Well it has eventually happened as predicted. Was at a show where some ten Gray Dutch were shown by five breeders and the color was from light tan color (outer color) to a chocolate color on the surface.

We all believed the brown gray that had surfaced in twenty plus years was to be the light brown-tan color, which is becoming. The chocolate color gray looks like a chocolate colored agouti. It seems that the more the standard committee aids the members, the more the members come up with something different. I also wonder why we just don't call this variety "Agouti" and let it go at that. I spoke to all five gray breeders and they insisted that their color was the color prescribed in the standard. If you would only read the gray standard as being submitted to the ARBA standard committee, you will see that the "shaft" starts with slate blue at the flesh, then with yellowish orange and black finishing with a light tan tipping--not a chocolate color, but a light tan or as some call it a very light brown.

I am deeply concerned about losing the steel variety in 5-10 years. If you do not keep the light tan surface color in the agouti strands of fur and allow them to finish light on top, the steels will be all but finished since you use gray to produce steel. They now are in the large minority and yet are a beautiful animal. Yes, they are perhaps the hardest to breed of all the Dutch varieties. We will be fortunate for the gray/steel breeders to save those light tipped gray for the propagation of both gray and steels. We of the ACRC thank you for upholding our gray/steel standard and not deviating from a hard fought battle that took over 20 years to straighten out.

WHAT PRICE GLORY

Was feeling a little blue this past summer, so did what I normally do to cheer up - play with my Dutch or visit another Dutch breeder. I decided to visit an Ohio Dutch breeder and called him up to see if he was going to be home on the day I was coming. I had not been to his place since 1979 when he had 20 breeding does in three colors.

Much to my surprise he was out of Dutch entirely. He told me that he had developed the best marked Dutch in the state and did a lot of winning up until 1983. At this point when going to a show with 8-12 Dutch, some started to be judged as disqualified. By the fall shows most of his show herd was disqualified and he didn't have the "will" to start over. Seems cow hocks were so inbred that none could be salvaged to start over. Was it worth ignoring the genetic defect knowing it would eventually "kill you"? This man is not the only one "riding one rail" and it was frustrating hearing his story (and pitiful) when I knew at one time he had the best. He requested not to have his name used because of the shame he felt. Perhaps like others, he will pick up a trio and redevelop his herd and his name. I wish him the best and do look forward to a future visit to his Dutchland. Please try again as you have learned a hard lesson never to be forgotten. Once a Dutchman, always a Dutchman!

Hello, is this Bill Geitzenauer? do you have any rabbits for sale? Well, I'd like something that will show but I can't pay more than \$15.00 for the rabbit. What color or sex are you interested in? Oh, it doesn't matter. Well I have a couple in the price range but they are not "top" show prospects and wouldn't win the class but won't get disqualified either. No, I want the one that would win the class!

As you can see nobody wants to breed winners anymore! A top show specimen takes me about 5 or 6 litters culled to get the best available. Seems people don't understand that even though the parents are good show rabbits, God doesn't always cooperate. When I told her she was really looking for \$ 50.00 to \$150.00 rabbits she was speechless! To get that 3 or 4 out of 20 breedings, it cost the breeder \$300.00 in feed alone and someone must pay for the 19 litters that were culled and not made one cent on but still ate!

Then I was told that another breeder would sell theirs to her for \$10.00 & \$20.00. and then I said "it sounds like a good buy" go for it!

One year from now, I will not even remember her name and will not see her at the shows. She will cease to be a show person because she was not willing to become committed to perfection through the basic process of inbreeding/culling. Hopefully this provided a seed for thought and was it a wrong number?

UNTIL THEY WIN

The question recently asked of this writer, yesterday, was how was the judging this past spring season?

It does seem that the same complaints were registered as they have been for the past 20-30 years! It has poor type but it won, the fur was poor, it had crooked legs, pinched hindquarters, "smallish" head etc. But the socialization was better than ever----- Seems that people have become friendlier, asking for your advice and actually thinking about your reply. Often times previously it was advice or consultation asked for but just to let off steam, never intending to be actually ingested.

We have become a body of pessimists, when viewing the judging, being authorities of our breed and quite often disagreeing with a judge's placement because "ours" was the best in the class, yet it placed only 3rd. We quite frankly try to influence a judge's decision by "holding" our bunny in the holding pen on the table and using mental telepathy or whatever, wishing our bunny into first place. Having been in England 10 years ago, it was found that when a judge does his/her thing with a class, exhibitors are not allowed within 50 feet of the judge. Actually the judge can do their jobs better, faster, more accurate without the mumbling, undertone speech occurring and without someone looking over their shoulders when examining each specimen. Everyone gets a "fair shake" and an honest placement with the card comment the results of the animals showability!

Have to say that 90 % of the judges observed have done a nice job under the circumstances and if they could concentrate on their placing of the stock it would allow them to do a better job for the money they labor for.

Have seen stock sold for pets in shows that should not have been. Their breeders have told their clients that a certain animal will show but did not explain to them fully that it would probably be the first off the table. I believe more time should be spent with new potential breeders, to enhance their understanding of the show regimentation. Before selling to them have them attend one show as an observer. Give them a one year membership in the specialty club of their breed. Five years from then they will look on you as a respectable thorough breeder and person. Yes, it seems a little bit ambiguous to sell a cull to a new breeder as a pet or cull without

definitely having the person understand that it is improbable the pet would win a class. When they show up at a show with 20 in a class and you as the breeder have two or three superior and beat your own culls/ pet stock sold. does it really give you great satisfaction? how does the new cull owner take this "slap" in the face, no wonder most clubs have a one-third turn over rate.

Have also "found" that at all shows this spring when someone needed the show Supt. they in the crowd could not be found, even if you knew them. In that most of the of the exhibitors are not from the sponsering club, lots of people don't know them. My suggetion at different shows last year of pinning a sign on his back or special hat, apparently did little good. who's the show supt.? Know where he is? what does he look like? (or she)

Well, shows have not changed much. People are still critical of all, until they win!

To our surprise, one of the other breeders who knew where our carrying cases were, had gone and placed Paul's rabbit on the table for Best Fancy competition ... and she won. We didn't go on to win Best in Show but without friends like these we would'nt have had the chance to take Best Fancy. Like they say, YOU CAN'T BEAT THE DUTCH, but then again you can't beat good breeders (and Friends) like these.

Mary ran wildly to the greenhouse and to his cage. He tried to raise his head. Mary gently picked him up and with his last ounce of strength he rubbed his chin on her cheek and he was gone.

We cried over that yard sale rabbit. Mary, all by herself, buried Tyler in the hard winter ground. When she buried him—part of her confidence seemed gone too. A week past and then two and no mention of any rabbit shows. She had two litters of kits and three more due but that fire in her had dwindled to a mere spark.

Jack Wireman was our answer. He challenged Mary and off to Chapel Hill at Akron we went. One of Tyler's sons stood out and his name is Danny and he won! Mary will never have another Tyler but Danny comes close. And Alfie, and now Danny's sons...

We traveled to shows and finally the NDS at York. The spark was flickering but had not grown as much as we would like to have seen.

Now here's where the above mentioned statement comes in. A well-known man came in and asked to look at Mary's own breed torts and she happily agreed to show him her rabbits. He complimented her on the excellent color and great body type. We talked about how nice it was to be able to attend our first NDS and how excited we were. And then he stated, "Children have no business breeding Dutch rabbits!" Needless to say I almost fell off the bench I was sitting on. And her father was almost speechless. Mary's jaw almost sagged to the floor. And as that man walked away Mary said, "he's wrong!!!!" And then we saw the fire in her eyes.

Maybe we misunderstood but honestly I never thought we would walk into a NDS and hear that! I would like to offer a "thank you" to that man. Maybe you were trying to discourage Mary but all you accomplished was to bring out that fire to breed the best Dutch possible. I won't mention his name—he knows who he is.

And just a special sincere thank you to the people who have encouraged, answered questions, and just been there: Jack and Ruth Wireman, Andy and Sophie Barton, Larry Nixon, Kevin Hooper, and Vickie and Kevin Bogan. Dear Dutch Reporter:

I have been raising Dutch for the past 13 years but very rarely show them. My Dutch and other small breeds are raised for the pet shops and 4-H projects. Two years ago I became serious about breeding the Dutch and maybe next year, I will start showing them.

Now that I am paying more attention to the breed, I am encountering many problems. My best type animal will not have the markings and my best marked animals will have odd colors. I get many lavenders, golds, odd shades of chocolates, some with rings like the agouti pattern and many shades of blue. Recently I am getting ears void of color.

The most serious fault I find now is in size - not too big, but too small. Was I surprised when breeding a three pound black buck to a four pound black doe to get one solid agouti doe. When bred back to the father, I got one black with a blaze and one solid agouti. Do you suppose there is dwarf in the background? I do not have pedigrees on the animals as they have been purchased helter skelter from fair shows, pet shops, etc. Is breeding a dwarf to a Dutch a common practice or is this an Easter Bunny situation to produce small animals?

As I cull for winter, I will keep a better eye on these odd balls and get to the serious breeding of good Dutch. I have Larry Nixon and the Butlers to thank for this new interest in Dutch.

BUYER BEWARE

Having recently read an article from a major feed company brochure, it made me say "bull on that"! After reviewing both the pros and cons of the statement, it made me wonder how many people would take this as gospel. The statement: "Rabbits should be fed a complete pelleted feed from a self feeder. No hay or grain is necessary if this is done."

Well it seems that no one knows what the "complete" ration of a rabbit is. Most of the pelleted forms subscribe different combinations of protein, fiber and fat as well as vitamins/minerals to be complete.

In my 40 years of Dutch raising, I have tried perhaps fifteen different "complete" rations and subscribe to none as being wholly complete. It seems that most rations are made for the greater consumer of pellets which is the commercial breeder. We, of the non commercial branch of the industry do not need that 2-3% fat or 18-20% protein. When I first started raising Dutch continuously in 1949, most of the old time breeders fed a good grade of hay, but not alfalfa, with some mixed grain and they didn't have half the trouble raising Dutch because they told me that coccidiosis/mucous enteritis and things like slobbers were rare.

I have found out that they were at least partially right in that the first thing an 18 day old kit should see when leaving a nestbox is a good bunch of dry timothy hay, not pelleted food. Without formulating a mixture of grain by yourself, some pelleted food should supplement their hay. It seems through investigation if your place is clean and ventilated, not drafty, and the kits start on hay, they are less susceptible to ailments that always seem to take the best in the litter and leave you frustrated.

While they will not get fat on hay with pellet supplement, they will develop into Dutch type rabbits, not big round beefy animals for the market. It has worked for people in our area, perhaps you'd like to try it because "buyer be ware!"

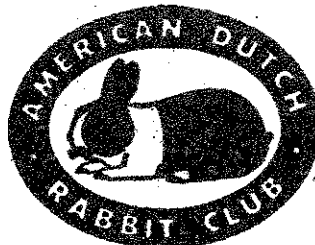

The following Constitution and By Laws of the American Dutch Rabbit Club contain the changes as voted on by the ADRC membership.

CONSTITUTION and BY-LAWS of the AMERICAN DUTCH RABBIT CLUB

Constitution:

ARTICLE I - NAME: The name of this Club shall be the AMERICAN DUTCH RABBIT CLUB, INCORPORATED.

ARTICLE II - OBJECT: The object of this Club shall be to promote, encourage, and improve the breeding of Dutch rabbits by maintaining an organization to study standards, encourage exhibitions, and offer service to its members.

ARTICLE III - AFFILIATION: This Club shall be affiliated with the American Rabbit Breeders Association, Inc.

ARTICLE IV - MEMBERSHIP: Any person of good character and reputation and in accord with the object may become a member of the Club upon presentation of a signed application together with membership fee for at least one year to the Secretary-Treasurer. Term of membership to be one year from date on membership application, providing application is received within five (5) days of this date. Each member shall be provided with a copy of the latest A.D.R.C. Guide Book, if available, and a one year subscription to the Dutch Reporter.

ARTICLE V - OFFICERS: SECTION 1: The elected officers of this association shall consist of a President, Vice-President, and nine (9) Directors, who shall be elected for a two (2) year term, by and from the membership. The President, Vice-President, Secretary-Treasurer, and nine (9) Directors shall constitute the Board of Directors. Each of the nine (9) Directors must reside in a different district. Any member, to be eligible for any office, must be an owner and breeder of Dutch rabbits.

SECTION 2: The Secretary-Treasurer shall be appointed by a two-thirds majority of the Board of Directors, to serve a minimum term of three years. The Secretary-Treasurer may be reappointed by the Board of Directors, who may also remove him/her from office, for cause, by a two-thirds majority, during any term of office. The term of office shall begin on January 1st.

SECTION 3: The President and four (4) Directors representing districts 4, 6, 8, and 9 shall be elected biennially on the numerically odd years. The Vice-President and five (5) Directors representing districts 1, 2, 3, 5, and 7 shall be elected biennially on the numerically even years. The Directors representing each district will be elected by a vote of the members living in that district only.

SECTION 4: Vacancies in office shall be filled by appointment by the President, subject to approval by a two-thirds (2/3) majority vote of the Board of Directors. If filling the office of Director, a person from the same district the vacancy is in, shall be appointed.

SECTION 5: Directors shall be elected from the nine (9) districts divided as follows:

- #1 - Washington, Oregon, Idaho, Montana, Wyoming, Alaska, and all Foreign.
- #2 - California, Hawaii, Nevada, Utah, Arizona, New Mexico, and Colorado.
- #3 - North Dakota, South Dakota, Nebraska, Iowa, Minnesota, Wisconsin, and Missouri.
- #4 - Texas, Oklahoma, Arkansas, and Kansas.
- #5 - Illinois and Indiana.
- #6 - Louisiana, Mississippi, Alabama, Tennessee, Kentucky, Georgia, Florida, North Carolina, and South Carolina.
- #7 - Maine, Vermont, New Hampshire, Rhode Island, Connecticut, Massachusetts, and New York.
- #8 - Michigan and Ohio
- #9 - Pennsylvania, New Jersey, Delaware, West Virginia, Maryland, and Virginia.

** Since the regions of each district are based on membership residing in said district, the regions outlining each district shall be re-evaluated every ten (10) years.

ARTICLE VI - VOTING PROCEDURES: SECTION 1: Two (2) nomination ballots and two (2) ballot envelopes shall be included in each March-April Dutch Reporter mailed. All members with voting privileges shall remove their ballot from the Dutch Reporter, and upon completion of voting, place it in the ballot envelope and seal it. This ballot envelope shall be

placed in another envelope addressed to the Secretary-Treasurer of the American Dutch Rabbit Club, Inc., with the voters name and return address on the envelope. Upon receipt of the envelopes, the Secretary-Treasurer shall verify the eligibility of the voter. The Secretary-Treasurer shall open and discard the outer envelopes. The Secretary-Treasurer shall receive these ballots until the 15th of May, at which time the polls shall be closed. The ballot envelopes shall then be packaged and sent to the Chairman of the Election Committee, and he/she will assemble the Election Committee, open the ballot envelopes, count the ballots, and certify the results to the Secretary-Treasurer, President, and Dutch Reporter Editor by the 25th of May. The Election Committee Chairman shall then package the nomination ballots and send them to the Secretary-Treasurer of the American Dutch Rabbit Club, Inc., and they shall be retained for a period of one (1) year, at which time they may be destroyed. These ballots, while in the hands of the Secretary-Treasurer, shall be accessible by any member in good standing, provided proper arrangements are made with the Secretary-Treasurer.

SECTION 2: The Secretary-Treasurer shall determine the eligibility of the nominees and ascertain if they will accept the nominations. The two (2) highest who are eligible and have accepted the nomination for each office of President or Vice-President shall be listed as candidates for their respective offices on the final election ballot. There shall not be more than two (2) names on the final election ballot for the offices of President or Vice-President, except in case three (3) or more eligible nominees received the highest number of votes, and the number is identical thus creating a tie (or in case of a tie/ties for second place) and providing further that the three (3) or more accept nominations. There shall not be more than two (2) names on the final election ballot for the office of Director in each district, except in case three (3) or more eligible nominees received the highest number of votes, and the number is identical thus creating a tie (or in case of a tie/ties for second place) and providing further that the three (3) or more accept nominations.

Two (2) final ballots and two (2) ballot envelopes shall be included in each July-August Dutch Reporter mailed. All members with voting privileges shall remove their ballot from the Dutch Reporter, and upon completion of voting, place it in the ballot envelope and seal it. This ballot envelope shall be placed in another envelope addressed to the Secretary-Treasurer of the American Dutch Rabbit Club, Inc., with the voters name and return address on the envelope. Upon receipt of the envelopes, the Secretary-Treasurer shall verify the eligibility of the voter. The Secretary-Treasurer shall open and discard the outer envelopes. The Secretary-Treasurer shall receive these ballots until the 15th of September, at which time the polls shall be closed. The ballot envelopes shall then be packaged and sent to the Chairman of the Election Committee, and he/she will assemble the Election Committee, open the ballot envelopes, count the ballots, and certify the results to the Secretary-Treasurer, President, and Dutch Reporter Editor by the 25th of September. The Election Chairman shall then package the final ballots and send them to the Secretary-Treasurer of the American Dutch Rabbit Club, Inc., and they shall be retained for a period of one (1) year, at which time they may be destroyed. These ballots, while in the hands of the Secretary-Treasurer, shall be accessible to any member in good standing, provided proper arrangements are made with the Secretary-Treasurer.

SECTION 3: The Secretary-Treasurer shall then inform the nominees and the Board of Directors of the results and shall declare the nominees having the highest number of votes elected. The officers-elect shall assume offices on the following January 1 and serve their elected terms or until their successors have been elected.

SECTION 4: Any member, to be eligible for office, must have received at least ten (10) votes to become a candidate for office of President or Vice-President; he/she must have received at least five (5) votes to become a candidate for office of Director. Any member, to be eligible for office, must have been in continuous good standing at least two (2) years prior to certification date of election, September 20, and all candidates shall remain in good standing with membership fee paid in advance at least through date of assuming office, January 1.

ARTICLE VII - DISCIPLINE: SECTION 1: The Board of Directors may, by a two-thirds majority, suspend or expel any member or reject an application for membership or renewal, providing charges have been preferred by another member. Less than a two-third majority shall constitute acquittal of the charges.

SECTION 2: In the event of preferment of charges, the member against whom the charges have been made shall be fully informed by the Secretary-Treasurer and given thirty (30) days to reply before action is taken by the Board. If reply is made, it shall be considered by the Board along with the charges.

SECTION 3: Any person expelled, suspended or otherwise rejected shall not be eligible for reinstatement for a period of

at least one year and then only upon authority of the Board of Directors.

SECTION 4: An Officer whose membership has expired shall be notified by the Secretary-Treasurer by registered mail, with signature receipt requested, and if the renewal has not been made in thirty (30) days from the date of expiration, said office shall be declared vacant and it shall be the duty of the President to fill by appointment the unexpired term of office.

SECTION 5: An Officer who shows lack of interest in his official duties, who fails to answer correspondence of Club matters from his fellow Officers, shall be asked by the President to resign said office. In case of failure to do so, the Board of Directors by two-thirds vote shall declare the office vacant. It shall then be the duty of the President to appoint an Officer to fill the unexpired term of office.

SECTION 6: An Officer who shall willingly or otherwise give up the breeding of Dutch rabbits during his term of office shall automatically resign his office and it shall be the duty of the President to fill the vacancy of the unexpired term of office by appointment.

SECTION 7: No member or candidate for membership may infringe upon the name of the American Dutch Rabbit Club, Inc., or that of any other member or his rabbitry. This also applies to State Dutch Rabbit Clubs.

ARTICLE VIII - MEETINGS: SECTION 1: The annual membership meeting shall be held during the annual Convention of the American Rabbit Breeders Association, Inc.

SECTION 2: A regular membership meeting shall be held during the National Dutch Rabbit Show; however this meeting shall in no way replace the annual meeting unless the two are concurrent.

SECTION 3: The President, or in the absence of the President, any elected Officer present may call a meeting of the Board of Directors at any time during the annual Convention of the American Rabbit Breeders Association, Inc., or the National Dutch Rabbit Show. The presence of five (5) Officers at such a meeting shall constitute a quorum.

ARTICLE IX - AMENDMENTS: SECTION 1: This Constitution may be amended by a two-third majority of the votes cast. Votes to be cast by mail ballot. All members are to be notified in writing of the proposed amendment or amendments and furnished a ballot at least thirty (30) days before the closing of the polls.

BY-LAWS

ARTICLE I - DUES: The membership dues shall be seven dollars (\$7.00) per year payable in advance, with a combination membership being provided for husband and wife at nine dollars (\$9.00) per year, expiring with the same date. One dollar (\$1.00) of each yearly membership fee is to be placed into a separate account called the "Guide Book/Contingency Fund" and the provisions of ARTICLE III - SECTION 1 and 2 of the By-Laws shall not apply to these monies. A single paid life membership may be purchased for the sum of one hundred forty dollars (\$140.00), payable in advance. A husband/wife life membership may be purchased for the sum of one hundred eighty dollars (\$180.00), payable in advance. All deductions from paid life memberships are excluded. After membership has expired, the member may renew within a period of sixty (60) days; otherwise upon sending in membership fees, the member will be given a new membership unless they specifically requests that their membership be dated back more than sixty (60) days to the original expiration date in order that they may keep their original membership number. Any member having been delinquent sixty (60) days or more, whether requesting old membership number or not, shall be deprived of all sweepstakes points accumulated prior to the expiration date.

All junior members of the American Dutch Rabbit Club, Inc. shall pay dues at the rate of \$2.00 (two dollars) less per year than a single adult membership. They will retain all privileges as adults except voting. A junior member shall be defined as being a youth under the age of 18 (eighteen) years on the date of applying for membership.

ARTICLE II - DUTIES OF OFFICERS: SECTION 1: The President shall preside at all meetings of the membership or Board of Directors, appoint all committees, fill all vacancies in office by appointment and perform such duties as pertain to the office.

SECTION 2: The Vice-President shall perform all duties of the President in his absence or disability. In event of vacation of the office of President, the Vice-President shall automatically succeed him in office.

SECTION 3: The Secretary-Treasurer shall be custodian of all general funds; shall maintain a bank account in the name of the Club; shall maintain a set of books and records suitable to the Board of Directors; receive and act on all membership applications received, subject to the approval of the Board of Directors; maintain Sweepstakes Show records; consult and advise the Board of Directors on all unusual matters; furnish them with quarterly reports showing the general condition of the Club; furnish the Board of Directors with semi-annual audited reports, all these reports to be published in the Club's publication; keep an accurate record of all meetings; and perform such other duties as may be assigned by the President or the Board of Directors. The Secretary-Treasurer shall furnish an approved bond covering the assets of the Club. The premium for said bond to be paid for out of Club funds, with the bond to be delivered to the President within ten (10) days after assumption of office.

SECTION 4: It shall be the duty of the Secretary to edit, or cause to be edited, THE DUTCH REPORTER. If for any reason the Secretary is unable to perform this duty it shall be the duty of the President to appoint an editor and the Secretary shall cooperate with the appointed editor by giving such news from the office as would be of interest to the membership.

SECTION 5: The Board of Directors shall have power to transact all business of the Club between meetings; act upon charges brought before them; formulate rules; award the location of the National Dutch Rabbit Show; and decide upon all questions of policy brought before them.

ARTICLE III - APPORTIONMENT OF FUNDS: SECTION 1: The Secretary-Treasurer shall receive 25% of all membership dues including renewals, and 25% of Sweepstakes fees as full compensation for his/her services.

SECTION 2: The dues shall be further divided with 12 1/2% to be allotted for the American Dutch Rabbit Club, Inc. Publicity Department. These monies are to be placed in a separate account retained by the Secretary-Treasurer. Any portion of these monies may be transferred to the Publicity Department, or to any American Dutch Rabbit Club, Inc. purpose, upon approval of a majority vote of the Board of Directors. The remaining 62 1/2% shall go to the General Fund. All percentage payments are to be paid on a monthly basis.

SECTION 2A: An annual allotment of \$500.00 (five hundred dollars) from the General Fund shall be awarded to the sponsors of the National Dutch Rabbit Show, with further stipulation that at least 1/2 of the allotment be used for cash specials, and listed as such, from the American Dutch Rabbit Club, Inc. Said money to be sent by the Secretary-Treasurer to the sponsors on or as near to January 1st preceding the National Dutch Rabbit Show for that year.

SECTION 2B: An annual allotment of \$150.00 (one hundred fifty) shall be paid out of the General Fund towards the American Rabbit Breeders Association, Inc. Convention, with further stipulation that the entire amount be used for open Dutch specials.

SECTION 2C: An annual allotment of \$50.00 (fifty dollars) be paid out of the General Fund towards the American Rabbit Breeders Association, Inc. Convention, with further stipulation that the entire amount be used for youth Dutch specials.

SECTION 2D: All of the above allotted specials to be advertised as being donated by the American Dutch Rabbit Club, Inc.

SECTION 3: The President shall receive the sum of \$50.00 (fifty dollars) for attendance at each annual, regular, or special meeting, provided that meeting is not held in the town in which he/she resides, in which case there shall be no payment. In no case shall the payment be in excess of the sum of \$100.00 (one hundred dollars) per calendar year. The Secretary-Treasurer shall receive the sum of 20 cents (twenty cents) per mile round trip, or round trip coach air fare, whichever is less expensive, for travel expenses to the National Dutch Rabbit Shows and the American Rabbit Breeders Association, Inc. Conventions. Should the National Dutch Rabbit Show or American Rabbit Breeders Association, Inc. Convention take place within 125 miles radius of the Secretary-Treasurer's home, only the sum of \$50.00 (fifty dollars) will be paid. In the case that the National Dutch Rabbit Show or American Rabbit Breeders Association, Inc. Convention should be held in the town in which the Secretary-Treasurer resides, he/she shall receive no payment for expenses.

SECTION 3A: The Publicity Chairman shall be paid \$50.00 (fifty dollars) for each National Dutch Rabbit Show and American Rabbit Breeders Association, Inc. Convention which he/she transports American Dutch Rabbit Club, Inc. publicity items for sale at the Club booth; such funds to be paid from the Publicity Fund. In no case shall the payment be in excess of \$100.00 (one hundred dollars) per calendar year and no funds shall be paid if the show is held in the city where the Chairman resides.

SECTION 4: Each Officer, along with the Chairman of the Publicity Department, shall have the Dutch Reporter mailed to them by first class mail in lieu of any postage.

ARTICLE IV - STANDING COMMITTEES: SECTION 1: The Publicity and Promotion Committee shall consist of a Chairman and State Representative, and shall be appointed for a term of two (2) years. The Chairman of the Publicity and Promotion Committee shall be known as the Publicity and Promotion Director, and shall have charge of all publicity and promotion work for the Club except for the editorship of the Club's publication. He shall be custodian of and be responsible for the Publicity funds and give a financial report at each annual and regular meeting.

SECTION 1A: A quarterly report of the Publicity Department shall be submitted to the Secretary-Treasurer for publication in the Dutch Reporter.

SECTION 2: The Standard Committee shall consist of a Chairman and four (4) members, at least two (2) of whom shall be licensed American Rabbit Breeders Association, Inc. judges. The Standard Committee shall all be members, in good standing, of the American Dutch Rabbit Club, Inc. They shall be responsible for maintaining continuous study of the standards, receiving any requests for a working standard on a new variety, and transmitting any proposed revisions or additions to the entire American Dutch Rabbit Club, Inc. Board. Upon majority Board approval, the Secretary shall cause such proposed revisions or additions to be sent to each member in good standing with a mail ballot so that they may register their vote for or against each change, revision, or addition. If these changes, revisions, or additions are approved by a two-thirds (2/3) majority of the ballots cast, it shall be the duty of this Committee to submit them to the American Rabbit Breeders Association, Inc. Standard Committee with the recommendations that such changes, revisions, or additions be adopted.

SECTION 3: The Election Committee shall consist of a Chairman and two other members, none of whom shall reside in the same county as either the President or Secretary-Treasurer. The Election Committee shall be appointed annually by the President, from the membership, with majority approval of the Board of Directors. The Election Committee shall assemble and open the ballots, tabulate the results, and certify these results to the President, Secretary-Treasurer, and Dutch Reporter Editor within ten (10) days after the closing of the polls. If all three (3) members of the Election Committee are unable to meet to carry out these duties, the President shall be notified immediately, and different Election Committee members appointed, as needed, prior to the opening of the ballots. It is necessary that the signatures of all three (3) members of the Election Committee accompany the results as sent to the President, Secretary-Treasurer, and Dutch Reporter Editor. No member of the Election Committee shall be eligible for election to any office. Any member serving on the Election Committee shall not be eligible to serve on this Committee again for a period of three (3) years.

SECTION 4: The Auditing Committee shall consist of a Chairman and two (2) members, no two (2) of them shall either be Officers or reside in the same county as the Secretary-Treasurer. Their duty shall be to make a semi-annual audit of the fiscal period, preceding the National Dutch Rabbit Show, and the American Rabbit Breeders Association, Inc. Convention, of the Secretary-Treasurer's books and make a report there-on at these meetings. The Committee may recommend, if deemed advisable after examination, that the books be audited by a certified public accountant. The above Committee to be appointed from the membership present at the above mentioned meetings.

SECTION 5: Any special Committee deemed advisable by the President, or authorized by the Board of Directors or membership, may be appointed by the President and given specific assignment. At the completion of their assignment, they shall be discharged.

ARTICLE V - PARLIAMENTARY AUTHORITY: The rules of parliamentary procedure in Roberts Rules of Order shall govern the proceedings of the Club.

ARTICLE VI - ORDER OF BUSINESS: The order of business shall be:

- 1 - Call to order.
- 2 - Roll call of Officers.
- 3 - Reading of Minutes.
- 4 - Report of Officers.
- 5 - Report of Committees.
- 6 - Unfinished Business.
- 7 - New Business.
- 8 - Good of the Order.
- 9 - Adjournment.

ARTICLE VII - AMENDMENTS: SECTION 1: These By-Laws may be amended by a two-third (2/3) majority of votes cast. Votes to be cast by mail ballot. All members are to be notified in writing of the proposed amendment or amendments and furnished a ballot at least thirty (30) days before the closing of the polls.

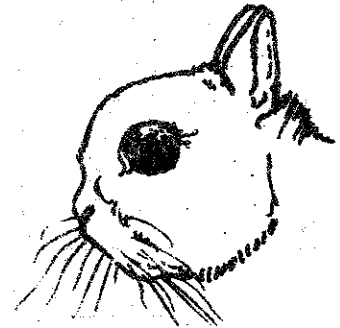

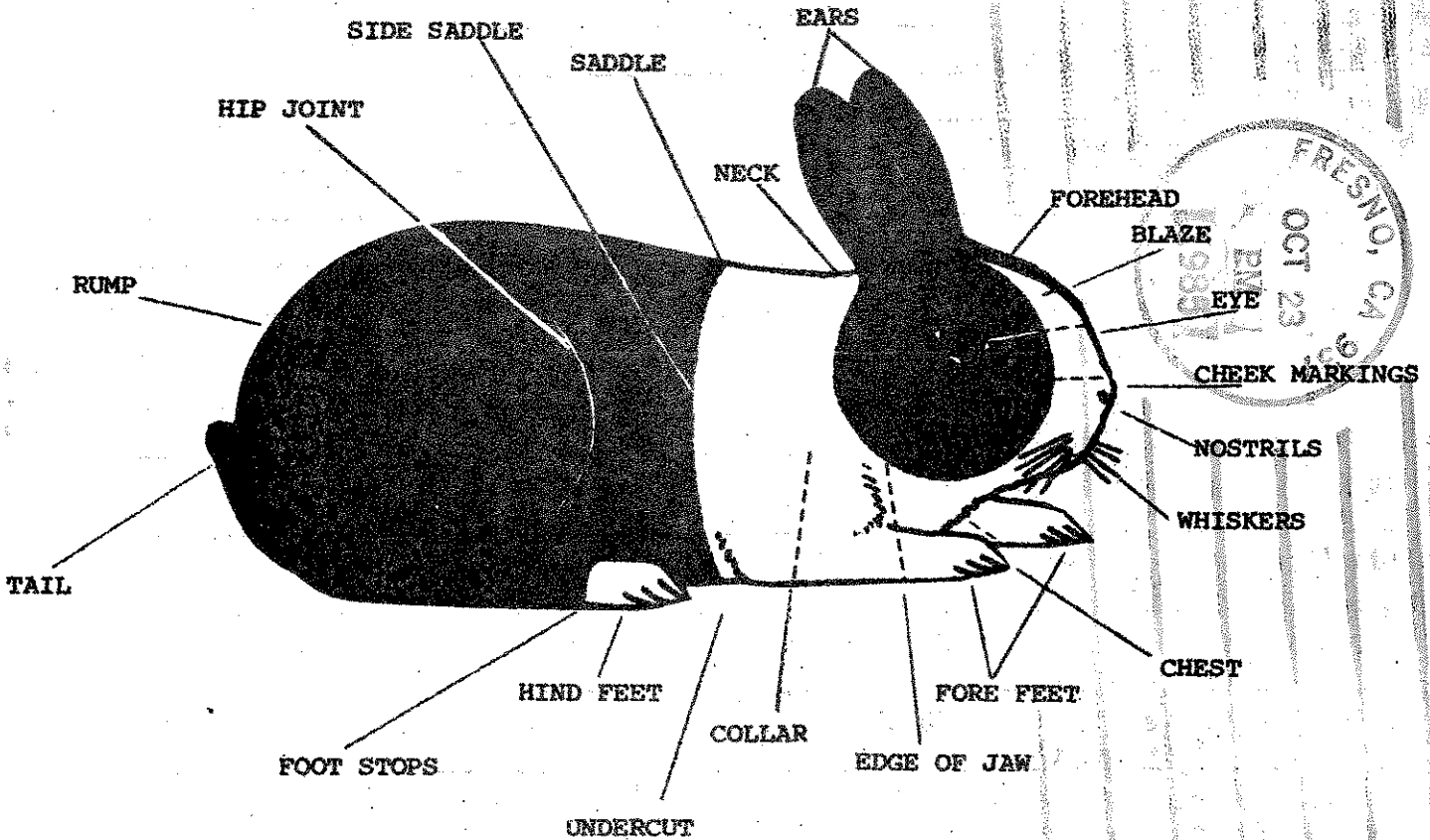

TO BE COBBY IN TYPE, COMPACT IN FORM AND LIMB. GOOD DUTCH TYPE CONSISTS OF A NICELY ROUNDED BACK, BEGINNING ALMOST IMMEDIATELY BEHIND THE HEAD AND PROGRESSING OVER THE SHOULDERS, LOIN AND RUMP TO TAIL. SHOULDERS SHOULD BE ROUNDED AND SLIGHTLY NARROWER AND LOWER THAN HIPS. RIB SPREAD SHOULD BE SO THAT THE SIDE LINES CARRY STRAIGHT THROUGH FROM THE SHOULDERS TO THE HIPS. A GOOD DUTCH SHOULD HAVE NICELY ROUNDED HIPS, VERY SMOOTH, ROUNDED UNDER VERY GRADUALLY AND SMOOTHLY. THE DUTCH SHOULD RETAIN THE COBBY, STOCKY APPEARANCE WHETHER IT WEIGHS 3½ POUNDS OR 5½ POUNDS.
