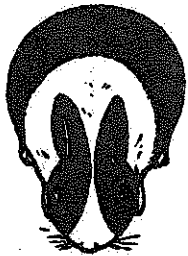
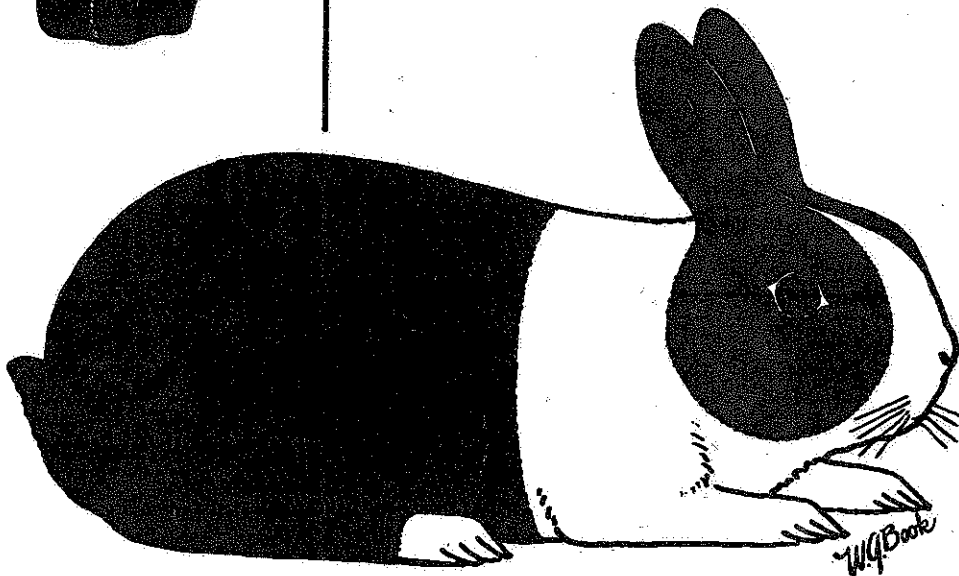


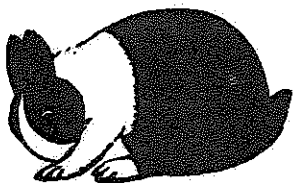

AMERICAN DUTCH RABBIT CLUB Louisville, Kentucky - October 19, 1966 Minutes, General Meeting

The regular meeting of the American Dutch Rabbit Club was called to order by Chairman, Don Reid at 9:30 a.m. The following officers were present: Secretary-Treasurer, Jessie Weinhardt, Directors, Don Reid, Stanley Goeglein. Absent were: President Bill Summers, Vice-President Jack Boughton and Directors Clinton Dennis, W. R. Griffith, Don Lovejoy and Wm. T. Hobin.

A motion to dispense with the reading of the minutes of the previous meeting because they had already been published in the Dutch Reporter was made by S. N. Thatcher, seconded by Al Meier was carried.

Letters of regret at not being able to be present were read from Bill Summers and W. R. Griffith.

Under report of officers the Secretary reported that as of Oct. 15th, we had 483 members and \$971.88 in the bank. Mr. Shufflebotham and Mr. Wm. Stedman voiced a dissatisfaction with the forms of our financial reports and stated that the Constitution and By-Laws called for published reports each quarter. It was brought to their attention that these reports, under the By-Laws, must be audited before publication and this had been complied with. An auditing committee of E. P. Shilliday, Al Meier and J. C. Lowit was appointed by the chairman with Wm. Stedman and Tom Shufflebotham to act as observers.

There was a discussion of the Special Dutch Issue of Small Stock Magazine by Director Stan Goeglein. He reported that he had received \$25.00 expense money from the Secretary and had turned back \$43.71 to that office. He stated that he had received 50 copies of this magazine and 50 had been sent to the Secretary but apparently the Publicity Director had never gotten any. He made a motion, which was seconded by Thatcher, that the Secretary contact Don Guthrie to learn if it might be possible at this late date to secure any more copies. Motion carried.

There was a report by Don Reid, representing the ADRC Standard Committee, that there were so many discrepancies between the Dutch Standard as published in our Guide Book and that published in the ARBA Book of Standards that we do something about it. It was suggested that we might be wise to go ahead and put out a new Guide Book, but the Secretary informed the meeting that we had at least a three year supply left and this

would not be feasible, as the cost would be too high to justify such action. It was suggested that in any re-printing we lop off the word "American" from our breed name. It is the American Dutch Rabbit Club but we support the "Dutch Rabbit".

Several thoughts were expressed along these lines -- one that we have a small pocket sized booklet printed containing our Standard, but it was finally decided on a motion by Stan Goeglein, seconded by Al Meier, that the Secretary secure bids on having pages the same size as the ones in our Guide Book, gummed on the back for sticking over the old pages -- these to be mailed to present members and to be included in Guide Books of all future members as long as our present supply of books lasts. Motion carried.

A full report of the election committee was submitted by Al Meier, Chairman of that committee, with a copy of the results being turned over to the Secretary.

The question was raised as to whether the Publicity Chairman had ever complied with the instructions from the Amarillo meeting to secure a bond to cover the funds handled by his office. The Secretary stated that if he had done so her office had never been notified of such action and no financial report had been submitted for this meeting. A motion was made by Stan Goeglein, seconded by Thatcher instructing the Secretary to write and remind Mr. Harris of these instructions. Motion carried.

It was announced that the Ohio State Dutch Rabbit Club had been awarded the National Dutch Show for 1967 and Mr. Don Weeks, as Secretary for that group gave us a few details. He stated that the show would be held April 29-30 in Wilmington, Ohio. They would like as many specials as possible. They have facilities for, and hope to see 1,000 Dutch at this show. Wilmington is centrally located for a great many breeders and they hope to have as good or better show than has ever been held.

The Secretary was instructed to collect a jack-pot for the next ARBA Convention, where-ever and when-ever it is to be held. A total of \$24.00 was collected.

Mr. Toebe asked to speak to the membership in meeting. He thanked the Dutch Club for their cooperation, stating that he felt we had a nice entry and did a nice job and he hoped many of us would come back sometime, if not for another Convention then for a local show.

He commented at length on the failure of our second Judge, Don Lovejoy, to appear. He stated that in 1961, when Mr. Lovejoy had also been elected to serve as one of our judges, by this club, he had written him no less than four letters advising him of his election and requesting an affirmation of his willingness to serve and never had a single reply, and Mr. Lovejoy did not attend the Convention. He stated that the same thing happened this year and it was his personal opinion that this club should never elect this man to this or any other office in the future.

The Secretary requested that someone else be appointed to handle the detail work of the show at the next Convention as she simply could not find the time for this work. Since no time or place for the next Convention had been decided on it was felt that such appointment would have to wait for more definite information.

Stan Goeglein brought up the subject of the Dutch Booth at this Convention. He felt, as did most of the members present, that it was a disgrace for a club the size of ours to have not ing more to offer than was in our booth this year -- that we had thrown away the cost of rental. There followed considerable discussion regarding the responsibility for this booth and it was pointed out that this was one of the duties of the Publicity Director, to either be present or provide the material and select someone to take charge of this activity.

The Secretary requested that someone be appointed to act as a Sweepstake Clerk -- that is, someone to whom she could mail the show reports and who would figure the sweepstake points and return them to her. Mr. Thatcher agreed to take this on on a temporary basis as he did not know exactly how busy he might become with work for the 1967 National Dutch Show.

The question was raised as to whether the membership present were in favor of holding a Seller's Class at this show. No one was interested.

There was a motion by Al Meier, seconded by Thatcher that the Dutch Club grant honorary memberships (life) to those Charter Members of our Club who still carry memberships in the ARBA. Motion carried.

The Secretary then gave a show report of this Convention, announcing Trophy winners

and display awards. She also took this time to thank Don Weeks, Jim & Barbara Walker and Jodie Croker for all the help they had been in handling the details of the show.

A vote of thanks was then given the Secretary for the work she had done.

A motion to adjourn was made by Walter Cook, seconded by Bill Weinhardt. Carried. Meeting adjourned at 10:45 a.m.

YOU CAN'T BEAT THE DUTCH

A.R.B.A. Specialty Clubs
Gentlemen:

This is to confirm our meeting at Louisville and to bring those of you who were unable to attend up to date.

This past year I have had more letters from Local Clubs than from the Specialty Clubs and we discussed two of these issues at Louisville and now I find I have a third issue which I will present to you through this letter.

First many Local Clubs feel that since most Specialty Clubs protect themselves through their sweepstakes rules by requiring so many animals be shown within the breed and by so many exhibitors before they will pay out their ribbons and rosettes, and they feel they should be afforded some manner of protection before they have to pay out the required cash specials. In other words if the Specialty Club requires \$3.00 for best of breed and \$2.00 for best opposite sex; as it now stands in most Specialty Club sweepstake rules, they have to pay out the \$5.00 if there is a pair shown and they are placed even though they lose money on the show. They ask that they be afforded some protection through the sweepstakes rules. One Specialty club has brought up t is same point and suggested that if they (the local club) lose money on the sweepstake they be given another sweepstake for \$1.00 the following year. I believe the general feeling was that they did not want a cheaper sweepstake fee but rather a protection on the pay-back.

The second question was why some breeds were allowed a separate sanction on varieties with a breed rather than on the breed itself. The Local Clubs tend to feel that one sweepstake per breed is all that is justified and that this coincides with the ARBA policy of giving only trophies on best of breed and best opposite sex. After much discussion regarding this it was felt that a decision could not be reached by those present and it should be taken up by the clubs concerned, through their officers and see if a workable solution that was acceptable to all concerned might be reached.

The new one brought up was why some Specialty clubs specify in their sweepstake rules that no cash award or prizes could be paid anyone except paid up members of the Specialty club. All clubs felt that the Specialty Clubs could and should specify this on anything given by the Specialty Club but if the specials or cash awards were put up by the local club or local club members, they should be permitted to award their own specials as they see fit. It was pointed out that in many local clubs breeders who do not raise that particular breed put up the specials and he insists it is his money and he can give it to whomever he desires, if they win it.

The feeling of the A.R.B.A. is that all of these suggestions have merit and are worthy of consideration and urge all of you to review your sweepstake offers and see if there is, in your own opinion, a possibility of a revision. It was further felt that BREEDERS and LOCAL CLUBS were the back-bone of our Specialty clubs and ALL OF THESE form the back-bone of the ARBA. It is through a close knit relationship that we grown and stay strong.

One Specialty club has brought up t is same point and suggested that if they (the local club) lose money on the sweepstake they be given another sweepstake for \$1.00 the following year. I believe the general feeling was that they did not want a cheaper sweepstake fee but rather a protection on the pay-back.

The second question was why some breeds were allowed a separate sanction on varieties with a breed rather than on the breed itself. The Local Clubs tend to feel that one sweepstake per breed is all that is justified and that this coincides with the ARBA policy of giving only trophies on best of breed and best opposite sex. After much discussion regarding this it was felt that a decision could not be reached by those present and it should be taken up by the clubs concerned, through their officers and see if a workable solution that was acceptable to all concerned might be reached.

The new one brought up was why some Specialty clubs specify in their sweepstake rules that no cash award or prizes could be paid anyone except paid up members of the Specialty club. All clubs felt that the Specialty Clubs could and should specify this on anything given by the Specialty Club but if the specials or cash awards were put up by the local club or local club members, they should be permitted to award their own specials as they see fit. It was pointed out that in many local clubs breeders who do not raise that particular breed put up the specials and he insists it is his money and he can give it to whomever he desires, if they win it.

The feeling of the A.R.B.A. is that all of these suggestions have merit and are worthy of consideration and urge all of you to review your sweepstake offers and see if there is, in your own opinion, a possibility of a revision. It was further felt that BREEDERS and LOCAL CLUBS were the back-bone of our Specialty clubs and ALL OF THESE form the back-bone of the ARBA. It is through a close knit relationship that we grown and stay strong.

YOU CAN'T BEAT THE DUTCH

CHOCOLATE DUTCH

by J. Weinhardt

The popularity of the various varieties of Dutch, aside from Blacks, has been known to wax and wane with more or less regularity down through the years. Some years, if you watch the show reports with an analytical eye you will find the Blues almost superceding the Blacks. The next year it will be a much larger showing of Tortoise and so on. It has been a long, long time since we have had any predominance, of even what might be classed as a mere "good showing" of Chocolates. Of those we do see, a great majority look as if they might be the big brothers and sisters of the Blacks and Blues -- they are much too big and bulky looking for good Dutch type. Even when many of these are near the ideal weight, and many are surprised to read the scales under these animals, they still appear much larger than the good Blacks and Blues. What is the reason for this? I've never done any weight analysis of these animals, but I'm very much inclined to believe that this effect is caused by a larger bone structure and hence a bigger, heavier frame. Comparison of heads alone would bear this out. Also take a good look at the feet and legs.

Why should this be so? First, Chocolates are our youngest variety. To achieve the color our breeders hybridized from older established varieties. It has been genetically proven that hybrids almost always grow larger and more quickly than either of their parents. Maybe I'm way off on that statement, but if I am someone will be very quick to set me straight and I will let you know. Besides, the historic cause for the problem is only important to the point where it will contribute to a solution.

The problem continues because we, the breeders continue to breed this fault into our Chocolates. We breed them because the judges place them. With only 15 points on type and 50 on markings these bigger animals keep right on winning over smaller type individuals. I have a buck of this variety that has won the equivalent of four Grand Championships in his four years. He tips the scale at exactly 4½ pounds and has for most of his life. To look at him you would swear he weighed 6 pounds. His frame is just too big.

What is the answer? It seems to me that there are two points of departure. One: We must pull more strictly. Stop keeping and showing these well-marked big-boned animals! Which is more important, sweepstakes points or improvement of our breed? Second: Those of our members who are judges had better give this subject some deep and considered thought -- ask yourself, "How far would a big boned animal like that go with me if it had a Black coat instead of a Chocolate one?" The judges of Dutch that I have seen who look at all of the varieties through the same eyes are few and far between. Some of our judges are doing a fine job and are to be commended, BUT it is up to us as breeders to do our share of the work so well that this problem will not confront the judge. ALL VARIETIES OF DUTCH SHOULD HAVE THE SAME TYPE AS BLACKS & BLUES!
