

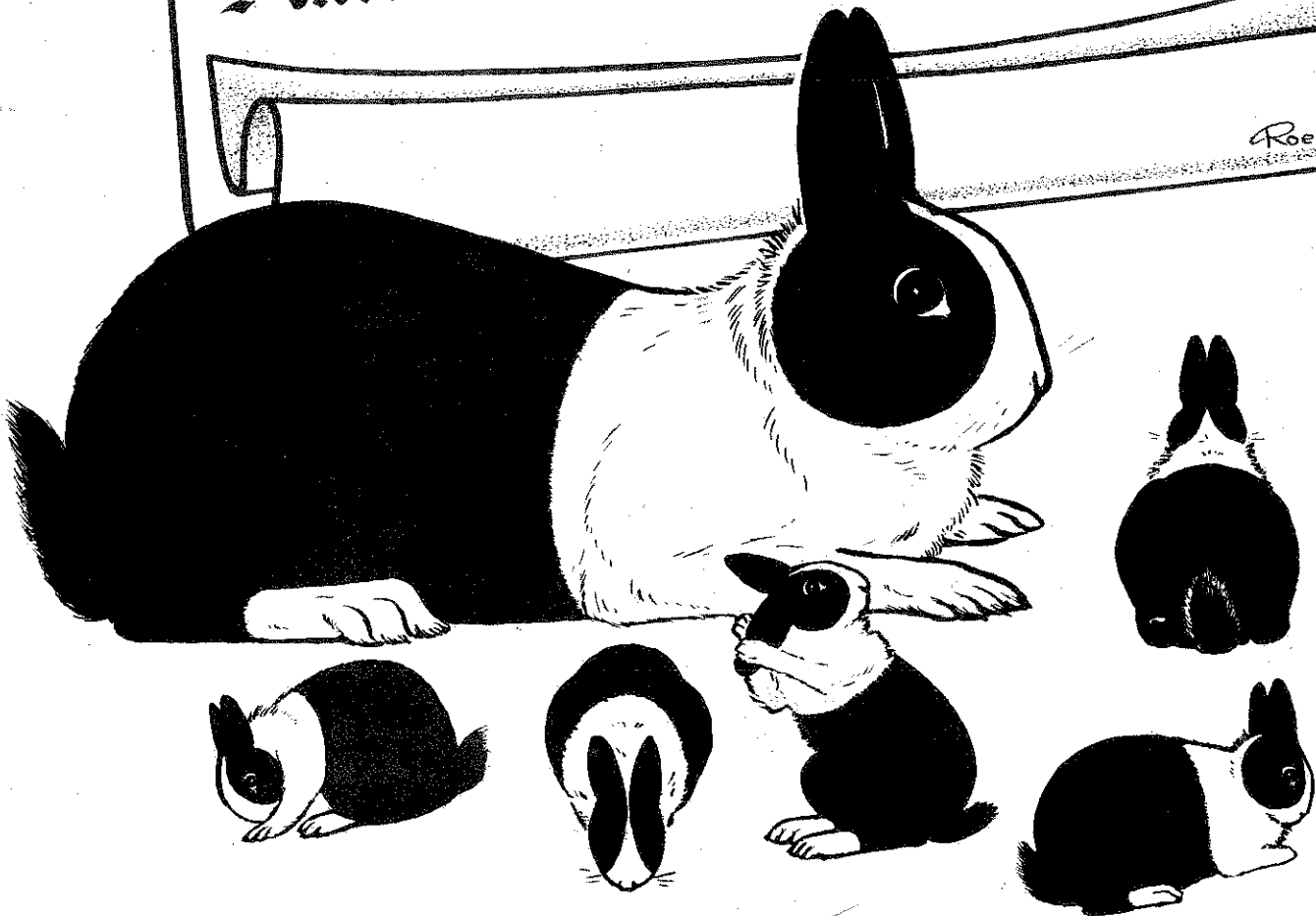

We have been informed by those in charge of the National Dutch Show that they have been unable to arrange the date for the show due to the Indiana State Fair and their inability to meet the Fair Board at this time, but we will have this for you in the next issue of the Reporter. In regards to your selection of judges we are listing the votes of the 10 high which were as follows; R. J. Bernhardt 40, R. L. Souers 38, James Blyth 15, Lester C. Wells 15, Karl Sautters 12, E. J. Slater 8 John Furrer 6, Carlton Gaddis 5, Ancel R. Beaver 5 and Vern Ashton 4. 25 other judges received from one to three votes.

I want to take this opportunity in behalf of Mr. Bernhardt and myself to thank the members for their confidence in our ability as a Dutch judge and hope that after the show is over we will have proven ourselves worthy of your confidence.

In 1949 our Standard on the Dutch rabbit comes up for approval as it now stands or as it is changed. Personally we believe there are some minor changes that should be made and it is not too early to start thinking about it and having discussions on the different changes proposed. We are listing a few for your consideration and would like for you to give them some thought and then write us and let us know your opinion. Remember that any changes that are made should be made for the betterment of the rabbit and not just for personal reasons.

Do you think the spread on senior weight from 3 to 5 $\frac{1}{2}$  pounds is out of line? Do you think there should be a difference in senior weight on bucks and does? Do you think that a description on the various colors of the A.O.C. Class should be given? Do you think that the word ideal should be used in connection with weight and ear length? What is your opinion? Let us hear from you.

## "NATIONAL CONVENTION NEWS"

Texas fall shows really get into full swing with the Gulf Coast Rabbit Club of Beaumont, Texas opening the fall shows with a real Dutch Show. This show will be held October 21 thru 24 - 1948. Secretary of the Dutch Club R. L. Souers will place the awards for the Dutch. You can be assured of real competition at this show as the Houston Rabbit Club had a table show in June with 55 head of Dutch shown and believe me there were some real one to look at in all colors.

The Texas show at Beaumont has one of the best display buildings in the country. The coops are well spaced and your animals will not be bitten by the animal in the next coop. Plan to attend this show in person.

Judging will start Saturday morning October 23rd at 9 O'clock. After the Dutch show ends on the 24th the other breeds will go on exhibit. 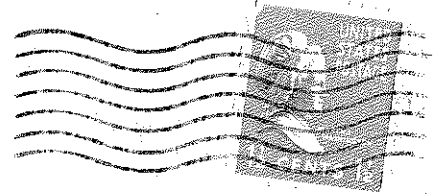
