# SECRETARYS MESSAGE...

Here it is, time for another issue of the Dutch Reporter. Unfortunately, this one will be quite small in both size and contents! There are a couple of reasons for this-----

One---it is extremely difficult to publish any type of news bulletin and have it ready for mailing on the first of a month when articles begin to arrive on the 25th. of the month preceding the publication date. The layout of the DR must be set up, --- the stencils cut, --- the pages mimeographed, --- approximately 800 DR's must be collated by hand, stapled, addressed and then sorted down by state and zip for mailing. I like to think that we are all constantly being watched over and helped, but, --- even He wouldn't attempt to do this all in 5 days and expect it to be right! This is the reason for the deadline being set at the 15th. of the month preceding the mailing date.

The second reason is that we have been notified of family illness, and previous commitments have kept us from leaving until now. We have decided that with the risks involved, to postpone the trip any longer, would not be feasible. It is because of both of the above reasons that I cannot promise that you will have this issue by the scheduled time, but I am going to try my best to get what little I have out before I leave. Starting with the November/December issue,----Regardless of name, title, occupation or length of membership, NO ARTICLE that reaches this office after the deadline will be printed in the issue due. There will be no exceptions without advance arrangements. I would like to thank our Director from New Jersey for his contributions to the Dutch Reporter, and for always having his articles in ever so promptly!

Since the 1st. of the year, we have received 112 NEW youth members. 81 of these have joined since the 1982 N.D.S. The Youth Committee has tried to put together a sound program that is acceptable to both the youth and adult members. It seems that a youth program has been attempted before, but there was not enough interest shown to warrant anything except thought. Due to hard work by the Committee, the youth now have reduced membership fees, a youth sanction that includes ribbons for B.O.B., B.O.S., and B.O.V., a sweepstakes to compete in with trophies and rosettes being awarded to the winners and a youth section in the Dutch Reporter devoted to youth articles. It is sad that after accomplishing all of this, there is little being contributed by the youth members. Where are the articles for the youth page? Why aren't we hearing about some happening in your area? Why aren't we hearing about how you are enjoying the youth sanctions being requested by the local shows? The Committee is now planning a contest to give our youth something to strive for. This will be something they will be able to compete for other than sweepstakes. Without hearing from you, they have nowhere to go! They definitely need to know if the youth will show enough interest to warrant going ahead with this project. They can't speak for you. They don't know your likes, dislikes and needs! Your help is needed if this program is to progress.

You will notice that in printing the show reports, there are two parts. The first is with the shows listed by their dates, as usual, while the second is with the shows listed with their show dates along with the dates that they were received by this office. This will give you a chance to see how long it takes these shows to get their reports in. This will also enable me to start stenciling the show reports before the last minute. Being able to stencil periodically will take quite a load off of the publishing deadline.

I am depleting the last of the Dutch Reporter covers as new ones will be printed up for the Nov/Dec issue. Some of you may be missing the printing on the inside

cover page, evidently due to a printing malfunction in the last batch of covers. Some may be receiving a plain sheet of colored paper with just enough to get them through the mail. The reason for this is that I have two ad spaces available on this page and it wouldn't make much sense to have new covers printed without having the page completely filled. These spaces are available for a fee of \$25.00. We will have 10,000 covers printed so your ad will run for approximately 2 years. This is very reasonable! However, should you want this space, send your name in to me immediately. Do not send any money. Should you be one of the first two asking for the space, I will bill you immediately and ask how the ad is to read. This way, I won't have to return checks that were sent me too late. WE have a PROBLEM

It certainly appears that something is wrong either in the Gray standard or in those who breed Gray. I for one supposedly breed Gray attempting to develop steel. When starting in Gray, I read everything available since 1956, when I found that a Dutch (National) Club existed. Previous to 1956, little is available other than the English Standard. Could find no hard evidence of why American Standard deviated from the English Standard when it was originated.

Have been corresponding with two Gray breeders and visited two others this past week to see what we have now. When taking into consideration that stock purchased by myself came from three Nationally known Gray breeders, I think I know what is being raised and in what proportions, in my section of the Country. It is now startlingly evidenced that perhaps more than three quarter of the Gray being produced today are brown grays that do show an undercut. My personal stock of Grays, (from three breeders originally) has 2 to 1 favor of brown grays.

In that our club has no historian, we really don't know why the brown grays were written up in this manner, to be both agouti and not showing an undercut, as well as being diluted to a point of pale gray variety which does not have agouti fur.

In the 1950's, the Gray Standard was revised to a point that undercut showing was not a disqualification. This seemed to satisfy our gray breeders and most were happy with the change to some degree.

While talking with a well known judge two weeks ago, he confided in myself that he really could have disqualified 3 out of 4 Grays in the past 10 years but it would have been at his expense. He said if the majority being bred, raised and shown in the past 10 years, at least something should be done to protect this investment. Perhaps Mother Dutch Club's Standard Committee should investigate this presumption and if correct, revise the Gray Standard to fit the original, as well as being of service to our membership.

I honestly resist change, being conservative by nature, but feel that if something is not done soon (been over 20 years now) we will lose many Gray breeders and members, due to the surfacing of good judging. Again I say that judges are not at fault, but we must move fast to avoid the heart break it is now causing our membership.

Would like to thank those of you who nominated myself for Vice-President. It would be hard indeed to surpass Mr. Wireman in energy, capability and dedication. Thank you again for believing I could!

## YOUR STRAIN

This past summer has generally been a fruitful one considering the rabbitries visited and youngsters observed. Yet, have visited a couple that have not been. In most cases, they were small herds with no distinctive bloodline. For those of you who do not understand bloodline or strain, it means, the development of particular traits by using perhaps two other peoples lines in developing your own. This usually takes at least 3 to 5 generations with heavy culling of undesirable traits.

The biggest complaint of these breeders is that they are taking two different strains and thru breeding, expect the young to be show animals every time. Some of these breeders have initially purchased "meat Dutch". Although they have purchased "meat Dutch", they expect them to throw "show Dutch." Yes, it has happened before, but generally not, and very frustrating. In the first place, buy stock that is the best you can afford. The best time to buy is late spring (June) and late fall (November) in our latitude.

In the late spring, herds are culled out for the summer, and in the fall, cut down due to the winter coming. If you do start with good animals and you paid a good price for them, still do not expect the best in the litter. May be as some of you have told me, you get nothing to show.

You must save a couple out of that litter no matter if they won't show but with characteristics or good points that are desirable. Good type with a short body and rounder head, high back, etc. will suffice even though it has no stops but the parents do. The next generation, when bred back to one of the parents, should now produce some show. Out of this, keep the best and start to think of eliminating or selling the grand parents as you have now, and in succeeding generations, develop "your" strain. Remember never to breed together Dutch with the same faults as you will strengthen the fault.

As observed, some of you discard all the young in that first combination and rebreed the same again until either you get something decent or just drop the program altogether because of frustration.

Yes, you can get something good out of the first combination, occasionally. Remembering my first combination of a \$3.00 doe and a \$5.00 buck some 33 years ago that produced a brother sister that was the first litter I produced as a new breeder. This pair were shown 6 times in "adult shows" and never were worse than Best and Best Opposite Black. The doe and buck were never offered for sale, but had many lucrative offers. The best offer was made at the Allentown Fair in 1950 where I turned it down. Two days after the Fair, she just up and died for no seen reason. The buck developed a weepy eye about a week later and was never shown again and in fact, passed away at the ripe old age of 1 year---no apparent cause either!

This got me very interested in Dutch, but to this day, have never had a brother and sister (litter mates) do this, although some have been close.

Well, hope it happens to you! Perhaps everybody needs something like this to turn us on. This, as you know was the exception, not the norm. Do not be too pushy or eager. It will come if your diligent, caring and patient, but please start with decent stock from breeders that have decent herds, with no bad eyes or crooked bones in the majority of their stock. Observe at the show table what is being disqualified and for what reason. Be Observant!

## HERSHEY IS GONE —

In the last Dutch Reporter I proudly reported "What ever happened to Hershey's Chocolates", an update on our original doe, the "Queen Mother" of our rabbitry. In July, while I was hospitalized, my family brought me the heart breaking news that her fine daughter "Lil Hershey" had died while producing a litter of 7. To further sadden the summer, our original Hershey died a few weeks later at the age of 10 years, 2 months. They are both missed, but the next outstanding doe produced in our rabbitry will be designated to carry on the Hershey name.

It's been a frustrating summer for me. As one who has been blessed with good health over the years, it was a depressing experience to come home from the hospital and not be able to care for my Dutch myself. My recuperation has progressed nicely but, in order to handle my Dutch in the proper manner I sold half my herd. I was fortunate to be able to place my rabbits with some up and coming young Dutch breeders, the Lucky Foot Rabbitry in Rockville, MD. where they will be used wisely and receive outstanding care! I still have a good but small herd left with which I expect to be able to make a comeback at the shows when I can start getting around better. I'm breeding now with the hopes of producing some real good ones for the '83 N.D.S. in Canton.

"NOW THAT'S SOME BUNNY"

"I am black but comely..."---Song of Solomon, 1:5

She goes by the name of Tommy D's No. 7, but in the rarified world of show rabbits, she's a 10.

She is cobby and compact, in form and limb. She is nicely rounded in her body. Her fur is dense and short, the black portions jet-black and very glossy.

She is neither paunchy nor dull. Nor is she choppy, cow hocked, flabby or snikey.

Her markings are well nigh perfect, although one judge found her cheeks a bit "wavy."

No matter. She is currently the best Dutch rabbit in the United States.

She beat out 419 other Dutch rabbits for the honor at the National Dutch Rabbit Show in York, Penna, last weekend.

Her breeder, Tom Dietrich of Columbiaville, is justly proud. He's been breeding and showing Dutch rabbits for about 3 years. "A lot of breeders have been trying for 30, 35 years, without a champion," he says. Tom attributes his success to "a lot of research and a lot of time."

The criteria in judging show rabbits are as detailed as those of a dog or horse show. The black Dutch rabbit's markings must conform to precise standards on its cheeks, saddle, foot markings, underbelly, blaze and neck. It's almost churlish to mention it, but Tommy's No. 7 also has a bit of a drag back on her undercut. This means her white chest fur "drags back" into the black of her belly fur. "They say there's no such thing as a perfect Dutch rabbit," Dietrich says philosophically, with the emphasis on "perfect." No. 7 is a member of the oldest of the "fancy" rabbit breeds. Records show that Dutch rabbits were being shown back in the 1860's. Others in her clan are classed as blue, chocolate, tortoise, steel and gray.

Breeder and showman Dietrich has currently 75 rabbits, all Dutch. He's a member of the Michigan Rabbit Breeders Ass'n., the American Dutch Rabbit Club, and the American Rabbit Breeder's Ass'n.

No. 7 swept the board in the Pennsylvania show: 1st. in senior black doe, then best black, and finally --- triumphantly --- Best Dutch in the show. In addition to a trophy she won her breeder about \$100.00 in cash prizes. Not bad for a 7-months-old Lapeer County doe. She has a lot of poise, too, posing for the County Press photographer with the calm but alert bearing of a champion.

No. 7 was recently mated to another Dietrich rabbit, a grand champion Dutch buck. She'll kindle -- the curious word rabbit breeders use for the act of giving birth -- on May 23. Tom's looking forward to a litter of 6 to 8 from No. 7. "There's royalty in their veins," he smiles.

The B.O.B. died giving birth. She had fifteen babies and with fostering off, saved 3 little ones, but they were not put into the breeding program. The B.O.B. mother has produced other winners lately. The last one was sold in the Seller's Class at the National Dutch Show in Hutchinson, Kansas in April of this year, and was purchased by Scott Williamson. She was best fancy out of 700 at the Michigan Rabbit Breeders Convention in March of '82. She then lost a toenail from dogs, and could no longer be shown.

Rabbit fur is lighter and warmer than furred sheepskin.

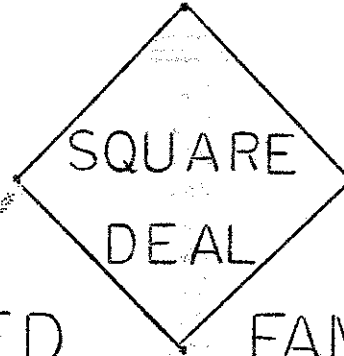
Because the rabbit is almost a continuous feeder, it always has it's stomach half filled.

To prevent winter losses, place four or five sheets of newspaper on the bottom of nest box, on the paper throw a few handfuls of clean white dust free wood shavings, then add straw and hay mixed, or either alone.

An over-excited rabbit which is struggling against restraints will usually quieten down if its head and eyes are covered by your palm.

If you hear anyone slightlyingly call rabbits "rodents", do correct them by pointing out that rabbits are "mammals" belonging to the order of Lagomorpha.

The rabbit is no longer a pet, but a valuable agricultural animal that can be cooked and served in over 300 different ways.

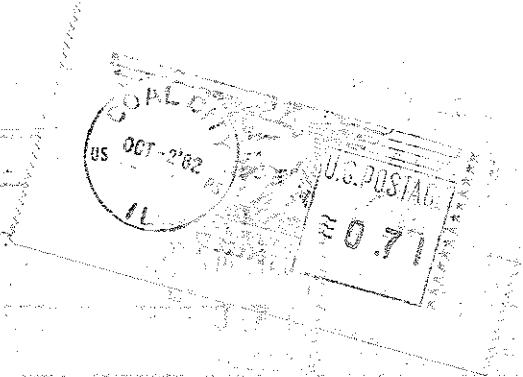
