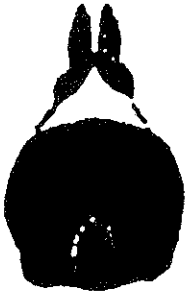
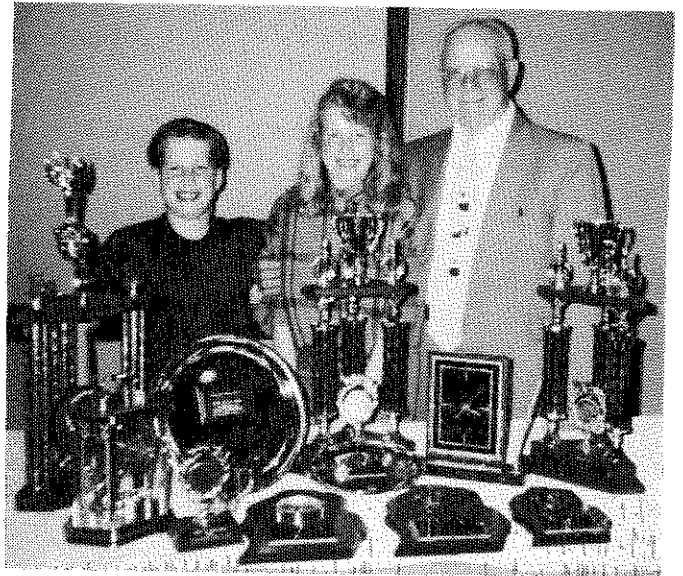

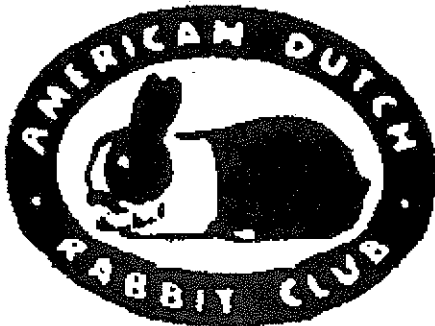

So, I would like to join thanks to Nell and Don. Anyone wanting to help another person should write a letter to Don Brady. This good man can still read. He is confined to a chair all day, and I am sure he would enjoy receiving some mail from his Dutch friends.

And yes, I really enjoy the Dutch rabbit.

BOARD OF DIRECTORS MINUTES; N.D.S., SALINE, MICHIGAN
MAY 8, 1992

The meeting of the American Dutch Rabbit Club Board of Directors was called to order at 8PM by Vice-President Fred Mullinax. Those answering roll were: Vice-President Mullinax; Directors Hooper, Wireman, Milhahn, Parmer, Schettler and Gehr; Secretary-Treasurer Hart. Those absent were: President Carlton; Directors Pugh, Christ and Reed.

Director Hooper made a motion that we dispense with the reading of the minutes from the last meeting as they were published in the Dutch Reporter. The motion was seconded by Director Wireman. MC

The Vice-President addressed some items brought to his attention by President Carlton: He stated that a Standard Committee appointment would have to be made and he would like for both Director TE Reed and Director Gehr to be members of that committee. A motion was made by Director Wireman and seconded by Director Hooper that these two appointments be made as requested. MC President Carlton will need to appoint three other members and bring them to the Boards attention.

The idea of a quarterly issue of the Dutch Reporter was addressed. Director Schettler said that she was in total favor of this recommendation. She publishes the Dutch Blaze and is in full realization of the time and finances needed, along with support through submission of material for publication. Director Milhahn stated that years ago, the ADRC published a monthly newsletter and he was in favor of keeping it bi-monthly. He expressed that the membership dues could be raised to help defray costs. Vice-President Mullinax stated that we were already in a recession and he was not in favor of dues being raised for this purpose. The remainder of the Board in attendance were also not in favor of raising dues at this time. It was also discussed that there could be the possibility of a new DR Editor. However, Director Gehr does not receive any editor's fees for this duty and a new editor would also have to take on this responsibility with no reimbursement. Director Gehr asked that the idea be put before the membership that we publish the DR on a quarterly basis on a trial period with no raise in membership fees. This would allow more time for some to send in material for publication and also help to assist in making the DR more financially secure.

The Eastern Dutch Rabbit Fanciers submitted a bid for the 1994 National Dutch Show in Reading, Pennsylvania on April 29-May 1st.. The showroom has 6,417 square feet available at the 'INN'. The airport is located about five miles from the showroom. After some questions and discussions, the Board voted to allow them the bid. A motion was made by Director Wireman and seconded by Director Milhahn. MC

There was further discussion on presenting the quarterly publication of the DR to the membership and it's feasibility. A motion was made by Director Parmer and seconded by Director Wireman that both Director Hooper and Director Schettler present it to the ADRC membership at the General Meeting as they both publish newsletters and realize the problems and expense involved. MC

It was discussed at the ARBA Convention in Pomona, California about the ADRC allowing one half of it's portion of the Sellers Class go to specials for the next ARBA Convention. This was discussed as a possibility to enhance the Convention specials as there is very little ADRC allowance that goes for this purpose. This was 'only' for the

Sellers Class at the ARBA Conventions. Director Parmer made a motion, seconded by Director Hooper that the American Dutch Rabbit Club donate one half of it's portion of ARBA Sellers Class funds towards specials at the next ARBA Convention. MC The breed chairperson is to divide the specials between open and youth at their discretion as per an amendment to the motion. Motion by Director Hooper and seconded by Director Schettler. MC

NEW BUSINESS: Director Schettler made a motion to add the calculation of points for BOV and BOSV by one (1) times the number in the variety for BOV, and one-half (1/2) times the number in the variety for BOSV. There was a discussion to this motion and Director Gehr stated that the BOSV rabbit should receive one (1) times the number of the same sex of the BOSV winner in order to be fair. Director Schettler agreed with this and amended her motion accordingly. The motion was seconded by Director Gehr. MC This will become effective with the 1993 sweepstakes year. Director Gehr made a motion for the BOB and BOS points to be changed to coincide with the variety points; one (1) times the number in the breed for a BOB win and one (1) times the number of the same sex as the BOS winner for BOS. This is to become effective with the 1993 sweepstakes year also. The motion was seconded by Director Schettler. MC

REPORT OF OFFICERS: Director Parmer noted that Dutch were doing good in the NW with shows of up to 50-70 Dutch. He stated that there were alot of younger breeders: Director Wireman said that he had only been to a couple of shows and Dutch were up a little. He said that he was having trouble getting litters and has only had two since the first of the year: Director Gehr stated that he's been judging every weekend since the second week in January and has only had the opportunity to judge one Illinois show. Dutch seemed to be up a little with the Illinois Dutch RC beginning to hold specialty shows. He noted that the IDRC held a strong possibility of bidding on the 1995 NDS in Illinois: Director Schettler said that in her area, Dorothy Bayliss is retiring and selling her Dutch herd. She noted that she still had some stock available if there was any interest. She also stated that Leonard Weir's rabbitry got raided by dogs and he was completely wiped out. Director Schettler stated that they were gearing up for the 1993 National Dutch Show and excitement was high. She invited everone to attend: Secretary-Treasurer Hart noted that she had only been able to attend a couple of shows and Dutch appeared to be up a bit. Possibly the Dutch specialty show and the possibility of another NDS in Illinois will spark more Dutch being shown. She also noted that they were having some trouble getting some of the does bred and had very few litters lately: Director Hooper stated that the Dutch numbers are up with a couple of breeders that had been out of Dutch for awhile now getting back in. Director Hooper stated that he and a couple of other people were working on a good color description of the steel Dutch. They are going to try to get a meeting together in the fall to discuss the color and a preliminary description: Director Milhahn stated that the Michiana RC is no longer in existence and as of January 1st., it is now the I & M State RB. Director Milhahn noted that he has forty does and about 200 babies with only four does missing since the 1st. of January. He stated that due to his health, he hasn't been in attendace at many shows: Vice-President Mullinax said that the Carolina's Dutch Shows had over 100 in one show and 76 in the other. He stated that a

youth won Best in Show with a Dutch and that the youth were going strong and picking up alot. Vice-President noted that he received a note from President Carlton extending his regrests that he could not be at the 1992 NDS and hoped that each of us had a good time.

Director Parmer stated that he would like to see the Standard Committee 'tackle' the gray variety and put in some wording regarding agouti. He stated that many have no ring color. Director Gehr said that in the gray variety, the standard needs to say the 'any absence' of ring color is a disqualification. he noted that he'd like to see the gray and steel color description be more definite for judges to act on.

Director Gehr also noted that there has been many great people come through the American Dutch Rabbit Club and he felt that a 'Hall of Fame' needs to be addressed. He asked that the Board think about it as he will bring the matter up again at the 1992 ARBA Convention in Columbus, Ohio.

Director Parmer noted than Jan Coffelt sent her regards to everyone and regrets that she was unable to attend.

Being no further business, Director Parmer made a motion to adjourn. The motion was seconded by Director Milhahn. MC

In the September-October 1991 issue of the Dutch Reporter, Dr. T.E. Reed expressed concerns about two areas of the Dutch Standard of Perfection. He called for a discussion leading to clarification of these areas. One of these areas was the description of the Steel.

Why should we, who are new to the breeding of Dutch, feel that we should have input into the discussion of the ideal steel color? Four years ago we were the novices who after reading the description of the Steel still could not figure out how to tell the difference between some of the Steels and Grays at the shows that we attended. We decided that since the visible fur color of many Steels and Grays was very similar that it must be the presence, or lack of a definite undercut that differentiated the two varieties. We felt there had to be other differences. In an attempt to understand the coloration of these rabbits we have searched the literature and armed with our jewelers loop have examined a number of Steel and Gray Dutch. We would like to share with other concerned Dutch breeders the results of our research in hopes of stimulating discussion that will lead to a descriptive change in the Steel Standard.

To identify some sort of background color, as Dr. Reed suggests, may not be enough to allow a novice to identify the ideal Steel color from a reading of the Standard. More descriptive information is needed. Before an attempt is made to change the standard, an understanding of the Steel coloration is necessary. A comprehensive discussion of the genetics of Dutch rabbits can be found in an article printed in the July-August 1990 issue of The Dutch Reporter.

The Steel is basically an agouti rabbit with the addition of a gene designated as E^S. This extension gene is a dominant gene that extends the amount of black pigment, tends to reduce the amount of agouti banding and also darkens the white belly. On the Steel Dutch we have observed the secondary guard hairs have a single band of color that ranges from yellow to almost white depending on the other

genes present in the animal. A chart accompanying an article published in the American Dutch Rabbit Club Guide Book, written by Joanne Parker, indicates that the Steel Dutch is an agouti rabbit. In Genetics of the Rabbit, Roy Robinson reports "(t)he other dominant allele E^S was reported by Onslow (1922) who extracted the gene from Steel Dutch." In an article reprinted in New England Dutch Rabbit Club News, Vol.6, No.1, January 1991 is the following "Let us consider the agouti types of coloring in Dutch and make comparisons by the different forms of yellow that are obtainable. Grey Dutch shows in the coat an even mixture of black hairs and yellow and yellow banded hairs. Grey carries the black genes and ordinary extensions. Change the makeup to one gene of ordinary extension and one gene of dark extension, and we have a Steel Dutch". In discussing modifying factors in Genetics and Eugenics it says, "(t)hus the ordinary extension factor in rabbits produces with the regular agouti factor an ordinary gray coat, but the darkened extension factor produces with the same agouti factor a steel-gray coat. We think of the character of the gray marking as a consequence of the agouti factor but find in reality that it is changed by a change in the extension factor, no less than by changes in the agouti factor."

The agouti rabbit has grey or greyish-brown dorsal fur but a much lighter almost white underside. The long primary guard-hairs are unbanded but the shorter guard-hairs and underfur all have a band of phaeomelanin. Along the flanks the color of both banded and unbanded regions is much lighter, fading away gradually as one proceeds ventrally. Since the Steel extension gene acts by extending the black pigment over the yellow pigment to varying degrees the basic variations in the band color remains unchanged. Steels will have more color in the bands in the dorsal section and the band color will be lighter as it proceeds down the animals body in spite of other genetic factors that may be present. Since any animal is a combination of many genes there are numerous ways to modify or change the color of an animal.

There is a gene given the symbol (W) which controls the width of the band on agouti animals. The allele (symbol w) is completely recessive to normal and lies in the same chromosome as the agouti locus. The wide band homozygote is distinctly lighter than the narrow band agouti.

According to several authorities the Agouti (A) gene may be incompletely dominant to (a). Due to incomplete dominance the appearance (phenotype) of AA and Aa agouti rabbits may not be the same.

A recessive mutant, dilute (d), has been known for a long time, diluting black fur color to grey (blue) and yellow to cream. Although there seems to be disagreement as to whether this effect is caused by absence of pigment granules or by a clumping of the granules. Roy Robinson in Genetics Of The Rabbit says in his discussion of the dilute gene "The normal pigment of agouti rabbits is either dense black or yellow. A mutation known as dilute has been discovered, however which dilutes the black to blue and the yellow to beige. The mutant is fully recessive to the normal and is represented by the symbol (d) (Castle, Walter, Mullenix and Cobb 1901). The agouti pattern of white belly fur, eye circles, etc., are unchanged."

If you have gotten this far and are in agreement let us make a few suggestions about possible changes in the standard description of the Steel Dutch. 1.The Steel Dutch must be described as an agouti animal that retains the outermost band of color on the secondary guard hairs. 2.The desired band color should be described. 3.The background color should be described. 4.The overall effect should be described.

If the standard is changed we could suggest that Steel Dutch be pink in color; however, this is a genetic impossibility. Any changes made in the standard must reflect genetically possible combinations given the existing gene pool that we have to work with. In writing a new standard there are a number of factors to keep in mind. The

band color will vary over different parts of the same animal. Any changes in the standard must also allow for natural occurring color variations due to modifying genes. While there may be many shades of Blue, Chocolate, Tortoise, and even Black, preference should always be given to the correct color. This should hold true for Grays which must exhibit all the rings distinctly and never appear steelish. It should also hold true for Steels which should be distinct and identifiable and never confused with Grays. Unlike Grays, the naturally occurring Steel is not the steel color that is preferred on the show table. Although there are several genetic combinations that result in steel coloration, they do not all look alike.

Dutch breeders must first agree on which of the Steel colorations is acceptable on the show table. Only then can breeders attempt to produce Steels with the genetic combinations that result in the desired coloration.

Our thanks go to Kevin Hooper who has generously provided many of the Steel and Gray animals that we have examined. We would welcome the opportunity to discuss this matter with other breeders attending this National Dutch show. We have with us several jewelers loops (magnifying lenses) which we can use to examine animals if you so desire.

BURKLEY C. EARLES

Burkley C. Earles, 79, 1720 S. 17th St., died Thursday afternoon at Trinity Regional Hospital following a short illness.



Services will be at 10:30 a.m. Monday at Gunderson Funeral Home. Mass of the Christian burial will be at 11 a.m. at Sacred Heart Church with the Rev. Burkley C. Earles Lawrence McCarty officiating. Burial will follow in Corpus Christi Cemetery. A vigil for the deceased will be at 4:30 p.m. Sunday at the funeral home. Visitation will be after 2 p.m. Sunday at the Gunderson Funeral Home.

Survivors include his wife, Irene, Fort Dodge; sons, Thomas Earles, West Des Moines, and Luverne Earles, Arcadia, Calif.; daughter, Eleanor Cadam, West Des Moines; many grandchildren and great-grandchildren; brother, Herschel Earles, Osage; and sisters, Estle Earles of Minnesota and Nuna Van Duesseldorf of Britt.

Burkley Earles was born June 2, 1912 at Villa Grove, Ill. As an infant he moved to Corwith and then lived on farms near Corwith, Kanawha, and Britt. He married Rosella Reis in 1935 at Britt. They moved to Fort Dodge in 1936. He worked at Tobin Packing and then owned and operated Earles Roofing and Insulation from 1951 to 1964. He retired from his business in 1964. He was employed for a short time at Brady Moving and Storage Company. He started raising laboratory animals in 1964. He retired due to ill health in 1975. His wife Rosella preceded him in death in 1987. He married Irene Ayers in 1988 in Fort Dodge.

He was also known as the "Rabbit Man," being involved with rabbits since the 1940s. He started many local rabbit clubs and served as an officer in both local and state clubs until 1980. In 1950 he became a registrar for the American Rabbits Association, Inc. In 1964 he became a judge for the American Rabbit Breeders Association and in 1973 he became a judge of guinea pigs. He judged rabbits and guinea pigs in seven states. He was a lifetime member of the American Dutch Rabbit Breeders Association, the American Rabbits Breeding Association and the Iowa State Rabbit Breeders Association. Following his retirement from his construction business in 1964, he owned the Iowa Small Animal Enterprises which grew into the largest animal laboratory supply in the state. He was also credited with developing the first breed of Crested Cavey guinea pigs which was then recognized as a new breed by the American Rabbit Breeders Association, Inc.
