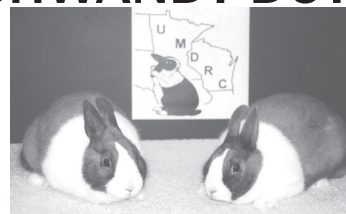

Nest Box Basics

*H*ere are a few

comments and thoughts on Nest Boxes and what has worked for me in the past.

- Place the nest box with the doe on the 28th day.

- The size that we use for dutch is 8" X 12" X 8" high.

- I make most of the nest boxes out of 5/8 inch plywood with 3/8" drain holes

- We place 2 handfuls of shavings, and line the rest of the box with straw leaving a large hole in the middle for the doe to make her nest.

- I like to secure the box in one of the back corners of the coop with a single wood-screw to prevent it from moving or tipping over.

- Sometimes you can tell if the doe is going to refuse to use the nest box by watching her behavior after you have placed the box in her coop. If she removes all the straw from the box and places it elsewhere (like the other back corner) of the coop, chances are she is NOT going to use the nest box, and will probably have them on the wire. Things you can try if this happens: Try a different nest box (it may smell different) & put it in the other corner where she has been putting the straw, or try putting a nest boxes in both back corners of her coop(use TWO boxes).

- If this doesn't seem to work and all else fails a good way to save the litter is to place cardboard in the cage and turn the coop into one big nest box so it won't matter where she make her nest. First remove the doe from the coop, cut and install cardboard on the bottom and up about 4 inches around the sides of the coop. I use hog-rings or wire ties to keep the cardboard in place. Than put about 6 to 8 inches of straw in the bottom of her cage leave the nest box in as it will take up space and you won't need as much straw plus she may decide to use it after all.

Now you will be able to get a good nights sleep because you won't have to worry about losing a litter on the wire. The next morning remove the

doe, and search the coop for the nest it maybe hard to locate as it is usually all covered up with straw, separate the nest from the remaining straw and place it in the nest box, getting as much of the fur as you can. At this time all the extra straw and cardboard can be removed and the doe can be put back along with her litter in the nest box.

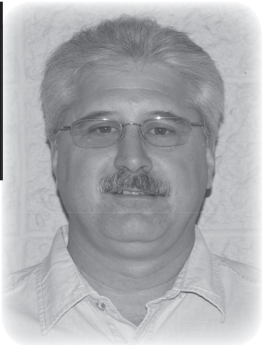
The behavior I like to see when I place a nest box in with a doe is for her to jump in the box and start digging at the bottom she may jump in and out of the box several times with a mouthful of straw but at some point she starting arranging the straw in the box, and pulls a little bit of fur, placing it in the box and than leaves the nest box alone until the next day or two when she gives birth. If you see that behavior you should be able to get a good nights sleep also.

Good Luck with those nest boxes and let me know how it goes.

On another note, I hope everyone is making

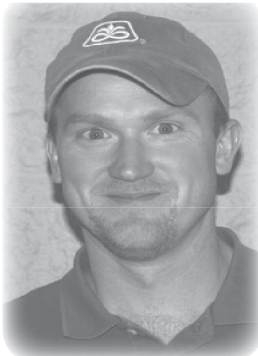

The difference in ventilation and temperature was noticeable immediately. Now it can get up to eighty degrees and I don't need to turn the fans on, which has saved us on the electric bill. I don't know why I didn't think of this sooner. Sure the barn doesn't look as nice, but the bunnies are comfortable. It does get cool in the barn at night with that open, but hopefully that will keep the ears a bit shorter.

The show season generally comes to a halt during the summer around here. We did attend a show hosted by a brand new club this July. There are many county fairs in Illinois that have sanctioned shows but only one in Wisconsin, in addition to the Wisconsin State Fair held in August. It is difficult

I have learned to at least examine the pedigree to check out what varieties are in the background after purchasing a black buck on the Dutch auction and finding out that it was out of all steel breeding. I did not raise steel at that time, so I then sold it to the contending bidder. At one time I was interested in a Tort until seeing that it had harlequin breeding behind it. I will admit that I am the type of breeder that is open to experimenting with rabbits that others would have no interest in. If it is an exceptional rabbit for a good deal, I am willing to give it a try and see what happens.

The Dutch Club has lost a member and co-chair of the publicity committee in the passing of Dan Monahan. Our thoughts and prayers go out to Todd and all of Dan's loved ones.

Good luck to all those able to attend the National ARBA Convention in California this fall. Unfortunately we will not be attending, though we wish we could. Maybe those of us that are unable to attend convention will decide to travel a little farther out of our normal show radius to show some Dutch and catch up with friends.

ASK THE JUDGE

A member mentioned a bit of frustration while a class was being judged and people were chitchatting at length with the judge. Can the judge fairly view the rabbit while holding a conversation? On the other hand, some judges stop judging to hold conversations of several minutes in length, thereby creating delays in judging the classes. As a judge, how do you handle it when someone wants to talk to you while you are judging a class, or even if you wish to talk to someone? And, can you fairly evaluate the rabbits if you are holding a conversation?

From Jan Coffelt:

I personally think that a little light conversation at the judging table is relaxing while I am judging and sometimes makes the judging more personal and interesting to all in attendance. However the judge needs to keep the conversation short and pertinent to the judging. They must be careful not to engage in conversations that are not relevant to the task at hand. To do so gives the impression to those exhibitors in attendance that you are not paying attention to the animals being examined.

Judges who spend a lot of time talking may be entertaining and may even seem educational, however extra conversation steals time. When you

are expected to do at least 250 animals per show, conversation needs to be kept at a minimum.

Exhibitors share in the responsibility of too much conversation at the table. They should hold their lengthy questions until the judging is completed. If questions are asked at the judging table they need to be careful not to disclose who is the owner of the rabbit in question.

From Kevin Hooper:

This is a great question. The answer probably is "It depends." The main thing to consider here is that judges are people too. We enjoy talking rabbits, and life in general. I, as many people know, like to crack one-liners. I can do this while judging without missing a beat. That light atmosphere is one in which I am comfortable, and I can make the correct (at least as I see the Standard) decision. However, if the conversation relates to something that the judge is passionate about, or aggravates them, that can break the concentration and slow the class markedly. For me, that would be discussing an Ohio State football game the day after a loss!

Typically, these types of conversations are seen more at local shows. The bigger and more difficult the class, the less conversation should be heard.

Also, some times an exhibitor may need to talk to one of the judges on a more private issue, or the judge may need to talk to the exhibitor. In this case, this should be done when there is a pause in the action as opposed to stopping mid class for a lengthy conversation.

Like everywhere else in life, sometimes judges may not make the best decision in the timing, or length of time that they choose to have a discussion. If this seems to be the norm with a judge, a complaint should be filed with the ARBA.

ASK THE BREEDER

How do you get started in raising Dutch? How do you choose a breeder to purchase from? Do you ask for a pair of Dutch or a trio? What should a breeder sell you (type, color, markings)?

From Kevin Hooper:

I like many other breeders got my start when my brother had rabbits in 4-H. We lived on a small farm and dad said we did not have the room to raise hogs. Well, in looking back, how much room would a few hogs have taken? I know how much room about 15 - 20 outside rabbit hutches took!



My first rabbit - a Dutch - came from a friend of my brothers. She was a typical pet rabbit. After I showed an interest in raising them, we bought one from a local breeder. Then after attending a few shows, I bought from a state breeder, then another and another. We had many to choose from in Ohio, and still do!

When starting, it is important to purchase animals that will work together. Usually, this means animals with some common ancestry. This could mean any number of animals, depending on what you might want. I always would try to find what I needed preferably in one rabbit, but often you would have to bring in more than one to find the desired traits.

A breeder should sell you what you want. What you want should always include a good Dutch body, with good type - thicker ears, bold eye, good bone, straight legs, etc. Even if you want or need some marking improvement, don't sacrifice much in the way of Dutch type.

From Jill E. Pfaff:

Getting started raising Dutch in my opinion is like anything else, do your homework so you can ask questions and don't forget to listen. Join ARBA & ADRC, go to shows, at the show table you can learn a lot about the rabbits and the people which will help you choose the breeder to get your start from. I recommend starting with just a pair to new rabbit breeders but if you are an experienced rabbit breeder a group of 5 is the best way to get going fast so that you have two bucks and you can breed offspring to the other buck for your second generation.

Type should always come first in my opinion, new breeders shouldn't expect someone to hand them perfect Dutch, for one thing they don't exist which is part of the fun! Many animals are what I call parts rabbits, they have a trait you want and then some you don't want so try to match up with one that compliments the faults. Bucks are the most important part of your breeding herd genetically speaking they have more impact, look for a masculine buck with a nice head, good ears that have substance and are well furred. I don't usually keep herd bucks that have more than one marking flaw. I look for overall evenness in markings: cheeks, belt and stops.

From Fran Schettler:

Getting started in Dutch can happen in many ways depending on many factors. If you're already in

rabbits, you will have much more access to a wide variety of breeders from whom you can purchase stock and gain knowledge of the breed. If you are not already in rabbits, it pretty much comes down to finding your closest local Dutch breeder and establishing a relationship with them. Hopefully this local breeder is reputable and has good stock and good knowledge of the breed.

This is pretty much how Jim and I got started in Dutch about 25 years ago. We didn't even know that rabbit shows existed, but Jim, who was born in Pennsylvania, had had pet Dutch as a kid. In my great wisdom after we got married, I decided to give him a pet rabbit for his birthday and found a newspaper ad from a local breeder of American Chins. So Princess was our first rabbit, but, more importantly, the breeder let drop that there were RABBIT SHOWS! We were astounded. We went to a nearby show and thus acquired our first pair of Dutch. From there we found a couple of local breeders and thus met Dorothy Bayliss and Bobbie Meyer. Dorothy Bayliss took us from our first pair of black Dutch purchased at that first show into all six colors and much of our beginning knowledge was gained from her over the next few years. We were very fortunate that she was relatively nearby and was extremely knowledgeable about rabbits. Even more importantly, she put up with all our questions and phone calls. Without her mentorship, we would not have made it.

Needless to say, California Dutch back then were a major joke when it came to type. Once we were smart enough to realize this, we knew we had to bring in stock from elsewhere in the country. About then, Scott Williamson came to California. Between animals that we brought in from the national shows and the animals that Scott helped us acquire, California Dutch have become some of the best in the country.

When we were first purchasing our new stock for each variety, we either bought a pair or a trio from Dorothy. Once we knew more, we purchased the best all around bucks at the national shows that we could talk people out of. These bucks were usually not intended for sale! Crossing these bucks with the Bayliss does who were great mothers and well colored although too large with poor heads was our starting challenge. It took several years before we were nationally competitive, but we made it!

Finding a supportive mentor who has the breed smarts and rabbit husbandry is likely to be the key to your success coupled with the willingness to buy AND cull smartly, work hard and persevere in the bad times is what will ultimately make you a success!



From Kristy Hume:

Our family originally got into breeding Dutch rabbits when I was very young. It was our 4-H project for my older brother and I. We had gotten a Dutch rabbit from a family friend, and I was so young I honestly can't tell you how we acquired any of our other initial breeding stock. I have heard stories of the first time my brother showed our rabbits, the notorious "I'm a newbie!" Pet Taxi in tow and almost, if not all, of our rabbits being disqualified for being mismarked. We had basically no guidance, but we figured it all out sooner or later. We never showed much but 4-H shows, so it's hard telling with the knowledge I have today what our animals were really like.

Anyway, my older brother lost interest in rabbits, I found myself spending all of my time with my pony, so we sold everything; all of our rabbits, cages, crocks, etc. to a lady for an insanely low price. No one realized that years later we'd be kicking ourselves on that decision! I have always been very active in showing animals at my county fair, and when I got a new, young Warmblood horse that I was going to ride strictly dressage, I needed a new animal to take to the fair to show. I offhandedly decided I'd like to get a few Dutch rabbits and breed them again.

This time around though, we had my step-mom, Julie. She is the research queen! She got online and looked through articles and on websites to see who the big names in Dutch in our state were. We wanted nice rabbits, so we went to those who were winning at the time. We connected up with open breeder Tom Dietrich and youth breeder Steven Stump. We didn't really know what we were looking for as far as the standard of Dutch went. Markings were easy enough, but type we had no clue about. We went to breeders with the intent that we didn't need "perfect" rabbits- we actually were looking for older brood stock that they were replacing, but were still young enough to use. I really think this was a wise route, because I know now that personally, I have sold some really exceptional older brood does that were being replaced by their daughters, but if someone had coming looking to buy those daughters instead, there's no way I would have sold them because I want to show and breed them! Another thing that pertains to this conversation is that I don't think it's a good idea to go to breeders necessarily looking for show rabbits. I think that for the most part, especially with does, you're going to end up with a lower quality animal that probably will do average on the show table, and then when it hits

breeding age, there is always the chance you're going to end up with the one rabbit out of every dozen or so that doesn't want to breed, passes away during maiden birth, etc.

When we went to Tom's place, he showed us a variety of rabbits and talked to us about colors and right then and there I set in stone that I was going to raise blacks and blues by buying an older blue brood doe, a black buck with blue background, and a nice little black junior doe. We didn't have any knowledge of torts, steels and grays, so we never were really interested in them, but we did know about not crossing our blues and chocolates because of the lilac issue. The rabbits Tom sold me were exceptional, and I can never thank him enough for selling such quality animals to a youth breeder just starting up. Within months I was raising my very own babies that were winning on the show table from the two older animals, and the junior doe I showed once just to see how she would do, and the little gal ended up winning BOB.

I wasn't able to go to Steven's house, so my parents bought a pair from him for me. We got a pair of blacks, both older, proven breeding animals. They were a little different breeding from my other three, but still went back to the Tommy D line. I had a lot of success crossing them into my other three.

Now that it has been a few years and my knowledge of Dutch has grown in leaps and bounds, these are the tips I have for someone just getting into the hobby. First and foremost, research is the key! The web is an un-ending source of information of articles, breeders, etc. I also recommend going to the shows and meeting the breeders. Most of them are more than willing to show you what type and markings you should be looking for in your rabbits, it is so much easier to learn when you can actually get your hands on rabbits. Buy a Standard of Perfection to become familiar with markings, but type will just take practice. I think that if you have the room and want to seriously get into Dutch, a group of 5 rabbits (2 bucks and 3 does) is a nice number, preferably not all from the same breeder. You want lines that cross well, but not that are so similar that your rabbits get inbred. Make sure your colors are breeding compatible (again, all this information can be found in books and online). When looking for breeding animals, it's important to remember that markings are only half the points, your rabbits also need type! These days, if your rabbit has poor type, it is going nowhere on the show table. Judges are a lot more



forgiving to a few marking flaws than a flat, long rabbit. Personally, I like my bucks to be really nice animals. They should have good markings and great type. You can use one buck on so many does, that you don't want an animal with a severe flaw, whether it be marking or type, when he is crossing on so many animals. As for does, it's the opposite, you can afford to have one with a marking flaw or two, even ones that make them unshowable (tied elbows, split stops) and it's much easier to breed those flaws out. But I never compromise on type on my does!

Last but not least, if you're serious about raising quality Dutch, remember that what you buy is what you get. Nice animals are going to cost more money, but in the end, it should take less time to establish your rabbitry with nice animals and if you get a winning reputation, you will be able to recoup that money in the sales of their babies.

How to Combat Snuffles

Probably the single most common question I am asked is how to cure snuffles. As expected this is not a simple answer.

There are two different treatments plans depending on if you are a breeder or a pet person. I will begin with advice to breeders. If you own rabbits as pets, please skip the breeder section. Breeders - please read both sections.

There are at least four different bacteria responsible for this disease, so I prefer to call it snuffles rather than by a specific bacteria. These cultures were taken directly from the sinus of euthanized rabbits after a sterile preparation of the skin over the sinus area to insure there was no skin contamination, and that I cultured only the organism responsible for the nasal discharge.

Snuffles can have several different presentations leading me to often refer to this disease as the snuffles complex. Classic snuffles is a thick nasal discharge which can be seen at the nostril at rest or when the rabbit sneezes. Other forms include abscesses in the lungs, skin, jaw, middle ear, behind the eye, reproductive tract, joints, naval and hocks.

The exudate formed is thick and will not easily drain.

For Breeders Only

The goal of breeders is produce rabbits which are the best in health as well as having the desired breed characteristics regardless if these are commercial or fancy rabbits. The healthiest rabbits will come from the healthiest stock. The healthiest stock comes from culling out inferior specimens.

Before you decide you have snuffles in your herd, be sure you have a clean, dust free barn. I will pull out my power washer, and power wash cages paying particular attention to ceilings of the barn as well as the cages to be sure falling dust is not contributing to the problem. If you have a dusty barn causing sneezing, the rabbits will stop sneezing immediately. Monthly power washing is recommended when rabbits are housed in a barn.

When faced with snuffles in a herd, I recommend you do not use antibiotics, but remove the affected animals from your herd. When you see a rabbit with a snotty nose, mark that feeder or cage card with a clip. If on the next day or later that month, the rabbit again has a snotty nose, it is not kept.

When breeders continue to treat rabbits with snuffles with antibiotics, they continue to have this disease in the rabbitry. The longer you use antibiotics, the longer you will have snuffles in your herd.

Snuffles is primarily spread from the doe to her babies. Initially the kits may obtain a natural immunity from their mother's colostrum. This immunity seems to wear off between 8 and 12 weeks of age which matches the decline of the maternal immunity in other species. I have seen snuffles once in 10 day old kits, but this was only once in 35 years. The majority of rabbits will break with snuffles at the 2 to 3 month mark.

The next time we commonly see snuffles is in does when they kindle their first litter. Bucks and does can break with snuffles after (or at) their first show, or with changes in weather.

The first step in eliminating snuffles from a breeding herd is to make every cage an isolation cage. I recommend Plexiglas dividers hooked between cages where the cages are closer than 3 feet apart. I like the clear dividers as they allow more light into the individual pens, but more importantly they can be disinfected. Wood cannot be disinfected. Metal or colored plastic dividers would be a second choice. But the clear dividers allow the operator to see rabbits more easily, as you do not have to stand directly in front of each pen to see in. Potentially there may be psychological advantage of the rabbits seeing each other, to learn nest making or breeding behaviors, but that is open to argument.

The step two is to cull all the rabbits that have snotty noses for more than 2 days.

Step three is very hard, but after 1 and 2, will send you on the road to recovery: cull all does who produce juniors who have snuffles by three months of age. At this point, I am assuming you are not showing any rabbits until they are over 3 months of age, and also that you isolate your show stock from the rest of the barn.

Once you start showing, those show rabbits can pick up snuffles in a showroom, especially in coopedin shows. But when you see snuffles in juniors before weaning or before their first show, they can only get the disease from their mothers if your cages are all isolation cages.

If you do show, group your barn so the breeding stock is at least 3 feet from show stock, or even in a different building. This also makes finding your show rabbits easier.

I am often faced with the question of what to do about the rabbit who sneezes but nothing comes out. Do these rabbits have snuffles, or allergies, or what? Sometimes we do not know until, if the rabbit is a doe, she has a litter and the babies have overt snuffles, i.e. snotty noses. At that point we know that doe is a carrier with dry sneezing, and she should be culled.



It is clear in my mind that there are healthy carriers of snuffles: a rabbit may carry the disease and not show any signs. The only way to identify this is when the rabbit is a doe, and her babies develop snuffles before they are weaned. If the cages are isolation cages, and the litter has never been shown, they can only contract the disease from their mother. To stop having rabbits with snuffles, these healthy carriers must be identified and culled. They are identified by looking for affected juniors, and then culling the mother. I would not trust cultures or blood tests.

At this point, you may have gotten rid of 90% of your herd. But in a year, the remaining 10% can reproduce and put you back in business. And really, you will be back in business as you cannot stay viable with sick rabbits either as a show or commercial herd.

Another factor is hybrid vigor. After you have culled the rabbits with snuffles, buy healthy stock from a reputable breeder to introduce new bloodlines into your herd. The new bloodline is referred to as hybrid vigor. Continuing to inbreed with existing animals reduces the vigor in any breeding program.

The heartbreaking question is what to do with a valuable blood line or a cherished pet? In the latter case, your cherished pet is removed to a different place outside of your barn. You feed him or her last. For further treatment see the pet section which follows. You never breed this rabbit; it is a pet. You can now follow the recommendations for pet rabbits in the next section.

The valuable bloodline is far more challenging. I have tested the following:

A buck with snuffles is only bred to a doe who if she also develops snuffles that you will be able to cull her. Watch the juniors closely and cull any at the first sign of snuffles. Do not then breed this doe to any other buck as she may now be a healthy carrier and capable of infecting a new buck.

A valuable doe with snuffles is bred to a buck that is never used on other healthy does, as the infected doe may infect him, and then he may infect other does.

When her litter is five weeks old, that doe with snuffles is removed from the cage and litter is left in the original cage. Moving the litter to a new cage will stress them and cause them not to grow as well. At five weeks, the young are eating enough pellets and hay and can continue to grow at a normal rate as long as they stay in their original cage.

Keep the litter together until they are 89 weeks old, and then separate them out into pairs (two bucks or two does - I prefer to leave the bucks in the original cage as they are less likely to fight). By 3 - 4 months of age, I have the entire litter in separate cages. Any which sneeze are immediately culled (no second chances). With this technique

you should be able to save one, possibly two, out of the litter. From this one or two, you can preserve a valuable bloodline. The heartbreak is if they break with snuffles when giving birth to the next litter. In that case, you repeat the process.

I do not cull an entire litter if one has snuffles, because the ones who can resist the infection, the truly healthy littermates, are the ones you want to use to rebuild your herd.

Please notice, I have not used a single antibiotic in this process. Antibiotics suppress the disease without curing it, prolonging your battle with snuffles. But you do practice the method of isolation and culling to achieve the goal of a healthy diseasefree herd.

I want to take a moment to encourage you to disinfect cages between rabbits and not share feed or water containers without disinfecting them as well. Bleach and air drying are your best disinfectants. After removing visible manure and bedding with running water, a wire brush and a scraper, I brush the cage with a bleach solution. A ten percent bleach solution will rust wire cages. I use about one ounce of bleach to a quart of water. I brush this on all interior surfaces, and let it dry for 24 hours before putting a new rabbit in any cage. Alternatively, if you have thoroughly cleaned a cage and it stays dry and unused for 7 days, that cage is safe without bleaching.

Also, breed together only rabbits born in the same year so you are not carrying diseases from one generation to another. This means with healthy stock, if you have a buck born in 2005, breed him only to does born in 2005. This keeps diseases which may be sexually transmitted from passing to the next generation.

Treating Pet Rabbits for Snuffles

In 1988, enrofloxacin, known as Baytril® in veterinary markets, was introduced. For the first time in years, veterinarians thought they were able to cure snuffles in rabbits. Unfortunately, the antibiotic only appears to put the bacteria into remission and does not cure the disease.

I have used both the injectable and tablet forms enrofloxacin, and more recently orbifloxacin, sold as Orbax®, to treat snuffles and related bacterial diseases. Both of these are available only by prescription and should never be used in rabbits intended for food.

The dose for both of these drugs is accepted in the veterinary community at 4 times the dog dose. Dogs and especially cats may suffer blindness at these high doses. It is not clear if rabbits do the same, but the sight of rabbits is poor and may be hard to assess. Bone problems in the growth plates resulting in stunting and pain is reported in giant breed dogs and children when this class of antibiotic is given to young, rapidly growing



individuals. I am not aware of young rabbits being stunted or having pain from these antibiotics.

Some rabbits will eat Orbax® and Baytril® directly when placed on the pellets. I have found that Orbax® appears to be tastier than Baytril®. If the rabbit does not eat the tablet directly, then dissolving it in a small amount of water and dosing directly in to the mouth or mixed with mashed banana or applesauce on a plate can be used. I will separate a syringe and place the tablet in the back end. After reinserting the plunger up to the tablet, water can then be aspirated into the syringe sufficient to cover the tablet. One tablet will dissolve in about 30 minutes. Usually I let the pill soak in the syringe for 12 hours, the time for the next dose.

I use two methods to treat snuffles in pet rabbits: one the blitz treatment in an attempt to overwhelm the infection, the other to use a more moderate dose and live with it. In new cases I often try the blitz, and if not successful, use a maintenance dose.

The usual dog dose of these fluoroquinolones (Baytril® and Orbax®) is one 22.7 mg tablet per 20 pounds either twice a day or once a day, respectively. In a 10 pound rabbit, I will use 4, 22.7 mg Orbax® twice a day for 7 days. This incredibly high dose is well tolerated with few rabbits going off feed or getting diarrhea.

The maintenance dose is 1 to 2 tablets once to twice a day for the rest of the rabbit's life.

Another treatment option is to use injectable penicillin in combination with one of the fluoroquinolones. Penicillin by itself will kill 10% of the rabbits it is given to, but so far I have had good luck with the combination of penicillin with Orbax® to treat syphilis.

Another option is to use tetracycline powder in the water. This will discolor the rabbit's teeth. Years ago, I worked with trimethoprim-sulfamethoxazole (Tribrissen®), but had little success.

I do not recommend tilimicosin (Micotil®). This injectable is very painful and can kill both rabbits and humans. The deaths in rabbits occur in 1 hour, with as much as a 50% death rate.

The bottom line is that snuffles does not appear to be curable. The disease can go into remission, but only seems to return if the rabbit is stressed.

Snuffles in rabbits mimics the cat upper respiratory disease, rhinotracheitis.

Rhinotracheitis in cats is caused by a herpes virus, with a number of bacterial invaders. Cats will sneeze much of their life. Cultures reveal bacterial infections which are susceptible to many antibiotics. With antibiotics, the disease will go into remission, but will return when the antibiotics are withdrawn. The disease is highly contagious through nasal secretions.

There is a herpes virus vaccine for cats. When given before exposure, the vaccine is highly effective. The trick is to vaccinate before exposure. The mother cats will infect their kittens before the vaccine has a chance to work. Keeping mothers and litters separate from others in the cattery, weaning at 5 weeks while the kittens still have maternal immunity, and frequent vaccination of the isolated kittens starting at 6 weeks to 14 weeks, will help to clean up a cattery. Culling affected adults, while raising vaccinated kittens, is the key to overcoming this disease in catteries.

At this time, no one has isolated a virus in rabbit snuffles. But clearly snuffles is not solely a Pasteurella infection. I have had pure cultures of Bordetella, Pseudomonas, Klebsiella as well as Pasteurella from the sinuses of autopsied rabbits in herd outbreaks. All of these cultures were taken following a sterile preparation of the skin over the frontal sinus, and then using sterile bone cutting instruments to enter the nasal cavity. Sensitivities on these cultures indicate that many antibiotics should be successful, but they are not.

Is there a virus behind the infection, an immune deficiency in certain lines, especially those which are inbred to preserve valuable traits, or simply the thick nature of rabbit pus which makes this disease impossible to cure? Hopefully these comments will help researchers in their quest for a snuffles vaccine.

BLAST FROM THE PAST

Copies of the Old Dutch Reporters are being placed on the ADRC website for future generations to read and enjoy. This column will feature selected articles from our history.

Here, reprinted are parts of an article in the February 1954 issue. Tom Shufflebotham wrote many articles for the Dutch Reporter and was a respected breeder and judge. This article is relevant to the question that is answered in this issue's question for the breeder.



Dear Tom:

I just finished rereading one of your articles of good type and color in Dutch. I am trying to build under the same line, but find that usually such fine stock is out of the reach of the average breeder. I have heard a lot of you say to do all you can to get new breeders in the Dutch, but when you go to the fellows to buy some of their good stock, it is so high that you go and buy where they are cheaper. I wouldn't be in Dutch now if I had to pay what some are making for their stock. I have been lucky enough to get a couple of good type and color bucks in the black and in the tort: and a fair chocolate, but I can't seem to get any good does for breeding, I am wondering what you would ask for a trio of does either a black or blue and a tort and chocolate.

My Dear Mr. Ettenhofer:

I have spent a lot of time and money in the interests of the Dutch fancy, and my twenty years plus in the Dutch fancy definitely places me among the "old-timers". I have not only spent much time in developing one of the outstanding studs of Dutch, I have also spent much more money in it than the beginner realizes. You know why I have spent the time, and I shall endeavor to explain to you why I have spent the money.

As time goes on I am more and more convinced that THE BEST START IS THE CHEAPEAST! When you purchase breeding stock you are not merely purchasing individual animals, you are purchasing the background which is by far the more important! When you buy stock from one of the older breeders who have worked hard to develop a pure-bred established strain you cannot PAY HIM TOO MUCH! I am talking from my own experience for I doubt

that there is a breeder in the country who has spent or paid more for stock than I have. Yet on the other hand, I do not think anyone has ever bought CHEAPER stock. You will find, I think, that it is usually the beginner who complains of high prices, and this maybe because he IS a beginner, and is not qualified as yet to judge what constitutes the true value of stock, nor what GOOD STOCK IS REALLY WORTH.

When you select stock from an established breeder who has built up his own strain you are not only paying for the individual animal - you are paying for years' experience in selective breeding. The beginner is most certainly taking a short cut to the top when he buys from a breeder who consistently produces winners! Your customers too, will be more willing to pay a good price for stock with an established strain as background. Your own investment will soon be returned, both in monetary matters and in satisfaction. If you need specialized medical care you pay for a specialist - you are not paying for the time he spends with you; you are paying for his knowledge. When you purchase breeding stock you are paying for the results of the breeder's knowledge. Several years ago I purchased a collie pup - not a ribbon winner - for \$75.00. I know I was not paying the money for the particular pup - I was paying for its background. Having raised both dogs and Dutch rabbits, I find it more difficult to produce a winning Dutch, than a winning dog. What would the beginner think if he were asked \$75.00 for a Dutch breeder?

Having purchased Dutch myself, I have paid what the beginner would consider fabulous prices. I considered this CHEAP, for I was buying the BEST there was from the BEST STRAINS THERE WERE. I imported stock in 1935, '46, '48, and '53. The 1946 imports cost over \$300.00 but among them was the Champion Lucky Boy Blue. The 1948 imports cost approximately \$600.00 and among them was the tortoise buck that was winner of Best Dutch at both the British Dutch Club young stock and adult stock shows. I considered them CHEAP because they have done what I expected them to do. All my blacks are from the Foord Brothers strain, as are my blues: my tortoise are of the Astley Realshad strain, founded by J.T. Harrison. I have kept them pure as I do not believe in outcrossing; hence the imports at different times. I feel that I have improved the strain by selective breeding and that logically they should be worth more than I paid for them. The gainer here is the BEGINNER who buys the stock, and the Dutch fancy as a whole.

I do not know what some of the other old-timers are asking for their stock, but I am reasonably sure that it is not more than the worth of the stock. The most I have received was \$75.00 and this was for



an outstanding show animal. I was offered \$100.00 for the junior Tortoise buck shown at Amarillo, and I once refused \$300.00 for Dutcheng Winsome Lady when she was a junior. Although I admit these prices are high, I consider them reasonable when I take into consideration the price paid for the comparable stock by myself. Usually I get about \$15.00 per head for junior breeders.

When the majority of beginners write for stock quotations, they usually ask for the Dutch that has never been born, and if it were born here would remain in my hutches until the day it died. They customarily want winners and the old-timers know that it is the background that counts in all breeding operations. There is actually much more pleasure in producing your own winners and much more satisfaction in the possession of them. If you do not care to pay a good, fair, price for stock, do buy some good breeding stock. You will certainly breed your own winners quicker by this method, than by buying stock just because it was cheap in price. If you cannot afford to pay the price asked by the established, reputable old-timer, it is much better for you to wait until you can do so. Remember, the hutch you put it in, the food that you feed, the time spent on it are the same on a cheap rabbit as the are on a good one.

To the beginner, I have this advice to offer: BUY THE BEST BLOODLINES YOU CAN PROCURE. They don't have to be winners. If you have enough faith in the man you are dealing with to do business with him, then have enough faith in him to select the stock which he things will give you the results quickest. They are all interested in the progress of stock they sell. Should you be fortunate enough to get winners from the first litter you raise, don't think that you know more about them than the old-timer who has worked with your stock for years to get it to this point of production! Realize that you are cashing in on his years of selective breeding - and give credit where credit is due. The price may have been high - but the product was there and you probably did not pay the TRUE VALUE of his stock.

I am sorry that I have nothing at present to offer in either black, blue, or Tortoise. I will have nothing until May and if you are still interested at that time do write for quotations. May you have the good fortune to pull back the fur and find what you are looking for.

AMERICAN DUTCH RABBIT CLUB CONSTITUTION AND BY-LAWS CONSTITUTION

ARTICLE I - NAME: The name of this club shall be the AMERICAN DUTCH RABBIT CLUB, INCORPORATED.

ARTICLE II - OBJECT: The object of this club shall be to promote, encourage, and improve the breeding of Dutch rabbits by maintaining an organization to study standards, encourage exhibitions, and offer service to its members.

ARTICLE III - AFFILIATION: This club shall be affiliated with the American Rabbit Breeders Association, Inc.

ARTICLE IV - MEMBERSHIP:

Section 1: Any person of good character and reputation and in accord with the object may become a member of the club upon presentation of a signed application together with membership fee for at least one year to the Secretary-Treasurer. Term of membership to be one year from date on membership application, providing a application is received within five (5) days of this date. Each membership shall be provided with a copy of the latest A.D.R.C. Guidebook, if available, and a one (1) year subscription to the Dutch Reporter.

Section 2: Any member having paid thirty-five (35) consecutive years adult membership regardless of age, or that has twenty-five (25) consecutive years membership in the A.D.R.C. upon reaching the age of sixty-five (65), shall be awarded a Life Membership.

ARTICLE V - OFFICERS:

Section 1: The elected officers of this association shall consist of a President, Vice President, and nine (9) directors, who shall be elected for a three (3) year term, by and from the membership. The Secretary-Treasurer shall be appointed by the President, approved by two-thirds (2/3) majority of the Board of Directors, excluding the Secretary-Treasurer. The appointment of the Secretary-Treasurer shall be for three (3) years. Any member, to be eligible for office, must be an owner and breeder of Dutch rabbits.

Section 2: The Secretary-Treasurer may be reappointed by the Board of Directors, who may also remove him/her from office, for cause, by a two-thirds (2/3) majority, during any term of office. The Secretary-Treasurer will be an active voting member of the board of directors, except in the appointment or removal from office of Secretary-Treasurer. The Board of Directors, therefore, consists of the President, Vice-President, Secretary Treasurer, and nine (9) directors. The term of any office shall begin on January 1st of the year following each election.

Section 3: The President and one (1) director representing each district will be elected for a three (3) year tenure. The Vice-President and one (1) director from each district will be elected the following year for a three (3) year tenure. Finally, the Secretary-Treasurer will be appointed and the final three (3) directors, each from a different district will be elected the third year to serve a three (3) year tenure. Directors may be from the same state and district as other officers: President, Vice-President, and Secretary-Treasurer. The directors representing each district will be elected by a vote of only those members living in that district.

Section 4: Vacancies in office shall be filled by appointment by the President, subject to approval by a two-thirds (2/3) majority vote of the Board of Directors. If filling the office of director, a person from the same district the vacancy is in, shall be appointed.

Section 5 - DISTRICTS: Directors shall be elected from three (3) districts divided as follows:

- 1- Connecticut, Delaware, Florida, Georgia, Maine, Maryland, Massachusetts, New Hampshire, New Jersey, New York, North Carolina, Ohio, Pennsylvania, Rhode Island, South Carolina, Vermont, Virginia, West Virginia.
- 2- Alabama, Arkansas, Illinois, Indiana, Iowa, Kentucky, Louisiana, Michigan, Minnesota, Mississippi, Missouri, Tennessee, Wisconsin.
- 3- Alaska, Arizona, California, Colorado, Hawaii, Idaho, Kansas, Montana, Nebraska, Nevada, New Mexico, North Dakota, Oklahoma, Oregon, South Dakota, Texas, Utah, Washington, Wyoming.

* NOTE: No foreign member will be eligible to hold office.

ARTICLE VI - ELECTION PROCEDURES:

Section 1: Any member wishing to run for an elected ADRC office or Board position shall submit a resume to the Secretary-Treasurer, prior to May 1st, in the year the office or Board Position shall be



voted upon, stating the position for which they wish to become a candidate. The resume shall be printed in the April-May-June Issue of the Dutch Reporter. All candidates must be current ADRC and AREA members, and be actively breeding Dutch Rabbits. Any member to be eligible for office must have been in continuous good standing at least two (2) years prior to May 1st of the year in which the election is being held, and all candidates shall remain in good standing with membership fee paid in advance at least through the date of assuming office, January 1st.

Section 2: Final numbered election ballots, shall be mailed out by August 1st to eligible voting members. Ballots shall then be marked and placed in a pre-addressed envelope and returned to the ADRC Election Committee Chairman by September 15th, at which time the polls shall be closed. The Chairman of the Election Committee will assemble the Election Committee; open and count the ballots, and certify the results to the Secretary Treasurer, President, and Dutch Reporter Editor, within 22 days. The Election Chairman shall then package the final Ballots and send them to the Secretary-Treasurer of the ADRC, and they shall be retained for a period of one (1) year, at which time they may be destroyed. These ballots, while in the hands of the Secretary-Treasurer, shall be accessible to any member in good standing, provided proper arrangements are made with the Secretary-Treasurer.

Section 2a: No one (1) person can run for more than one (1) office during any election.

Section 3: The Sec-Treas shall then inform the candidates and the board of Directors of the results within three weeks, and shall declare the candidate/s having the highest number of votes elected. The officer/s elect shall assume offices on the following January 1st and serve their elected terms or until their successors have been elected or duly appointed. In the case of a tie for any office, a majority vote of the remaining Board of Directors shall break the tie.

Section 4: If any candidate is running unopposed for office, they shall be declared elected. No ballot will be issued for an unopposed office. Any office where no candidate has submitted a resume, shall be filled by appointment by the President with a 2/3 majority approval of the Board of Directors.

ARTICLE VII- DISCIPLINE:

Section 1: The Board of Directors may, by a two-thirds (2/3) majority, suspend or expel any member or reject an application for membership or renewal, providing charges have been preferred by another member. Less than a two-thirds (2/3) majority shall constitute acquittal of the charges.

Section 2: In the event of preferment of charges, the member against whom the charges have been made shall be fully informed by the Secretary-Treasurer and given thirty (30) days to reply before action is taken by the Board. If reply is made, it shall be considered by the board along with the charges.

Section 3: Any person expelled, suspended, or otherwise rejected shall not be eligible for reinstatement for a period of at least one (1) year, and then only upon authority of the Board of Directors.

Section 4: An officer whose membership has expired shall be notified by the Secretary Treasurer by registered mail, with signature receipt requested, and if the renewal has not been made in thirty (30) days from the date of expiration, said office shall be declared vacant and it shall be the duty of the President to fill by appointment the unexpired term of office.

Section 5: An officer who shows lack of interest in his official duties, who fails to answer correspondence of Club matters from his fellow officers, shall be asked by the President to resign said office. In case of failure to do so, the Board of Directors by two thirds (2/3) majority vote shall declare the office vacant. It shall then be the duty of the President to appoint an officer to fill the unexpired term of office.

Section 6: An officer who shall willingly or otherwise give up the breeding of Dutch rabbits during his term of office shall automatically resign his office and it shall be the duty of the President to fill the vacancy of the unexpired term of office by appointment. Section 7: No member or candidate for membership may infringe upon the name of the American Dutch Rabbit Club, Inc., or that of any other member of his rabbitry. This also applies to State Dutch Rabbit Clubs.

ARTICLE VIII MEETINGS:

Section 1: The annual membership meeting shall be held during the annual Convention of the American Rabbit Breeders Association, Inc.

Section 2: A regular membership meeting shall be held during the National Dutch Rabbit Show; however, this meeting shall in no way replace the annual meeting unless the two (2) are concurrent.



Section 3: The President, or in the absence of the President, any elected officer present may call a meeting of the Board of Directors at any time during the annual Convention of the American Rabbits Breeders Association, Inc. or the National Dutch Rabbit Show. The presence of five (5) officers at such a meeting shall constitute a quorum.

ARTICLE IX - AMENDMENTS: Any alteration of, or amendment to the Constitution and By-Laws shall be made by way of a resolution. This resolution must be submitted to the Secretary of the ADRC in writing, no later than thirty (30) days prior to the opening day of the National Dutch Show or the ARBA Convention. The secretary shall send copies of the resolution to each officer of the ADRC for their review. Said resolution shall be reviewed and discussed at the next Board of Directors meeting, with the board, by 2/3 majority, either supporting or rejecting the resolution. The resolution and the Board's recommendations would then be read by the ADRC Secretary at the next general membership meeting, with ample opportunity for discussions. The resolution and the Board's recommendation would then be printed in the next issue of the Dutch Reporter. Voting on the proposed amendment would be held with the annual ballots, to be mailed out August 1 st. The Constitution may be amended by a 2/3 majority of all eligible votes cast. All amendments shall take effect the January 1 st after the election.

BY-LAWS

ARTICLE I - DUES

Dues - The membership Dues shall be:

Adult \$10.00 - Youth \$8.00 - Husband/Wife \$14.00 - Family Membership \$20.00

Youth must be 18 years of age or under at the time of application. A family membership shall consist of no more than two adults and their children (18 years of age or younger) who are in the household, at the same address.

Only one Dutch Reporter and Guidebook shall be mailed to a Husband/wife membership or a family membership.

Lifetime memberships for Adult and Husband/Wife members can be purchased for twenty (20) times the current membership fees, payable in advance, by those members 35 years of age or older. All deductions from paid life memberships are excluded.

One dollar of each membership shall be placed into a separate account called the "Guidebook/Contingency Fund", and the provisions of Article III - Sections 1 and 2 of the Bylaws shall not be applied to these monies.

Membership dues are good for a one year period, beginning from when the membership is processed. After membership has expired, the member may renew within a period of sixty (60) days; otherwise upon sending in membership fees, the member will be given a new membership number unless they request that their membership be back dated more than 60 days to the original expiration date, in order that they may keep continuous membership and the original membership number. Any member having been delinquent sixty (60) days or more shall be deprived of all sweepstakes points accumulated prior to the expiration date. All youth members retain all of the privileges as adults except for voting.

ARTICLE II - DUTIES OF OFFICERS:

Section 1: The President shall preside at all meetings of the membership or Board of Directors, appoint all committees, fill all vacancies in office by appointment, and perform such duties as pertain to the office.

Section 2: The Vice-President shall perform all duties of the President in his absence or disability. In event of vacation of the office of President, the Vice-President shall automatically succeed him in office.

Section 3: The Secretary-Treasurer shall be custodian of all general funds; shall maintain a bank account in the name of the club; shall maintain a set of books and records suitable to the Board of Directors; receive and act on all membership applications received, subject to the approval of the Board of Directors; maintain Sweepstakes Show records; consult and advise the Board of Directors on all unusual matters; furnish them with quarterly reports showing the general condition of the club; furnish the Board of Directors with semi-annual audited reports, all these reports to be published in the club's publication; keep an accurate record of all meetings; and perform such other duties as may be assigned by the President of the Board of Directors. The Secretary-Treasurer shall furnish an approved bond covering the assets of the club. The premium for said bond is to be paid for out of club funds, with the bond to be delivered to the President within ten (10) days after assumption of office.



Section 4: It shall be the duty of the Secretary to edit or cause to be edited, the Dutch Reporter. If, for any reason the Secretary is unable to perform this duty, it shall be the duty of the President to appoint a Dutch Reporter Editor subject to 2/3 majority approval of the Board of Directors. The Secretary shall cooperate with the editor by providing such news from the office as would be of interest to the membership.

Section 5: The Board of Directors shall have the power to transact all business of the Club between meetings; act upon charges brought before them; formulate rules; award the location of the National Dutch Rabbit Show; and decide upon all questions of policy brought before them.

ARTICLE III - APPORTIONMENT OF FUNDS

Section 1: The Secretary-Treasurer shall receive twenty-five (25%) of all membership dues including: The renewals, and 25% of sweepstakes fees as full compensation for his/ her services.

Section 1a: The sweepstakes chairperson shall receive one dollar (\$1.00) per open show sanction paid from the open show sanction fee as remuneration to compensate for time and effort spent by said chairperson in calculating, tabulating, and recording all show results. The sweepstakes chairperson shall provide the Dutch Reporter editor with a typed copy of each show report listed chronologically and sweepstakes standing for both open and youth divisions listed numerically; top twenty (20) open and youth divisions as well as the top five (5) from each district.

Section 2: The dues shall be further divided with twelve and one-half percent (12.5%) to be allotted to the ADRC Publicity Department. Any portion of these monies may be transferred to the Publicity Department or to any ADRC purpose, upon approval of the Board of Directors. The remaining sixty two and one-half percent (62.5%) shall go to the General Fund.

Section 2a: An annual allotment of five hundred dollars (\$500) from the general fund shall be awarded to the sponsors of the National Dutch Show, with further stipulation that the ADRC receive recognition for this allotment. Said money is to be sent by the Secretary- Treasurer to the sponsors on or as near to the 1st of January, preceding the NDS for that year. Show sponsors must have all NDS judges secured before any allocation is made. The ADRC requires three (3) open judges, chosen by and preferably from the membership, at each NDS. The ADRC Board has the authority to change the required number of judges as deemed necessary by the number of entries. The open judges shall be the top selections from the ballot if possible.

Section 2b: An annual allotment of one hundred fifty dollars (\$150.00) shall be paid out of the General Fund towards the American Rabbit Breeders Association, Inc. Convention, with further stipulation that the entire amount be used for open Dutch specials.

Section 2c: An annual allotment of \$150 shall be paid out of the General fund towards the ARBA Convention, with further stipulation that the entire amount be used for youth Dutch Specials.

Section 2d: All of the above allotted specials to be advertised as being donated by the American Dutch Rabbit Club Inc.

Section 3: The President shall receive the sum of fifty dollars (\$50.00) for attendance at each annual, regular, or special meeting, provided that meeting is not held in the town in which he/she resides, in which case there shall be no payment. In no case shall the payment be in excess of the sum of one hundred dollars (\$100.00) per calendar year. The Secretary- Treasurer shall receive the sum of twenty cents (\$.20) per mile round trip, or round trip coach air fare, whichever is less expensive, for travel expenses to the National Dutch Rabbit Shows and the American Rabbit Breeders Association, Inc. Conventions. Should the National Dutch Rabbit Show or the American Rabbit Breeders Association, Inc. Convention take place within 125 miles radius of the Secretary-Treasurer's home, only the sum of fifty dollars (\$50.00) will be paid. In the case that the National Dutch Rabbit Show or the American Rabbit Breeders Association, Inc. Convention should be held in the town in which the Secretary-Treasurer resides, he/she shall receive no payment for expenses.

Section 3a: The Publicity Chairman shall be paid one hundred dollars (\$100.00) for each National Dutch Rabbit Show and American Rabbit Breeders Association, Inc. Convention which he/she transports American Dutch Rabbit Club, Inc. publicity items for sale at the Club booth- such funds to be paid from the Publicity Fund.

Section 4: Each officer, along with the Chairman of the Publicity Department, shall have the Dutch Reporter mailed to them by first class mail in lieu of any postage.

ARTICLE IV - STANDING COMMITTEES:

Section 1: The Publicity and Promotion Committee shall consist of a chairman and at least two members appointed from the membership by the President for a term of two (2) years with the majority approval of the Board of Directors. Chairman of said committee shall have charge of all



publicity and promotion work for the club except for editing the club's publication. Said chairman shall be custodian of and be responsible for the publicity funds and shall give a report at each annual and regular meeting.

Section 1a: A quarterly report of the Publicity Department shall be submitted to the Secretary-Treasurer for publication in the Dutch Reporter.

Section 2: The Standards Committee shall consist of a chairman and four (4) members, at least two of whom shall be licensed ARBA judges. The Standards Committee shall be appointed from the members in good standing by the President with majority approval of the Board of Directors. They shall be responsible for maintaining a continuous study of the Standards and communicating any proposed revisions or additions to the ADRC Board. Upon majority Board approval, the Secretary shall cause such proposed revisions or additions to be sent to each member in good standing with a mail ballot so that they may register their vote for or against each change, revision, or addition. If these changes, revisions, or additions are approved by a two-thirds (2/3) majority vote of the ballots cast, then the committee must submit them to the ARBA Standards Committee with the recommendations that such changes, revisions, or additions be adopted.

Section 3: The Election Committee shall consist of a Chairman and two other members, none of whom shall reside in the same county as either the President or the Secretary Treasurer. The Election Committee shall be appointed annually by the President, from the membership, with 2/3 majority approval of the Board of Directors. The Election Committee shall assemble and count the ballots, tabulate and certify the results to the President and Secretary-Treasurer within 22 days of receiving the ballots. If all three members of the Election Committee are unable to meet to carry out these duties, the President shall be notified immediately, and different Election Committee members appointed as needed, prior to counting the ballots. It is necessary that the signatures of all three members of the Election Committee accompany the results as sent to the President, and Secretary-Treasurer. No member of the Election Committee shall be eligible for election to any office. Any member serving on the Election Committee shall not be eligible to serve on this committee again for a period of three (3) years.

Section 4: The Auditing Committee shall consist of a Chairman and two (2) members, no two (2) of them shall either be officers or reside in the same county as the Secretary-Treasurer. Their duty shall be to make a semi-annual audit of the fiscal period, preceding the National Dutch Rabbit Show, and the American Rabbit Breeders Association Inc. Convention, of the Secretary-Treasurer books and make a report there-on at these meetings. The Committee may recommend, if deemed advisable after examination, that the books be audited by a certified public accountant. The above Committee to be appointed from the membership present at the above mentioned meetings.

Section 5: Any special Committee deemed advisable by the President, or authorized by the Board of Directors or membership, may be appointed by the President and given specific assignment. At the completion of their assignment, they shall be discharged.

ARTICLE V - PARLIAMENTARY AUTHORITY:

The rules of parliamentary procedure in Roberts Rules of Order shall govern the proceedings of the Club.

ARTICLE VI - ORDER OF BUSINESS:

The order of business shall be:

- 2 - Roll call of officers
- 3 - Reading of Minutes
- 4 - Report of officers
- 5 - Report of committees
- 6 - Unfinished Business
- 7 - New Business
- 8 - Good of the Order
- 9 - Adjournment
