Open class had 489 judged with 64 fur. Youth had 192 judged with 29 fur.

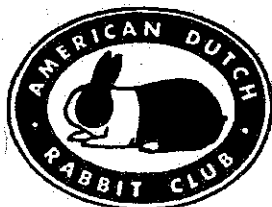

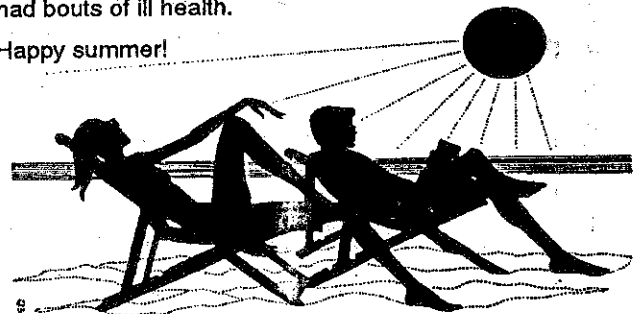

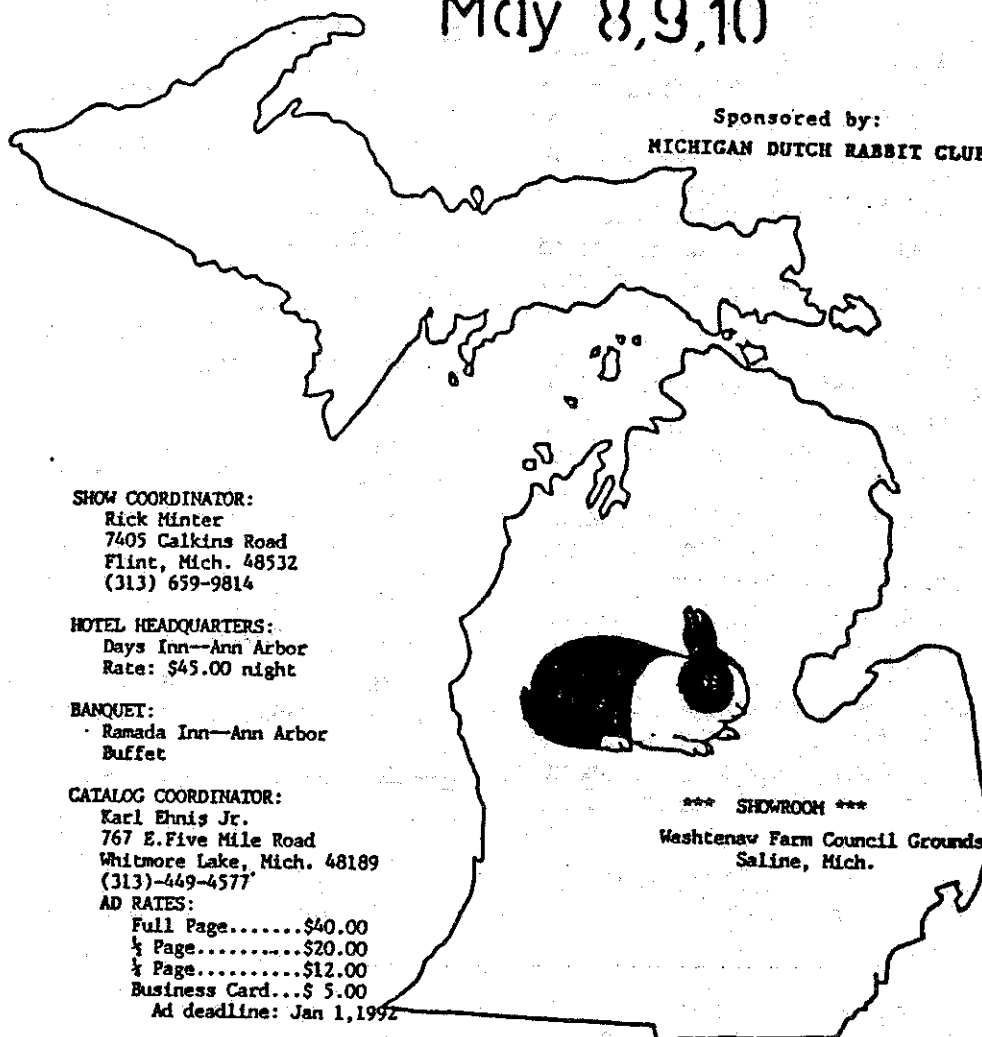

MINUTES OF THE ADRC BOARD OF
DIRECTORS MEETING, MAY 3, 1991

The ADRC Board of Directors meeting was called to order at 8:10 PM by President Wenton Carlton. Roll of Officers: Those present were; President Carlton; Directors Jack Pugh; Fred Mullinax; Fran Schettler; George Parmer; Jack Wireman and Secretary/Treasurer Hart. Those Officers absent were; Vice-President Bill Reid and Directors Dick Gehr; Dr Terry Reed and Chuck Christ. Also present was our youth representative Amy Minter.

The Board immediately went to the priority business at hand with regard to the open position of District #2 Director. Mr. Myrl Milhahn of Michigan received eight (8) votes as a write-in candidate and wishes to be seated in this position. Mr. Milhahn has obtained legal counsel in his behalf with regard to this matter. The ADRC Constitution and By-Laws 'requires' that a petition be filed in order to be placed on the election ballot. The write-in portion of the ballot was designed as a means for the membership to express a possible candidate for the President's consideration when appointing these offices. Since write-ins are not provided for in our Constitution and By-Laws, it is concurred that Section 5 of the By-Laws, along with previous presidents would prevail. Section 5 states that the Board of Directors will decide upon all questions of policy brought before them. This was indeed felt a question of policy. A determination with regard to write-ins was made. The ADRC

obtained the legal opinion of three (3) different lawyers with regard to this matter. It was felt that the ADRC was indeed within it's rights in an appointment to this office if a petition was not filed. However, it was also the legal opinion of the three (3) lawyers contacted that in order to prove in court that we are within our rights, we could possibly deplete the club's treasury. We would come in to a no-win situation. In winning our case, there would be no funds to continue the American Dutch Rabbit Club, and therefore no seat for anyone to be appointed to.

Mr. Milhahn was asked if he would compromise and was asked if he would be willing to take out a petition as required within our Constitution and By-Laws, and the ADRC would hold a special election immediately within that District only. This would, of course, be open to anyone who wished to file for that District. It was stated that if Mr. Milhahn won this election as per the current ADRC rules and regulations, he would be seated as District Director immediately. Mr. Milhahn refused the offer and any other compromise. He stated that he was already officially elected and wanted his seat on the Board. Mr. Milhahn was questioned by Board members with regard to why he did not take out a petition in the beginning if he was that interested in an Officer's position. When he was asked when the last National Show was that he attended, his reply was the NDS in Bloomington, Illinois. He was asked if he was willing to deplete the ADRC treasury and cease the ADRC

from existence, his reply was that he did not want to hurt the Dutch Club but he would continue legal action to obtain the Directors seat regardless of cost. It was decided at that time that this matter would be brought up to the General Membership present but the Board's decision had to rest on the protection of keeping this organization in existence. This cannot be done if the treasury is depleted due to court costs incurred in our behalf. Therefore, those Board Members present decided to appoint Mr. Milhahn to the Director's seat provided that he was willing to cease all litigation now and in the future against this organization, it's officers or it's members and abide by all rules and regulations of the ADRC. A written statement was drawn up to this effect for Mr. Milhahn's signature.

Al Butler gave a publicity report. Al stated that a new item, a 'glass mug' has been added. He states that all inventory is paid for and there are no outstanding bills. Barb & Al were commended for the fine job they do with their department.

REPORT OF OFFICERS:

DIRECTOR PARMER states that Dutch are slowly picking up in his area with two or three new members.

DIRECTOR PUGH states that he's been to a few shows with 50 to 100 Dutch entered. Dutch seem to be holding their own. He expressed the possibility of an NDS sponsored by the EDRF in '94. They will submit a bid at a later date.

DIRECTOR WIREMAN states that he's been busy with the preparation for the '91 NDS and hasn't gotten any reports from anyone in his district.

PRESIDENT CARLTON reports that he's been to very few shows but that they held their first Arizona State show in some 15 years. The only exhibitors were himself, Chuck Christ and a Dutch exhibited by a young exhibitor. He stated that Dutch are on and off in New Mexico and there seemed to almost be virtually no Dutch around in Colorado.

SECRETARY-TREASURER HART reports that Dutch appear to be holding their own in Illinois but some of the regular breeders haven't been bringing their normal size entries. Dutch are slightly lower in numbers at some of the local shows.

DIRECTOR MULLINAX stated that Dutch have really picked up in his area. The youth shows have 40+ Dutch with many new breeders. He said that they 'really seem to be getting into it.'

DIRECTOR SCHETTLER reports that the '91 ARBA Convention is the #1 Priority in the state right now. There is a Dutch luncheon being scheduled for Tuesday and should be approximately \$10.00 per person. Fran is breed chairperson with Joanne Purpus as co-chairperson due to the size of the state. Delta is the official airlines for the convention and Rick Lehman has secured an 'excellent' motel very close to the fairgrounds. Fran suggests that you get your reservations in ASAP. She

stated that Dutch are hot and heavy in Southern California right now with alot of quality Dutch. Northern California is down just a bit. She noted that supports with specials is needed from the membership for the ARBA Convention. They hope to possibly secure a second judge for the Dutch in California.

YOUTH REPRESENTATIVE AMY MINTER states that she has received no response from the youth with regard to input. She also states that the youth are down a bit in Michigan. She gave a report on the 1992 NDS in Saline, Michigan on May 8-10th. She noted that the motel is approximately 4 miles from the showroom.

Jim Schettler presented a bid by the California Dutch Rabbit Club for the 1993 NDS in Pleasanton, California on April 23-25th.. He stated that they will have everything as centralized as possible. He noted that there were five (5) motels in the area and rates tend to be lower on the weekend. Jim and the California Dutch RC presented and 'exceptional' bid. Those present unanimously approved the bid. Motion to accept by Director Wireman and seconded by Director Pugh.

OLD BUSINESS:

The ADRC has received many compliments with regard to the reinstatement of the Dutch variety ribbons for both open and youth. Due to a style and size change, the ADRC is not incurring and additional costs and the mailing of the ribbons has stayed within the .29 postage fee. Director Wireman

made a motion, seconded by Director Schettler we continue the ribbons until a later date. At that time the costs, etc. will be re-evaluated.

NEW BUSINESS:

Director Pugh stated that the EDRF will submit a bid for the 1994 NDS for Reading, Pennsylvania. Director Parmer noted that the NWDRRC is chattering about a future NDS as is the Illinois Dutch says Secretary Hart.

Director Parmer wished to commend the California Dutch Rabbit Club for their 'EXCELLENT' NDS bid package. The Board also expressed their commendation.

President Carlton was asked to mention the possibility of a Hall of Fame for the ADRC. Director Mullinax made a motion, seconded by Director Parmer that this be tabled until the Convention in California and possible put in a fute DR for suggextions.

Amy Minter said that the youth in Michigan would definitely like something for the '92 NDS. We 'NEED' input from the youth regarding what they want to see so that the Board is able to start some type of program going within the ADRC.

At this time, Director Wireman said that an 'UNOFFICIAL' count of the Dutch entered was 515 in the open division and 202 in the youth. Director Wireman noted that there were three open judges, Scott Williamson, Larry Bengtson and Al Butler and two youth judges, Wenton Carlton and Barb Butler. He noted that the Seller's Class would be cut off at approximately 1PM Saturday to avoid delays in

getting started.

There being no further business, Director Parmer made a motion to adjourn, seconded by Director Mullinax. MC

Raising rabbits can be very frustrating for those of us who have some picky eaters or rabbits that simply go off of feed at different times of the year. Keeping them eating regularly requires a little extra time and some additional specialty feeds.

The first thing I try to get the rabbit eating regularly, (providing there are no signs of coccidiosis) is to give them a handful of wheat straw. Most of my animals eat it well and it seems to increase their appetite for pellets. If this fails to get them eating their pellets regularly, I will give them the straw again and remove the pellets for twelve to twenty-four hours. Removal of the pellets is very important; just as if you had eaten something that made you sick, you would not want to be forced to eat it again.

Once the pellets are given back to the animal, hopefully it will begin eating. If not, some additional foodstuffs may be necessary. Rolled oats or alfalfa hay can be used the same way as I do with the straw. The oats are high in energy and the alfalfa is high in minerals so be careful not to give them any large quantity if they are not accustomed to eating them.

The other food I use to get them eating, or to increase their consumption of pellets is a banana. One-third to one-half of a banana per day will generally increase their appetite providing they will eat the banana. It seems to have the same affect as it does with people regarding weight gain.

One must not forget to treat for coccidiosis on a regular basis. Using sulfa-quinoxaline (I use Sul-Quin 6-50 from Salsbury Labs out of Iowa), will help to keep them eating on a regular basis.

Remember, rabbits have been known to starve themselves, so it is important to get them to eat something.

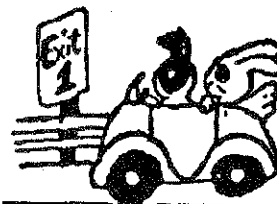

FLYING WITH RABBITS

Jim and I were asked several times during our Ohio NDS adventure about flying with rabbits. We have flown about 6 or 7 times with rabbits using American, United and Delta Airlines. Hopefully some of our experiences will help some of you.

The first thing to realize is that your success depends largely on two things--your preplanning and the airline personnel you happen to get.

When we plan a trip with the rabbits, these are the steps we follow:

- Call the 800 ticketing number for the airline of choice. Allow 15 - 45 minutes for this call. (I have found that travel agents cannot or will not handle these special arrangements.) Tell the agent about your travel plans, and get the flight information. After getting that information, tell them that you have a special quirk to deal with-- that you are planning to ship rabbits with you as **excess baggage**, (not as air freight, it's much too expensive). At this point you will find out if that airline currently takes rabbits. Remember too that your plane must have a pressurized baggage compartment. United will fly rabbits for you for \$50 per kennel each way.

- Tell the representative that you will be shipping in special rabbit "kennels" approved for airline travel (be sure that you really are!) Say that they are self contained and that the kennel is divided up into separate compartments for each rabbit, and each compartment is large enough for the rabbit to turn around in. Say that you have done this many times before with no problem.

- If the representative tries to tell you that it is one rabbit per kennel, try to explain that rabbits are not like dogs and cats, and describe your cage. Say again that you have done it before. If you are getting nowhere, either give up on that airline, ask to speak to someone else, or call back later hoping to get someone else.

- If you do get a sympathetic ear, ask to have a note made in your computer file that you are flying with rabbits. This eases the mind of the ticket counter check-in person. The representative should also make pet reservations on all flights for you.

- Be sure to find out any special requirements. Each airline has weight and size limits for excess baggage. Find out the cost. We can get 12 Dutch in one kennel by hooking two 18" x 24" cages together (each divided up into six holes) with the special cage clamps sold for the purpose. The top cage has a solid top. We make sure that we use our best cages for flying. They should be clean and new looking, with clean shavings in the pans. Don't use cat litter or straw, some litter is toxic to rabbits, and straw can poke the rabbit in the eye. There should not be any broken or bent wires. You want to impress the agent who is going to "make or break" your trip. If you put a couple of cages together to make one kennel, be absolutely sure that they cannot come apart. This was the main concern of our agent checking us out of Oakland for Ohio.

- Check in at the main check-in counter after having the sidewalk porter transport your rabbits inside. Pay your kennel charge and be sure you have a vet certificate and a spare couple of copies in case the agent asks for them.

Sometimes they want to attach it to the cage. Act confident and let them know you have done this before. Hopefully, the agent won't give you any last minute problems, but there is no guarantee!

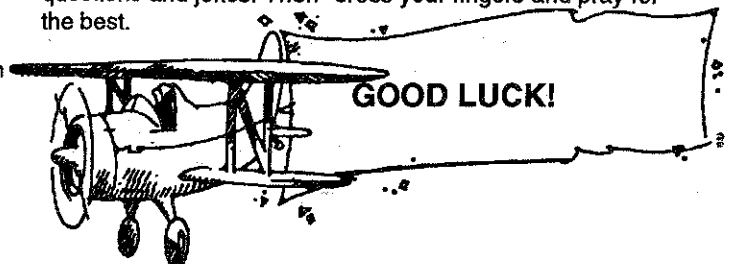
Coming back from Ohio, our plane was delayed because of bad weather in Chicago and we missed our connecting flight. We were immediately concerned with where the rabbits would be kept in Chicago for the three hour layover we were now facing. (It was raining!) I asked the gate ticket agent where I could go to find out the rabbit's status. He directed me to United's customer service counter. After some searching and a 20 minute wait, they discovered that our baggage and rabbits had made our connecting flight and were on their way home without us! I asked the agent to contact Oakland airport and make arrangements for the rabbits to be kept somewhere safe away from the public, and out of the elements, until our arrival. United was very cooperative, and arranged to have the rabbits held in a safe area behind the main ticket counter. They were there, safe and sound, when we finally arrived. They did require an inspection of our baggage tag for the kennel before they would let us claim them.

Under normal conditions, when you arrive at your destination, the rabbits will not arrive on the regular baggage carousel. Look around the baggage area and find the special freight doorway, or a "people" door. If you cannot locate one, ask the local baggage agent supervising the area where pets would be coming in. The rabbits usually arrive 5 - 10 minutes after the baggage, but a couple of times they have beat us to the baggage area.

For the Tulsa ARBA Convention, our rabbits ended up flying a completely different route from us, and arrived at the airport three hours after we did (after midnight!) This is because the Convention airline is usually full of rabbits, and there are regulations governing the number of pounds of live animals an airplane can carry. Since everyone for Convention is arriving during a fairly narrow time slot, many animals have to be rerouted to different times and flights. You have no way of being sure whether yours will be on your flight or not.

Once you have finally gotten your rabbits, we find it easiest to rent a baggage cart to load the cages onto. This makes carrying the rabbits and our suitcases much easier.

In summary, be sure to make arrangements **in advance**. Get the ticket agent to put a note in your passenger computer file--it makes it look preapproved. Be sure you meet the airline's basic size, weight, labeling and vet certificate requirements. Act cooperative and confident when you arrive at the airport ticket counter. Be prepared for your rabbits to cause a stir with airport personnel and other passengers. You'll probably get lots of rabbit questions and jokes! Then--cross your fingers and pray for the best.



HOUSING RABBITS IN HOT WEATHER

We keep our rabbits in a small building. Here are some things that work for us in very hot weather:

1. Have plenty of openings to let fresh air enter and hot, stale air escape - doors, windows and vents. Screens keep out bugs but quickly clog with fur so check them often and keep them clear so the air can move. (A vacuum cleaner is a handy tool. Let the rabbits get used to the noise by turning it on at a distance the first couple of times. They quickly adjust to it but watch not to startle them with it. Any strange sound or movement can easily startle them.) Each wall should have vent openings at the top and at the bottom. The bottom vents bring in fresh air and are especially important. They should be spaced no further apart than about five feet. Each corner of the building should also have a bottom vent because corners are hard places to ventilate.

2. A wind-powered whirlybird turbine roof ventilator at the high point of the roof is a must! One ventilator per twelve feet of building length is a good guide.

3. Use an automatic, thermostatically controlled exhaust fan. We use a home type, 3-speed box fan that costs about \$30. We get about two years use and then replace it. Keep it clear of fur and dust or it won't move the air and could overheat and be a fire hazard.

4. Put a big dial type thermometer in the hottest part of the building so you can always be aware of the temperature.

5. During summer, we lay a garden/lawn type soaker hose coiled into a big loop on the roof. When the outside temperature gets much above 85 degrees, we turn it on just enough to keep the roof wet. It cools the roof and usually keeps the inside temperature below 85 degrees due to the evaporation of the water from the wet roof. Nothing can take the place of good ventilation which is absolutely necessary for fresh air changes and temperature control in the rabbitry. But once you get that good ventilation, the wet roof will go a step further and cool the inside temperature below the outside temperature.

6. Cages need to be cleaned and disinfected more often in hot weather. We also use absorbent pine shavings in the trays year round which makes for healthier air in the rabbitry.

7. We have well water at our place so we add about a half a teaspoon of regular Clorox per gallon of water before watering the rabbits. We do this year round for precautionary purification. (When we first started this, it took the rabbits a few days to adjust to the new taste.) It also keeps the water bottles clean and slime-free.

8. As a final note, we take out excess nest box straw and fur, and to be on the safe side, we bring nest box babies into the house during the heat of the day on extremely hot days.
