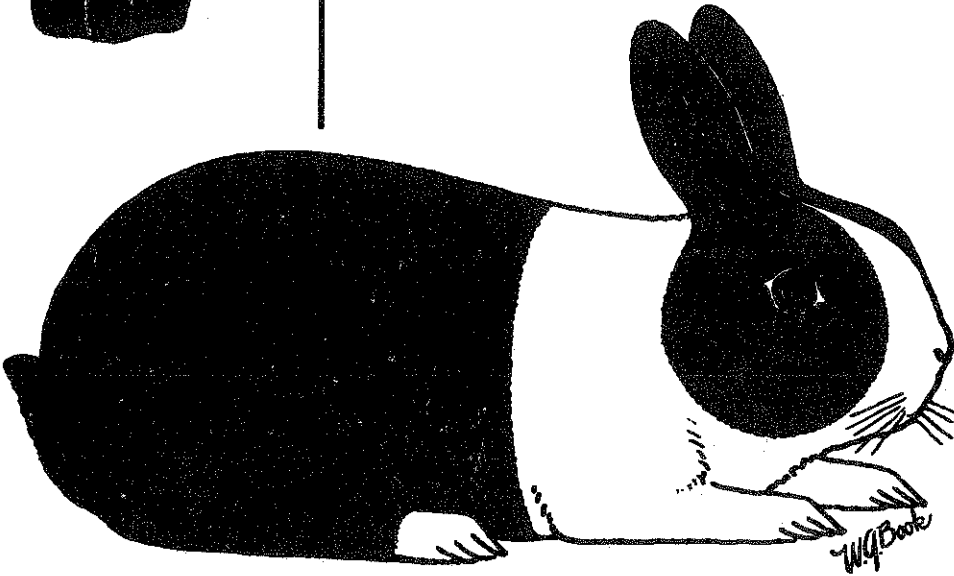

SECRETARY'S CHIT-CHAT

Time is fast approaching for the Tampa Convention and Show. Have you looked over your stock? Have you sent your special to the Dutch Breed Chairman, Mr. George Smith, R# 1 - Box 211, Thomaston, Conn.? Please don't put it off any longer.

Have you sent your ad in for the new Guide Book? Mr. Shufflebotham has reported that he has received one more half page ad from Donald Paxton of Huntington, Indiana, also a quarter page ad has been sent to this office by Bob Scott of Riverside, N. J. If you have sent in your own why not try to secure ads from some of the people with whom you do business who might receive benefits from nationwide advertising at such reasonable rates. Although Sept. 10th. will have been long gone when you receive this issue of the Dutch Reporter, I am certain that Mr. Shufflebotham will still welcome any additional ads that may come in. As I understand things the pages can not possibly all be set up at once, thus room can still be made for extra pages. A blank is again enclosed with this issue -- if you have not sent in your ad -- DO IT TODAY!

A word about the election blanks that you will be receiving any day now. The By-Laws state that these blanks are to be in the hands of the membership "on or before Sept. 10." It also states that there must be six candidates for Director, unless less than that number qualify by having sufficient nominating votes and meeting such other qualifications as to place of residence and willingness to run. This year this posed quite a problem as there were eight candidates who met all requirements EXCEPT, stating their willingness, or unwillingness to run for the office. On Sept. 7, I had just four candidates willing to accept the nomination with the remaining four not replying either pro or con. This made several phone calls necessary to fill the slate which was done finally late on Friday night. On Sat. morning the material was taken to the printer and another delay will be created by the need to submit proofs of the ballots and envelopes to Mr. Bayliss in California before the printing can be completed. It is hoped that these ballots can be placed in the mail by Sept. 17-20 with an allowance of thirty days for returning them to the election committee for tabulation. Please VOTE AND RETURN YOUR BALLOT JUST AS SOON AS YOU RECEIVE IT!

One little word about the ballots -- great care is taken to see that a ballot is mailed to each and every eligible member, however it was reported to me, via the

grapevine, that some members failed to receive their nomination ballots. I am sure I don't know how any member can expect me to correct an error (even though it is the fault of the United States Mails, not mine) if I am not informed of your failure to receive a ballot. Some of you are quick enough to write to other officers informing them of these things -- just as if it were done intentionally, without ever giving me an opportunity to correct such errors. Please, at least give me a chance by offering YOUR full cooperation.

Another matter I must bring to your attention again and that is the matter of your club's application for sweepstake sanction. Remember our rules call for 60 days prior to the opening of the show. Many clubs are being very tardy about this matter, in fact so tardy that the applications are received too late for listing in a Dutch Reporter prior to the show. This is not fair to our members living in the show area who might not receive a catalog without writing for a copy. If such delinquency continues to increase it may prove necessary to enforce this rule to the letter, which would mean the turning down of some applications for sanctions which would hurt not only our members, but the clubs sponsoring the show. May I remind you, each and every one that it is your responsibility to see that your club complies with all of our rules governing a sweepstake. This also includes the offering of the \$1.00 special on EACH of the six colors even though the show committee may feel that such colors as Steel and Gray are not being raised in their vicinity. They might just be surprised. It doesn't cost anything to offer this extra money if none are shown.

YOU CAN'T BEAT THE DUTCH

DUTCH PRE-JUNIOR CLASS -- NO!!

A few issues ago there was an article in the Dutch Reporter on "Dutch Pre-Junior Class?" The writer stated in this article that, "the opinion of most breeders is to have a Pre-Junior class". I for one am against this and I do not believe that this is the opinion of the majority of Dutch Breeders. He also said that it was his opinion that a baby could not compete with a top size junior as he would have too much to lose due to lack of development. According to our ARBA Standard on Dutch a junior is to be under 6 months of age and can weigh up to $5\frac{1}{2}$ pounds. It is my opinion that any Dutch rabbits under 6 months of age and not over $5\frac{1}{2}$ pounds is a junior and should be shown if the breeder wishes to show the rabbit no matter what the rabbit's age. If the baby has too much to lose as the writer states, then the judge will also see this and the baby will not place ahead of the older junior, or have we lost confidence and respect for our ARBA judges? The writer also stated that, "A nice type baby could weigh 6 pounds when it grows up, and be way out of proportion." This is very true, but we are forgetting that a rabbit is judged as he or she is the day of the judging and not how it will be later in life as no one can determine this, they could at best only guess. Furthermore the age of a junior Dutch is just a guess, the only person who really knows how old the rabbit is would be the one who bred the doe. I have in my hutches a Tortoise buck, very small bones and very coby who weighs 3 pounds. Would anyone like to guess his age? I have a doe, very good type but large at $5\frac{1}{2}$ pounds. You don't know how old she is! Believe it or not -- the little buck is 7 months old and I doubt if he will ever weigh more than 3 pounds. On the other hand the big doe is only $4\frac{1}{2}$ months old. I for one put my trust in our judges and if they think, in their honest opinion, that a 6 week old junior beats my 8 month old Grand Champion doe -- that is the judges opinion and I live by it and make no bones about it. Our judges for the most part are honest and fair and are only human beings. They may have an off day once in a while, but they can't make all of the rabbits in the show come in first place. I have no complaints about our ARBA Standard for judging of Dutch or any complaints against any judge. I think they do their best and they have always treated me very fair.

Now lets hear from some of you other Dutch breeders and how about some of our members who are licensed ARBA judges going out on the limb?

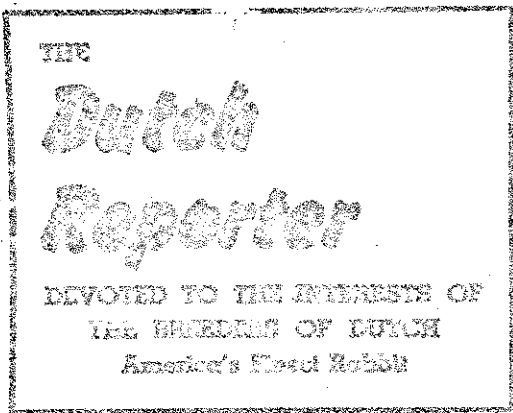

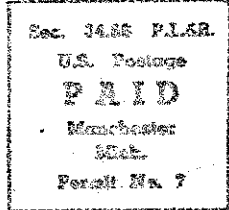
