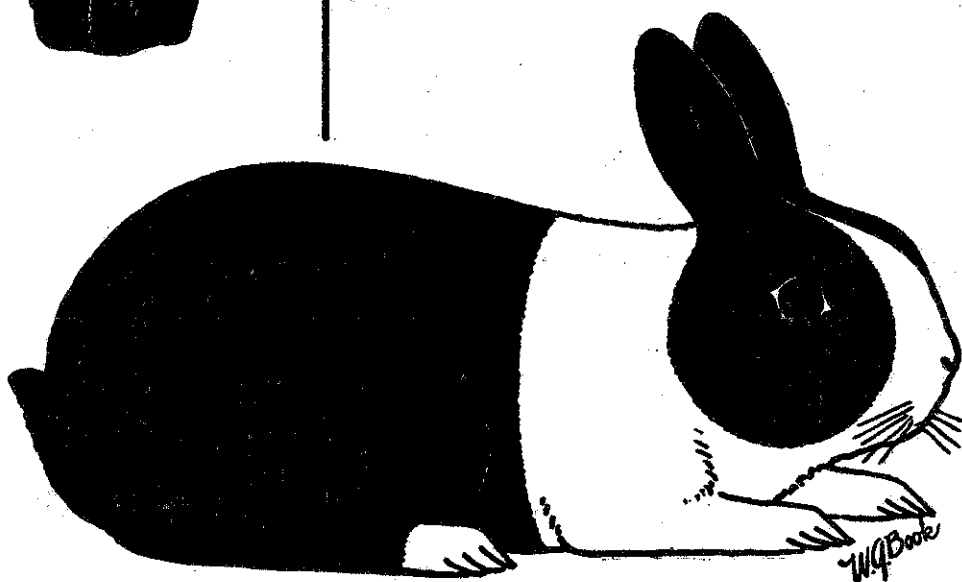

DUTCHING TIPS

No doubt as you read in a recent issue of the Dutch Reporter the account of the ADRC at the St. Paul Convention you were greatly interested in the report of the sessions devoted to discussion the the Gray Dutch. At this time I consider it timely to give my views on this matter.

To bring you to date on this issue, I should like to remind you that the Gray Dutch judged at St. Paul were disqualified by Judges Leisenring and Guthrie with the notation: "does not comply with the Standard of Perfection". This caused much furor among the Dutch Breeders and the members of the standard committee who were called in to the conference that took place immediately after the judging. While I did not agree with the REASON for the disqualification of the Gray Dutch, I was rather glad that the judges had the intestinal fortitude to disqualify the animals as I feel that it was time that the question be brought to a head. After all, the Convention should be the perfect place for such a discussion.

However, since the ADRC meeting in Norwalk in 1955, there has been much confusion among both breeders and judges as to what was wanted in the Gray Dutch. At that meeting I was practically the only one who voted against the proposed standard as I felt it could not be applied without disqualifying most of the Gray Dutch.

These were my arguments against it at that time and nothing has occurred since to change my attitude. I do not think that any dutch should be disqualified for having an undercut showing--rather I would have it, disqualify for no undercut. I think this point causes most of our confusion!

Study with me, our standard as printed in our own Guide Book. (Quote), "The undercut is the continuation of the saddle." Now is it not true that if you have no undercut, you can not have a complete saddle? Remember that we have allotted points for both saddle and undercut--it is my contention that if you eliminate any of the markings on dutch that you do not have a COMPLETE dutch!

We have an undercut on the Steel Dutch. Why? Because our standard calls for one, and they have been bred for many generations to comply with this portion of our standard. If we can get the undercut on the Steel Gray, we can get it on the Gray, if we only breed for it.

Let me illustrate my point: the Steel Gray Flenish calls for a white belly and it has one, because the standard calls for one. The standard for the Steel Gray Dutch calls for an undercut as near the color of the saddle as possible and we are getting them that way simply because the standard calls for it! I contend we can do the same with the Gray!

Reading again the report of the St. Paul Convention, you will note that it was suggested that we get an opinion of an expert in genetics on this question. At the ARBA meetings in the American Legion Hall, two such experts from the University of Minnesota showed some films on genetics and followed the showing with an open forum. In the films shown were some interesting experiments on color production - resulting

such fantastic conclusions as the production of green pigs! During the open forum I queried as to whether it would be possible to produce Gray Dutch with an undercut - "most certainly", was the emphatic reply.

Therefore, as long as we are breeding all other colored Dutch for such an undercut, why don't we follow to the natural conclusion? Write it in the Gray standard and breed them that way! We have been told by experts that we can do so. The standard of perfection is just a guide to a goal - to work to, to build to, something yet to be achieved.

As the matter now stands we are to devise a new standard on the Gray Dutch that is color only. This is everyone's business. Don't sit back and do nothing as we all did when the last standard was submitted. No suggestions were received by the standard committee from the breeders of Gray Dutch. Let us speak up before action is taken and not complain after. Having served on the standard committee I know full well what a thankless and tedious job it is.

The description of the Gray color is one hard to word so that it is meaningful to the breeders and judges. In my opinion again, there are too many grays to fit one standard. Flemish breeders have gone beyond and drawn standards on Sandy Gray, Gray and Light Gray: both British and Canadian clubs (Dutch, of course) have standards on both brown-gray and light gray. Perhaps our solution is to be found in like action - perhaps you feel you know how it could be wisely handled with the one standard.

Suppose you give this matter close attention and thought - and then write your suggestions and MAIL them to E. C. Bickley, who is chairman of our standard committee. (See pg. 1, under Directors, for address) I know that he will be only too glad to hear from you now - and not later!

IN ANSWER TO JOHN MELLOZZO'S ARTICLE RE: GRAY DUTCH

After reading John Mellozzo's article (August 1957 Dutch Reporter) there are several points on which I do not entirely agree.

Mr. Mellozzo, being a friend of mine (at least up until this time) and belonging to the same club, seems to see the Dutch picture in a different light than I do.

Of course everyone has a right to speak their mind as Mr. Mellozzo did, and that is exactly what I am about to do.

First of all, Mr. Mellozzo is condemning the judges for not placing Steel-Gray and Gray Dutch best of breed. This can cover a lot. This could lead to arguments and discussions that would never end. The way competition is today in our show rooms, the best way I might describe it is - 50 points on markings and 13 points on color.

I have raised Steel and Gray Dutch from time to time, and believe I know a little about them. However, I do know I can't breed Gray Dutch to meet the standard set up for them. I also do not confess to know as much about them as Mr. Mellozzo, who claims 18 years of breeding Gray Dutch.

I have always been under the impression that Gray Dutch do not have the contrast, more of a washed out effect, than the Black, Blue or Chocolate Dutch have. They do not have the outstanding appearance. On the other hand, I think a good color Steel Dutch is a very attractive animal. It has been my experience though, to have what I think is a good colored Steel, and showing it under six different judges, I will get six different remarks on color.

As for Gray Dutch, there is no good color, and there won't be until the standard is changed. Again, it is my opinion that there will be many different remarks on color.

On Black, Blue or Chocolate, the color is either there or it isn't. Perhaps that is why these three colors are the most popular ones.

I think all of this arguing about the Gray standard has hurt the Grays. If you recall, out of 289 Dutch at the 1956 ARBA Convention, there were only 15 Gray Dutch.

I believe as I read Mr. Mellozzo's article that type seems to be one of his pet peeves. I will grant you type is one of the most important things in any rabbit, but type alone won't win. We still have 50 points on markings, and only 15 points on type.

May I remind you that the American Dutch Rabbit Club is one of the largest Specialty Clubs in the ARBA. Why? Because we have a rabbit that is second to none. Here we have a rabbit that fits every fanciers needs. Here we have a rabbit with a variety of six different colors to choose from. We have a rabbit with a standard calling for 3½ to 5½ pounds, with an ideal weight of 4½ pounds. There are only three other breeds of rabbits that are approximately in this weight category.

The two pound spread is what makes our Dutch the popular rabbit that it is. This is the only breed that can lay claim to this. The membership does not have to be told that we have the best all around rabbit. Mr. Mellozzo says the Dutch should be small (3½ pounds) to have good type. As for ears, he states the shorter the better. Again, I disagree. A five pound rabbit with 2 ¾ inch ears would be out of proportion, as well as a 3½ pound rabbit with 3 ¾ inch ears. Regardless of size, whether 3½ or 5½ pounds, we could have a balanced rabbit.

Mr. Mellozzo goes on to say that the judge should not be allowed to judge breeds of rabbits unless he is raising them and knows them. We have over 50 breeds of rabbits, so that would mean that the judge would have to have at least 50 breeds, plus all of the varieties in his back yard. This I am afraid would keep the judge so busy he wouldn't be able to accept a judging assignment. Or perhaps he should keep two or three breeds, and if all judges settled for the same two or three breeds, what would happen to all the other breeds, exhibitors, etc.? I think most of our judges are fairly well qualified to handle most of the breeds assigned them at the various shows.

Mr. Mellozzo also states in his article that some parts of the Gray Dutch standard should be changed. I agree with Mr. Mellozzo on that point, and I think the standard should be changed to fit the present Gray Dutch before it becomes extinct. As I just mentioned the 1956 ARBA Convention brought out 289 Dutch, among which were only 15 Grays.

I noted Mr. Mellozzo's recipe for a Gray Dutch standard is what we now have, have had, and which has been causing all the confusion.

The only solution I can offer, if we want Gray Dutch, is to change the standard to fit the Gray Dutch we now have, or eliminate them completely.

There is one thing I think we should all keep in mind - before we admit any more colors into the Dutch fancy, and that is this, let's improve on what we now have.

Oh, yes, - BRASSY - as referred to in the Dutch Guide Book, means having a yellowish tinge or brass color - BUT in Webster's illustrated Dictionary, 1955 edition, the word "Brassy" is defined to mean "SOMETHING SHOWY BUT NOT OF HIGHEST GRADE"/

This is just to touch the subject lightly, and I am sure some of you other breeders out there will have something to add to this.

But We Try

QUESTION: Now, does your Club say there are TWO kinds of Dutch. A large type and a small type. All I have to go by is the ARBA weight standard. Most of the Dutch breeders here are getting their Dutch much larger than the standard and tell me that there is a large and small Dutch. One breeder even put a 4½ pound Dutch in the single fryer class in February this year and said it was under 59 days of age. I have never been able to get that weight on mine that fast, can you?

Frankly, I cannot see the Dutch as a commercial breed as it takes too long to produce a 3 ¾ pound fryer and your feed cost is too high for the breeder to break even. As I said before, they are a wonderful fancy. What does your Club recommend as the correct amount of feed per 24 hours for Dutch?

ANSWER: Tom Shufflebotham, Chrm. ARBC Educational Committee. First you asked if the Club has two kinds of Dutch - a large type and a small one. Confusion on this point has been brought about by many breeders calling their Dutch "toy type Dutch" and "small type Dutch". Let me state emphatically that there is only one type of Dutch - and that the one described in both the ARBA book of standards and our own Dutch Club Guide Book. You will note that the standard calls for an ideal weight of 4½ pounds, with maximum weight at 5½ and minimum at 3½ pounds. Any deviation from the ideal weight is a departure from the standard of perfection - whether it is above or below the ideal!

Secondly, we have never contended that the Dutch is a commercial breed, although there are many producers who use them on a large scale for meat production. I myself have found them very satisfactory in producing a dressed fryer of about 1½ pounds and find an eager market for them. Actually you can raise Dutch for the fryer market at less cost per pound than many of the larger breeds defined as commercial! Dutch make exceptionally fine mothers, raise a high percentage of the young kindles, are very hardy and stand extremes of temperature better than other breeds. They prove very easy keepers and if fed only pellets 4 ounces per day per animal is ample to keep it in good condition.

A question has just been put to me today, which it occurs to me may be bothering other members of the ADRC. The question was, "Why, when there were three names on the list of nominees for President of the ADRC, did we find only one name on our ballots?"

If you will consult your Dutch Guide Book, on pages 13-14, you will find the rules governing the procedure of nomination and election of officers. You will find that any member, having been in continuous good standing for at least two (2) years previous to October 20, of the election year, and receiving a minimum of ten (10) votes is eligible to have his name placed on the election ballot. The rules, under Article V - Section 2 - goes on to state that the Secretary-Treasurer shall ascertain if such persons will accept the nomination. There is no rule that says they may be drafted if they refuse to accept and at this time I have in my files letters from both Mr. Leisemring and Mr. Hickley, declining the nomination for President. This left me with no alternative but to send out the ballots with the one eligible name left as candidate for President. Likewise, under the nominations for Vice-President, there being only one candidate receiving sufficient votes to qualify as nominee for that office, there was only one name under Vice-President on your ballot.

I was very glad to have this question brought directly to me for clarification, rather than to find later that some of the members thought someone might be "pulling a fast one" and doing something unconstitutional. Believe me, the rules were given very careful study for weeks before this election and at any time I felt any doubt about whether I was doing what was right, they were referred to again and again.

Please, any of you, at any time there is any question as to what is going on in your club, lets continue to have this kind of cooperation and come to an understanding without hard feelings. Will do?
