

PUBLICITY NOTES

Virginia (Mrs. William) Pierce, of Pueblo, Colorado sends in a most interesting report of the Colorado State Fair and notes with glee that the Dutch were top entry at this fair show! She adds that from 60 adult exhibitors some 1,663 entries -- and you have to admit that this is quite a show!

Trophies won at the Fair Show were awarded at an annual Fried Rabbit Banquet. This banquet is also the scene of the annual crowning of Miss Colorado Rabbit Queen, who this year was 15 year old Miss Dianna Carlholm of Sterling. This selection of Miss Rabbit Queen has been an annual event since 1958 -- and it is noteworthy also that the first queen is now studying beterinarian medicine!

Mrs. Pierce also notes the improvement in the quality of stock shown by 4-H members and credits it in part to the presentation to the count agent of the Standard of Perfection of the ARBA. I join Mrs. Pierce in feeling that adult breeders must get behind this r-H movement if it is to be effective.

Bruce Nicholson, of Washington State, has sent copies of the special edition of the Washington Bunny News which was dedicated to Dutch. We commend the Washington breeders for their constructive interest in their fancy and commercial interests and we especially are pleased with the pamphlet "Raising Rabbits" which they furnish their members. This is true promotion!

I am revising the list of publicity and promotion committee members and it will appear at the end of this article. Letters are beginning to come in from some of the members and I gather that these committee members are talking up the ADRC to people in the highways and bi-ways. However, I must admit that in my experience, rabbit breeders are never at a loss for words when it comes to talking up their hobby -- and everywere I have seen rabbits someone is sure to take up the fight for out dear little Dutch!

In reading over the correspondence which comes to both Tom and myself I find few reporting heat losses among their animals. They are good summer keepers and in our experience they stand the cold of our winters equally well!

In fact so many interesting things have happened to our Dutch that I am planning to write a "Rabbit's Eye View of the People World"!

I am only trying to say that the promotion and publicity of our club is still in your hands - if you enjoy your rabbits, if you enjoy the companionships you make through them, if you are using them as a commercial venture I am sure you do not keep still about it! How can you if you are enthused?

Mrs. Wm. Pierce of Pueblo is doing a splendid job of publicity -- and it is not confined to the Dutch. Many of her clippings are going to be on display at the National Convention, as are releases of other members, and I think it will point up that if you have a story to tell someone is going to listen while you talk! Bruce Nicholson, a member of the Dutch Club and corresponding secretary of the Washington State Rabbit Breeders Association, also promises to be a good committee member; as does C. W. Stinson of Georgia. I know that others of my committee will be sending in items of interest from their localities -- and that you will be surprised to know how far-flung is the interest in our Dutch!

Perhaps you have noticed Mrs. Virginia Pierce's news items in the rabbit magazines, as she is the publicity chairman for the Dutch Rabbit Club of Colorado. Mrs. Pierce is a busy person, as aside from raising Dutch rabbits she writes to several magazines, the local Colorado papers, and several breeders, besides Mr. Applegate. She also serves on the State Fair Committee, and is active in church work of several different kinds.

Mr. Pierce (William) also is active in the work of their church (Bethel Methodist) and the Masonic Lodge. He has been on the board of directors of their rabbit club, and has decorated their information booth at the State Fair for years.

The Pierce's have had their membership in the name of Pierce Rabbitry and first joined the ADRC in 1946. They reside in Pueblo, Colorado and agree that "You Can't Beat the Dutch".

You will note on another page the report of the election committee of the counting of the nomination ballots. One member has written me about the publishing of the coming sweepstake shows. If my proceedure is not clear to one, perhaps there are others who are wondering about

the same thing, so perhaps an explanation is in order.

When I first started publishing the Dutch Reporter back in July of 1954 it was the policy of the previous editor to begin publishing a show date in the next issue after it was received and continue repeating it until the month just prior to the show date. This wasn't too difficult and did not take up too much room as at that time the ADRC was sanctioning only about one hundred shows a year and many requests did not come in until a month or two before the show. The number of requests for sanctions started climbing until in 1960 we sanctioned upwards of TWO hundred shows and so far in 1961 there have been two hundred and five, plus two already sanctioned ro 1962! I feel sure that you prefer to read something other than coming shows, so it is my practice to publish the information regarding these shows in the first issue after the sanctions have been granted and then again in the issue just previous to the date of the show. This recent complaint being the first I have had in a couple of years, I feel sure that this method is working out satisfactorily for most of our members so will continue until it is proven unsatisfactory.

I had a phone call from Ed Toebbe the other evening and he assures me that plans are about completed to make the 1961 ARBA Convention the finest yet. He tells me that all catalogs have been mailed to those who have requested them, so I assume you are all checking real carefully to see just how many REAL GOOD DUTCH you will have to take along. If you have not written for your catalog, or have not received one after having written you had better write immediatly or you will be one of those

who didn't get his entry in on time.

Mr. Osmon would still be very grateful for further specials to be placed on Dutch at the Convention. Of course it is far too late for listing them in the catalog, but credit can be given via the Reporter and all late specials will be posted in the show room. Wouldn't you like to send him something? I am really looking forward to being in Louisville. Besides being a beautiful part of our country, there are many fine people living there and there will be many, many more present for the 1961 ARBA Convention. Will I see YOU there?
