

# President's MESSAGE

nother National Dutch Show has come and gone. I hope it was enjoyable for all of those who attended. A record entry of 375 was entered in the youth show and 624 in the open for a total of 999 Dutch. There were 160 entered in the fur classes, and 12 in the AOV class.

I can't thank those who helped out enough. We had seventeen people show up to help set up. Thanks go out to those who drove in from Indiana. Illinois. Pennsylvania, and Ohio to assist. It was very nice to be able to leave the showroom on Thursday evening at 7:30, with most of the set-up finished. And to those who helped clean-up, many thanks! Breeders from not only here in Ohio, but those from California who had a later flight, and some from New Jersey who still had to drive home, helped dismantle the showroom. We even had some breeders come to the show with no Dutch, yet they came to help write and did so all day. Once again thank-you.

Congratulations to the winners of the show! Fran Schettler had a nice showing with Best Dutch, Best Choc and Best Tort! Val Slack from Indiana had the Best Opp in open. The youth winners were Kristina and Michelle Blythe from South Dakota, and Emily Smith from Michigan. The winning was spread out among breeders in both open and youth. Good job to all!

We had a productive Board meeting on Friday night. To highlight a few items that were discussed; It was decided that our youth do have voting rights - providing they have an adult membership. The youth membership was created to give a price break to families. It only costs a couple of dollars more to have voting rights. Seems fair to me. Our Breeder of the Year was discussed and it was approved. Look elsewhere in this issue for details. We voted to table the Rabbit of the year pending some more work on the guidelines for selecting the winner.

Eric Mixdorf led a discussion on the early issues that the standards committee has been discussing. I would encourage you to make your opinions known on the various sections of the standard that they may be proposing to change. Letters to Eric and the Dutch Reporter will make sure

that we have plenty of discussion before it is time for the membership to vote.

The Board approved the Bid from the Kansas Dutch Club for the 1998 NDS and the 1999 Bid to host the NDS from the Upper Midwest Dutch Club in Wisconsin. Any help from you on these shows would be appreciated.

The Board also discussed creating a quality points contest. This was tabled until the fall pending more detailed information.

The Board had a lengthy discussion on new member retention. We will be working on this over the summer and hope to have something put together by the fall meeting.

Roger Guetschow has blocked off forty rooms at the Fairfield Hotel in Madison. He says that it is much nicer than the ARBA Headquarters.

One item that I want to mention. I was walking through the showroom at the NDS and a small doe caught my eye. I recognized this animal from the ARBA convention last fall. It was entered in the Jr Doe Class then, and now! It had the longer toenails of an animal that is well over six months of age, and it had the same owner. Then as I was watching the Blue Jr Doe Class, I saw the judge turn over a doe, which also had daggers for toenails, and it had dark rings on the toenails. The judge saw this as well as you could see by the expression on his face. Both of these animals were small and too old to be juniors. These two animals should not have been in the show - even if they were good. Toenails are a dead giveaway. Why would you show that animal?





### **ODDS AND ENDS**

How to rebuild a water system. It

crashed. The early warm weather that we had in April fooled me into thinking the cold weather was gone. (It normally is by then for us.) I was working in the barn and I turned the thermostat off that controls the heat cables in my water lines. Fifteen degrees shattered many of the pipes and I had to rebuild. Moral of this story - The system is good, but don't turn off the thermostat.

The Blue Steels are proving to be

very productive. The Best Opp Dutch at this years NDS was out of a Blue-Steel and a Blue Steel Grandfather. My Best Gray was out of the same Blue-Steel doe, and she has very nice color. My Best Opp Gray had the same Blue Steel Grandam. In all I had 11 Steels or grays at the NDS that had a Blue-Steel parent or Grandparent. The Gray and Steel Color out of the Blue-Steel is nice.

I have raised my first litter of Gold to Gold. Three Golds and a Tort. The Golds show much improvement in the brightness

of their color and less of the Agouti factor form the gray is showing up. The tort was a nice Tort buck with good color. A long coat of fur spoiled the brightness of his color. He did not have a white tail as was cautioned by our ARBA Standards Chairman, Tex Thomas. His caution was that since breeders would be crossing Torts to Golds, and the Golds have a white bottom to the tail, we would see more white tails on our torts. Not so far. I will keep everyone advised of this as I get more Gold bunnies.


One proposal on a possible Standard

Revision was to take two point and allot those to feet and legs. These point would come from the body type, yet indirectly would be still on the body - feet and legs. I like trying to increase the importance of the proper feet and legs, but I don't like to see those points come from the body point allotment. A breeder working on her registrars license asked me for a Dutch lesson the other day at a show. She said that by reading the Standard, the body type is not that important. We know that it is, but that is not the impression. Would we dare steal a point from every marking to allot for the body type? Most Dutch breeders know that a good Dutch will have good body and okay markings. While a Dutch with Great markings and no body type, is a bad Dutch.



#### AMERICAN DUTCH RABBIT CLUB BOARD OF DIRECTOR'S MEETING MINUTES

Board Members in attendance were: President Kevin Hooper, Vice President Wayne MacKinnon, Secretary/Treasurer Doreen Bengtson, District One Directors Martin Preede, Sue Peters, Todd Uran, District Two Directors Rick Billups, Richard Gehr, Sharon Mixdorf, District Three Directors Fran Schettler, Wenton Carlton and guests Eric Mixdorf and Julia Anderson. Absent was District Three Director George Parmer.

President Hooper entertained a motion by Richard Gehr to dispense with the reading of the minutes because they had been previously printed in the Dutch Reporter, seconded by Rick Billups, carried.

#### Report of Officers:

Rick Bullups- Dutch in the state and district are holding their own. Good showings in the Carolinas/DC areas. A member in the area is talking about a National Dutch Show in the Tennessee area by 2000.

Todd Uran - Youth in his area are increasing in numbers, several large shows are coming up soon. Wayne MacKinnon - Things are pretty quiet in the northeast. The New England Dutch Club is having secretary problems.

Martin Preede - Martins part of the northeast at present doesn' have too many shows scheduled, but there is some youth activity starting to blossom.

Sue Peters - There have been some encouraging showings of Dutch in Sue's territory, especially the Waynesburg, Pennsylvania Dutch Special. "Dutch people will come out if the judge is good."

Sharon Mixdorf - Numbers at the shows are down, but Dutch is the highest showing breed in Iowa in open competition and the second highest in youth.

The resolutions were printed in the January/February Dutch Reporter and will be printed again in the July/August Dutch Reporter along with the ballot for voting by the membership.

Dutch Reporter Committee - Julia Anderson reports the Dutch Reporter is doing real well. Advertisers are renewing their ads as they come due and new people are advertising in each issue. Please keep the articles coming.

Special Awards Committee - Sharon Mixdorf presented a preliminary report of the actions of her committee. They are presently working on an outstanding Dutch rabbit of the year as well as an outstanding Dutch member of the year. 

#### FROM THE RABBIT'S VIEW

I have just read Kevin Hooper's article, the part about conditioning. One can learn a lot from Kevin, and I have had three bucks sent from him a few years ago and have been 500% happy with all three.

However, this is an opinion. It seems that more than a few people view their rabbits (especially show rabbits) more as living objects. I have had rabbits in 4-H and a couple of other times before I started breeding Dutch. I have always tried to keep my bunnies happy. How many people think about that? It is true a good rabbit is in the breeding, but rabbits are living and breathing beings with likes and dislikes and very capable of boredom.

They can do well on pellets, water and little or nothing else. But are they happy? The way to a rabbit's heart is through its stomach. Along with pellets I give grass hay twice a week. They dig and play, as well as eat it. Carrots & tops, apples, parsley, and romaine are fed to nursing does. They have pine cones to play with

and chew. Sure it takes extra time and a little more money, but are they not worth it? The pets, rescues and borders that hang out here are treated the same.

I also do not inbreed. Nature is not set up for their members to continually inbreed. I line breed at a distance and cross unrelated lines. My cages are roomy for the bucks too. I let them out to exercise when I can. They should have more. Just rabbits in a cage hides their personalities.

My Dutch have been winning for 6 1/2 years, lots of BOB's and BOS, a best 4 (& several honorable mentions) and just missed 2 runnerups to Best in Show after a standoff with a Florida White.

I do believe in animal welfare and it is common sense that any animal who has to spend its life or most of it confined to a cage, should be able to enjoy that life as much as possible.



# UP CLOSE AND PERSONAL WITH THE MIXDORFS

t's been said that if the Dutch rabbit had never existed, chances are Eric and Sharon Mixdorf may have never met. Between the two of them they share over 35 years of raising rabbits and Dutch in particular.

Eric inherited his rabbit skills, since the age of 4, from his father who has shown rabbits since the early 1960's. Also, almost all of his brothers and sisters continued with the tradition with rabbits as their 4H/ FFA projects. His first rabbit that he can recall was a Chocolate Dutch buck suitingly named "Peter Rabbit". It was in his high school years that he began actively breeding, culling and showing his own Dutch. At that time, there was no vouth division in the Dutch club and Eric learned quickly by showing against the veteran Dutch breeders - David Paul, Dale Zentner, Lowell Simonson, Roger Eich among others. Rather than get discouraged he continued to cull his herd closely and after a time began to win once in a while.

The interest in Dutch in Iowa began to blossom in the early 1980's and the Iowa State Dutch Rabbit Club was formed in which Eric served as secretary/treasurer for many years. Since then Eric has served as show secretary for the 1986 NDS, served on the seller's class committees, and is currently chairman on the Dutch standards committee. Eric considers his biggest win being awarded Best Tortoise at the 1991 NDS in Wellington, Ohio, and his biggest regret over the years, not being at that show to see the rabbit win along-side his fiancee Sharon Fait.

Sharon (Fait) Mixdorf began raising Dutch in October 1981, with a Chocolate doe that was found in a park near her home in Marshfield, Wisconsin. A week after getting this doe, it gave birth to two Chocolate Dutch bunnies.

Sharon and her twin sister Karen (Gates) had been raising mixed breed rabbits for about 3 years before this. After several litters of Dutch, they decided to show a

few at their local fair, where they learned about the ARBA. Through the ARBA yearbook they learned there was a local club which Sharon joined and from this club the twins learned of sanctioned rabbit shows.

This led to wanting Dutch with pedigrees and in 1986 they attended their first NDS in Des Moines, IA, where they first met Eric Mixdorf

In 1987 Sharon and Karen had their first Best in Show, with a Blue doe they raised. This doe produced the Black jr. buck which won BOSV Black at the Madison ARBA Convention in 1988 for them. This same buck is pictured on the wristwatch Sharon wears to this day.

In 1989 Sharon and Eric became better aquatinted at the ARBA banquet in Tulsa, OK. After talking and dancing that evening they continued to correspond with on another by letters and seeing one another at a few shows now and then. Things kind of fell into place from there and they were engaged on Easter Sunday in 1991.

Eric and Sharon were married in May 1992 and continue to be active in the Dutch breed and ADRC. Sharon is currently a District 2 director and chairman of the special awards committee and Eric reports the Dutch happenings in the Domestic Rabbit magazine. They have raised all 6

varieties of Dutch but currently have Blacks, Blues, Chocolates and Tortoise. Their rabbitry, named Hawkeye Dutch, consists of around 60 adult animals of which a handful are Dwarfs and Tans and the rest Dutch. They show at around 15 - 20 shows a year with about 8 - 12 animals per show. The building consists of a garage with 70 holes. A north-side overhead door with a large screen door, along with eastside and southside windows provide ventilation. Fans are used for air movement in the hot humid summers and a furnace keeps it heated to around 40 degrees in the winter months.

Eric and Sharon have been working hardest on getting better heads on their does and nice full hindquarters on their Dutch. They enjoy helping out the youth and have donated many quality animals in the Dutch seller's class over the years. "Although it's fun to win, it's even nice to hear how much good luck other breeders have had with your stock" is a philosophy Eric and Sharon strive for. "It's then that you know you are really promoting the Dutch breed and not your pocketbook."

Whenever you feel like "talking Dutch", give Eric and Sharon a call or stop by when you are in the area. Bring an empty carrier. They live in Waterloo, a town of around 70,000 in Northeast Iowa.

### **NATIONAL DUTCH SHOW OPEN WINNERS**

### OUR OHIO SURPRISE By Fran Schettler, California

ver since my husband Jim and I became active in Dutch, the National Dutch Show has been, at least to us, the most prestigious Dutch show ever, even surpassing the ARBA Convention show. Maybe it's because it's the three day, all-Dutch emphasis, but, whatever the reason, it is the show we always try to attend. It also has been an important show to us because, back when we first got into showing Dutch at the national level at the Des Moines NDS in May 1986, California Dutch were the joke of the whole country. At that time, over 10 years ago, California Dutch were big, long bodied animals with long, narrow heads and long ears. One of our goals has always been to reestablish the credibility of California Dutch and where better to do it than the National Dutch Show.

Having attended several National Dutch Shows and a few ARBA Conventions all over the country, another point of interest is that, for West Coast breeders, a National Dutch show on the West Coast is quite different than going to one elsewhere in the country. Not only is the overall "flavor" of the show different from what a West Coast exhibitor is used to, but you get to meet so many other breeders of Dutch that you've never met before, and you get to see the large quantities of outstanding Dutch in "hotbeds of Dutch" areas such as Ohio-it's quite special. Therefore, winning Best of Breed at the 1997 Ohio National Dutch Show carries an extra special "high" for us, more so than our win at the 1991 Pomona ARBA Convention.

We were certainly surprised that our junior tort doe did so well. I almost didn't even bring her! She was only three months old, but had been competing very well in a few earlier shows. She had gone slightly off feed about four days before the NDS, which caused her to lose some of her condition and started her coat slipping. Daily grooming helped the coat, and alfalfa hay and rolled oats kept her eating something. It was a last minute decision to go ahead and bring her. Fly to the show

with one empty hole? No way! I had hopes for her prior to her "hunger strike". only to be very disappointed when she apparently decided that California spring weather was too hot to handle. Either that or she can read a calendar, which was hung in the barn on the wall just opposite her cage. When you come to a show like this, you generally have a pretty good idea which animals you've brought have the best chance, and I was pretty sure that she'd temporarily lost her competitive edge. I was more hopeful about our junior chocolate doe, who, surprisingly, actually bloomed right in time for the show. (Now I know that she definitely CAN'T read the calendar from her cage).

It was very exciting to win one variety at the NDS, even more exciting to win two varieties, and we would certainly have gone home happy at that point. To then come to the realization that the judge's long deliberations were to try and decide between our two animals for either Best or Best Opposite of Breed was a total shock. Those two poor animals certainly were taken in and out of their judging coops a lot of times during the final accounting! I still find it amazing that the four open judges had to discuss the choice between the two does for such a long period of time before deciding. Talk about suspense! I think that the people we talked to were was pretty evenly split on which animal they liked the best. I am even more pleased that two varieties who seldom take top honors over the blacks and blues were even considered. Thinking back over the years, I can't remember a chocolate ever winning, though I can remember a tort or
