy tinge permissible. Ticking to be carried evenly over cheeks, top of body, sides, down the outside of rear legs and ears. Narrow black lacing on ears desirable. Eye circles of white or very light gray, should be narrow and inconspicuous.

Belly Color:

White surface color with slate-blue under-color extending from inside of rear legs over belly to undercut. The undercut showing on the surface color of the belly is permissible, when not showing on the surface of the belly it is determined by blowing into the fur and is the point of junction where the slate-blue under-color on the belly meets the white fur covering the forelegs and the chest. The undercut should be a continuous line with the gray-ticked saddle to form a perfect circle around the body, the same as other varieties.

Tail Color:

Top of tail to match body color. Underside of tail to match belly color.

Faults:

Avoid excessive Sandy or Brassy tinge, White hairs, and long black-tipped guard hairs.

This is not the A.D.R.C. Standard Committee Standard we wanted approved, but we do think this is a big improvement over what we had and will remove the sore spot we have had to live with in regard to undercut on Gray Dutch.

YOU CAN'T BEAT THE DUTCH

A.R.B.A. CONVENTION
Pomona, California - October 25-28, 1965

We left Willow Run Airport on Sunday 9:40 A.M., temperature 35 degrees. Arrived in Los Angeles at 11:45 Pacific Coast time, temperature 100 degrees -- about to knock you down! This was my first trip in the air, but Mrs. Gentner's 5th. trip. Flying at 31000 feet we had clouds below us until past Chicago, then the clouds cleared away and we could see the ground, across the Mississippi River the Captain announced he was bearing southwest over Kansas City. Still bearing southwest we could see snow-capped mountains ahead, flew over the Painted Desert, past Albuquerque, New Mexico, then across the Mohavie Desert up the valley, mountains on both sides and ahead the high peaks, snow covered. Could see a lot of the Los Angeles residential areas, shopping and industrial areas in the valley before landing at the Airport.

We had made no plans in advance for this trip. Called the Fair Motel at Pomona which was listed in the Convention Show Catalog, they had rooms available at \$9.00 per day:

Headquarters Motel charging \$14.00. The lady told me that a bus would leave the airport at 1:30 for Pomona-- got tickets and waited. Left the airport shortly after 1:30 P.M., arrived at Motel in Pomona about 3:05 P.M. about 35 miles, hot and heavy traffic all the way.

After registering and getting our luggage to our unit, called a cab and went to the Pomona Valley Inn about 1/2 or 3/4 mile away. Got our Banquet and Farewell party tickets, also tickets for the tour of Knotts Berry Farm and Wax Museum, also registered at the A.R.B.A. booth, got our identification badges and paid my A.R.B.A. Membership renewal. The tour of Commercial Rabbitries and the El Monte processing plant had been called off due to lack of cooperation, I was told.

The Coffee Shop at Pomona Valley Inn opened shortly after 5 p.m. and as we had had only the lunch served on the plane, we decided to eat, cafeteria style and very plush, wonderful Salad bar, after that couldn't eat any more -- then the bad news \$7.54 -- we did not go back.

Decided to walk back to our Motel, was almost too big a job, as I am not used to walking anymore.

On Monday morning we discovered a coffee shop right next to our Motel, good food and reasonable, after eating got a cab to the fairgrounds. First person we met that we knew as ARBA Director Fred Applegate. After greetings were over he told us that Louisville, Kentucky had been awarded the 1966 Convention. At this time Joe Lutes came by and greeted us, everyone on the west coast was glad to see people from the east make it out there. While looking over the booth displays met President Willmann who said he didn't know of any other people from Michigan out there. He was very busy and left us -- I better note here, did meet George Payliss Sunday night at the Motel and on Monday morning he was busy with the Dutch judging.

About 30 minutes after we had met President Willmann, he came looking for me, found me, too and I was drafted at once, he took me into the other building to Bob Hansen and I was paired with a Mr. Buddie, I think of Illinois, to interview the boys of the ARBA Youth Club to select a Youth King. Mr. Shilliday, newly elected Director from Ohio and a Mr. Spence of Texas were interviewing the girls.

It really was an interesting experience -- we had 11 boys to talk with and five places to fill. The first two were very close with the next three not too far behind. While working on these interviews I looked up and Judge C. F. Dickinson was watching. He is at his daughter's home at Whittier, California for the winter. He had met Mrs. Gentner in the show room, she told him where I was. He was looking very well. After completing the interviews, Mrs. Gentner and I returned to our Motel by cab to get ready for the Banquet.

The Banquet was really different -- held out doors 00 tables set up around the pool on an Hawaiian theme,-- served buffett or cafeteria style -- indirect lighting (so you can't see what you are eating).

After eating, introduction of A.R.B.A. Officers and show officials, guest speaker, David Sills, Attorney, Orange County, Calif.-- topic Crime Increase and Seeming Inability of Officials to Cope With and Control.

Some presentations of plaques, followed by King and Queen Youth Awards, and roll call of States showed a good representation of States even if it was a long way -- the Gentners were the only ones from Michigan present.

Met a Mr. & Mrs. Walter Fackler of Pomona who were very nice and friendly and took us back to our Motel after the Banquet.

Tuesday we enjoyed the tour of Knotts Berry Farm and Wax Museum. This tour was planned and supervised by Mrs. Bea Schott and she did an excellent job.

The ARBA meeting scheduled for Tues night was missed by this reporter -- too much walking in the 90 degree temperature had me floored. Did attend the second ARBA meeting on Wed, where President Willmann read the one resolution that had been presented: "That show rules be changed to allow a placing of best rabbit in Show. At once Sec'y Blyth made a motion not to pass, was seconded -- then President Willmann granted both sides equal time for discussion which lasted 33 minutes. The vote was 56 against -- 47 for. Right away Mr. Shilliday asked for the floor and asked that a special committee be appointed to plan to place this award at Louisville in 1966. It is believed that this will be done.

The Facklers took us on a tour of the fairgrounds of which they are justly proud. They cover an area of 416 acres, being the largest county fair grounds in the U.S. The grounds are well kept, all paved lots of parking area, good buildings well kept up. A Mexican quarter that operates shops, etc. at fair time. Another permanent display on the grounds is a grouping of steam locomotives donated by two or three different railroads. We were highly impressed.

Although his employment had kept him too busy of late years to attend rabbit shows, he still maintained a small herd of Black Dutch. I was fortunate enough to obtain his last steel-bred black a few years ago, along with much good advice which gave me a big boost with steels. Our deepest sympathy to both Mrs. Schalip and Mrs. Milliken and Oliver's family.

Mike also informs me that he combined a trip to the Convention with a visit to relatives in Seattle. He only stayed for two days and was disappointed in the size of the show.

Don Reid writes that his "ranch" was hit pretty hard by a tornado in August. He says, "Most of our 5 acres of big trees are destroyed. Lot of damage to our house and buildings." Guess they did need that trip to Pomona!

We have attended two carrying case shows within the last month. These shows seem to be gaining over cooped shows -- guess that is due to the lack of cooperative labor in setting up and tearing down. Both shows were well attended and if you could be right on top of the judging table you had some idea of what your competition was, but if you were unfortunate enough to have two breeds being judged at the same time, you were just plain out of luck. You didn't know if the class was really a sharp one and the one that looked good at home had lived up to your expectations or if it was just a mediocre class and most anything reasonably good could have won it. No chance to sell much of anything either. If you were looking for something specific and knew who might have it you stood a chance of finding it, but otherwise you were out of luck. If I had my choice between a cooped show or a carrying case show I would surely choose the one that was cooped even if I had to drive an extra hundred miles to reach it.

Things are moving along for the National Dutch Show. The committee expects to get out requests for specials and advertising very soon now -- please be ready to cooperate when they contact you.

We will have to get moving on this Special Dutch Issue of Small Stock Magazine, too. Remember, WE MUST BUY A CERTAIN AMOUNT OF ADVERTISING FOR A GIVEN AMOUNT OF INFORMATIV MATERIAL, so please be thinking it over and be ready to help your committee when they ask for it.

I don't know what your plans are for 1966, but we are preparing for a bigger and better Dutch year than ever at Weinhardts. We are building new pens, discarding old ones -- always increasing our capacity with each change, and settling in for a long, hard winter. Lots of abies in the nests and more due in the nest 2-3 weeks. Hoping for a few winners for those spring shows.

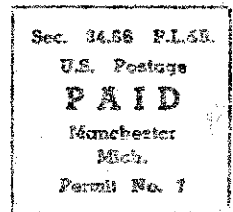
