Congratulations to all the winners, and we losers, well let's try for Tampa. Hope you all had a good time and a safe trip home.

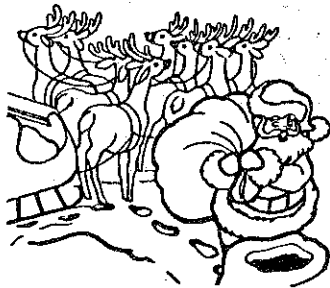
Sure was nice to see all the old faces and meet the new ones. I was a little under the weather for a couple of days, but am OK now.

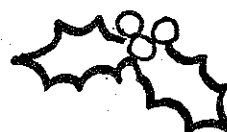

DIRECTORS MESSAGE FROM FRAN SCHETTLER

The ARBA Convention is over and California brought home its fair share of awards and good placements. Best of Breed went to Scott Williamson, who also took BOB with the same black doe at the Hanford show on November 4. Joanne Purpus won 1st in black senior bucks in Tulsa, and many other Californians placed well in what I thought was some excellent competition.

I was glad to be able to pick up some of the new promotional items at Tulsa, and I was able to stock up my local supply for sale here in California. New items that I now carry for sale include the sweat-shirts, playing cards, and the coffee cups. Anyone in California or Nevada interested in purchasing any of the promotional items on the order list in the DR can contact me for delivery arrangements. Prices are the same as on the list.

The Hanford show also saw Scott Williamson taking home Best Opposite of Breed with a black senior buck, Best Blue went to Shannon Byrom-Dykes, Best Chocolate, Gray, Steel to the Schettler's, and Best Tort to veteran breeder Leonard Weir.

By the time you read this, the Annual All-Dutch Show being held by the California Dutch Rabbit Club will be history. I will report those results in the next issue.

I breed for blacks only, because as I've said many times, I breed NZ Reds and play with Dutch. In approximately forty years of Dutch, I have never kept more than six breeding does, and rarely more than one buck.

After several false starts, I decided that I needed a buck that had cheeks (rounded bottoms) and stops as close to the Standard as possible. The best buck I could obtain with those qualities happened to be a Blue who was best opposite Blue at a National Dutch Show. His background was almost entirely Black. Up to eighteen years ago, I had used two other Blues - both bred out of my Blacks - and good enough to be big winners. One I gave to Charlie Williams as a young senior. He came back to me three years later with twenty-six Grand Champion Legs stapled together. The second one of my breeding was a winner of Best Opposite Blue at a Convention.

I do not find that Blue blood contributes anything to Black color, although I believe the Blues need some Black blood once in a while to keep the Blue color from getting mealy.

EDITOR'S COMMENTS:

There are several good articles in this issue, and I would personally like to THANK those that submitted them. A magazine is only as good as its contributors. Anyone that has published a newsletter knows how hard it is to "fill the space with something the membership will appreciate". This may not be popular with many of the members, but just stop and look at what advertising costs in other clubs and publications.

It was felt that with the Dutch Reporter being printed by a commercial printer, the quality is better than when we were doing it ourselves. I have had many comments on how good the DR looks now, and I would like to Thank the Board for making the decision to have it done this way. I, as your editor, am not providing the quality. Anyone that was doing this job could put out a good DR having it printed professionally. I only lay it out, retype some of the things that are sent in, and take care of the labeling and mailing. The credit for the quality belongs to your BOARD.

In order to maintain and

continue with the publication as it is now being printed, it is necessary to become more self supportive through our ads. Because of this, the following rates have been suggested and approved by the ADRC Board of Directors.

Starting January 1, 1990 the above rates will be in effect. Anyone taking out a new ad, or renewing an ad will need to submit the rates as noted.

I am aware of this, as Norma is my partner, and I hear most of the calls she takes. If I don't, she surely tells me of them. This should tell you that an ad might produce that little extra to pay the feed bill.

The 1989 ARBA Convention show was an outstanding showcase for the American Dutch Rabbit Club and its members. Over 400 entries, with good representation in every color, and over 75 exhibitors.

The first thing that we noticed as we arrived at the Fairgrounds in Tulsa, Oklahoma was the huge building that the rabbit show was in. The fourteen thousand rabbits, and all the booths, both commercial and club displays, were all in about a third of this building - and there were no posts anywhere. The part of the building we were in was air conditioned also, and as it was in the 70's during the day, it was needed.

When we found the Dutch booth, which was right in front of the Dutch cages, we were greeted by Mark Fox, co-breed chairperson, and Mark did a super job of helping us coop our rabbits, and get the paperwork straightened up. During the whole length of the Convention show Mark maintained his happy disposition while insuring that everything got done properly. His co-chairman, Bob Bergene, came in Sunday with a nice bunch of specially made trophies and plaques. Between the two of them, they did an outstanding job.

Because of computer problems, judging started late on Monday, and had to be continued into Tuesday, finishing up about noon. The placements were spread out pretty well, with a lot of fine animals being shown. Scott & Dianne Williamson won B.O.B. with a Black Jr. Doe, and Eric Anderson won B.O.S. with a Blue Jr. Buck.

Wednesday at noon we held a very successful banquet at the Holiday Inn, with about 80 persons attending. Awards and presentations were made to the

winners.

Probably the best part of the whole Convention was the Dutch area, and the Dutch people. There was always a bunch of Dutch people around, talking, looking, and just having a good time. The Dutch were the first breed to put placements on the cages, so exhibitors and visitors alike could see who won what. Only one other breed put placements on their coops. We also had the placements on poster board prominently placed in the Dutch booth. 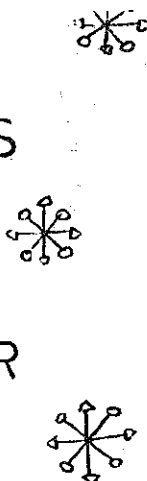

KETOSIS - PREGNANCY TOXEMIA

Acute death of does during the last few days of the gestation period; or, the first few days after kindling, without sign or cause can be very devastating and frustrating to the rabbit owner. Many of these deaths are never definitively diagnosed and will always be a mystery.

The condition known as ketosis or more commonly known as pregnancy toxemia, can cause the above. The signs seen with this condition is usually only that of acute death in a well conditioned (fat) doe during the latter one-third of the gestation period or the first few days after kindling. If signs are present, they will be displayed only for a short period of time and they will include that of the doe being very lethargic, disoriented, and severe depression. Does that die prior to kindling and that are not observed for a few hours after death, may demonstrate blood-like soiled fur around the vulva/rectum from the leakage of blood tinged fluid from the pressure created by the feti filled uteri.

From practical experience, this condition is more common in some herds than others and more frequently seen in does that have had some other condition present that produces a minor inappetence during the latter stages of pregnancy. In addition, there are enhanced incidence of this condition in herds that utilize high energy diets and in does that have an excessive amount of fat stored in the body.

The entire physiological concept of this condition is not totally understood in rabbits; however, the demands for energy during the latter stages of pregnancy is at its highest. This is due to the fact that the greatest amount of growth of the feti occurs during the last few days of the gestation period. To meet the energy demands the fat deposits of the doe's body are automatically mobilized. As the fat is metabolized in the liver, it is anticipated that the normal functions of the liver is altered, due to the vast amount of fat present, and the end products of the fat metabolism, ketones, are dramatically increased in the blood. In elevated levels, these ketones can be very detrimental and devastating to the rabbit's body.

This condition has such a rapid onset, and death is so acute, one usually does not have the opportunity to administer treatment. However, if one is fortunate enough to observe the depressed and lethargic doe, the animal can be treated by a veterinarian with subcutaneous glucose (fifty percent) and corticostroid injections. In addition, immediate oral administration of fifty percent dextrose solution, liquid molasses or kayro syrup can be very beneficial in the treatment and recovery of the doe. The success of treatment has been varied from one individual to another.

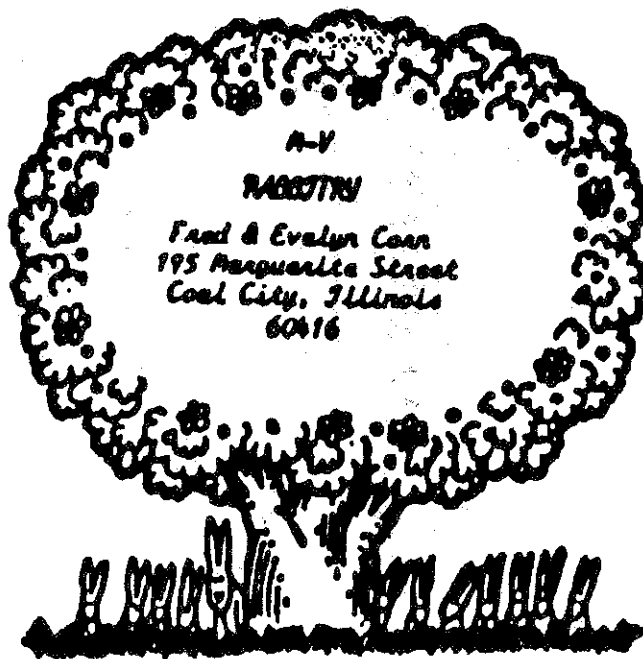
Prevention of this condition is much more practical than treatment. It is extremely important that bred does be in proper condition (not too fat) and that the total caloric intake be increased during the last portion of the gestation period. This can be accomplished by increasing the volume of feed given to the doe; or, by increasing the concentration of the energy by adding high energy feeds; such as, molasses to the diet.

Upon necropsy of does that die of this condition, one will be able to demonstrate a grossly enlarged liver that is discolored yellow to yellow-brown and there will not be any other noticeable pathological lesions present.

In summary, ketosis; or, pregnancy toxemia, occurs in the female domestic rabbit during the last days of the gestation period or shortly after kindling. The most common sign is that of an acute unexplained death in a well conditioned doe. The cause of death is usually related to the high levels of ketone substances in the blood as a result of the metabolism of the fat deposits in the body due to the increased need of the body for energy to support the rapidly developing feti. Prevention of this condition is more practical than treatment and can be accomplished by keeping the does in proper breeding condition and increasing the energy consumption of the doe in the last portion of the gestation period.
