Just a couple of "hillbillies" in a little shack on the side of the mountain - Is that us? While we're not on the mountain, I can see them from my kitchen table. Every day they change - from soft misty blues to deep majestic purples.

The trip was certainly one to remember! We moved on the 8th of July, traveled for 18 hours in temperatures to 104 degrees and lost three rabbits out of 60. While the rabbits traveled remarkably well, we are paying the price of extreme heat now. Animals are moulting by handfuls; while most Dutch are white and one other color, mine seem to be white and two colors - one of old fur, the other is darker, smoother new fur. It will be months before they are ready for shows.

Like everyone else, the heat will render many of our bucks that are a year or older - sterile. We are using only our Junior bucks in order to have late Fall and Winter bunnies. I've also noticed that with extreme summer heat more litters exhibit severe cow hocks and buck teeth. I believe that due to the heat, bunnies are out of the nestbox earlier putting added stress on their legs from wire that is spaced too far apart for their little legs. In an effort to keep cooler, they breathe through their mouth, possibly causing more teeth deformities. These are just my theories - just seems funny that the number of legs that are severely cow-hocked and buck teeth are dramatically higher in hot summer months.

I'm sorry to report that one of our Directors and our Publicity Chairman have been ill. George Parmer, District 3 Director was hospitalized with possible heart disturbances; Al Butler had a heart attack on August 11 and surgery on August 22nd. I'm happy to say that both are home and recovering. We wish them and their families the best.

The A.R.B.A. Convention is just weeks away. You should have your reservations by now. The specials that are offered for the Dutch are FANTASTIC! Be sure to look for information on the convention in this issue.

A short rest is all you'll need and it will be time for the All-Southern Grand Final. It's the south's biggest and best. This year Lesley Haynie is the Dutch breed chairman and will certainly offer some excellent Dutch awards. Show date - December 10th....Place - Atlanta, GA. Why not get away from the hectic pace of the holiday season and join us?

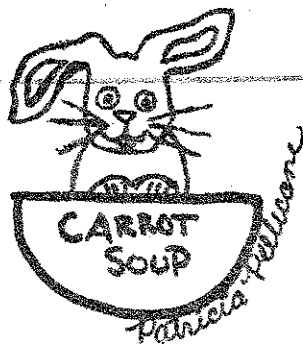

I USE THE FOLLOWING SYSTEM TO TATTOO MY YOUNG DUTCH. (1) PLACE
THE TATTOO IN AN AREA FREE OF FUR IF YOU WISH TO READ THE TATTOO
CLEARLY. (2) MAKE SURE THE PUNCTURE WOUND IS DEEP ENOUGH SO THAT
IT WILL EXCEPT ENOUGH INK. YOU MAY PRACTICE USING FILE INDEX
CARDS, USE THREE TOGETHER FOR THE PROPER AMOUNT OF PRESSURE
NEEDED TO TATTOO. (3) IMPORTANT SHAKE THE BOTTLE OF INK WELL EACH
TIME BEFORE USING. (4) USE A LIBERAL AMOUNT OF INK, (I USE A SMALL
TOOTH BRUSH, SOFT TYPE) TO APPLY INK. (5) WIPE WITH A SOFT CLOTH
PRESSING GENTLY BUT FIRMLY. OF ALL THE DIFFERENT INKS, PASTE, AND
APPLICATORS BEING USED I PREFER THE FELT TIP TYPE AS I FOUND IT
APPLYS INK IN JUST THE RIGHT AMOUNTS FOR ME. HOWEVER I DO HOLD
THE PLASTIC BOTTLE UPSIDE DOWN AND APPLY A LITTLE PRESSURE TO GET
IT FLOWING. HOPE THIS HAS BEEN OF HELP TO SOMEONE.

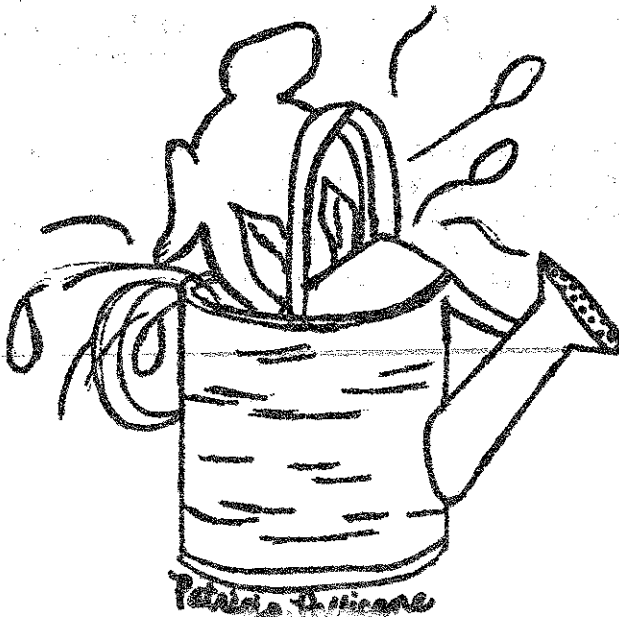

FROM THE DESK OF YOUR SECRETARY

I hope everyone is making plans to attend the 1988 ARBA Convention in Madison, Wisconsin. This issue of the DR contains some items of interest pertaining to the Convention and also a 'visitation site' letter from ARBA President Reed. I'm certain that you will find it both informative and beneficial. I hope to see you there.

In one of the 'UPCOMING' issues of the Dutch Reporter you will find a ballot for voting on new proposed standard changes. When these proposals appear, please study them carefully and make your decision. May I suggest that we all try to look at these proposals with the best interest of the breed in mind rather than what our personal likes and dislikes are. What I'm trying to say is, I feel that we should be intelligent enough to realize that just because we may personally like very low cheeks and a wide blaze doesn't mean that we should try to change the standard to accommodate ourselves and our herd. Have you ever watched someone judge your breed placing his/her emphasis, and seemingly making their placement decision based on "what a body" (!) without even a comment on the remainder of the animal? It appeared that they could care less about it's markings, fur, color or condition. I agree, you definitely need good type to make an attractive animal. But until we place more points on type, I'm afraid that we have to ask a judge to give consideration to where the other 75 points come from. I want my Dutch judged by the standard, and I want that standard to 'benefit the Dutch'!

The proposed changes must be presented to the membership for vote so that the results can be tabulated and be sent to the ARBA Standards Committee no later than June 1, 1989. This leaves ample time for the ballot to appear in either the Nov-Dec '88 / Jan-Feb '89 / or March-April '89 Dutch Reporter. You'll find the basics of these proposals in the March/April 1988 issue of the DR. The ADRC Standard Committee will make their final decision on what will appear in ballot form and will then forward this office a copy for a membership vote. Again, go over your standard ballot carefully and thoroughly 'WHEN IT'S ISSUED' and be sure to VOTE!

Once again, please check your Dutch Reporter label for your expiration date. Memberships are deleted from our files once they have lapsed over sixty (60) days. You also lose all of your sweepstake points accumulated prior to that time. Renew promptly!!

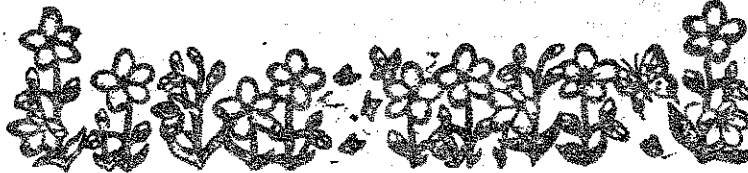

Fellow Dutch Breeders, I won't mention the weather because if you don't know how hot & dry it has been all over, some places worse than others. Well you have not been paying any attention or you are num.

This time it's Tatting. For my method look on page 73 of your 1986 guide book or page 79 of the 1975 to 1980 (+) guide book.

This method I have used for quite a few years with success. I always use India Ink Black.

I will make a few remarks though at no extra charge when the judge has to dig in the ear & wrestle the rabbit all over the table then hold it up to the light and then take the breeders work as to the tatto, something is wrong.

The rule says throw it out. So what is he or she waiting for. When the judges start enforcing this A.R.B.A. Show rule then we will start to tatto our rabbits legible. Either follow the rule or take it out of the book. This may be tough but its part of the game. Lets get with it.

If you have trouble with my method I'd like to hear about it. Always room for improvement. Don't tatto to young especially the blacks and blues. Give the ear a chance to grow some.

I'd also like to congratulate Jeanine for the last two issues of the Dutch Reporter. They were of very good quality and also showed som T.L.C. Keep up the good work Jeanine as the Dutch Reporter is our life line of the AMERICAN DUTCH RABBIT CLUB.

I would like to welcome our new Dutch Club in the Carolina area. Good luck fellow breeders.

Congratulations to the sweepstakes winners also.

I liked Martha's show reports. Not to large of print and not to small so an old man can't read them. Good job Martha!

From Your Director District 2

EARMARKING

I've talked to quit a number of people about earmarking. It seems most all do it their own way. Paste versus ink etc. I myself have never like the paste. I use India Ink. I get a fresh bottle every spring. Maybe it has frozen or got too old, but it doesn't seem to do as good a job as a fresh bottle. It is only a couple of dollars for a little peace of mind.

To start with, getting the rabbit ready for marking. I think it helps to put the rabbit in a carrying case before you tattoo. A quarter of an hour ($\frac{1}{4}$) or longer. Especially if they are a little jumpy. It seems to settle them down. I then put the letters or numbers in the clamp. Next I try it on a piece of paper to make sure I've got the right ones and the right side up. Hold the rabbit very firm. Especially the head and bottom of the ear. We don't want to tear the ear. Put in a couple of drops of ink and clamp it in. Then I rub it in with my thumb. Wipe up excess of ink. Then I coat it with vaseline. Also it wouldn't hurt to put all your letters and numbers, also the ink on the far side of the table. In case you don't have a good hold on the rabbit. Ever try finding and picking up all the pieces that have scattered all over! Then there is ink all over your hands and the table. Boy What a MESS! Watch your language, it's not the rabbits fault.

As for a system. I use even numbers for Bucks and odd for the Does. I do have a couple of does with even numbers, but when they were little I would have swore they were bucks.

A side thought. I get a kick out of watching a rabbit get disqualified, especially for the wrong sex, wrong class or some other dumb mistake. Most of the time by a so-called long time breeder. They just take it for granted. Long time breeders don't make those stupid mistakes. HA! You start looking them over better and being more careful. How many will admit it?

Back to marking. I have a doe marked H1. The little one out of that doe will be like H2 - H7 - 5H etc. till I run out of numbers then on to another letter. I only use two digits per animal. It is easier to place. Especially in small ears. And it is easier to remember too.

Like most everything else, if your way works good, then don't change. I think most everything we do with our rabbits whether it be tattoo, housing, feeding, nest box size or size of pens, etc... If it works good and no problems why change.

My brother drives a Ford product, my brother-in-law a General Motors. I drive a Chrysler product, my neighbor an import, we all get to where we want to go.

Have a good time. Save your money. See you in Madison.

Over the years we have outgrown this method somewhat because of the amount of rabbits raised. Now we try to stay close to our old method and keep very good records.

Plans are made for our trip to Madison, and I expect Sharon to start packing any day now. We hope to see a lot of friends during the fall show season and hope to make some new ones.

One method to tattoo

Our Editor has asked me to write an article on tattooing your rabbits. This is a subject there has been many articles written on, and probably each of them works equally as well as the other.

My method of tattooing rabbits is to do it when they are comparatively young. It seems the tattoo sticks a little better if it is done before the animal develops the full substance of its ear.

First, I clean the ear with rubbing alcohol. Then I clamp the desired name or number in the ear. Next I brush the ink over the tattoo and rub it in with an old toothbrush. After working the ink into the tattoo, I rub a thin coat of vaseline into the ear. This makes it very easy to wipe out excess ink. After all of the excess ink is removed from the ear, I place another thin coat of vaseline over the ear mark. This final coat of vaseline seems to seal the tattoo and also can prevent infection in the ear.

I am sure that there are many methods of tattooing, but I have found this one effective in producing a good legible ear mark.



In the years we have been members of the American Dutch Rabbit Club, This is my first letter to the DUTCH REPORTER.

Personally I have no rabbits, but my wife and daughter keeping me hopping(pun), doing repairs, ect.in their rabbitry.

When the few cooped shows that are held out here in California we found that our bucks were fighting with their neighbors through the wire. As we all know, when the bites heal, the new fur almost always come in with unwanted dark hair. We have tried to rectify this by buying some thin Plexi-glass and cutting it to 8" X 16" and drilling holes in the corners. The Plexi-glass is then wired to the inside of the coop. The plexiglass is low enough to allow air circulation, but it is high enough to keep the bucks from fighting and spraying each other.

This has allowed us to show some of our good Dutch that might have received bites which would create problems for us in the future.

Having tried black, blue, and tort Dutch, I recently decided to try grays. I purchased stock from Jan Coffelt and Lesley Hayney, and I discovered something really impressive. After breeding to black and getting mostly black litters, I bred a gray buck to a blue doe, a black doe, and a gray doe, and I ended up with three litters of all gray babies- 18 in all. The last of the litters produced the big surprise- seven showable babies! I have only been raising Dutch for five years, but I have never seen that many showable kits in one litter. I am enclosing a phot of the group to prove my point. No Dutch breeder would be surprised to hear that five of the seven are bucks...and the does, while showable, are unlikely to be winners..

In closing, I would like to thank the previously mentioned breeders, as well as Marti Dill, who sold me my first good Dutch. I have found rabbit breeders helpful and generous, and I thank them for giving me a great new hobby.
