DR. T.E. REED - District II

Hello Dutch fanciers everywhere! Dutch activities in District II have increased considerably during the past eighteen months. There are an increased number of Dutch rabbits being shown, more exhibitors and the overall quality of the animal has increased tremendously with many Best of Breed Dutch being given consideration for the Best Four Class honors. The Black and Blue varieties in this district continue to be the most popular; but, in certain areas, the Chocolate and Tortoise enjoy tremendous popularity. The Steel Gray and Gray varieties have those dedicated individual breeders in our district; but, they lack the overall popularity. However, when these varieties are correct, they are exceptionally beautiful and compete favorably with the other recognized varieties of Dutch.

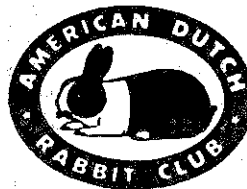
The Dutch rabbit has some exceptionally good characteristics that oftentimes go unnoticed and should be given consideration by those individuals selecting a breed of rabbits to raise.

The majority of the strains of Dutch rabbits have exceptional maternal characteristics and the ability to lactate in abundance. These traits are extremely important; particularly, to the youngster who may not have an abundance of experience and management skills when they initiate the rabbit project. It is particularly important to the young new breeder (old timer too) that the first breeding experience be successful to keep the interest and involvement high rather than to have the breeding experience end in a disappointment of the doe not taking care of the young and the end result being dead kits scattered over the cage floor; or, dead kits in the nest box from the doe not lactating properly. This point should be stressed to the potential buyer.

The Dutch rabbit appears to have more inherited resistance to certain conditions than many other breeds.

These conditions include ear mite infestation (ear canker), sore hocks, fur blockage, and certain respiratory diseases. Again, these characteristics enhance the choice of the Dutch rabbit as a desirable breed of rabbit for the young and old breeder.

As District Directors, we are here to assist the American Dutch Rabbit Club members in the district and anywhere in the United States with your problems and concern about the Club or about raising rabbits in general. Please do not hesitate to forward these concerns to me at Box 98, Markle, Indiana 46770-0098.

CORRECTION

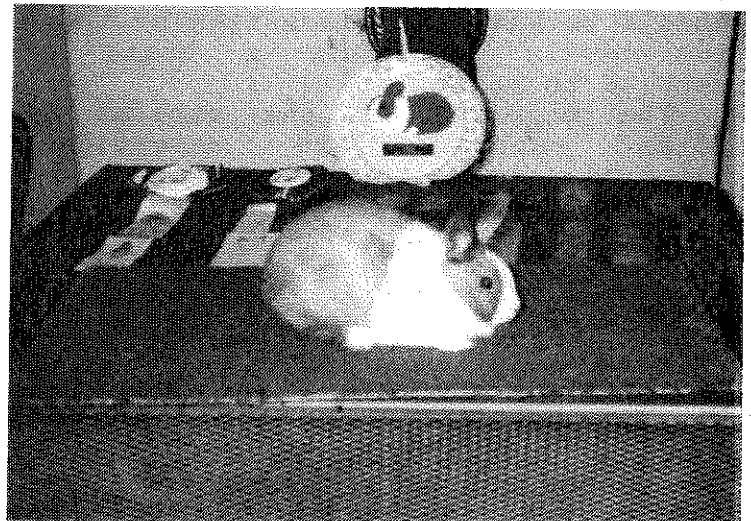

Hello from sunny California. This time of year the all breed shows fall off to a minimum and the fair shows start up. We did have an all breed show July 2 in Watsonville, which is on the coast near Santa Cruz, so the weather tends to stay fairly moderate. There were 84 Dutch shown and the Best of Breed was won by the Bairds of Morgan Hill and Best Opposite was taken home by Youth Jill Giron. The California Dutch Rabbit Club is holding a double Dutch specialty show on August 19 in Morgan Hill, and is having some "for fun" classes during the pot luck/bar-b-que lunch hour. I have had some members say that they prefer to keep the sweepstakes standings in the DR, and some have protested omitting the show results. have reaffirmed to me that we should consider redoing the sweepstakes formula to better reflect quality points rather than quantity points, making small breeders competitive with the larger ones.

California county fairs, I've noticed from reading the DR, don't seem to get the attendance or sanctioning common to county fairs in many other agricultural states. Some of our fairs require cooping in for 4 to 10 days, and facilities often are not oriented very well for the health and safety of the rabbits. An exhibitor here has to be careful which fairs to attend, and often has to accept that there may not be sufficient exhibitors to earn GC legs. However, there are several fairs that are well handled and fun and only require the rabbits to be there for 1 to 4 days. Many of the Dutch people this year are trying to get together and enter enough animals to have fun at some of these fairs as well as win some legs. It has been my observation that, in general, fair boards here do not seem too sympathetic to rabbit exhibitors and their problems. How is your state?

I hope to see many of you at Tulsa in October. My husband Jim and I are going to try and attend, even though Jim may have to leave early due to work requirements. I hope that whatever airline I use coming home will be accomodating to a lone woman with a dozen or so rabbits plus luggage!

STEEL DUTCH - SOME NEW DISCOVERIES

Lately, with the help of Fred and Sue Barlow of Indiana, we've been finding out some new things about the Steel Dutch.

First, the Standard is incorrect when describing the steel as having the color brought out by a moderate amount of gray tipped guard hairs. There are no gray tipped guard hairs on any steel we have examined. Every hair is black tipped with a band of gray to cream color. The best color seems to be on the animals with narrow bands of color. The more narrow the band, the more gray (pale) the color on each hair is. This can be seen with a jewelers eye glass. Also, the more wide the band is, the more the color of that portion of the hair appears to dilute, or become more: yellow, cream, brass, etc. The reason I use the term dilute, it has to do with the variances in color in the grays, steels, and possibly the blues on a genetic basis.

While this article will not completely tell you how to get steels genetically, it will give you an idea on our preliminary findings in our experiments. By the next issue, I hope to have a detailed genetic explanation of the steel.

We've been working with steels, blues, grays, and dilute grays as well as blacks. The dilute gray is a gray missing the third band of ring color.

So far, by using a blue to a steel of average color, we've been getting the nice colored steels with narrow bands of color. The key to the steels seems to lie in the blues. By breeding a black out of blacks and blues, to a steel of 90% steel breeding, we've been getting blacks, steels, and nice steels (narrow bands). If we use a black with no blue we only seem to get blacks. There seems to be a gene involved with the blue - what we call the dilute gene which makes steels or dilute grays.

Some of you may say I don't know what I'm talking about, but I've simply tried to explain what we've discovered so far. Sue Barlow is

working on the actual genetic formulas which I hope we can have to offer you in the next issue.

Simply by using blacks with a blue background, blues and dilute grays, I'm now producing many, many steels. So - don't throw away the grays missing the 3rd band of color - at least not till next issue.

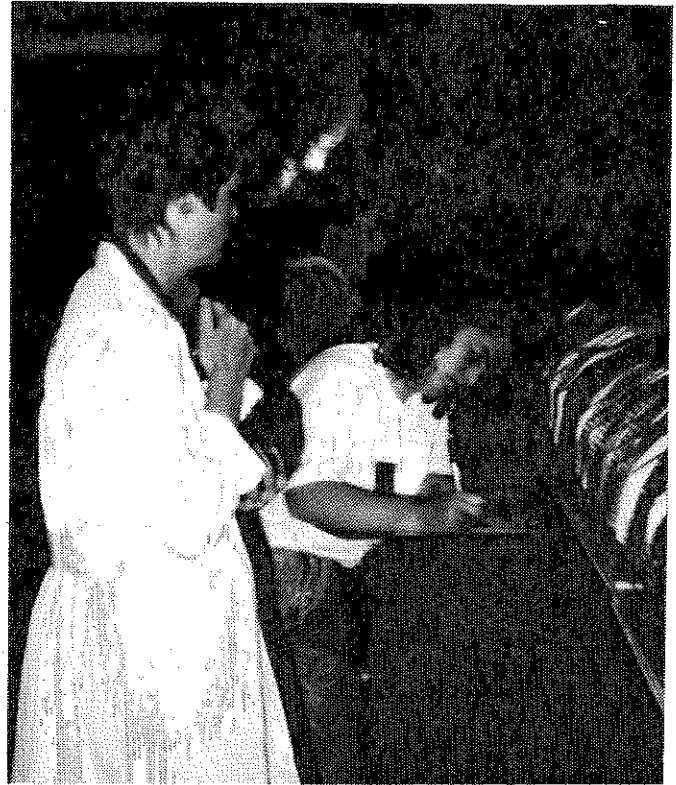

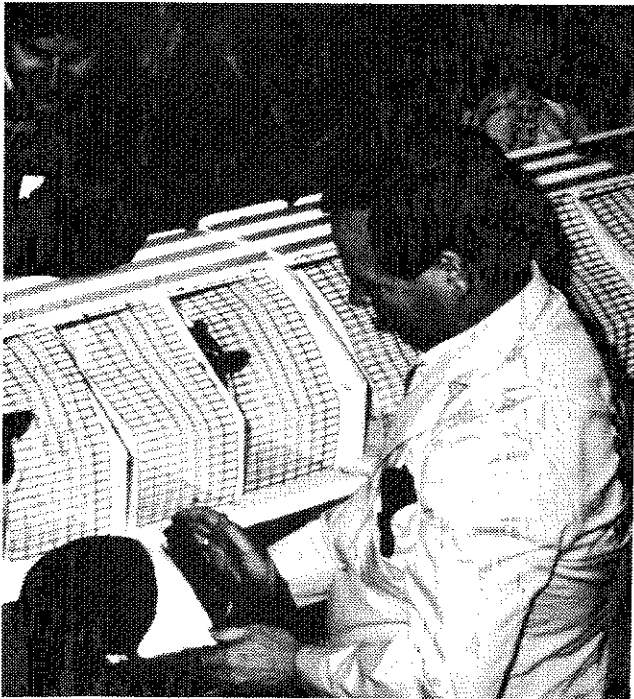




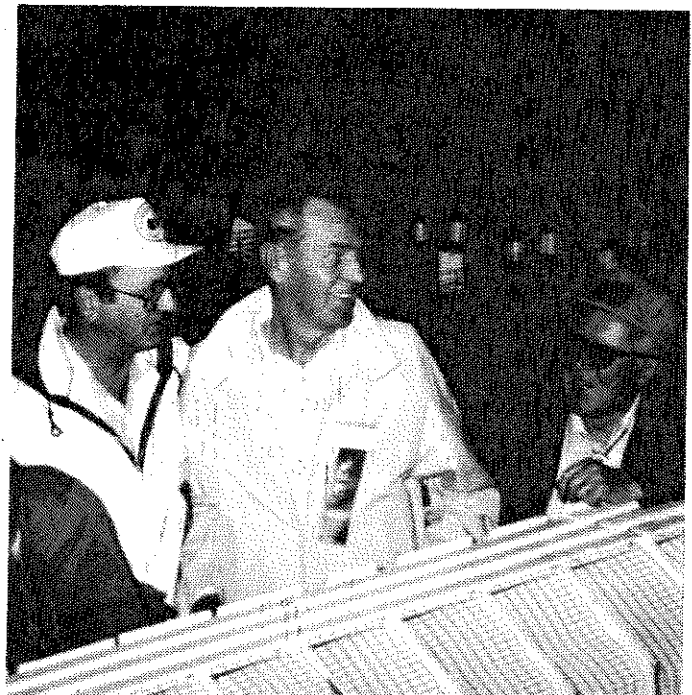

How to Select Good Dutch

William Geitzenauer, of Washington, New Jersey, one of the directors of the American Dutch Club, described his method for analyzing the qualities of a particular strain of Dutch rabbit.

First, Geitzenauer said, look over your senior animals the way a judge would, using

your Dutch Club Standard as a basis for comparison. List the strong and weak points for each rabbit on a card bearing the appropriate animal's ear number, he suggested. Do this for each senior animal.

Any desirable trait that is present in more than 50% of your animals is a strong trait in

your strain, according to Geitzenauer. If type is not a strong trait in your animals, he recommends that you dispose of the animals with poor type and look for some new rabbits with good type.

If you are unsure of exactly what good type is, go to a few shows and listen to the judge's remarks, Geitzenauer advised. Then see if the judge calls out "good type" on the Dutch you might consider purchasing.

After listing the strong points of your Dutch with good type, see what points show up on the cards most often. Do the same with weak points.

If a majority of your rabbits have wavy saddles, that is a weak point which has been inbred into your strain. If it is not stopped it will be characteristic of your strain to have bad saddles, he cautioned.

To eliminate this weakness he advises outcrossing with another strain that has good saddles as a strength.

If you find that one of your junior animals has a good saddle, keep it even though it has another fault that disqualifies it, he added. If the wavy saddles are not prominent in your seniors, breed the good junior to a senior that has little or no waviness in its saddle.

Do not "wholesale" breed this young Dutch, particularly if it is a buck, he warned. Try a few matings and see how many of the young have good saddles.

Pick out the best in each litter — the ones with the strong points of the strain and good saddles — and discard the rest.

Geitzenauer recommended that breeders spend at least two generations building up a weakness to "implant" the gene, before working on elimination of another fault in the strain.

He also pointed out that there has never been a perfect Dutch, but that this method is the only way to improve your strain by choice. It is possible to improve by chance, he added, but once your winning combination runs out, due to the death of a good breeding animal, you must revert to unrefined guessing. □

FEED SUPPLIMENTS and VITAMINS

There are many vitamins and feed suppliments that are being promoted at the present for rabbits.

First of all, the manufacturers of rabbit feeds state that their feeds are 100% complete. This is supposed to be true. We have taken a select group of rabbits and these rabbits have been on an added pellet suppliment. Our observation is that the suppliment does do some good as we are able to get more weight on at a faster rate. We tried increasing our normal feed and this gave them loose stools. Adding 1/4 cup of suppliment did not cause any disturbance in the digestive tract. Actually the fur has a much greater sheen and the rabbit's growth has amazed us. We now have a 4 lb. rabbit at 11 to 12 weeks. All the suppliments contain a form of milk and more vitamins and minerals. The feed processors state "do not cut down the amount you normally feed per day, just add the suppliment".

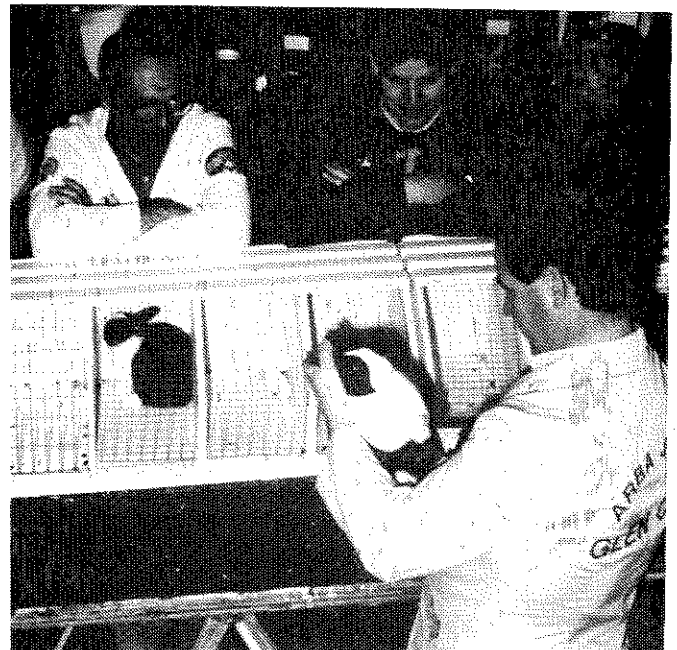
The way we do it is we feed their normal amount of feed at night like always, then when we clean and check them in the A.M. we now give the suppliment. This seems to work out fine for us and all our hundreds of producers. This is like a breakfast snack.

If you are breeding for meat or labs, the added cost of the suppliment will work out to the same as you will produce the end results in a shorter time. Actually we have done extensive cost analysis and this suppliment is saving a little money on each rabbit.

The reason we tried the suppliment was we had a hair chewing problem going on. It started with our up and coming and we contacted our feed manufacturers and they recommended

the suppliment. At this point we feel the suppliment has gone past expectations and no more hair problems. It even cuts down on the molt problems. We had several molting and now they have their new coat. It is denser and it looks like someone polished the hair. Nothing impresses a judge more than seeing a rabbit with a nice density coat and a nice sheen. This suppliment does not add any fat on them so a potential breeding problem is not present. I certainly wouldn't want to get better results and create another problem. I will let you know after one year's time on this select group. Maybe they might reward us with bigger litters. This is dreaming but it would be nice.

Decker studies genetics, then takes chances

STROUDSBURG — Judges of the American Dutch Rabbit Club decided in April that Carl Decker's "Pride-O-Deck's ACI" is the best Dutch rabbit in the country, based on about 32 pages of breeding and judging guidelines in the club's guidebook.

But how much does a Dutch rabbit differ from the little brown bunnies hopping around hill and dale in the Poconos?

Not much, says Decker. Color is different, and the body shape a bit different. Mostly behavior is different.

Decker tells of a time some breeders released some Dutch rabbits not far from the fields of the Monroe Beagle Club. The Dutch rabbits cross bred with the local rabbits. When the beagle club ran trials soon after, the cross-bred bunnies ran differently than the rabbits the dogs were used to, confusing the dogs and ruining the trials. The breeders had to promise not to release any more Dutch rabbits.

Pride-O-Deck's ACI (the letters are a code that tells Decker which rabbits produced this one) won the best of breed trophy at the national American Dutch Club rabbit show in Canton, Ohio. The rabbit also won best chocolate (a rabbit that is brown and white) last year. (The rabbit is 3 years old.) And this year, for the first time, the English, who are particular about their rabbits, awarded Decker's pride *their* best of show award — the first time they've done so with an American rabbit.

The Dutch breed is at least 125 years old. It's divided into colors — chocolate, black, blue, gray, steel gray and tortoise. Decker counts 32 separate genetic traits that affect a Dutch rabbit's competitiveness. These are all things examined by a judge, and considered by a breeder when he's mating a pair of rabbits.

There's type, or body shape. The rabbit should be a chunky fellow, without a long neck, with nicely rounded haunches that are larger than its rounded hips, round belly, and so on.

The markings include the blaze, which is the white strip up the middle of its face from nose to ears; the saddle, or white front portion of its body; the cheeks, of color, circling the eye and running into the ears; and the stops, or white portions of the hind feet. These must all be smooth, clearly defined, symmetrical, and the right size and shape. The head must be of the right, round shape, and ears proportional and held just so.

The fur should be short, dense and lustrous. And the color should be rich and true, with no odd white hairs in it.

The Dutch is one of about 60 breeds of rabbits. Decker estimates that 5,000 breeders breed them for competition, making them the most popular breed. But it's also the toughest breed to produce a truly exceptional rabbit in, because the markings are so complex.

Pride-O-Deck's ACI won over 437 other rabbits at Canton. Judges choose best senior rabbits in each color (those over 6 months), best junior in each color, then the best of the opposite sex (if a buck won, the does are opposite sex). Then they choose best of breed.

The genetics involved in breeding that big winner are complex enough that breeders differ on how to do it. Decker will breed a blue with a black to hold the strength of the blue color; some breeders reject that notion.

Decker will try a rabbit with a wide blaze matched with one with a narrow blaze to produce a good blaze. A black can be mixed with a chocolate to darken the brown.

"Up until just recently," Decker says, "genetics was considered mathematically exact. It isn't. A computer wouldn't help me.

"This is what makes it such a fascinating thing. When you look in a nest box, you may find what you want, and you may not."

Decker relies on intuition as much as science. "Two and two isn't four, completely," he says. "It may be four-and-a-half or three-and-a-half."

Another thing Decker does that many breeders don't do is to look at the grandparents of a rabbit for characteristics, rather than looking just at the dam and the sire. He believes this may be why he is so successful.

There is some hard information involved, of course. Decker says that a rabbit's 31-day gestation period is generally accurate to the hour — except, Decker says, that a thunderstorm can bring a rabbit in early.

Beyond the work of breeding, is there anything in these rabbits to give pleasure?

They have personalities, Decker says. They usually like people and take to being handled. "I've seen little girls dress them in doll clothes," Decker says. "I've seen them trained to be led. I've seen them housetrained."

As if winning a national first place wasn't enough.

MUCH HAS BEEN WRITEN ON THIS SUBJECT LATELY, TO RECAP THE MOST IMPORTANT ITEMS, USE FANS TO MOVE THE DEAD AIR. OPEN UP ALL WINDOWS TO PROVIDE THE MAXIMUM VENTILATION. REMOVE ALL ACCUMULATED DROPINGS FROM UNDER THE CAGES, MANURE BILDS HEAT AND CAN CAUSE AMMONIA PROBLEM THAT CAN LEAD TO SERIOUS RESPIRATORY AILMENTS. DO NOT OVER CROWD YOUNG DUTCH. WHEN WEENING YOUR KITS PUT YOUR FUTURE SHOW AND BREEDING STOCK IN INDIVIDUAL COOPS. WEEN AT AN EARLIER AGE IN THE HOT WEATHER.

WHEN YOU HAVE PROBLEMS

TREAT ANY OUTBRAKES OF SICKNESS AT ONCE! DO NOT OVERFEED, DETERMINE IF YOU CAN JUST WHAT IS WRONG WITH YOUR KITS,
