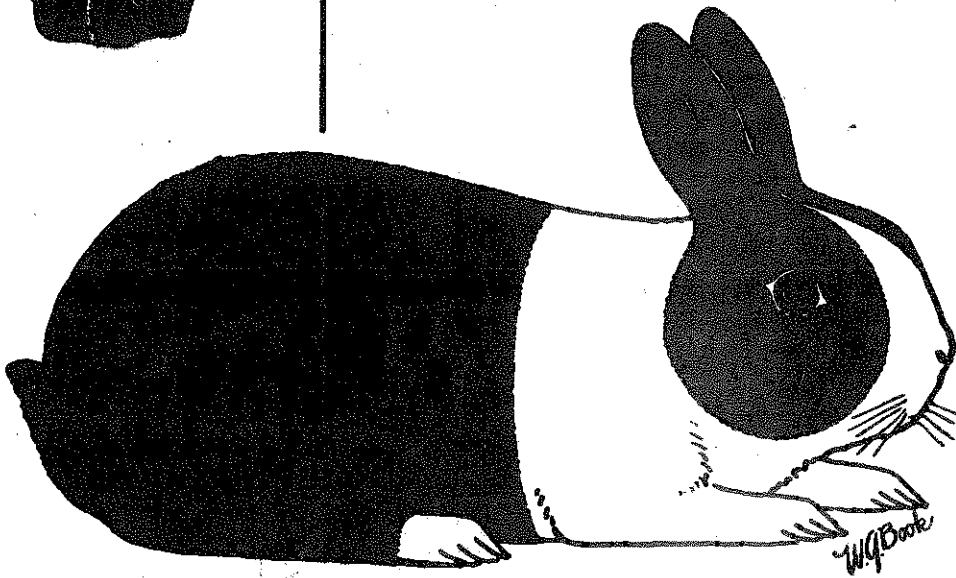
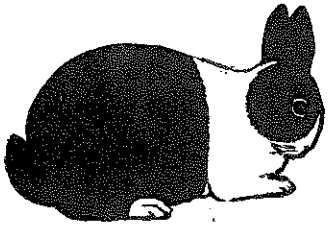
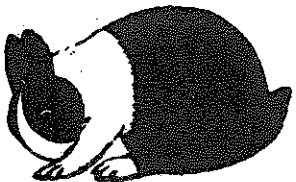

### IF I HAD TO START AGAIN

If I were starting out again to breed black Dutch, I'm sure I'd have no hesitation in pursuing the same plan I had originally. I might not be so fortunate in obtaining the foundation, but, at least, it's not so complicated a plan that the chance for success is entirely problematical.

I actually made two starts in Dutch -- the first was elementary schooling and the refuting of an old theory, which like so many old, taken for granted, rabbit breeding rules has no basis in fact: "get all your stock from one man". I suppose this is a good piece of advice if you get the stock from "the man who has everyt ing". I eliminated my first start because the same fault in markings occurred 75% of the time and I could see, I thought, where I could, by breeding close, probably get it 100% of the time.

My second start, and the way I'd do it again was made by gathering the basic ingredients for the perfect Dutch from several sources. I decided each animal I bought had to have at least one point, and hopefully two points, as close to the ideal as possible.

The first doe I bought was obtained for two reasons: one, I heard her breeder tell somebody he had gotten hold of an old Strickland buck some years back; two, the doe had almost perfect color -- right to the skin, and she had a pair of matched cheeks along with reasonably good stops. So, in t is animal I got one of the ideals plus an old, great blood line. (In the early '30's the Strickland brothers had the best blacks in the country -- imported from Foord brothers; the same line as that of that good breeder, Tom Shufflebotham.)

The second doe I bought was the worst of four juniors a fellow had at a national convention -- three of the four placed high and the one I bought placed about fourteenth. These animals all had lovely type and were very well marked, except for the doe I bought which had heavy cheeks. This doe was a litter sister of one of the other does and a half-sister to the buck and the other doe. The deciding factor in my purchase of this doe was quite simple: she was priced at eight dollars and the other two were thirty five or forty dollars apiece. This doe was straight Ancel Beaver blood and I'd have to guess that she made the greatest contribution of any doe I had in the first few years of breeding.

I bought a third doe but where or from whom I can't remember. She contributed nothing and was disposed of. (Note: Each doe was given two litters to produce something of value.)

The next step, of course, was to get a good stud buck. I looked for the buck that had the closest to perfect cheeks and stops I could find. The best available was a blue buck who had been best opposite blue at a national Dutch show (and later was second senior buck at two conventions), but wasn't regarded very highly by his owner because he weighed 4½ pounds and was rangy in type. I bought him for about one-third of what his breeder usually got for a top buck.

I now proceeded to breed my does and fortunately got good rabbits from two of the litters. I kept three of the best young does -- rebred the old does, and kept a couple does out of the next litters. I then got rid of the old does.

The young does were bred back to their sire, and out of these litters I selected a couple more does. I then retained the five best does from the group based on show points. I made a point of never keeping a doe with the same fault as either parent.

You will notice that I didn't keep a buck out of any of these litters -- I didn't want one out of a buck with a failing in type. My next purchase was a buck with very good markings but the deciding factor in his purchase was Jim Blyth's remark of, "excellent type" when he gave him first. I bought a half sister of his at the same time because the man's rabbits were all of a type and had very consistently good markings. This pair was a combination of Beaver and Walborn blood and when blended into the stock I had gave me a complete foundation.

After using the blue buck to start my line with, it is interesting to note that the last blue to be produced was born seven years ago. I think in a period of four years I had produced no more than three or four blues, and never used a blue for breeding after the original buck until last year when I used a black bred blue buck I got back at the age of five years.

My advice, and what I learned, can be summed up as follows:

1. Keep a small closely bred family after you start.
2. Start small -- no more than three does.
3. Don't keep any youngsters with the same faults as either parent.
4. Use the best marked rabbits possible.
5. Use slightly off-marked rabbits only if they have at least one outstanding marking, and, if the off-mark is on the heavy side.
6. Don't pass on to another breeder an animal you wouldn't breed from yourself.
7. Don't mix the colors, and, try to specialize in one color.

### I DID START OVER

A short time ago I was asked to write an article for the Dutch Reporter from my viewpoint as a beginner with Dutch. After pondering about it for some time I decided that I really didn't know what to say so I would write about some of my personal experiences.

Until last February I had been out of the "rabbit world" for the past seven years. I had previously raised several breeds of rabbits including Dutch but when it came time for college and then three years active duty with the U.S. Army I had to give up my rabbits. After fulfilling my college and army obligations I soon got "rabbit fever" and started building my rabbit house. I got my rabbit house and a few (all wire) rabbit hutches built and now my problem was where would I get my rabbits? I attended a couple of rabbit shows and visited most of the breeders within a 100 mile radius of me. I found that good breeding stock especially the short ear, rounded head, and choppy type I wanted was hard to find. As I mentioned above, I had raised Dutch before and for foundation stock I wanted the best I could get. I didn't care about markings, what I was after was type and color. I figured if I got good type and color that I was bound to get fairly good fur and the markings would come later.

I decided to write a few letters and ask help from friends I knew as to whom I should write for stock. To make a long story short I think I have an excellent start in Dutch. I bought all of my rabbits from proven breeders with outstanding records

behind them. So I'm sure I've got the genotype as well as the phenotype.

In building my rabbit house and hutches I looked at other breeders facilities and read and looked at all of the literature I could get my hands on. I feel that this is the reason I am pleased with my setup even tho I have limited space and may have to move in three or four years. At the present time I have 15 hutches 36" x 36" x 24" and 20 hutches 24" x 30" x 18" and I have the materials and plan to build 18 more hutches 24" x 30" x 18" within the next month even tho I am only using about one-half of the hutches now.

As with most beginners, I had gobs of questions and wrote the breeders I bought stock from for most of the answers. I might add that the promptness of their answers was really appreciated too. None of these breeders knew me and I was buying stock through the mail but all of these breeders sent me excellent breeding stock and I might add I was and still am (after a few litters) well pleased with all of my rabbits.

I purchased my foundation stock from Bill Summers, Robert Harris, and Don Lovejoy. These men all sold me stock well worth the money. I hope before long I will have the chance to furnish as fine breeding stock to some new breeder as these men did me.

Thanks for the opportunity to get to write a few words for the Reporter. I'm looking forward toward meeting all of the Dutch breeders I can at the National Dutch Show in Amarillo next spring and I hope to have some good rabbits to show.

#### COMMENTS ON HISTORICAL DATA IN MARCH ISSUE

Relative to the article in the Dutch Reporter relative to where the meeting was held when it was decided to publish a monthly Paper. This meeting was held in Indianapolis Fair grounds. It was the first Dutch Show held outside of Detroit, where it had previously been held, and sponsored by the Michigan Dutch Club for seven straight years.

I don't know why it was ever referred to by Mr. Souers as the Dutch Club Bulletin. I have every issue of the Reporter and it has always been known as the Dutch Reporter. The first ones issued used a picture of one of Ansel Beaver's black bucks. Then Mr. Herman Roerig, an active breeder and exhibitor of that time, and a commercial artist by profession, designed our first cover. It was a scroll with the words Dutch Reporter on it and a drawing of a dutch rabbit and some young ones on the bottom half of the cover. It did not depict the real type of our Dutch rabbit as it was too long in body. At one of our later ADRC meetings, Mr. William Book, a member from Ohio who was also a commercial artist designed our present cover. He also designed the present Dutch Club emblem. They were accepted by our club and I believe that we had them copyrighted.

Relative to the weight on the Dutch, there was no minimum weight and the maximum weight was 6 pounds. I saw Dutch rabbits registered at that time weighing only two pounds. This was later changed to our present weights, minimum of  $3\frac{1}{2}$  pounds and maximum of  $5\frac{1}{2}$  pounds with the ideal weight at  $4\frac{1}{2}$  pounds.

At the time our first Reporter was published our club dues were only \$1.00 per member. I would say it took a lot of guts to attempt this, and also the publication of our first guide book on dues of only \$1.00. The old timers that brought them about are to be congratulated. It is surprising to me how many of them are still members of our club and active. To name a few that is easy for me to recollect: Jim Blyth, Chas. Williams, Chas. O. Lewis, Russell Hall, Bob Sprague, S. M. Thatcher, George Bayliss and Cyril Lowit. There are more of them still active that I do not recall. These old issues of the Reporter are very interesting and present a pretty good history of the Club from the time of its 1st. publication as the contain reports of every meeting held by our club and were very informative. They did not contain show reports which take up so much of our present issues. One more of the old timers names comes back to me, as I pen these notes -- that of John Griffiths who was the first publisher of the Reporter.

Now relative to the remarks on Chocolate Dutch by Mr. Souers, there were not many of them in the country at that time. The first ones were imported to this country from Mr. Mitchell of England, by my good friend, Chas. O. Lewis and I believe a Mr. ...

Forrest Jones. We had no standard on them, and the first ones were shown as A.O.C. (Any Other Color). The Dutch Club had A.O.C. classes at that time. Mr. Lewis showed them at the A.R.B.A. Convention in New Haven in 1935. He had a very good buck at that time, Chocolate Pioneer, who could stand his own in any competition with any color, and I believe that he was the foundation of most of our present day Chocolates.
