





A. Rabbit Redux!

Hats off to Bugs Bunny, and have a carrot on us!

In celebration of National Rabbit Week, bunny lovers all over America will be taking a rabbit home to dinner, either as a companion or the main course.

National Rabbit Week promoters Camille and Lucille Blanchette of 89 Yankee Division Highway, Peabody, have bred rabbits for 20 years. Their son Roland now runs Roland's Hilltop Rabbitry off Route 128 in Peabody.

According to the Blanchettes, National Rabbit Week runs from July 17 through the 23rd.

"Not too many people seem to know about it around here," Mrs. Blanchette said, "but out West they have big shindigs, with dancing and everything."

Although there are over 300 kinds of rabbits, the Blanchettes specialize in raising New Zealand, Siamese, Dutch and satin rabbits.

"We have 217 besides the ones that are expecting," Mrs. Blanchette said. "We have 101 New Zealand whites, five New Zealand blacks, one black satin, 23 New Zealand reds, two grays and two Siamese satins and 39 Dutch."

The Blanchettes have a plastic sewing box filled with ribbons from prizes they've won for their show rabbits. Last year they received 20 first prize ribbons, "18 with ribbons and money according to Camille Blanchette.

"We follow all the shows and entered 13 last year," Mrs. Blanchette said, running her hands through the Best of Breed ribbons.

The Blanchettes are members of the New England New Zealand Rabbit Breeders Association, Essex County Rabbit Breeders, the American Rabbit Breeders Association, the American Federation of New Zealand Rabbits Breeders, the New England Dutch Rabbit Club and the American Dutch Rabbit Club.

The title 'Dutch' signifies a multi-colored rabbit, half white and half black. 'Blue Dutch' means that the rabbit is half gray and half white. 'Chocolate Dutch' is a brown and white rabbit.



BUNNY A LA CARTE

The Blanchettes treat their rabbits more or less as potential dinners.

"Rabbit is delicious," Mrs. Blanchette said, holding out a plate of rabbit chops that looked like a cross between chicken breasts and veal. "You can Shake N' Bake it or just put it in the oven to roast, or bake it in wine. Rabbit meat is 85 per cent protein, the bones are small and tender and there's less cholesterol."

Rabbits have a four or five year life span, and Mrs. Blanchette's husband chuckled, "Just don't eat 'em when they're on crutches."

Because they have so many rabbits, the Blanchettes feed them "rabbit pellets and a little hay" rather than lettuce and carrots.

"It's more sanitary not to feed them greens," Blanchette commented.

"And rabbits should never, never eat cabbage," Mrs. Blanchette interjected vehemently. "It bloats them all up and they die."

If a rabbit is bought to be a pet, it can be trained to live indoors just like a cat or dog.

"You can train them to go in a kitty litter box. Rabbits always pick one corner to mess in, and when he goes in the first place he finds in the house, that's where you put the box," Blanchette said. "You can put them on a leash or dress them up. One lady brings her rabbit to shows in a baby carriage."

The female rabbit has a 30-day gestation period, bearing

on the average eight bunnies per litter. Prior to giving birth, the female rabbit will pull out bits of her fur to make an angora nest for her young.

The Blanchette rabbitry sits on a hill, upwind about 100 yards from the house. The cages are all homemade and are guarded by the Blanchettes' German shepherd, Sarge, who frightens away prowling animals from the surrounding woods but who has been known to nuzzle baby rabbits with altruistic affection.

GRUNTS & DEWLAPS

Although rabbits are virtually noiseless, a large Dutch buck emitted a throaty grunt when approached and skittered to the back of his cage, brown eyes blinking nervously.

"Dutch rabbits aren't supposed to have pink eyes," Blanchette said.

A prize-winning black satin rabbit crouched in his cage with an enormous double chin bagging below his twitching whiskers.

"That fold of skin is called a dewlap," Blanchette said.

Producing a crate from the back of a plump, white doe's cage, Mrs. Blanchette pulled aside the downy shreds of fur to expose a placid tangle of bunnies a few days old, curled upon each other like hamsters.

"Never pick a rabbit up by the ears," Blanchette said. "Their ears are long enough — why stretch them?"

The Blanchettes are avid members of the Essex County Rabbit Breeders Association, which meets monthly at Essex Aggie. Although the club currently has about 40 members, it always welcomes new members to the fold, or warren, as the case may be.

The Blanchette rabbitry is not yet a full-time business. Its actual proprietor, Roland Blanchette, works at Honeywell and works at his rabbitry before and after work. When the male Blanchette is at work at Lynn General Electric, Mrs. Blanchette takes over sales.

"A lot of our rabbits are champions, you know, pedigrees," she said. "We keep track of every birth and have papers on them."

As well as keeping records on file, the Blanchettes also tattoo the inner ear of the rabbit with a numerical code designating the rabbit's pedigree.

"Raising rabbits is a great hobby for someone who is elderly or handicapped," Mrs. Blanchette pointed out. "They aren't much trouble to keep and it's interesting when you get
