

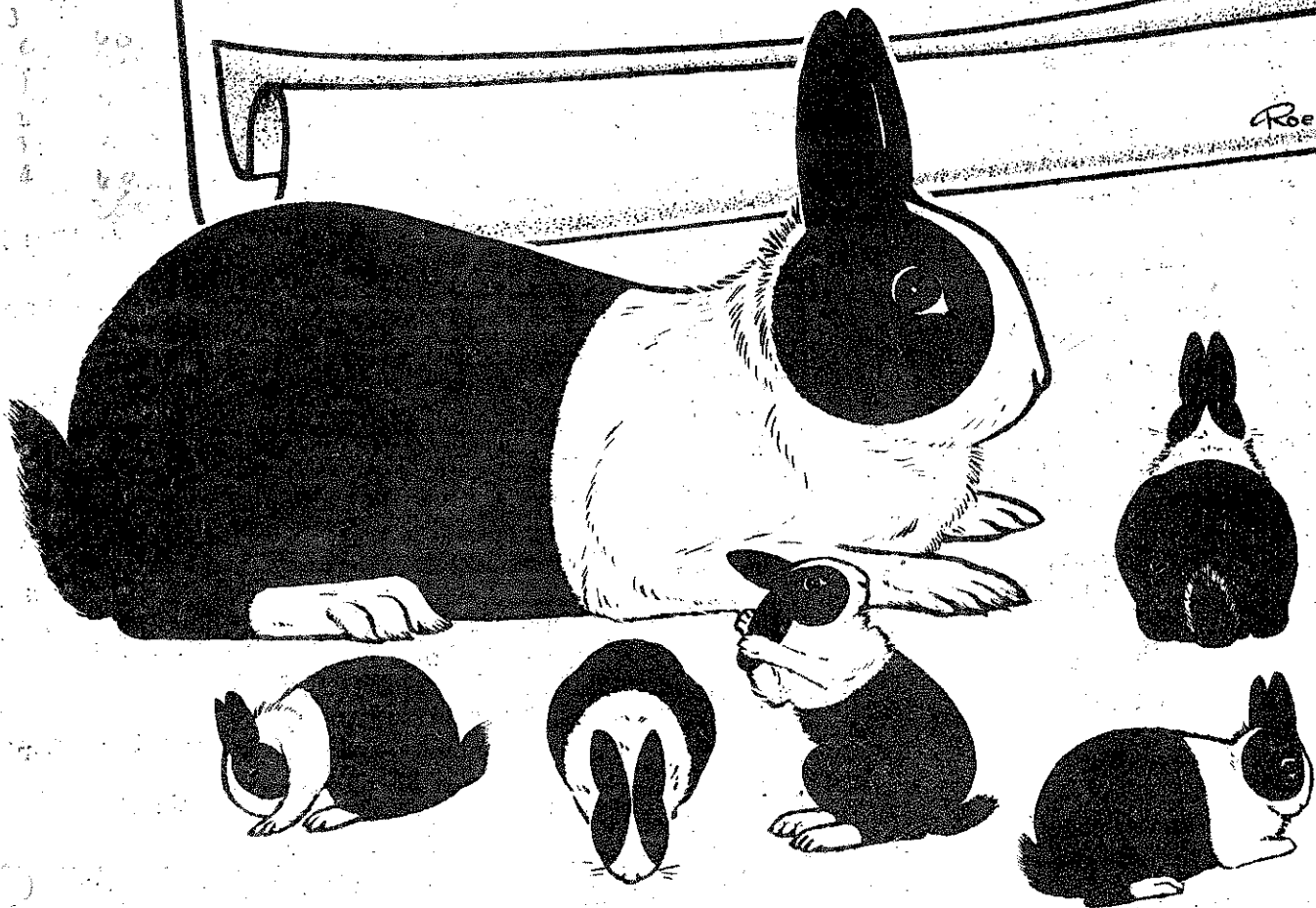

DIRECTOR'S PAGE

Having received notice from our Secretary that I was expected to
contribute an article for the September issue of the Reporter leaves
me at a loss as to just what should be or not be written.

With only eight years of breeding experience behind me I am not
qualified to take type or color and try and tell you just what we
expect in a good rabbit. The gentlemen who compiled our Standard left
little doubt in my mind as to what they wanted in type, but they sure
threw us a curve on color. As time goes on I think that some changes
will be made to clarify this, but I am not one to propose them.

As a Specialty Club, I think we have lost more ground in the last
three years than any club has lost in a like period of time. In my
estimation, the underlying cause of this is the continual bickering
over standard changes. We have nothing to offer a beginner except
doubt and disillusionment; and have discouraged many breeders whose
liking for the Dutch was overcome by the same doubt as to just what
goal he was breeding for. There has been much agitation in the past
few years for a radical change. It will not be consummated because
the solid breeders of Dutch, the ones not trying to utilize the breed
for self gain, are carrying on and breeding as near as possible to
the standard set up for them.

On the Pacific coast we have had little dissension over the
standard. A few years ago one of our breeders introduced the Polish
type, but with little success, for our judges continued placing them
with the guide book open before them. On the other hand, we have had

 Standard changes should put a stop to such nonsense.

We now have a fine Standard, why not leave it as it now stands?

Dutch are now a very popular Show Rabbit, also they do OK in pro-
 ducing meat from the culls, which a smaller Dutch would not do.

Many of us have to make our hobby at least pay for itself.

The Polish Rabbit is a Toy Rabbit, but do you see many at the shows?
 Does it have a large national following or Club?

Also, any changes in our present Standard should be made by Popular
 Vote, not by two or three members at the Convention, as everybody
 interested cannot be present.

Well, that is about all for now, and I am sure glad we have a
 Director such as Mr. Charles Pine in our Club and suggest that we
 follow his very good advice and have a little Tolerance; also leave
 our present Standard as it is.

PUBLICITY REPORT

S. T. Wheelus, Sr.

The month of August is gone and before we know it Convention time will be here. Now, from all reports up to the present, the interest in Dutch has declined rather than increased as it should. Cash Specials and Trophies are below normal and I have received only two ads outside of the Atlanta area to help toward paying for the Club's ad in the Convention catalog. WHY?

I'm going to give the reasons I believe are responsible for this lack of interest.

(1) First and of most importance, the old breeders are not doing everything they could. My opinion is that the older breeders of any club should be the leaders and should always be out in front to show the way especially to the new breeders of Dutch. I feel that if each officer had contacted at least 3 other members of our club we could have had many more specials for the Convention and also ads for the Convention catalog.

(2) Next in importance is this continuous bickering in regards to the Standard. I know that this has lost as many or more members than any other thing, this I can prove. I think I will be safe in saying that if an actuate poll was taken of all breeders of Dutch we would find that the weights our present Standard calls for would be 2 to 1

over the toy type Dutch. I have been in attendance at two Convention shows and there has been more confusion at the Dutch judging table than all other breeds put together; this is not good for the Dutch rabbit nor our Club. Some of the newer breeders of Dutch will wonder why. The answer is very simple - because it is due entirely to a few, and, mind you, I say a few, who insist on raising Dutch not entirely according to our Standard adopted by the membership but raising them according to their personal likes and dislikes, (the so-called toy type). Therefore, if the judge places one that is nearer the Standard but larger than the toy type, those breeders put up a howl and give the judge h'll. I will grant you that this happens in reverse but the difference, as I see it, is that in this case the breeder has more reason to howl. I firmly believe that, until such time as these members make up their minds that they cannot take over a Club such as we have and run it to suit only a few, the Club will remain at a standstill.

(3) You hear this breeder say that judge so-and-so is judging that show and he only likes the small type Dutch or he likes only those that are too big. Again, we cannot place the entire blame on the judge, for, after all, he is only human. The only way to have uniform judging is to breed according to our Standard which the majority of the members feel is good enough for, if they had thought otherwise, they would not have voted for it.

We are getting back where we were about 3 years ago by reviving the issue of weights called for in our Standard. If those that like the 3 1/2 lb. Dutch want to raise them, then by all means do so - but be good enough sports to take a beating on the judging table when they are beaten by one nearer the Standard. I personally believe that the Standard should be left as the majority want it.

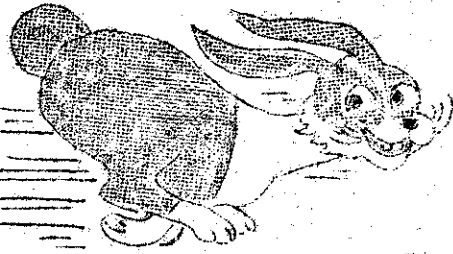
I hope that each and every member will forget their personal likes and dislikes and work toward the goal of success, MORE AND BETTER DUTCH. We all believe that we have AMERICA'S FINEST RABBIT and THAT YOU CAN'T BEAT THE DUTCH. Then, I think we should make every effort to prove to the breeders of the world that the above is true and that the Dutch breeders CAN'T BE BEAT WHEN IT COMES TO SPORTSMANSHIP.

The above might not be classed as a Publicity Report but I feel that, if we are to get the right kind of publicity, we must get on the ball and work as a team. For, no matter how much good publicity you get, it only takes a little of the bad to ruin it all. I know that all will not agree with me; but, if the majority do, then I will not feel bad. 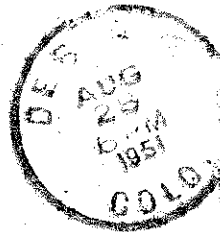
