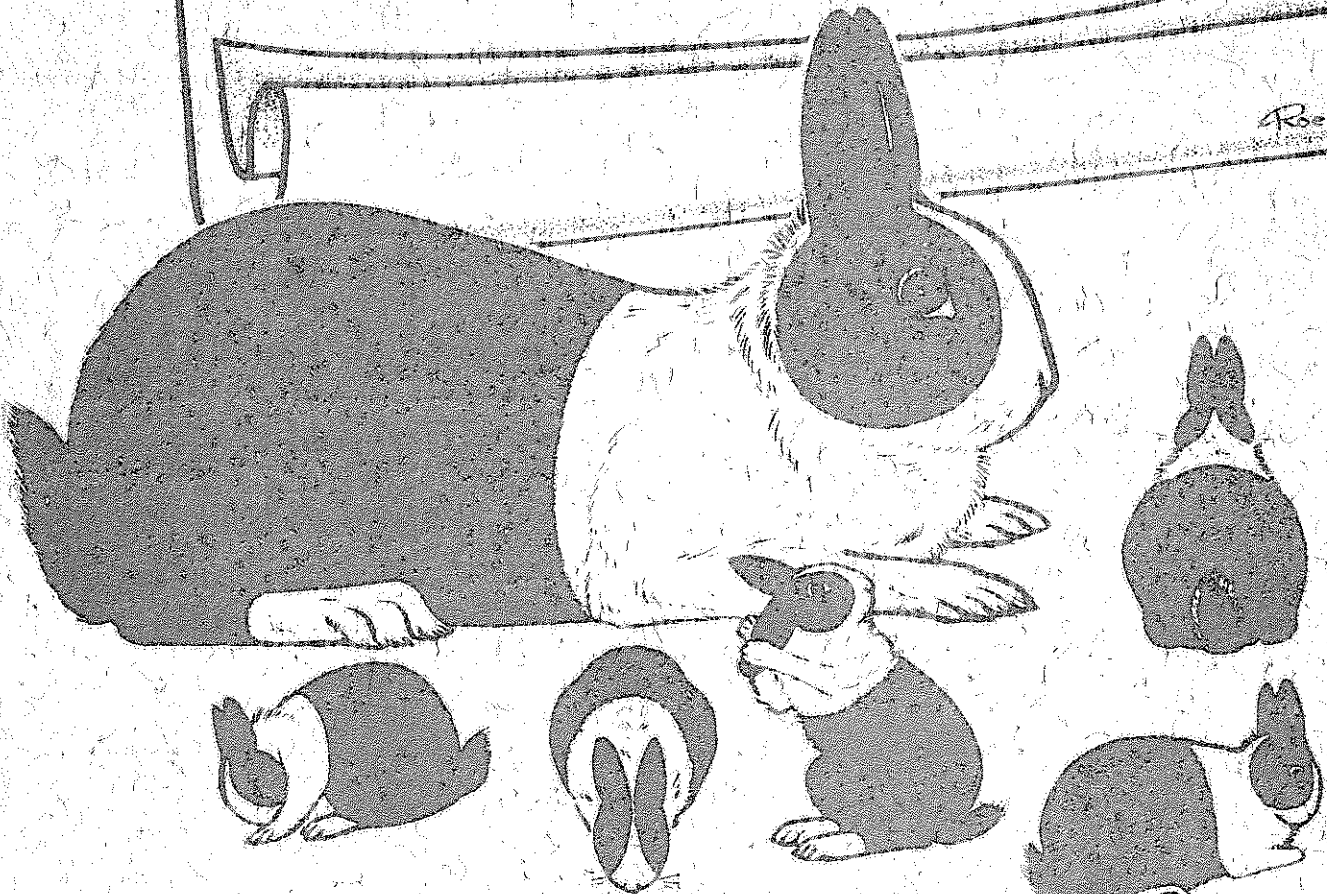

MORE ABOUT THE DUTCH JUNIOR DEPARTMENT

You have read several fine articles and letters regarding our Dutch Junior Department published in the past few issues of the Dutch Reporter. These articles were not edited, nor deleted in any way, in order that those interested might have an opportunity to present their thoughts on the subject of imposing the pending rules for future Dutch Junior Department shows.

Please bear in mind that we have SO FAR set up for our By-Laws "that there shall be a Junior Department show in all future National Dutch Shows." There has not been any provision made for any Dutch Junior Department shows in local shows, and no provision has been made for sponsoring any education for Dutch Junior Department members. I, personally, had hopes of seeing this dream come true; so far it is still a dream.

I would like to add my own personal opinion on the Dutch Junior Department rules to those who have so generously taken their time to submit food for thought on the subject.

With apologies to Mr. Hord, I would like to say if we prohibit the youngster from showing in both the Open Classes and the Junior Department at the same show for the reason he gives, namely: - "sticking the Judges necks out a long ways" - and "confusing the exhibitors" - then I will have to refer to Mr. Boroff's comment in the August issue of the D. R. "Why do we have standards if the Judges do not use them", and go a bit farther, and say "Why do we have to have Judges that do not judge by the Standards? ? ?". It is very true that "Classes change". For this very reason, many exhibitors are disappointed when their "top" rabbit places Best of Breed in two or three shows in a row, and WHAM - the next show the rabbit is third or fourth in the Class, and sometimes does not even place. HOWEVER, I must insist that "A CERTAIN RABBIT'S REMARKS belong to and are the property of that certain rabbit; and regardless of how many shows, and how many, or who, judges them (with the exception of Fur and Body Condition, changing, which we all understand, and for this comparison we must assume the body and fur condition remains constant) the remarks from the Judge should be very similar. Furthermore, I believe they will be found to be similar if the said judges know the Standard, and they keep wide awake at the time they are giving remarks. Right here, I would like to put in a good word for our ARBA Judges. Very few exhibitors expect our Judges to be perfect. The "human element" prevents their being perfect. However, ALL exhibitors expect the judges to know the rabbit standards and know where to find them. Most exhibitors are in accord with the Judge "going to his Guide Book" for confirmation of certain points he may not be sure of, when placing and judging a class. ALSO, we exhibitors have the right to expect our ARBA Judges to judge by the ARBA Standards, and I am sure our Judges are for the most part conscientious enough, and proud enough of their work to WANT to do just this. I have noted of late there are more and more discussions (friendly ones, to be sure) after the judging between Judge and exhibitor. A progressive Judge appreciates constructive criticism given in a kind, gentlemanly or lady-like manner. He is also willing to explain "the why and wherefore" in many instances, just for the asking. I think all of us, Judge and exhibitor, could do with an occasional "briefing" on our rabbit standards - and this includes myself. I am astray from the subject, and I hope I may be forgiven, however, I do not like complete crucifixion of our Judges, - altho I will admit I do not always agree 100% with 100% of the judges.

Now if we prohibit the Junior Breeders from exhibiting in both Departments at the same show, under two different judges - for the reason the remarks "may confuse the exhibitors" - then we may as well impose a rule "prohibiting the Junior Breeder FROM EVER SHOWING THE SAME RABBIT UNDER ANOTHER JUDGE" - whether it is the same show or a future dated show, had we not? ? ? You can rest assured those cards will be pulled out and compared by the majority of the exhibitors.

As for entry fees, I believe Mr. Boroff has the right idea - that is to let the sponsoring Clubs decide whether or not there should be an entry fee. I am sure any Club willing to sponsor a Junior Show will do everything in their power to set up interesting Specials, or pay-back.

I agree with Mr. Hord that our Junior Breeders should be taught the value of Commercial production. And it is being done with Dutch, whether or not you do it;

our mismarks pay the freight in many instances, whether or not you have read or heard about it, this is true. Probably too little has been said about the meat-value of the Dutch in the Dutch Reporter; this can be explained by simple language; anyone can, and it is very easy to do, breed mismarked Dutch. The obligation of the American Dutch Rabbit Club is to educate the breeders in breeding Dutch to conform with the Standard of Perfection.

In closing, I would like to comment briefly on remarks passed on an interview with Judge Keith Forbush, of Dearborn, Michigan, Chairman of the ARBA Junior Department, on the subject.

Mr. Forbush pointed out that "the object is THE YOUNGSTER". He further commented that "too often the object, the youngster, was completely forgotten, or pushed into the background, and the material used for work (rabbits, cattle, poultry, etc.) was often thought of as the subject. He stated further that at all times we should remember the "objective is to make better future citizens for our country, by teaching our youngsters the value of friendship, through meeting in friendly competition those working on common projects, whether or not the competitors are the same age, or of different ages". "To give our youngsters some concept of monetary value by giving them some business experiences as youths, in preparation for adult living." Etc.

So, I would like to leave this thought, - In this project, let's keep the youngster in mind - FIRST, LAST, and ALWAYS. As far as our rules are concerned, they are not important, when compared to the youngster. We should have as few rules as possible. We should teach responsibility, honesty, and how to breed good DUTCH.

In meeting of the A.D.R.C. at York, Pa. a motion from the floor was supported and passed to check the ballots for President. A Committee composed of Messrs. Wm. G. Book, Russell Hall, Wm. Midd, G. C. Leisenring, Tom Shufflebotham, Wm. Stedman, and Mrs. Grables, (Mr. Blyth was excused to the pressing business of the A.R.R.A.* counted the ballots for President and found a tie vote existed, and this Committee recommended that a run-off election for office of President of the A.D.R.C. be held within 30 days of that date, October 24, 1954.

President George Blyth has directed me to notify the Board of Directors and the Nominees to the above effect, and to advise them that a run-off election for office of President will be held, and a run-off election for Director between Mr. Souers and Mr. Settle will also be held, on the same time; and that the vacancy of office of Director incurred by the death of Mr. Pine shall be filled by appointment by the incoming President of the A.D.R.C.

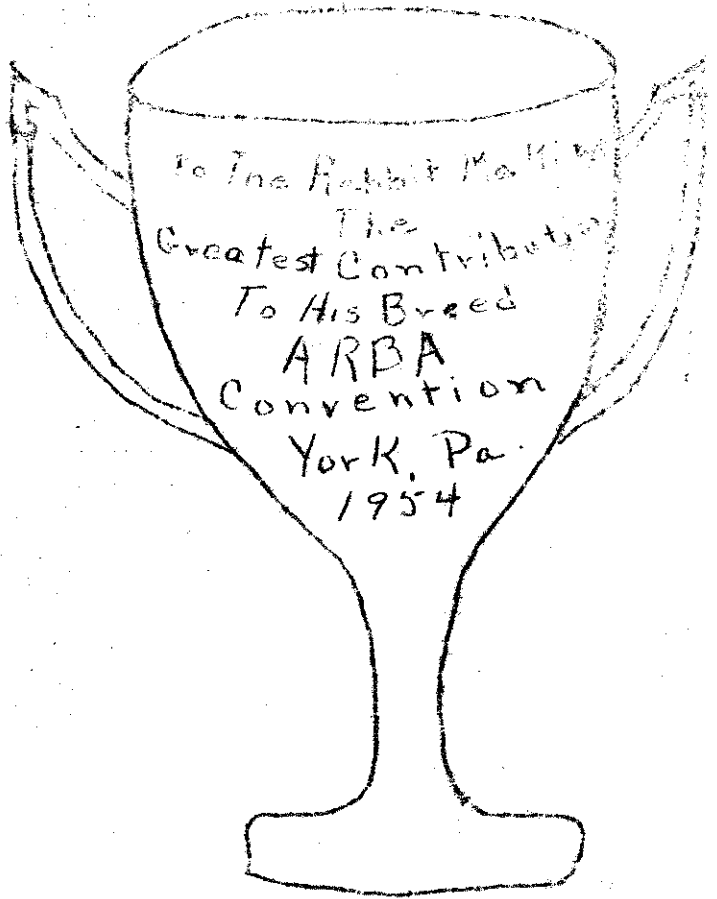
