Here is a hint for the Dutch Reporter. Will one of your successful members write an article on "How to Feed Dutch"? Dutch want to be plump, and yet to be only 4½ to 5 lbs. In show reports, one often sees "Needs more flesh", "Getting over weight". Perhaps the writer would state what foods -- maybe pellets -- crushed oats -- wheat -- barley -- toasted bread, etc. May he say weights of each, not handfuls, as handfuls vary. He might say -- 4 ozs. to be divided to so many adults.

I think such an article would be useful to many breeders. I have had my last lot of Dutch over 20 years, but my fault is too generous feeding.

I have not done so much breeding this season, but have had one or two satisfactory ones, and they should tend to improve my strain.

Must keep my numbers down, for I am now in my 85th. yr. and do the work, including the gathering of wild green food myself.

We Dutch Breeders did it again! The largest entry in the State Fair here. 1789 entries from 9 states over 8 states last year. Last year's entry was 1642. There were 336 Dutch of all colors and classes exhibiting. 96 exhibitors of which 26 were Colorado 4-H.

Orlan Onkst of Lincoln Acres was one judge. Pete Leeuwenberg filled in for Benny Hill who received a long awaited promotion and had his vacation cancelled. We are grateful to Pete and rejoice with Benny over his promotion.

One of my pupils won Best of Breed and he has worked hard thru the years, so I rejoice with Gerald Vaught of Pueblo.

This is the first year our State Fair Commission has given trophies for Best of Breeds. They also printed our catalog for us. We have always had to solicit ads before. The payback was as usual the best in America. One young girl, Linda Kay Zuidema won \$33.60 (Dutch Fur) besides her money on her Dutch first and Best of Breed. She comes from Arizona with the Parks.

I spent two days getting the names of the new exhibitors, getting acquainted and renewing old friendships. I received a ride out in a Press Car and was asked to go again on Tuesday, but was unable to go. I spent will over an hour going over the show and answering questions for the Press.

Out of 17 Dutch I had 9 wins. Probably would have had more but the drought here broke with several heavy rains, dropping the temperature 20 to 30 degrees and you know what that does to the coat of a rabbit. For the first time in 22 years I lost money on my entry fee -- \$1.27, but they fed them all week so I guess I didn't really lose

except for a Blue doe which was stolen -- ear. number DIC67. They must have gotten her either outside the show room or here while we took our young grandson to start him home. Every hutch was full and that evening I found the door pushed up across the top and open.

Bill Summers won the trophy for Best Polish.

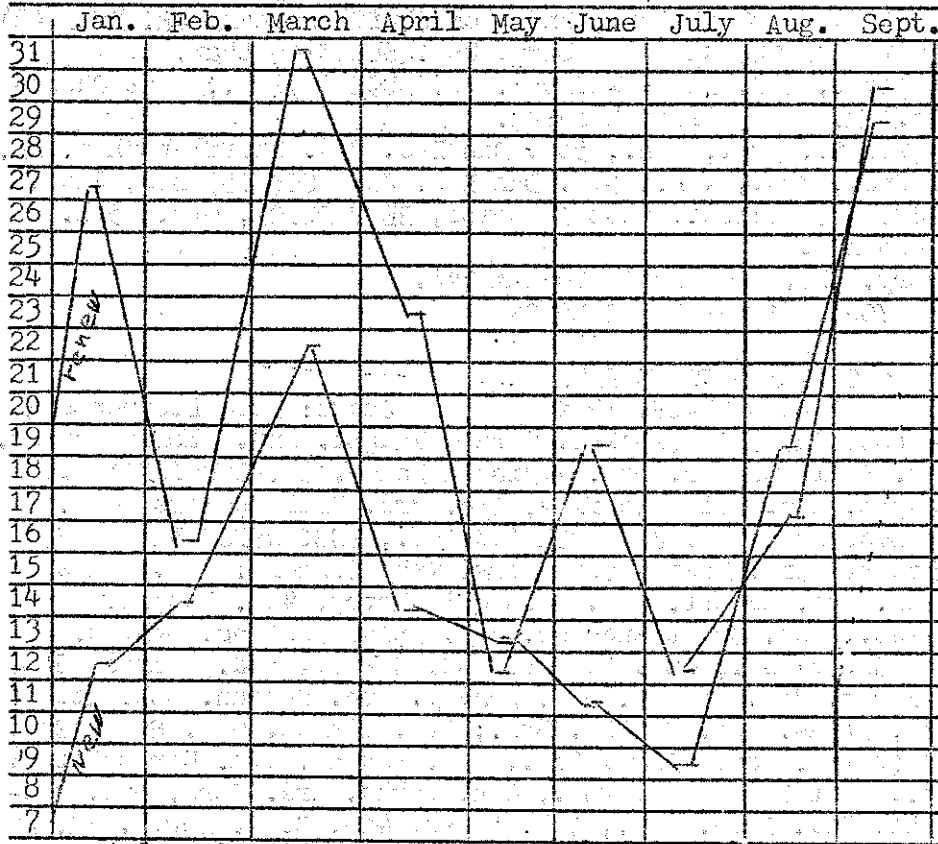
