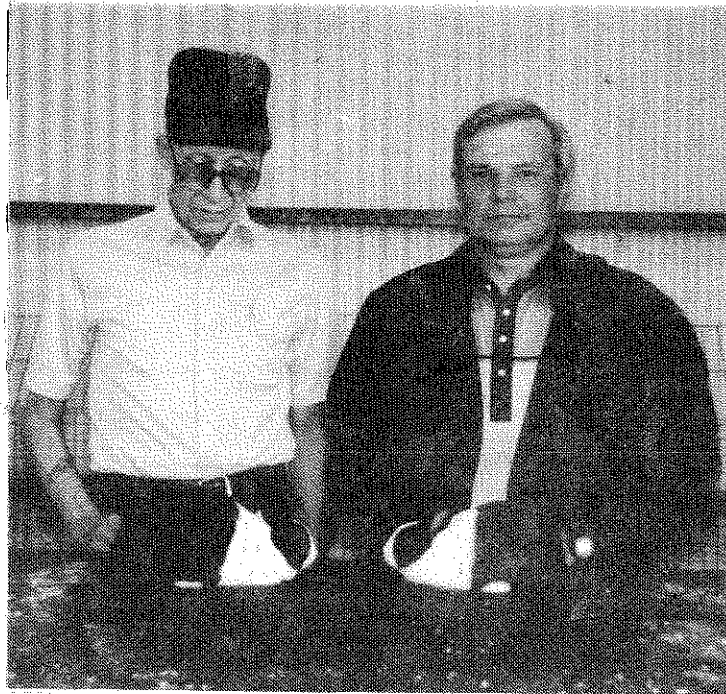

The Dutch happenings within the district are on an upswing at this time. There appears to be more Dutch being shown in our area than there has been in several years. It is extremely exciting to see some excellent quality and numbers of Dutch being shown in the Youth.

I would encourage any member in our district to forward me any information they would like to see in the Dutch Reporter as to their desires; or, report on the shows they have attended.

On a more personal note, I had the opportunity to attend the National European Show in Stuttgart, West Germany the latter part of February. The Dutch in Europe are extremely interesting. The Dutch average about seven to eight pounds; and, in addition to our varieties they have the Gold, Blue Fawn, and the Tri-Color. The Tri-Color is the Harlequin Black and Orange and it is mandated that they have both of these colors in each of the solid colored areas. The body, cheeks, and ears. The highest scoring Dutch was a Tri-Color. Another interesting fact is they require their cheek markings be about one-half inch above the whisker bed. Some of the animals that scored very high looked like they had eye circles for cheek markings. The most popular colors in Europe are the Tri-Color and the Gold. The only part of the stop marking that counts is the area that they can view from between the front legs. That is a sight to behold. To evaluate the stop markings they hold them up and peer down between the legs as if they were peering down the sites of a gun.

The whole exhibition of rabbits; and, Dutch in particular, was very interesting in Europe; but, I would not trade it for our system any day of the week. It is interesting that the judges only judge seventy-six

animals at that show; but, they did not spend more than ninety seconds with each of the animals. In all reality, I do not think they are any more thorough in their evaluation of the rabbits, even though they evaluate them individually, than we are in the States.

A warning to those who may choose to travel Delta Airlines to Convention--we were informed on our return flight that Delta regulations limit "one kennel" to six rabbits maximum!

Congratulations to the Ohio and Michigan clubs who presented successful bids for the NDS for 1991 and 1992. We Californians are looking into bidding for 1993.

The California Dutch Rabbit Club held a Dutch specialty May 5 at San Jose, in conjunction with the local all breed club. These shows had 75 - 80 Dutch being shown. Marybeth Talbott, a local youth breeder, dominated the black competition in the specialty show, winning three of the four black classes as well as BOSB with some outstanding blacks of her own breeding. Minutes of the Board of Directors Meeting

The meeting of the Board of Directors was called to order at 8:10 PM by President Wenton Carlton.

ROLL: President Carlton, Directors Wireman, Pecaric, Mullinax, Ehnis, Reed, Schettler, Parmar, and Secretary-Treasurer Hart were present; those absent were, Vice-President Reid, and Directors Gehr and Christ.

Director Reed made a motion to dispense with the reading of the minutes of the last Board of Directors Meeting as they were printed in the Dutch Reporter. The motion was seconded by Director Parmar. MC

REPORT OF OFFICERS:

Director Fran Schettler states that the California Dutch Rabbit Club has expressed much interest in the possibility of hosting the 1993 NDS. She also stated that everyone has noted that they are pleased with the new format of the DR but want to see the sweepstake standings in each issue.

Director Terry Reed remarked that he felt this was one of the trouble free years within the ADRC in years and has heard much positive talk about the Dutch Club. He also stated that he felt the quality of the DR was excellent.

Director Jack Wireman says that there isn't alot to report, however, the NE corner of Ohio and into Pennsylvania is getting a little more interest. He also stated that there was a good market for Dutch in his area. He noted that in speaking with the sweepstakes chairman, Kevin Hooper, he said that there had been a few corrections made to the standings.

Director Mark Pecaric remarked that Dutch in his immediate area is down a little. Some of the major breeders are now out of Dutch. He noted that New York has some very large shows with often 150 or more Dutch being shown.

Director Fred Mullinax states that Dutch are about 50/60 per show in his area with some top quality animals. He noted that the youth have gone down and also remarked that his area would like to see the point standings in each issue of the DR.

Director George Parmar says that they have lost almost all of the older breeders but Dutch have begun to pick up considerably. Many of the breeders are youth with exceptional quality Dutch. He says that there are not many Dutch for sale in the Pacific NW. He remarked that everyone he has spoken with is happy with the new DR. He also says that his area would like to see the sweepstake standings each issue but they were aware of the change in the chairperson and the transfer involved.

Secretary-Treasurer Hart reported that Dutch have really come up in her area with some excellent quality stock being shown. Youth appear to be staying the same and holding their own. Dutch activity seems to be picking up with some Dutch specialty shows in the making.

President Wenton Carlton reports that the youth in his area have some very nice quality Dutch. He states that many of the youth are in New Mexico and could put some of the adults to shame on the show tables. He says that entry fees seem to be high and Dutch are in the area of 40/45 per show. A lot of the Dutch being shown are out of Colorado. He states that it is beginning to get hot in his area with night shows starting to be held. He states that he has had many compliments on the Dutch Reporter. President Carlton also expressed greeting from Director Chuck Christ who was unable to make the trip.

There was some discussion on the airlines with regard to their shipping and handling of rabbits.

BIDS FOR THE NDS:

Ohio presented a bid for the 1991 NDS at Wellington Ohio Fairgrounds. There are a few minor drawbacks that must be handled with regard to the banquet which may be catered. The airport used would be Cleveland and is approximately 35-50 miles from the show. (The dates and more information will appear in a later issue of the DR). Director Terry Reed made a motion to accept Ohio's bid. The motion was seconded by Director Mark Pecaric, MC. The ADRC Board granted permission for Ohio to hold the NDS in May if needed.

Rick Minter and Tony Micallef presented a bid for the 1992 NDS in Michigan. The show will be held approximately 3 miles outside of Ann Arbor at the fairgrounds on April 25-27, 1992. There are many nice motels and hotels located within 3 to 4 miles of the showroom. They anticipate using the Days Inn as the headquarters. Camping will be available at the showroom. The banquet is still in the making and we will be notified when it has been arranged. The Detroit airport is within 30 minutes of the fairgrounds and several car rental agencies are located directly at the airport. I-94 and US-23 run directly through Ann Arbor and intersect with major state expressways. They have listed points of interest as the Michigan Space Center; University of Michigan Campus in Ann Arbor; Greenfield Village Henry Ford Museum; Briarwood Mall; and many beautiful resort and lake areas. Director Fred Mullinax made a motion to accept the bid for the 1992 NDS. It was seconded by Director George Parmer, MC.

UNFINISHED OR OLD BUSINESS:

Those involved with the artwork, etc. for the possible certificate issued for Dutch wins did not see it through. Therefore, Director Terry Reed suggested that Secretary Hart and Director Gehr look into having something made up for a presentation at the Tampa Convention.

The ADRC banquet at the ARBA Convention in Florida has been set up and material will be published at a later date. Rick Minter will be the youth Secretary but we need a breed chairperson and Secretary for the Open division. George & Maxine Parmer have offered their assistance to these people if needed. Director Fran Schettler stated that there would be no problem with regard to breed chairperson and secretary in California in '91 as the California Dutch Rabbit Club would do it.

Director Christ asked President Carlton to bring up the feasibility of a badge that you can hang the number of wins on as a possible sweepstakes award. President Carlton will have one made up if possible and bring it to Tampa for Board review.

NEW BUSINESS:

Articles are needed for the Dutch Reporter. Some of the Directors are not sending in any reports for publication says Director Wireman. Director Gehr may send postcards to the officers or others when he is in need of articles for publication.

Marti Dill is moving to Indiana and will start to work on the Guidebook. Any ideas, etc. should be sent directly to her. Marti Dill has had several trophies given to her by Tom Shufflebotham's relatives and she would like to know what should be done with them. There is some Dutch info that should be preserved if at all possible that belonged to Tom. Tom Shufflebotham's son Ron donates a clock for the Best Dutch at each NDS in Tom's memory. The show committee for each NDS should contact Ron and also try to get a picture of the clock presentation.

Jeanine Powers, past DR Editor, submitted the remaining balance from the DR account of \$4.28 and the account was closed.

Being no further business, a motion to adjourn was made by Director Mullinax and seconded by Director George Parmer. MC.

A Letter to the Membership
from Dr. T.E. Reed

I would like to take this opportunity to Thank each of the members of the American Dutch Rabbit Club for allowing me the opportunity to officiate at the 1990 National Dutch Rabbit show in Connecticut. Judging a national show of a breed that you have been closely associated with for many years is a highlight of any judge's career. Regardless of the number of times one judges the national shows, it is always extremely exciting and causes the heart to throb for weeks before the event.

I complement the Eastern Dutch Fanciers and the New England Dutch Club for all the efforts they put forth in hosting an excellent show to provide all Dutch breeders the opportunity for competition and camaraderie.

It was an extreme pleasure to work with judge Gehr in evaluating the various varieties and the cooperation extended. I feel confident if all judges would work together constructively, this would provide more consistent judging of all breeds of rabbits; particularly the Dutch.

At the conclusion of any national show, I think it is extremely important that one evaluates the progress of the breed, in general, from one national show to the other for the benefit of the breed and breeders. In general, it appears, in my opinion, that each of us Dutch breeders must continue to work on the development of the lower hip of our Dutch rabbits and improve the neck marking. Unfortunately, it appears there may be a trend for the body type to become a little longer than we would like, at the same time there appears to be a lack of development of the lower hindquarters. It appears that there is more uniformity in the head and ear structure and head markings, with the exception of

the neck marking.

The color of the Blacks appears to have improved tremendously in that there are fewer scattered white hairs and the color appears to be extending down on the hair shaft much farther; and, there is more development in the undercolor. This gives an increased intensity of the black color. The Tortoise still need improvement on the surface color down over the back; but, it appears there is more uniformity in the shadings than in the past. The Grays and Steels have a tremendous amount of problems with color. In my opinion, very few of the Steels and Grays exhibited actually met the Standard of Perfection on color; but, there appeared to be a great interest in both the Steel and Gray color. Possibly, through dedicated efforts, the color will be enhanced in the future. Many of the Grays just lacked the development of the ring color and many of the individuals were almost Steel colored on the hips.

The Black junior doe class that was exhibited at the 1990 National Dutch Show was a class that held the most extreme quality that I judged. The quality of junior does, through twelfth place, was outstanding. Judge Gehr and I were both extremely impressed with the pair of Steel juniors that won the class as they were both correct and of extremely high quality. I would like to take this opportunity to congratulate the winners and complement the losers on their efforts. If it were not for dedicated losers, the quality of our animals would not improve. Again, I Thank each and every ADRC member for allowing me the opportunity to have such a great weekend.

Example: Last weekend we came home after spending Easter day with my in-laws to find one of our best brood does had had two kits in the nest box but with no fur around to keep them warm. Three days prior to this we had a litter born with a good nest and 3 kits. Not quite sure what to do or who to call, we brought the new ones in the house thinking we would take them back out in the morning. (the one was crying just as hard as he could cry) They were real cold. We (my husband and I) made a few phone calls and they said try putting the twins in the other box with the good nest.

Well, it's been 4 days now.

Mother is doing fine with all 5 of the babies. I'm glad all survived and she didn't reject them.

Example of questions:

Q - Why do blues turn brown?

A - Too much sunlight.

Q - What's the proper ear length?

A - ????

Q - Where should the white on the stops and belt come?

A. - Not quite sure.

I hope I might have been some help in adding to the DR and

maybe with a little bit more helpful information you, me, and other members might be able to get new people to join so they can get this helpful book. Thanks for your time.

EDITOR: Thank You for your time, Tammy. You are one of a very select few that have taken the time to write in to the DR. Whether it be complaints, stories, ideas, or what, I wish I would receive more to print. It is extremely hard putting out a magazine that has useful information when no one will write anything to put in it. As I don't want to be accused of publishing "my book", I try to write as few articles as I have to. At times I need fillers, so will jot something down, but I try to refrain from long articles. Some people get tired of reading lengthy articles written by the same person all the time. However, to answer the couple of questions that you weren't quite sure of, the ears on the Dutch rabbit should be in proportion to the size of the head and body. The white on the stops is to be from the toes to a point one-third the length of the foot as measured to the point of the hock. (what you might consider the heel of the rabbits foot). The belt, or saddle, should be set just behind the shoulders and form a perfect circle around the body with the undercut. These answers are in the Standard of Perfection, which is also printed in the Guidebook each member receives upon joining.

I like the idea of addressing issues that novice breeders, as well as long time breeders, could benefit and learn by. Now all I need is someone to write the articles and send them in.

SPRING NEST BOXES

Now that spring is here, we all should have full nest boxes. Remember the doe does not know how much hair she pulled to cover her kits. If you find a nest box with an overabundance of hair, pull some of it out and put it in a paper bag and save it. When we get to winter you can use this hair to cover, as then it will be much colder. I save it and when I find a nest box that is a little short, I will fill it up. After doing this, I put a little Vicks on the nose and she accepts the extra fur with no problem. This is a way we can protect our future litters from the cold. Don't store hair in a plastic bag as that rots it.

SHOWING RABBITS

Could you please forward this letter to her in response to the article? I have enjoyed many years of DR and even acquired a pen-pal in Wisconsin a few years ago after an article in the DR.

Anybody who shows rabbits should be familiar with the basic show rules. These rules are for everybody's benefit;

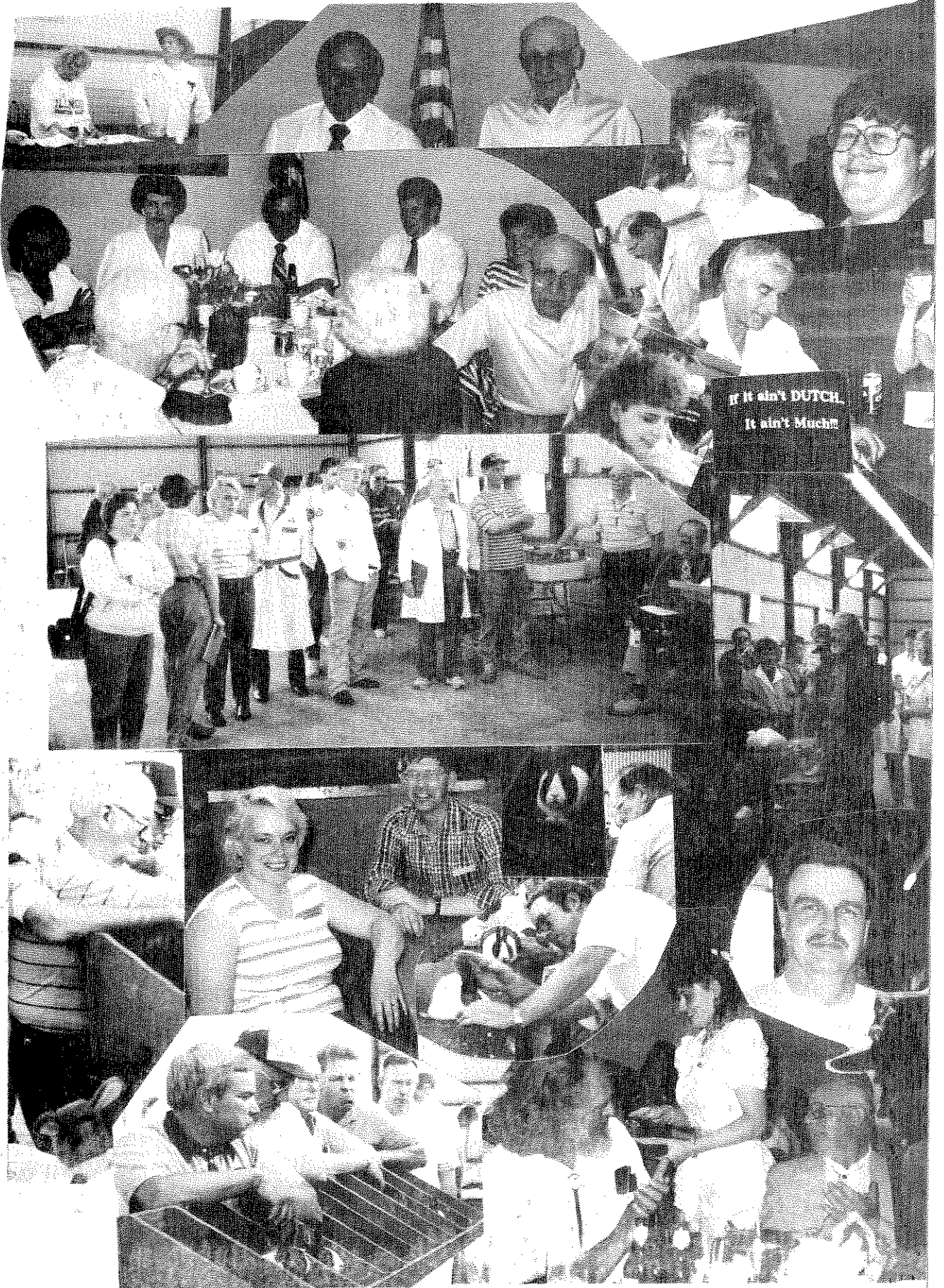
1 - You should not bring any rabbit which has diarrhea or sneezing or puss from the nose into a showroom. These three different diseases are transmittable to other rabbits. You wouldn't want your rabbit getting sick from other sick animals so don't enter a sick rabbit. It is better to scratch an entry than to make other animals sick.

2 - All judges should stick to the Standards of Perfection and not to "buddy-buddy judging". I saw at a recent show, the judge gave first place to his neighbor's rabbit and this rabbit had black right through the toes on his hind foot and this is a disqualification. Politics do not have a place in a show; so the rabbit being judged should be judged by the book and not by the number in it's ear.

3 - If everybody would pitch in and help, such as writing the cards for an hour, then these shows can run smooth. Many of us stand around complaining about how long we have to wait, then donate one hour and help at the judge's table. The judges have a lot to do and they need our help. Remember, if no one writes, then no judging.

Shows should be an enjoyable experience and if all help, then we all benefit.

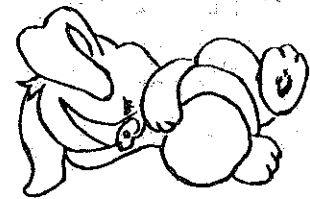

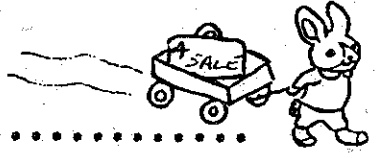

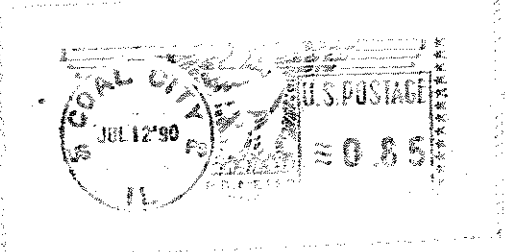
