

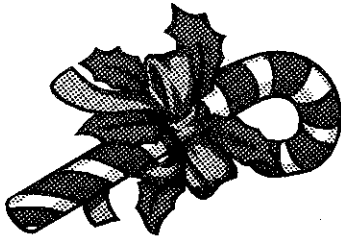
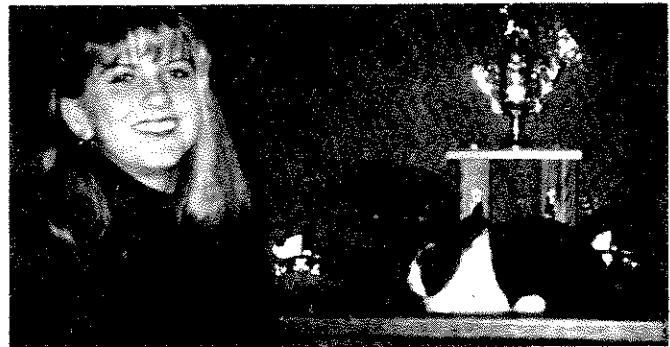

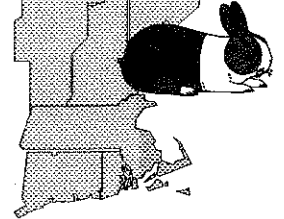

Feel free to call me with questions. Lastly, there will be a vote to approve a \$3 surcharge for 1996 memberships to help offset the cost of the Dutch Reporter. This would be a one time charge. Please look these proposals over carefully.

2) Also there will be an upcoming vote for judge selection for national conventions for two years. We have been losing the availability of judges that we want, and our selection is sometimes limited.

There were two new directors appointed at the Board meeting, Sue Peters and Wenton Carlton. Glad to have both of you aboard!

I would like to begin by thanking everyone who helped with the ARBA Convention show in Louisville, KY. In the open, Rick & Julie Billups, Doreen Bengtson, Tammy Wise, Todd & Charles Uran, Larry Nixon, Roy McClung, Bob McKenna, Eric & Sharon Mixdorf, and Erik Bengtson & Mandy Anderson for running the Youth show, as well as others I'm sure I missed. All chipped in to help with the largest showing of Dutch ever at the ARBA Convention. It took nearly two full days for festivities to be completed. Judges Larry Bengtson and Ray Brewer had their hands full sorting out the 600+ Dutch. Once again, congratulations to Wayne MacKinnon for best Dutch and new Dutch breeder Kenneth Runkles from Illinois with BOS in the open. Congrats also go out to our youth winners, Abby

Mullinax for BOB and Travis Anderson with BOS.

Some people at the Convention were asking me where were the Blue-Steels? They were at home in my barn. I had sent the request to present them to Tex Thomas, the chairman of the ARBA Standards committee. Unfortunately, the postmark on the request was a couple of days after what it was supposed to be and Tex rejected the application. I thought I had mailed it far enough ahead to get the postmark, but I guess not. Therefore the Blue-Steels were not evaluated. I will continue working on the Blue-Steel Dutch. I will work towards presentation for next year.

Several of the officers mentioned in the last issue our need for a dues increase. This was discussed in length at our Board of Director's meeting. We voted to begin the process (it takes over a year) to change our by-laws. One change will allow the Board and members at the general membership meeting at one of the semiannual meeting, to make changes necessary for immediate funding. This will allow changes if emergencies come up. This article in the By-laws will rarely be used, but it will be there if needed. This passed unanimously at the general membership meeting (85-100 members present).

The other change in our by-laws is to increase the dues level. We have not had an increase in over 15 years and this will allow us to get our finances in good shape and put a little back each year so we will not need another increase for quite some time. **THE INCREASE IS ONLY \$3 PER MEMBER PER YEAR.** This was also approved unanimously at the general membership meeting. **BUT THIS WILL NOT GO INTO AFFECT FOR AT LEAST ONE YEAR AND ONLY IF THE MEMBERSHIP VOTES TO CHANGE THAT ARTICLE OF THE BY-LAWS.**

The American Dutch Rabbit Club will loose about \$1000 prior to the Dues increase being effective the beginning of 1997. Therefore, at the General membership meeting, the membership unanimously approved to add a \$3 SURCHARGE per member for the 1996 calendar year until we can get a dues increase passed. This surcharge is for the betterment of the American Dutch Rabbit Club and will be discontinued at the end

of 1996.

Your current Board of Directors has been doing a good job of working together to get the club moving in a direction that will greatly benefit the members of the ADRC and the Dutch rabbit. If we can get these financial matters handled, then we will no longer need to debate getting rid of the Variety Ribbons, the size or the number of issues of the Dutch Reporter, or doing away with any other member benefits, in an effort to reduce spending. That seems to have been the major topic at the last several meetings. These changes will allow us to take up ideas that will further benefit and reward the members of this organization.

I look forward to hearing your ideas on what the club should be working on in the future. I'm sure many of you have ideas, so please write or give me a call to convey your opinion.

NEWS FROM RICHARD

Hello Dutch Breeders, My apologies for not having an article in the last issue of the Dutch Reporter. It seems with the 1996 ARBA National Convention plans, my work and judging schedules, and some time I save for myself, my duties as a Dutch Club director have suffered.

I was unable to make either the Board of Director's meeting or the General Membership meeting in Louisville, as I was tied up in the Illinois Rabbit and Cavy Shows, Inc. Booth or the ARBA Booth. However, I certainly wish I could have been at both of these meetings, as it appears something is amiss.

There is no one in the American Dutch Rabbit Club that knows better than I do about our financial situation, and that we need a raise in the dues and/or sanction structure. However, it is very disturbing to me that it was even suggested (particularly

by the Board members), that we violate our own Constitution and By-Laws in order to accomplish the increase. This is insulting to both the club and the membership.

We have survived for the past several years with the same financial burden that we presently face, and for anyone to suggest trying to either "slip something past the membership" or "making up some cosmetic farce" in order to raise the dues is, in my opinion, detrimental to the organization.

I hope it is not true, but I have been told that there may be an attempt to initiate a "surcharge" on the memberships in the near future in order to create more income for the club. I, for one, would be opposed to such a practice, as it is essentially changing the dues structure, which would constitute a violation to our By-Laws.

If it is so desired to generate additional income for the club, put out a plea and let those that wish to donate some extra money send it to Doreen. If each American Dutch Rabbit Club member, both adult and youth would donate a mere 1 cent per day, this would generate upwards of \$2,000. If everyone would kick in 50 cents per month,

we would be looking at a possible \$4,000 plus. Naturally there will be those that won't contribute, but it should be their prerogative. To initiate some scheme to generate income without following the proper procedures (submitting a resolution to change the C & BL), is not looking out for the best interest of this organization.

I would be glad to discuss my opinion regarding this subject with any member of the American Dutch Rabbit Club, particularly those that were kicking the idea around.

I cannot report on the Dutch at Louisville, as I was unable to see any of the judging, talk to any Dutch breeders about the rabbits, or even walk through the Dutch isles. As stated above, I was too busy with the plans and preparation for the 1996 ARBA National Convention in Peoria. MEET YOUR ADRC DIRECTOR. UP CLOSE AND PERSONAL

Hello! I would like to introduce myself to everyone. My name is Ken Emerson. My wife and I live in Geneseo, New York, a small town about 30 miles south of Rochester. We live on an old horse/cattle Farm, with 30 acres of land.

I began raising rabbits in 1987. When I was a kid I raised a few Dutch for a science project. In my older but no wiser years, I thought it might be interesting raising some rabbits. Well, that's how it all got started. I visited Johnny Baker, and left several hours later with a few rabbits and a lot more knowledge about rabbit breeding. I had never heard of a Rabbit Show, until Mr. Baker dragged me to my first local show. Not long after that first show, Johnny talked me into traveling with him to a Rabbit Convention (whatever that was!) all the way out in Bloomington. I had nothing to show, but he said I'd get to meet lots of people and have a good time. He was right!

It was at the Bloomington convention that I met the two gentlemen whose lines are the foundation of my present herd, Mr. Dale Zentner and Mr. John Nelson. I purchased an outstanding blue buck, Gizmo, from the Zentner line, and a trio from Mr. Nelson. These lines gave me


my start in Dutch, and I was fortunate enough to breed some winners very quickly. And as most of you know, I've been hooked ever since!

Our livestock and family outgrew the five-acre hobby farm where we were living at the time, and in 1990 we moved to our present home in Geneseo (which is in the heart of "horse country" in upstate New York). Our rabbits live in a converted cattle barn in hanging cages, where I have approximately 200 holes. Most of the labor for converting the cow barn to a rabbitry was provided by Jamie Green, an ARBA judge who now lives in North Carolina. Jamie stayed with us for a couple years while he finished his college education, and more than earned his keep by building cages and cleaning the rabbitry.

Somewhere along the line I got into raising Californians also (my wife prefers six-class animals), so now about half my barn is devoted to Dutch and the rest to the Cals.

In my non-rabbit life I am a sales representative for the Timberland Company, which makes rugged outdoor-type footwear. I travel throughout upstate New York and Pennsylvania for my job. My wife Debby is a librarian at the local community college. My oldest son just graduated from college and is living in Las Vegas. Our present household includes my younger son who's currently attending college, Debby's daughter who's also a college student, and our grandson Brendan who wants to be a rabbit judge when he grows up. At almost 3, he claims he wants to be "Judge like Mr. Rizzo" - Sam Rizzo, who's a good friend, golfing buddy, and now ARBA District 7 Director.

Also included are two horses and two insane dogs. It makes for a hectic life, but also lots of fun. And we don't know how we're going to explain to our grandson that now that winter's coming, there won't be a bunny show every weekend.

TATTOO TIPS

Hello fellow Dutch Fanciers! My name is Carol Neuman and I am a youth ARBA registrar who raises Himalayans and Dutch. I am also a director of the American Himalayan Rabbit Association. As I have to tattoo a lot both in my own rabbitry and for registering animals, I have tried several methods of tattooing. Some work better than others, and some don't work at all.

DO

Check the ear for mites or scabs. If there is evidence of either, take care of the problem and postpone tattooing for a few days.

Load your clamp backwards. Test on a piece of paper for the correct order.

Aim for the center of the lower half of the ear. It has the fewest blood vessels and least amount of hair.

Place the animal on a slippery surface. This way it can run away while getting clamped and can't injure itself.

Clamp tightly and release quickly. Rub the ink in with a q-tip, cloth or plastic baggie.

Seal the ink in with Vaseline. Wipe off excess ink and sealant.

You may want to try flipping the rabbit over and grasping its ears in one hand. With the other hand, clamp/write in the tattoo. This way, the rabbit has almost no means of possible escape, and it will feel more secure.

By using the numbering system, it is easier to keep records. For example, some people use a combination of numbers and letters indicating parentage, color, and date of birth. I use the NS prefix (for North Star), followed by a number. If the color of one of the parents is different from that of the animal, I use the letter of the parents color behind the number. I also use odd numbers for bucks and even for does. That way, if I show litter mates, there is no confusion. e.g. NS24C = A doe with a chocolate parent.

DON'T

Don't squeeze the prongs of the digit all the way through the ear. If the rabbit runs away, it permanently damage ear. It also makes the ear less likely to hold the ink really well. The ink stays on the surface of the skin because the holes are filled with blood.

Don't tattoo an animal too young. Either the tattoo will almost completely fade away or it will spread all over - into the hairy part of the ear and near the ear canal - making it ugly and very hard to read.

Never put ink on your letters before clamping them into the ear. This not only rusts the metal digits out, but if there is a mistake, it will be permanent!!

Using paste if often very messy. I have found that the lighter colored pastes like green and blue have been very hard to read in the dark colored ears of Dutch.

Don't use any sort of device that restricts the animals movement such as bunny wraps or towels!! Too often, a

good quality rabbit has ripped out its toenails or worse, broken its back because of this sort of restraint.

Everyone has their own method in tattooing and I'm sure not everyone will agree with my suggestions, but this is what has worked best for me over the years.

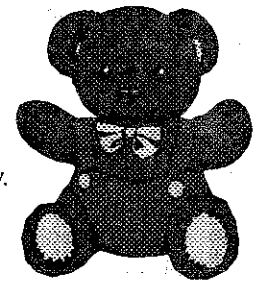

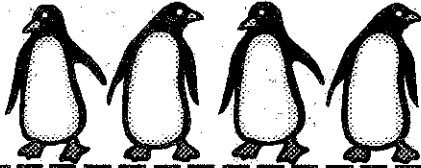

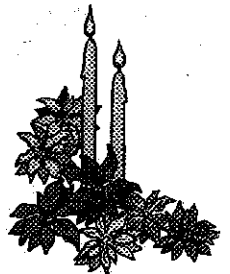


MORE WORDS ON THE SUBJECT

RAISING DUTCH IN WASHINGTON STATE

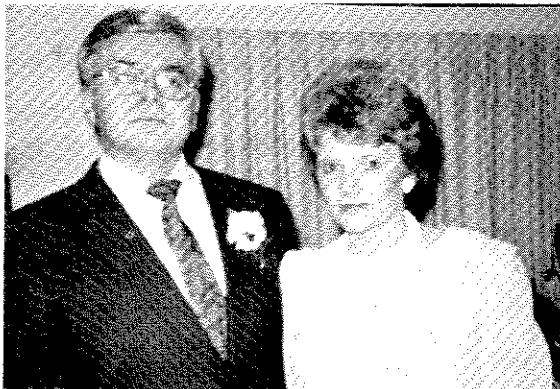

As for the debate going on, I should say that I don't believe that the addition of this color will ruin Dutch. All colors should be carefully bred and there are certain color crosses that should not be made and the same applies to the Blue Steel. As for not breeding true...I do not have enough of them to breed straight blue steel to blue steel, but in crossing blue to blue steel, I have found only blues and blue steels produced.

Please try to get a look at this color and carefully read as much as you can before you make a decision...if they are accepted again, we will be asked again to vote on them. Please vote knowledgeably and for what you believe would be the best for the breed.

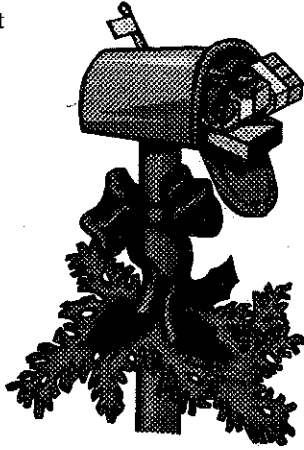

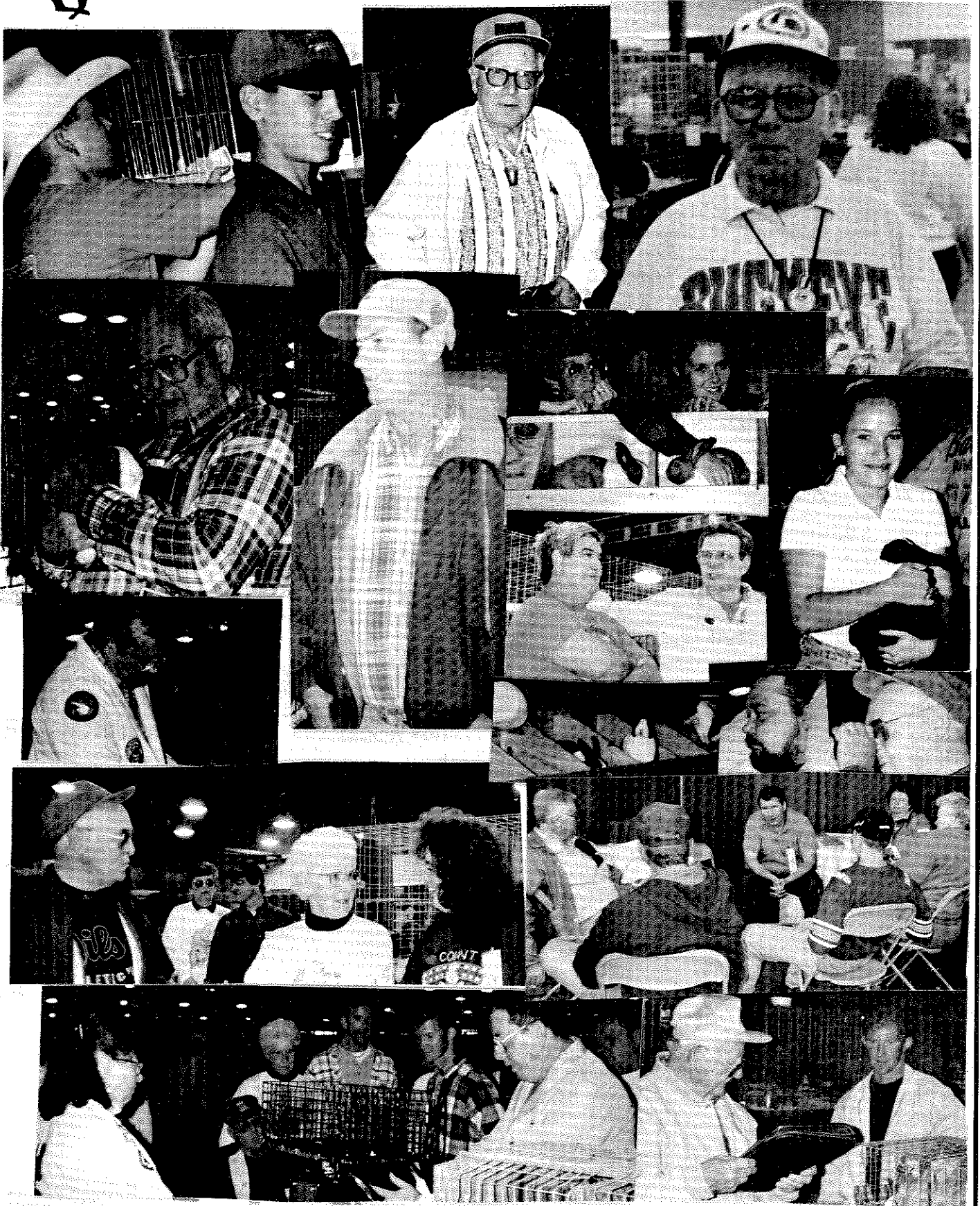

BREEDING DUTCH TO THE CORRECT COLOR

BY Allen Barr, ARBA Judge #352
Co-authored by Jill Dobson, breeder since 1975

The breeding of Dutch (and all colored rabbits) is not a new project. There is a rather selective group of breeders (now mostly deceased) that have, over the last forty years, bred some very good quality colored Dutch. Many have published articles in the Domestic Rabbit Magazine and the now defunct Small Stock Magazine. The quality of past articles has been very good in my opinion. I have found these articles helpful in breeding not only Dutch, but other breeds such as English Spots, Havanas and Netherland Dwarfs. The breeders whose articles I recommend are Don Lovejoy, Jack Boughton, James Blyth, Tom Shufflebotham, Bill Sommers, Charles Williams, and E.C. Bickley. I had the pleasure to meet some of these individuals and, as with most new breeders, I did ask a lot of questions, primarily about color. From their articles and personal experience I have put these breeding practices in writing.

GENERAL COLOR BREEDING PRACTICE

There are several basic color items to remember but the most important is that in almost all cases there is "NO BASIC REASON" to cross colors. All the colors can be bred successfully without changing or adding new colors or color crossing. By using selection improvement to always ensure that breeding animals have deep surface color or correct band width or ring definition, one can continue to breed the same line of Dutch at least five generations or even longer with no loss in color quality.

BLACK DUTCH

The breeding of good Black is probably the easiest of all colors. There is no color cross for the variety. I have not recently seen deep

colors involved. There should be no Blues, Chocolates or may Tortoise in a Black pedigree used for breeding Blacks. These colors will degrade the depth of surface color in offspring. There are other possible defects that pop up in offspring. Blacks with large amounts of Blue or Chocolate in the background will be prone to have more of a brownish tinge along the lower shoulder, flank and hips. Another color problem is white hairs. In all cases these should be culled from breeding stock. I suggest at no time should Black breeding stock from Black or Blue color matings be retained. This also applies to Blacks that come from Steel breedings.

BLUE DUTCH

The breeding of Blue Dutch can be just as easy as the Black. Blues do tend to have numerous faults which need to be improved, such as light surface color, white hairs, silvering and light colored guard hairs, and washed out color on ears and lower flanks. The guard hair problem takes some effort to solve. Again the best and only way to solve it is to cull any offspring which show this trait from your breeding herd. The selective breeding of Blues is harder to keep up with than Blacks. I have found good results from breeding in some Blacks to improve the Blue. The amount of mix for the Black input depends on the quality of the line of Blues. Some Blues would not need to input Black at all as they currently carry enough depth of surface color. The need to add color is determined by the total amount of depth of color found in the litters you raise. If you need to improve color, cull selectively for color even if it means eliminating well marked rabbits. The addition of Black will help almost immediately. These Blacks should be from a selective group of "pure" Blacks (as mentioned in the "Black" section.)

CHOCOLATE DUTCH

The breeding of quality Chocolates has always been a challenge. The best description to maintain for a breeding program (not the same as the Standard of Perfection) is to breed examples which appear to be as deep as

pure Milk Chocolate. Now this may be subjective as a description but it should be as deep as possible. A large number of Dutch on the west coast are too light in color. Selection can be made with the current gene pool but it can also be beneficial to cross out to "pure" Black. The crossing in of blues may cause dilution which produce Lilacs (the dilute of Chocolate.) If during anytime in your Chocolate breeding you produce any other colors even after crossing into "pure" Black, these offspring should be eliminated. Some Chocolate faults to look out for are: light surface color, light head color (especially at ears) brownish tinge on lower hips and flanks, slightly lighter guard hairs, and white hairs.

GRAY DUTCH (to be changed to Brown Gray for 1996 Standard)

This is the last standard true color of the Dutch. The body color is becoming too brown in surface color and not the bright orange ring color of the past. There has recently been indiscriminate color crossing to Steels which has caused some problems for the band width over the top of the saddle and ring definition on the lower hips. Another offshoot from this cross has been dark belly color instead of white or cream. This variety needs to have the balance of ring definition and the proper band width which gives the evenness of surface ticking. If the brightness and depth of color is not maintained or the level of selective culling not performed for band width, then this variety will breakdown over time. A whole article can be devoted to this color, maybe another time. My suggestion is to stick with gray to gray crosses and cull for ring definition, band width and belly color. Until recently Grays have been on the decline on the west coast. At the 1995 Cal-State Convention, Best of Breed & Best Four Class went to a Gray Jr. Doe. Best of Breed-Youth at the 1995 N.D.S. was a very handsome little Gray Jr. Buck raised in California. I have not heard enough breeding talk discussing the difficulties of this color to believe there is enough concentrated effort to advance the color even with the recent wins from California.

STEEL DUTCH

I believe this variety is the hardest of all the colors to breed for perfection. Steels are a made color and without proper attention will degrade with time in your breeding program. Effort must be constant to keep uniformity in the animals produced. This variety recently has had a lot of controversy both on new variety submission and also with the publishing of some very unorthodox breeding.

Steels are wide band agoutis. This wide band can be applied to any self color as well as the current Gray variety, which in other breeds is referred to as Chestnut Agouti. Black Steel is the only standardized color, but there can be Chocolate Steel, Lilac Steel and Blue Steel (the new variety under acceptance). I have viewed the first ARBA showing of the Blue Steel and found them to be uniform in color and good examples of the breed. There is of course the controversy about adding new colors. The color is not new and there has, through the years, always been various colors of non-recognized Dutch. With the current "anything goes" color breeding principles which are generally practiced now by the new inexperienced breeder, I would not recommend adding any more colors. If all breeders follow correct color breeding practices it would not be any problem to add a range of new colors or varieties. The current color problems associated with the breeding of Black Steels are: excessive gold tinge to

color, incorrect band width to the ring, and lack of uniform ticking. The most consistent problem with the breeding of Black Steels is to dark over the back (referred to as a dorsal stripe) which does not allow for uniformity of the ring over the back. I would use Steels maintain proper band width and if you need help to balance the color the addition of a Blue is the only color that should be added to the Steel breeding program. If any other colors are found from this cross they should be culled. The same goes for any Black from Steel matings.

TORTOISE

This is a made color or color which needs to have periodic bleeding to maintain the best color factors. The base color of the Tortoise Dutch is the gold or orange color with bluish shading on the head and lower flank stripe. There are currently some good examples of this color around but I have recently seen a lot of Tortoise which instead of bluish shadings they are showing shading of sepia. Animals with only the orange base color have been called Yellows or Golds and can be bred true. A real success can be made from selectively breeding a rich deep surface color for the Gold and not washed out as to be Light Fawn in color. There can be a lightening of the base color as well as the shading color which then needs to have periodic addition of another color. The only color I would recommend using is Blue. Care must also be taken not to have too much shading which results in the

entire coloration over the saddle. This produces an appearance of total body shadings which makes it difficult to visualize the color on the lower flanks and failure to show the bright orange factor over the saddle. There are currently good examples of Torts showing. I have viewed some Torts with sepia shading instead of bluish shadings, while others have a brownish tinge along the lower hips and flanks causing the body color to be blotchy. These specimens in all cases should be culled regardless of marking quality. I have also found, in reviewing pedigrees of Torts, that their backgrounds are mixed with Chocolate, Black and even Gray varieties. I do not recommend using these animals in any breeding program.

The best method in all cases would be to breed light colored animals to darker colored animals to maintain even color. It is also possible that good colored Torts can continue to be bred to good colored Torts with no problems as long as no faults are found.

I hope this article has been helpful to other breeders. The main reason I have chosen to write this article is that recently there have been articles published which gave incorrect or bad advice in my opinion. This article should help set the record straight. Anyone who has issue with what has been published here can contact me and I will be glad to discuss any items with them. I will add, though if some one does follow the above mentioned advice, their path will lead to success.

Dear American Dutch Rabbit Club Membership,

At a show not too long ago I witnessed an interpretation of the Dutch Standard I haven't encountered before. The judge came across a senior doe that weighed 3 lbs. She referred back to the passage in the Standard which defined a senior buck or doe as "6 months of age or over, or having attained minimum senior weight." The judge allowed the rabbit to compete because it was entered as a senior and therefore supposedly 6 months or over. The animal fulfilled one of the requirements, so it didn't necessarily matter if it fulfilled the other.

Can anyone shed some light on whether or not this is a valid interpretation?

SECRETARY'S REPORT American Dutch Rabbit Club BOARD MEETING, LOUISVILLE, KY. October 22, 1995



President Fred Mullinax called the board meeting of the American Dutch Rabbit Club Board of Directors to order at 7:30 PM on Sunday October 22, 1995 in the Yorkshire room of the Executive Inn, Louisville, Kentucky.

Answering roll call were: President Fred Mullinax, Vice President Wayne MacKinnon, Secretary/Treasurer Doreen Bengtson, District One Directors: Kevin Hooper & Ken Emerson, District Two Director: Lynn Shaw, District Three Directors: Fran Schettler and George Parmer, Sweepstakes Chairperson, Jeffrey Andrews and Publicity Department Chairperson, Rick Billups. (Absent were District One Director Linda Anderson, District Two Directors Floyd Dopler and Richard Gehr, District Three Director Charles Christ, Dutch Reporter Editor Julia Anderson and Youth Representative to the American Dutch Rabbit Club Board, Mandy Anderson.

President Mullinax entertained a motion to dispense with the reading of the minutes of the previous board meeting at the 1995 National Dutch Show in Oshkosh, Wisconsin, because the minutes had been printed in the Dutch Reporter. Motion seconded and passed. Report of Officers:

VICE PRESIDENT WAYNE

MACKINNON: said he felt Dutch activities on a national level are good, but rather slow on the local level.

DIRECTOR PARMER: said that Dutch activities in Oregon are pretty low key, but the state of Washington is really "hopping". They have lots of new breeders and have lots of good possibilities for the future.

SECRETARY TREASURER DOREEN BENGTSON: felt that the Upper Midwest is still glowing from the 95 National Dutch Show. Youth are especially active in the area. The move of the American Dutch Rabbit Club from Illinois to Minnesota has gone smoothly. Please try to remind everyone that sending memberships or sanction requests to Illinois will slow our response to you.

DIRECTOR SHAW: has been busy moving and hasn't been able to attend shows for a while, but feels that the numbers and the quality of rabbits shown are about the same as in the past.

DIRECTOR HOOPER: Ohio members are down a little, but there are new members coming in. Tune into the next DR for more about the 1996 NDS in Ohio. They have lots of ads coming in, some from corporate sponsors and have some new "twists" that will be revealed in the future.

DIRECTOR EMERSON: finds no new shows in the area, due to poor judging. The only way to get any competition going is to show in Ohio. Old breeders are NOT being replaced by new ones.

SWEEPSTAKES CHAIRPERSON

JEFFREY ANDREWS: reports that the Sweepstakes department is moving along pretty well. Jeff asks that all secretary's be reminded to complete all parts of the show report and add a note in the forms to return the report forms to the sweepstakes chairperson even if NO Dutch are shown.

PUBLICITY CHAIRPERSON RICK

BILLUPS: reports that old merchandise is being moved out with special sales and inventory is being kept at a minimum. Look to the 96 NDS for new items.

PRESIDENT FRED MULLINAX: says not too much happening in the Carolinas. He mentions a good showing of Dutch at a show in Tennessee.

OLD BUSINESS:

Wayne MacKinnon reported that the Hall of Fame Committee will be very active at this convention and if anyone would like to propose a name for the Hall of Fame, you can get forms from Wayne anytime at this show, or from the secretary in the booth.

The guidebook committee reported that final ads are due at this convention, and articles can be sent to Dick Gehr. Kevin Hooper voiced his hope that perhaps the publication date of the guidebook can be moved up a bit since the ARBA is presently selling their new Standard.

NEW BUSINESS:

A motion was made by Kevin Hooper and seconded by Ken Emerson and passed by the Board that rule #17 of the National Dutch Show Rules be changed to read: "No judge shall be allowed to judge two (2) consecutive Open National Dutch Shows, or two (2) consecutive Youth National Dutch shows."

Wenton Carlton as district three director to fill the seat in that area having no elected candidates. Approved. Doreen Bengtson for a three year term as Secretary/Treasurer of the American Dutch Rabbit Club. Approved.

A motion made by Lynn Shaw and seconded by George Parmer that the meeting be adjourned was passed.

Husbandry of the RABBIT

Part 4

In previous parts of this series, the anatomy and physiology, general care, restraint techniques, injections, medicating, anesthesia, sexing, and nutrition of the rabbit were discussed. The remaining parts will present various diseases that affect rabbits, including bacterial, enteric, and parasitic diseases. Other disorders commonly encountered in rabbits, such as sore hocks, malocclusion, posterior paralysis, uterine adenocarcinoma, and urinary problems are also discussed. Where appropriate, treatment regimens and therapy are included.

VIRAL DISEASES

Rabbits can contract a variety of viral diseases, such as infectious myxomatosis, rotavirus, and coronavirus. Viral diseases are rarely diagnosed in pet rabbit in the United States. Infectious myxomatosis is discussed in this review, however, because it is a well documented viral disease in rabbits.

Infectious myxomatosis, a fatal disease of domesticated rabbits, is a pox virus. The disease is transmitted to rabbits by mosquitoes, biting flies fleas, or through direct contact with an infected rabbit. Clinical signs generally begin with conjunctivitis, which rapidly becomes more marked and is accompanied by a milky discharge from the inflamed eyes. Animals may demonstrate mild lethargy and have an elevated body temperature. Death occurs within 48 hours in a large percentage of animals. Rabbits that survive become progressively depressed, with an edematous face, rough haircoats, and potential cutaneous hemorrhages. At

this stage, animals are anorectic and dehydrated. Lesions can either regress during a one to three month period or develop into skin tumors that may rupture and suppurate. In chronic cases, the disease can be complicated by pasteurellosis.

No known treatment for patients with infectious myxomatosis is available in the United States. The virus is not zoonotic. The disease can be prevented by insect control and by screening outdoor hutches. Infectious myxomatosis is primarily found on the West Coast in the United States and is not a common problem in pet rabbits.

BACTERIAL DISEASES

Pasteurella Multocida (Snuffles)

Pasteurella multocida (snuffles) is a common, enzootic, contagious disease commonly found in domesticated rabbits. Several serotypes of this bacteria, with varying virulence, have been found in rabbits. The bacteria tend to live in the nares or sinuses but may be found in any organ of the body. Asymptomatic carriers of *Pasteurella* are common in rabbit colonies. Any of the following signs can be exhibited clinically: nasal discharge, pneumonia, otitis media (or wry neck caused by *Pasteurella* or *Staphylococcus* infection), conjunctivitis, abscesses, genital infections, or septicemia. Environmental stressors (e.g., high concentrations of ammonia in the air, poor sanitation, and high-protein diets) contribute to the development of clinical pasteurellosis. Some rabbits (usually old animals) may develop immunity after being infected and become asymptomatic carriers.

Transmissions between rabbits occurs via direct contact, fomites, and airborne spread. Animals can be tested by taking a deep nasal swab and growing the organism on culture. Most laboratories only perform cultures for *Pasteurella* species; however, serologic testing is also available. An ELISA test designed to detect antibodies to *Pasteurella* is available for whole blood analysis through the Oregon State University Rabbit Research Center. A microagglutination test that requires one

milliliter of serum is also available through the Texas Veterinary Medical laboratory in Amarillo, Texas. Currently, most veterinarians only perform culture for diagnosis of pasteurellosis.

Antibiotics may provide temporary remission of clinical signs, but the next period of stress may cause a relapse. Some patients that are treated may not have another recurrence of the disease; however, they can never be completely cured and subsequently become carriers. Antibiotics used to treat rabbits with *Pasteurella* infections include trimethoprim-sulfa or enrofloxacin; drug therapy should be conducted for a minimum of three weeks. Tilmicosin phosphate, an antibiotic used to treat *Pasteurella* in cattle, has recently been used in rabbits. The agent, however, is not approved for use in rabbits and fatal consequences may occur if the drug is overdosed. If tilmicosin phosphate is used, all other medication should be discontinued for one week before treatment, the rabbit should be hospitalized for 15 minutes after the injection, owners should not be permitted to give the drug, and a release form should be signed by the owner.

A follow-up culture after antibiotic treatment is important, and any abscess should be drained and cleaned. Isolation of the affected animal is also important. No effective preventive vaccine or treatment is available; therefore, purchasing animals from breeding stock that is free of *Pasteurella* and culling infected animals are the best methods of control. Although transmission to humans is extremely unlikely, *Pasteurella* can cause skin infections, arthritis, meningitis, peritonitis, pneumonia, and septicemia in susceptible individuals.

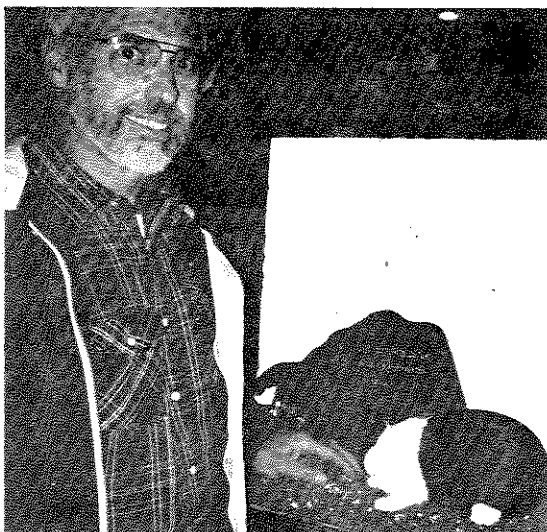

RABBIT TATTOOING

There is always a place to start any project. With tattooing, the first thing to collect is the equipment for the job. A sturdy work area of the proper height in a quiet area with enough room storage is very helpful.

Use a tattoo kit of appropriate size for the breed to be marked. Use fresh tattoo ink, which is a matter of preference; roll on paste, commercial tattoo ink or India ink with a dropper cap all work well. Paper towels, handi wipes or an old soft cloth are good for cleans ups. Use hydrogen peroxide for cleaning older ears. You also need alcohol, (alcohol will burn fresh punctures), Q-tips for inking, Vaseline for sealing and a tattoo box or slick surface on which to place the animal. An additional set of hands can help restrain, and help log which number went to which offspring on to a clip board or notebook.

Establish a number/lettering system before you get started. Most exhibitors' animals can be determined by a letter followed by numbers, or numbers then a letter or sequence that may even indicate sex or parentage. A person might use their last name's beginning letter or a rabbit designation preceded or followed by numbers, sometimes using odd numbers for bucks and even numbers for does.

It is best to tattoo young, around three months, so that the mark can grow with the ear. Tattoo well enough in advance of

a show so that the ear is healed, and the rabbit will perform better.

Once the stock is checked over for eliminations and disqualifications, and you have selected the ones you will tattoo, you are ready to start. Set up your pliers with the number/letter combination you intend to use. Record the ear number, sire, dam and date of birth. If you are new to all this, tattoo a cull rabbit first. Place the rabbit in a tattoo box which has been adjusted as snugly as possible for the size of the animal you are working with. You want to flatten the rabbit out as much as the depth of the rib cage will allow. Make sure to pull both ears through the opening having the left ear toward you, (the right ear is reserved for registration). If a box is not available, in my opinion, a slick surface works better than towel wraps which can loosen. Simple towels can still allow the rabbit to flinch enough to break its back, scratch or possibly tear an ear.

With the rabbit confined, prepare the tattoo site. Clean older animal's ears with peroxide. Young ones usually don't have filmy wax build up yet. Don't use handi wipes to clean inside—they contain enough lotion to displace tattoo ink. Ice may be applied to the back of the ear, even using a local anesthetic. Cetacain can help you more than it really does the rabbit. Look for veins which run through the ears, and find an area close enough to the head, yet not over a vein to tattoo into. Location of a tattoo is a matter of your

preference, but a mark is harder to see by chance when located closer to the head. In English Lops and other rabbits whose ears may be more closely examined, you may want to use the uppermost part of the ear close to the head where the cartilage is thicker. I have used it and found no resistance from a free standing Californian, Dutch or English Spot.

If tattooing with a plier-type clamp, locate your destination and flatten the ear across the flat/backing of the clamp. Squeeze the pliers together hard and let go quickly. You want to go all but through to allow for more ink space. This is especially true for colored ears, as they tend to need more ink. Work the ink into the fresh punctures with a Q-Tip, your thumb or a small stiff brush (old toothbrush). Tattoo needles work well, without quite the investment. Electric tattoo needles work well once you master them.

Some clean the excess, some do not before applying a thin layer of Vaseline to seal the surface. I have found that the Vaseline lip balm works well. You just squeeze it a dab out and rub it in. If you have a supply of antibiotic salves, one with a base similar to Vaseline, it will seal and aid in the healing process.

Your confidence in handling the rabbit is the best insurance of a job well done.

SUMMER'S WRATH

MJ(Marti Dill)

In the last issue of the DUTCH REPORTER we talked about the HEAT. All of the articles centered around keeping animals cool and comfortable. It is now Fall and our weather is beginning to cool but the effects from summer's heat can be seen in many of our barns.

Summer sterility in older bucks is one condition that seasoned breeders expect following a hot summer. Bucks over a year of age and temperatures of over 80 degrees for several days almost always means a buck who can not produce offspring for two to three months following extreme hot weather. It is always wise to keep a buck born during the first few months of the year to use as a herd buck in the Fall.

Other conditions found due to heat are cow hocks. Dutch are notorious for having tendencies toward cow hocks but if you cull religiously for straight hind legs you may still have cow hocked summer babies. Kits who get hot in the nest box crawl out earlier than normal to cool themselves. Fat bodied kits, full with mothers rich milk, and bones which are still soft and forming soon spread (spraddle) under their body weight. During the summer months we place a piece of pegboard on the cage floor, allowing the kits to climb atop. It gives them better ventilation than in the nest box as well as extra support to fragile legs. Sometimes it works, sometimes it doesn't and then culling becomes our only choice.

Slow growth can be a very frustrating problem. Just like humans, when it's hot, food is not appetizing. Feeding becomes a challenge. Normally pellets, water and possibly something to topdress with (oats, sunflowers, Doc's, etc.) are sufficient for normal growth. But in extreme heat getting

young stock to eat can be difficult. The does may not have fed the kits like usual due to their discomfort. After an early departure from the nest box, pellets may not be eaten by the kit in sufficient quantities to provide the necessary nutrition for good growth. Even those eating pellets eat one quarter and drop three quarters. Calf Manna can be helpful during this period but may cause difficulties later. Calf Manna is a calf milk replacer and smells like licorice. Rabbits LOVE IT, so much so they will refuse to eat other food. Simply open the sack containing Calf Manna and the barn goes wild with anticipation. A trick from years ago was passed on by Rick Billups, and his brother Rock, of feeding Bananas to encourage weight gain. As an end to all of this effort, there will be rabbits who will never reach senior weight due to summer heat. Again culling becomes our only choice.

Malocclusion is NOT a trait common to Dutch rabbits. Unfortunately when extreme heat continues during the summer months, kits often breath

through their mouth in an effort to feel cooler. Again the teeth are soft, not formed yet and the sucking in of air can deform the teeth. Remember they have very little ear space to cool themselves. Crowded nest boxes seem to produce more bad teeth. We never see malocclusion in winter months but unfortunately summer's extreme heat brings numerous problems.

Lack of fur density is a concern at any time of the year but is worse in the summer. Summer born juniors have difficulty going through a complete molt, trying to achieve that first adult coat. These animals tend to molt in patches rather than a normal shedding pattern.

While cooler in our barns, summer's extreme heat is there it remind us of the problems it can and does cause all rabbit breeders.
