

SECRETARY'S CHIT-CHAT

I don't think I need to tell the membership that the 1964 ARBA Convention will go down in history as one of the liveliest in the history of that association. Not only has the amount of discussion and letter writing since the report of the acceptance of the new Constitution and By-laws been of tremendous volume and along a very serious vein, showing that most of us who have long been members of the parent body have been doing some deep thinking about where the path leads, but there have been other developments of another nature which to me at least, are rather indicative of a passive resistance on the part of the breeders. Let me explain what I mean: In 1963 there were 31 combination memberships paid in to this office for ARBA. In the first three months of 1964 there were 11 members paid their dues through this office. During these same periods, Jan. 1963 through March 1964, there were 24 members paid their dues to the ADRC through the ARBA office. Since April 1, 1964 there have been only 9 members joined our club through the ARBA office and only three have paid their Dutch Club dues through the ARBA office. Perhaps this is not a significant drop, but coupled with all of the letters from you members who write me that you are not sure you will be paying such a combination in 1965, it certainly expresses a trend. It goes without saying that everyone is not happy with the situation as it now stands.

Since the last report I have recieved an additional \$10.00 to place on Dutch at Springfield -- this came from Bill Raymond of Indianapolis, plus a pledge of \$5.00 from Bill Hobin of Cranston, R.I. This makes a grand total of \$78.00 to be offered on Dutch at Springfield. Will you be there to get your share?

Received a note from Katherine Roberts of Kansas City expressing a liking for my rabbit recipes in the July issue and sending along her favorite as follows:

RABBIT MEAT LOAF: 3 pounds uncooked rabbit meat, ground.
 1/2 pound pork sausage
 3 teaspoons salt
 pepper to taste
 3 stalks celery, chopped
 1 medium onion, minced
 3 eggs
 cracker crumbs to thicken

Mix ingredients in order given. Shape into loaf. Chill overnight. Bake in 350 oven for about 1 1/2 hours.

Katherine says, "This has been served at least twice at Kaw Valley Rabbit Club shows and is always popular." She also suggests it might be a good idea to add a "Women's Page" to our Dutch Reporter. Any comments?




