





#### DISTRICT 1 Fred Mullinax


Hi Dutch Fans,

#### DIRECTOR'S MESSAGE

The California Dutch Rabbit Club recently held its annual All-Dutch Show and meeting in Visalia on November 4. 1990. Scott Williamson presided over the judging and placed a black senior doe owned by Joanne Purpus as Best of Breed. Best Opposite of Breed was taken home by a surprised Fred and Helen Schmall, who won with a tortoise junior buck. Scott also conducted the Dutch auction, which was the first time in recent history that the club has held an auction of Dutch rabbits. Top seller was a steel senior buck, donated by Joanne Purpus. The auction was a very successful fund raiser for the club. with Joanne Purpus, Jill Dobson and Kimberly Kuppens donating all of the proceeds from the sale of their rabbits to the club. The Schmall's provided their usual outstanding food for lunch, which included deep pit barbequed beef and, of course, rabbit. (It doesn't pay to place last in this show.)

Of particular interest to ADRC members is that the California Dutch Rabbit Club has, during this annual meeting, confirmed its intention to bid on the 1993 National Dutch Show. The location recommended is the Alameda County Fairgrounds in Pleasanton. Pleasanton is a suburban community not far from Oakland in the San Francisco Bay Area. It is my intention to present the California Dutch Rabbit Club bid to the Officers and Directors of ADRC at the next National Dutch Show.

The club also selected its "Youth of the Year" winner during the annual show. The winner is Debbie Holbrook of Vacaville. The award is presented to the youth club member who has achieved the most during the year with their Dutch, and who submits the required application. Show winnings are only a minor consideration in this award. Congratulations to Debbie!

I would like to thank Dr. Reed for the response to my question in the DR a couple of issues ago about the moulting problem. He took the time and effort to send me a 3 page letter discussing the moulting process and possible answers to my problem. Thanks Doc. However, I have not heard from anyone about a computerized pedigree program. Surely some of the Dutch people out there are using one? I would still be interested in your feedback. What about a show secretary's program?

I hope that everyone had a good time at Convention, and Jim and I wish everyone Happy Holidays!

The meeting of the ADRC Board of Directors was called to order at 8:00 PM by President Wenton Carlton. Director Wireman made a motion that we dispense with the reading of the last Board of Directors minutes as they were published in the Dutch Reporter. The motion was seconded by Director Parmer. MC

ROLL: President Carlton; Vice President Reid; Directors Wireman; Mullinax; Gehr; Parmer and Christ and Secretary-Treasurer Hart were present. Those absent were, Directors Pecaric; Ehnis; Reed and Schettler.

Report Of Officers: Secretary Hart stated that at the present time, we have 766 total members. 346 Single Adult/192 Husband-Wife and 228 Youth. She also stated that since January 1, 1990 through 10/3 1/90, there had been 550 open sanctions issued and 237 youth. A total of 787 sanctions with two months to go. She stated that the Dutch are up in her are a and seem to be on a upswing. The quality seems to be improving. Director Parmer said that the Southern part of Oregon, Dutch are up some with a few new breeders. He said that the youth are going strong in Dutch. Director Mullinax says that as a whole, shows are picking up with 60-70 quality Dutch being shown. Vice-President Reid said that the Dutch are 'dead' in his part of Texas. There are only two breeders showing anymore right there. In Oklahoma, 3 or 4 breeders have sold out In the Houston area, there are only 1 or 2 breeders showing along with a few youth. He said that there is only a handful of Dutch at a show anymore. He stated that breeders that had been in Dutch for a long time have ceased due to medical, physical or financial reasons. Director Wireman stated that shows are up and down. There appears to be more quality than quantity. He stated that there are quite a few youth members in Ohio. Director Wireman stated that the judges for the 1991 NDS have been secured and things are going pretty well. He said that he has heard alot of good comments on the Dutch Reporter. Director Gehr says that the Illinois Dutch are up a little due to a revival of the Illinois Dutch Rabbit Club. They have some active pushers. The Dutch at the State Convention and All Dutch show was way up with alot of quality animals. The IDRC would like to host another NDS in the future. Director Gehr said that he has been fortunate to judge the Dutch in many areas. He said that there has been much progress in the last five years. Director Christ said that the Arizona area is basically unchanged with only himself and President Carlton showing Dutch. New Mexico has a Dutch breeder in one club that hopes to build up the Dutch showing in that area. The 4-H in the Phoenix area is recommending Dutch to the children.

Publicity Director Al & Barb Butler stated that Al has judged in Sive states in the past 6 weeks with the numbers being good but not as high as he would like to see. He stated that the quality overall is outstanding. Barb Butler stated that there has been much comment on the Youth Dutch Display and the responsible party should be commended.

President Carlton says that he has judged alot of shows up in Utah and Montana and Colorado. He said that he was surprised at the numbers and quality especially in the youth. He stated that the youth rabbits shown could have competed and won in the open division almost anywhere. He noted that there were some nice Chocolates in Utah and Montana was coming up a little. He said that severalpeople were coming around in New Mexico and he hoped to see the numbers up in that area in the future.

There was discussion about the possibility of certificates and ribbons for adults and youth. This has been a discussion for quite some time now and it was felt that something should be done ASAP. Director Gehr made a motion that Secretary Hart be given the authority to purchase enough ribbons to last until the '91 NDS and get input at that time. Director Wireman seconded the motion. MC It was decided that not everyone will

be happy with the decision, but it is impossible to please everyone when making decisions.

Publicity Committee says that sales are down. Most of the stock is new and there are some discontinued items. All of the standard items are kept. They have dolls here at the Convention in a separate raffle with the proceeds to go to the Ohio NDS in '91. Support the raffle. There was a discussion on keeping the Dutch jackets in the publicity department. It was felt that this should be up to the department

Director Gehr stated that Kevin Hooper is doing a great job on the sweep-stakes, however, he no longer does the youth sweepstakes and it has been passed on to a youth chairperson. The open sweepstakes pays \$1.00 for each show report typed while the youth receive nothing. The youth chairperson is doing a fine job and should be given something for it. Director Wireman made a motion to pay the youth sweepstakes chairperson 50f per show typed for the DR. Director Christ seconded the motion. MC

OLD BUSINESS: There was a letter presented by Marti Dill to resign as Guide book Chairperson. A motion to accept her resignation was made by Director Wireman and seconded by Director Mullinax. MC The ADRC will solicit a new chairperson. It was discussed about the sale of the Guide books the ADRC currently has. These Guide books are now available without membership at a cost of \$4.00. This is to be listed in the Dutch Reporter. A motion allowing the sale was made by Director Gehr and seconded by Director Wireman. MC.

The ADRC computer needs to be updated immediately. President Carlton is going to check on the price of one in his area and Director Gehr and Secretary Hart will look into a purchase in their area with a service contract if possible. Director Mullinax made a motion to allow enough ADRC monies to purchase a new computer that is adequate. This motion was seconded by Vice-President Reid. MC

The Schettlers and the California Dutch RC will be breed chair and secretary for the California ARBA Convention.

We would like a youth chairperson to act as a delegate to the ADRC Board and see what can be done to promote or help the youth members. Amy Minter is to be asked if she would take on this responsibility as a liason. She will be given the opportunity to attend the Board Meetings but will have no voting priviledges. She will solicit for possible youth programs, etc. and bring them to the Board. A motion was made to allow the above by Director Christ, seconded by Director Gehr. MC.

Due to a problem with the results of the final ballot count, they are being recounted at the Convention and the results will be published in the DR.

A motion by Director Christ and seconded by Director Parmer was made to allow the sale of the ADRC Dutch Reporter equipment at a negotiable price. The equipment is deteriorating in outbuilding storage and is no longer needed to publish the DR. The Secretary was given a sale figure to ask and will be offered to another club at this fee. MC.

A motion to adjourn was made by Director Parmer and seconded by Director Mullinax. MC

#### KINDLING PROBLEMS; SCATTERED LITTERS

#### BY DR. T. E. REED

Every rabbit breeder approaches the time a doe should kindle with great anticipation. However, it can be a great disappointment when the doe fails to construct a proper nest, fails to use the nest box, and/or scatters the young on the wire. This problem is complicated, and exaggerated, during the colder winter months due to the fact that it is almost totally impossible to save any of the young due to exposure. During the warmer months of the year, there are opportunities to save partical litters of the young, or some of the litters, by placing the young in the nest and manually preparing the box for the doe.

The cause of the above problem can be catagorized into one of the following:

#### NEST BOX INCOMPATIBILITY

"Scattering" of the litter on the wire, due to the doe not wanting to use the nest box, can often be caused by the fact that the nest that one desires the doe to use is not compatible with her desires. The nest box may be of the improper size and she contaminates the nest by setting in the box, urinating and deficating in the box; and when it becomes time to kindle, the nest box itself is not condusive to the kindling process due to being soiled by feces and urine. This problem can be corrected by adjusting the size of the nest box one uses. From experience, it is suggested that the nest box be approximately one inch longer than the doe, in a normal setting position; and one inch wider than the doe, in the normal setting position. It is a tendency for most rabbit producers to use nest boxes that are entirely too large.

Due to the uniqueness of the doe, some does prefer that the nest box be covered, while others prefer an open nest box. This becomes the problem of the manager and from the actions the doe shows prior to kindling, the manager must make the decision as to what would be most compatible for the doe. Certainly, if the doe fails to use one type of nest box on a previous litter, it is recommended that the site and the type of nest box be changed for the next litter.

There can be other causes of nest box incompatibility rather than just the construction. Some does will fail to use the nest box due to the fact that the nest box will have a strong odor of disinfectant. It is imperative that all nest boxes be sterilized prior to placing with the doe; and they should be sterilized with the type of disinfectant that is appropriate for the individual's needs. However, it is imperative that after the disinfection process, the nest boxes should be rinsed thoroughly with good clean water so they do not carry any offensive odors to the doe.

Many individuals disinfect their nest boxes correctly, rinse then thoroughly, then place then in an area of storage where rodents and predators, as well as other animals, can run through the nest box and leave their odor. Again, many does find this offensive and will fail to use the nest box.

It is imperative that after proper disinfection and rinsing, the nest boxes should be stored in an area that they can be kept in an sanitized condition.

The use of the proper bedding material is very important. The bedding material should be of the type that the doe desires and also should be very clean and not carry any type of offensive odors where animals, predators, or rodents have

contaminated the nesting material. This single factor probably causes more problems with scattering litters than most rabbit breeders are aware of at this time.

Much of the time the bedding carries the odor of the natural predators of the rabbit and this is instinctive for the doe to not want to be in these places; and they do not desire to kindle their kits in an area where there is a natural predator, or the odor of a natural predator.

#### PRESENCE OF RODENTS AND PREDATORS DURING THE KINDLING PROCESS

The presence of rodents, predators, and strange animals during the kindling process is one of the most common reasons for the does to "scatter" the litter on the wire. This is also one of the most denied statements by most rabbit managers. One must be consciously aware that there can be rodents and predators in the rabbitry without the rabbit manager being aware of their presence. These predators are usually nocturnal and often go unnoticed by the rabbit manager; but are quite commonly present during the kindling process in the nighttime hours. Many rabbitry owners have reported the presence of raccoons and opposums rearing young themselves in the rabbitry without their being aware of this fact until many months or even a year later.

The kindling process is a very frightening time for the doe, partcularly the first litter doe, and they are very intense in their inhereted activities. Anything, that upsets this inhereted awareness can be very distructive and damaging to the kindling process.

The control of rodents and predators is something that one should be aware of throughout the entire year due to the fact that it can be very devastating during the kindling process. Also, these predators appear to be more common in the rabbitries during the colder months of the year when there is a high incidence of "scattering" of the litters for obvious reasons that they themselves want to keep warm; and need shelter as well as food.

#### POOR MATERNAL INSTINCTS

The maternal instinct of a doe is a very highly inhereted trait. One should use the maternal instincts of a doe in the culling factor in your production herd. Does that fail to have good maternal instincts will pass this trait on to their offspring. This is a very important factor in determining the cause of does "scattering" the young on the wire. One should use caution that if the doe does not have good maternal instincts that it is due to the hereditary cause and not an acquired trait through the presence of disease.

#### DISEASE

This is a very common cause of "scattering" young on the wire. This is strictly due to the presence of a metritis (uterus infection) in the doe. This condition can be present in first litter does as well as older does. This is usually the cause of "scattering" young on the wire of does that have previously made good rests, kindled, and reared good litters. The presence of the infection in the uterine horns of the doe produces a toxin that destroys or diminishes the maternal instincts that the doe has inhereted. With the presence of this uterus infection, the doe will lose those traits that she normally had, or, should have

had. This is a very common condition that is seen throughout the United States; and apparently in higher incidents at the present than in the past.

This condition can easily be treated and there is an excellent preventative medicine program for this condition that entails the administration of medication each time the doe kindles. This prevents the metritis from developing.

#### NON-METABOLIZABLE VITAMINS

This cause of "scattering" the litter has been in existance for several years. It has not been documented scienfitically; but, results from the addition of supplemental vitamins to the rabbit's diet has been successful in correcting the problem.

This condition is where the adult producing animals ingest feeds that have sufficient amounts of vitamins, Vitamin A in particular; and, for some reason, the animal is not able to metabolize the vitamin in the digestive tract and absorb the vitamin into the bloodstream. One of the common signs of this condition is that the doe fails in maternal instincts and will scatter the young on the wire rather than make a nest. If, in the next breeding, the does are supplemented with water soluble vitamins in the drinking water, they will usually kindle normally and have the normal maternal instincts that are anticipated.

It is theorized that the vitamin A that is ingested by the doe, is in some type of form that is non-metabolizable and cannot be absorbed from the digestive tract. This, in turn, causes an Avitamonosis A and one of the common signs of lack of vitamin A is stillborn young. As stated earlier, the entire theory behind this situation is not scientifically understood; but, the addition of water soluble vitamins at the normal rate prescribed on the package is successful in curing the problem.

"Scattering" the young is a very serious problem in many rabbitries throughout the United States. The cause of the majority of these problems can be catagorized into one of the above. It is imperative, if one is going to be a success in the rabbit enterprise, whether a fancier or a commercial operator, there needs to be continuous production throughout the year from the producing does and "scattering" of the young will certainly prevent the success of one's goals.

#### STRAIGHT COLORS by Al Meier, S.C.

Dick.

You asked for comments on breeding straight colors. I breed for blacks only because as I've said many times, I breed NZ Reds, and play with Dutch. In approximatelt 40 years of Dutch, I have never kept more than 6 breeding does and, rarely, more than 1 buck.

After several false starts, I decided that I needed a buck that had cheeks (rounded bottoms) and stops as close to the standard as possible. The best buck I could find was a blue that was best opposite blue at a National Dutch Show. His background was almost entirely black. Up to 18 years ago, I had used two other blues both bred out of my blacks - and good enough to be big winners. One I gave to Charlie Williams as a young senior. He came back to me 3 years later with 26 grand champion legs stapled together. The second one of my breeding was a winner of best opposite blue at a Convention.

I do not find that blue blood contributes anything to black color, although I believe the blues need some black blood once in a while to keep the blue color from getting mealy.

ED: Al also sent me a clipping from a "Fur and Feather" magazine from the 40's on breeding steels. If I have room, or can reproduce the clipping with the copier I will use it this issue. If not, I'll use it at a later date. THANKS, Al.

#### THREE SHOWMEN by Debbie Clark

I have thought long and hard before writing this article because I did not want it to sound like we were bragging. After weighing the pros and cons of the article, I'm still going to write it. It was a very special experience and I hope it or something like it happens to you.



#### REMATING THE FEMALE DOMESTIC RABBIT AFTER KINDLING WHEN? - WHY?

The length of time allowed to elapse from the time the doe kindles until she is remated will vary considerably depending upon a variety of circumstances. Included in determining the "breed back" schedule will be:

- 1. The total number of kits being raised by the doe.
- 2. The intended production purposes of the doe and litter.
- 3. The genetic capability of the doe to maintain physical condition during lactation.

The ultimate determining factor must be made by the rabbit manager utilizing the "individual" rabbit's physical condition to withstand remating and the rigors of another gestation period and lactation as the deciding factor. This will vary from herd to herd and from rabbit to rabbit, depending upon each individual's physical condition and the desired goals of production. However, there are some general guidelines that the rabbit manager may want to implement, fully understanding, that these may be altered for the individual doe under various circumstances; or, may be completely altered depending upon the purpose of the rabbit's produced.

It is generally accepted that once a doe is in production that "ideally" it is best to keep that animal in production due to the fact that by following this principle, it will usually minimize reproductive problems. It is generally accepted that excessive fat accumulation within the doe's abdominal cavity is the number one cause of breeding difficulties in the domestic rabbit. In addition, most rabbit persons are not aware of the small amount of pellets needed to maintain a "non-working" rabbit; and, therefore, dramatically overfeed the doe.

Excessive fat accumulation within the abdominal cavity acts as a physical barrier to prevent the ovum (egg) from entering the female reproductive tract to be fertilized by the deposited sperm; thereby, considerably decreasing the conception rate. In addition, there appears to be a decreased receptiveness of the female rabbit to the male in obese does. Regardless of the intended use (commercial production or fancy), a doe that is excessively fat may be a nonproducing liability to the herd.

The female domestic rabbit is usually more receptive to the male approximately seventy-two hours after kindling than at any other time in her reproductive cycle. The actual conception rate may

be somewhat lower in does bred at this time; but, the receptiveness to the male is at its peak. As lactation increases, the receptiveness of the doe to the male appears to decrease to varying degrees.

To take advantage of the above phenomonen and to incorporate the fact that producing does are usually not as apt to be excessively obese, some rabbit raisers recommend that the producing doe be remated two weeks prior to weaning the litter.

Most litters are weaned at four to eight weeks of Therefore, one may consider remating the doe at fourteen to forty days after kindling. By following the above schedule, the does can be palpated for pregnancy twelve to fourteen days after mating; and, in the doe that is pregnant the litter can be weaned she will have 'two weeks to recuperate from the rigors of production prior to kindling the next litter. If the doe is palpated to not be pregnant, the doe can be immediately remated and the litter can be retained with the doe for another two weeks until she can be palpated pregnant. At that time, the litter must be weaned and the doe should be ready to kindle again in approximately two weeks. If the doe fails to concieve the second time, the doe should be labeled as a "problem breeder" and all efforts possible taken to see that the doe becomes pregnant as soon as possible; and, special attention give that she does not become obese, complicating the breeding problems.

Ideally, the doe should be mated and palpated pregnant prior to weaning. The reason being that the doe is usually more receptive to the male. Also, due to the demands of lactation during the first three to four weeks after kindling, and an overall general increase in activity during the latter stages, the doe is not as likely to become obese and allow for a decrease in receptiveness. Also, the conception rate is increased. The above can be utilized as guidelines as to when the doe should be remated after kindling; but, it is extremely important that the manager consider each doe as an individual and remate her for the specific conditions that exist. Some of the specific situations are discussed below:

#### DOE THAT LOOSES THE ENTIRE LITTER

It is generally recommended that does that loose their litters during kindling; or, shortly after kingling, and does not have other complications, be remated three to seven days after kindling. This maximizes production for the commercial breeders and allows for the maximum utilization of desirable genetic characteristics for the fancier.

If complications are present, the does should not be remated until the problem has been corrected and they have regained an acceptable physical condition.

Does that loose litters during the nursing phase of production

can be remated immediately if there are not any complications. One should determine the cause of death of the kits so actions can be taken to prevent the reoccurance of these losses. It is extremely important that the excellent sanitation practices are implemented prior to the kindling process.

#### DOES WITH SMALL LITTERS

On occasion, the fancier will have does that have twins or triplets rather than a normal size litter and there is not the opportunity to foster these young to another doe. It may be highly recommended that these does be remated three to fourteen days after kindling, if the doe's physical condition can withstand this intense reproductive schedule.

Does that are only required to nurse one or two kits, with other things remaining equal, are not placed under severe rigorous lactation and usually adapt very well to a rapid rebreeding schedule.

#### DOES WITH EXTREMELY LARGE LITTERS

These does may very rapidly deteriorate in flesh condition the first three to four weeks after kindling; and, are not physically in condition to be remated on the regular "breed back" schedule, even when provided with adequate supportive care. One should extend the "breed back" time for these litters and not remate the doe as scheduled until she is in adequate flesh condition; or, wean the litter and allow the doe to recuperate before remating.

This is an area of great concern for the commercial producers. It is mandated that the commercial doe has production parameters that will allow here to raise a litter of seven to nine kits, allows for remating at ten to twenty-one days after kindling and has the inherent ability to maintain excellent breeding condition. If the commercial animal cannot maintain good physical condition with these production parameters, culling may need to be considered and the nutritive program closely examined.

#### DOES WITH COMPLICATIONS

Kindling is a very stressful time for the female domestic rabbit. There is an abundance of situations that can complicate the kindling and nursing process such as dystocia (difficult births), reproductive infection, respiratory infection, ketosis and so forth. Each of these situations must be handled on an individual basis. It is extremely important that any problem be identified and the necessary precautions taken to prevent these from reoccuring in future litters.

FANCIERS THAT DO NOT DESIRE MORE THAN ONE TO THREE LITTERS PER YEAR

There are many individuals that desire to raise only one to three

litters per doe per year due to the physical limitations of the space available. That can be done very successfully; but, the owner must use extreme care that the doe does not become obese in the time interval between breedings. This mandates that the doe be fed a restricted amount of feed each day to control the total energy intake to maintain good breeding condition. Adult does are usually very inactive and are kept in small cages. These animals need comparatively small amounts of energy to maintain their body weight and breeding condition.

In summary, the time to remate a doe after kindling is relative to the intended use of the doe and the actual physical condition of that animal. General guidelines for remating the doe are as follows:

- Does that loose their litter at or during kindling (no complications) -
- 2. Does with very small litters 3 to 14.
- 3. Commercial production does 10 to 21 days.
- 4. Commercial/fancy rabbits 2 weeks prior to weaning
- 5. Does with complications that cause poor physical condition - when appropriate

Condition of the doe is extremely important and the above recommended remating schedule has been determined to prevent the doe from becoming obese as this is the number one reproductive problem in the female domestic rabbit.

Also enclosed are a few photos I took at the 1990 convention. I hope you can use them.






