

1969 A:R:B.A. Convention I crossed the line in 69..... By: Don Reid

Saturday, Sept. 20th, our neighbor drove us to O'Hare Airport where we took Continental Flight #21 at 9 A.M. that took us to Denver, Colo. We had a very nice breakfast on the plane and arrived at Denver at 10:08 A.M. We checked into Western Airline and had a few minutes to shop at terminal. Muriel saw some nice turguoise at Western Shop that sells things made by Indians. We decided to check it again on our return trip. We were off at 10:55 A.M. and arrived at Calgary at 12:04 (noon) Looks as if only took three hours but we had almost an hour at Denver and picked up two hours flying West. At the Grand Finals for the N.Y.S. circuit held at Henrietta, N.Y. and sponsored by the Rochester Club, a Black and White Dutch owned by J. Richard Cooper, Breesport N.Y. won Best in Show. Show Supt. William Buell had not released the Best of Breeds and each was brought to the judging table to be discussed. Judges, Bob Byrne and Sam Gerardi conferred on the rabbits and they were remarked on, one by one, not in any order. Judge Byrne carefully gave remarks about each one andrepeatedly stated that there were some exceptionally good rabbits to choose from. Some of the Best of Breeds were better than the majority of those he had judged in the past. Finally, the choice narrowed to a White Plish, nearly perfect, owned by Frank Pandino and a Black and White Dutch owned by Mr. Cooper. This Senior Doe must have been pretty good. Other entries by Cooper included; Best Blue, Best Opp. Black and Best Black Jr., Best Choc Doe and Best Choclate. He took a "Best" in every color he entered.

To make the week end more exciting, he was presented with a plaque naming him, "Outstanding Breeder" Wayne County's William Valcore presented four plaques to breeders who had been especially helpful to his club.

This plaque, plus trophies for Best of Breed Dutch and Best in Show and the announcement that he was high point winner (dutch) for state trophy really made for an exciting week-end.
