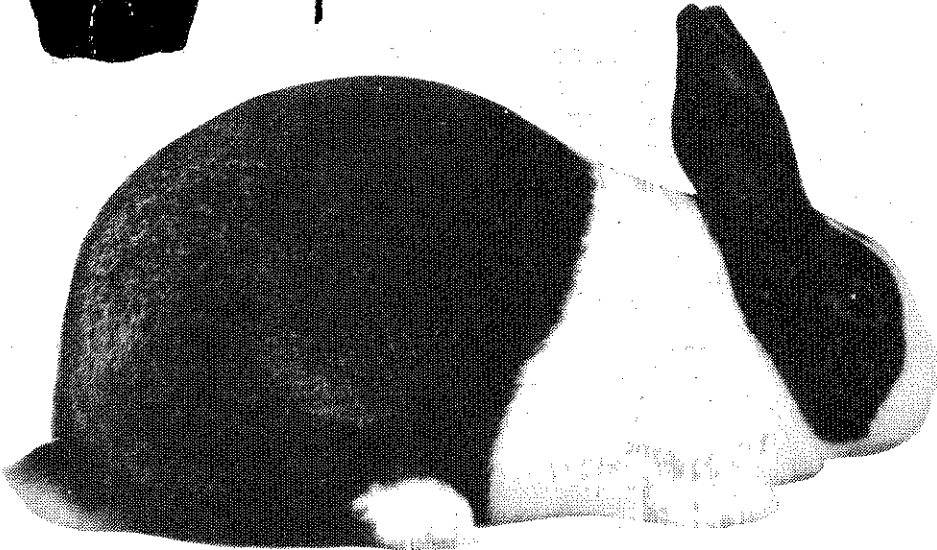

## QUESTION

This spring I bought a 2 1/2 year old buck from an experienced, reputable breeder. He was a proven sire who had produced many winners, and he certainly looked healthy and virile when he arrived in mid-May. The only problem of any sort was a reluctance to eat; he was very picky although he maintained weight and vigor. I bred him initially to four good does who were proven breeders, and all readily accepted service. None became pregnant. He since has bred three other healthy, receptive does, and only one became pregnant and delivered a litter. One out of seven is a poor average at a time of year when rabbits are their most productive.

His testicles and penis are normal. He is on and off the doe almost instantaneously.

Dear Dutch Breeder:

For conception to occur, it is mandated that there be union of a viable sperm and egg usually in the upper portion of the reproductive tract of the female. A conception rate of less than seventy percent, on first mating in rabbits, is an indication of some type of "breeding problems." To evaluate the situation, one must look at both the male and female animal(s) involved. With a conception rate of one out of seven, it is obvious that there is a problem! Since the majority of the does utilized have been proven breeders, it is easy to look at the buck as the "culprit" causing the low conception rate. Since the male has produced one litter, it is obvious that he is not sterile; but, there is obviously low fertility due to some cause.

When examining the male for fertility problems, one must give consideration to the volume and concentration of the semen produced. One of the more common causes of low fertility in rabbits is a low sperm concentration. The average concentration of sperm should be one hundred and fifty to two hundred million sperm per milliliter. Anything below two hundred and fifty thousand sperm per milliliter is considered poor quality semen and the possibility of conception is greatly reduced.

The concentration of semen from the buck can be readily checked by either collecting the semen in an artificial vagina; or, more practical, by utilizing a small amount of semen extracted from a doe's vagina that has just been mated. One can determine if there is live sperm present by placing a drop of semen on a normal microscope slide with a cover slip and then viewing under low power of a relatively inexpensive microscope. The motility of the sperm is relatively easy to determine and the concentration of the semen can be estimated, with experience; or, determined by normal laboratory procedures.

The most common cause of semen deterioration in rabbits is due to the male being exposed to high environmental temperatures (in excess of 85 degrees Fahrenheit). The amount of semen

deterioration will vary from animal to animal; but, this is the most common place where we see semen deterioration in the domestic rabbit under most circumstances.

If one has the opportunity to evaluate the male's semen quality and it is within the normal limits of volume and concentration; then, one must give consideration to the does. It is extremely important that the does ovulate viable eggs. The female rabbit will usually ovulate approximately ten hours after mating. There is usually an abundance of ovum ovulated and the number of kits will represent only approximately fifty percent of the number of ovum available for fertilization.

One of the primary causes of the ovum not to be able to come in contact with a viable sperm is the fact that in does that are carrying an excessive amount of fat, the fat acts as a mechanical barrier for the ovum to enter the oviduct and horns of the uterus. Another more common problem with the doe not ovulating properly is the fact that when the mating act occurs, the male does not stimulate the doe sufficiently to cause the ovulation ten hours after mating. This is a situation that can occur, particularly in older males, males that for some reason have difficulty in obtaining a full erection; or, in matings that are not totally sound. From the information in your letter, I would anticipate this is probably the cause of your low conception rate with this particular buck. You state the matings do not last long and this could be due to a partial premature ejaculation; or, due to a partial incomplete erection of the male due to age. If one checks the semen from the buck by examining a sample that has been deposited in the doe and found the sperm are motile, I would give consideration to the fact that the doe has not been properly stimulated to produce ovulation.

To assist in the conception rate when this occurs, one can very easily artificially stimulate the vaginal tract of the doe and enhance the conception rate. This procedure is very simple, takes very little time and requires a minimum of equipment. One can stimulate the female's reproductive tract with an insemination pipets immediately after the doe has been serviced, regardless of the length of time the buck has taken to service the doe.

Insemination pipets can be purchased at most farm stores and they are the pipets that are utilized in bovine for insemination. These bovine pipets can be severed in the middle to produce two insemination pipets for rabbits. These pipets should be sterile; or, as clean as possible. Immediately after the doe has been serviced, the pipet is inserted into the vagina of the doe approximately two and a half to four inches and the cervix and vaginal area stimulated. Nothing is inserted through the pipet. Just the physical stimulation is sufficient.

This is a very simple procedure where the doe is held, rear end up (upside down), between the legs while the inseminator is in a



sitting position. The tail of the doe is firmly grasped and held in a stabilized position in one hand while the insemination pipet is gently inserted into the vulva and then gently pushed to the dorsal part of the animal (toward the tail) and then gently slid into the anterior portion (toward the head) of the vaginal tract. The depth of insertion in rabbits is much deeper than most individuals anticipate. The end of the pipet can then be gently rotated for twenty to thirty seconds and then removed. This procedure will stimulate the doe to ovulate in approximately ten hours. It has been found that if one will restimulate the doe approximately eight to twelve hours after initial mating, utilizing the procedure set forth above, this will enhance the conception rate and litter size in these does.

This is an extremely simple, and safe, technique that can be utilized with great effectiveness for the fancier when utilizing those older bucks that tend to be very brief in their mating time. Do not be intimidated by the explanation.

At our research center, we have found it to be quite common for a portion of older males (any breed) to become relatively picky and reluctant to eat. In preliminary studies we have found there appears to be an increased incidence of partial wool block in older male animals compared to other aged rabbits. The actual cause of this situation is not entirely understood. However, when many of these older males with the history of "reluctance to eat" have been necropsied, one will find a small fur mass present in the stomach. The unusual situation about this is the fur mass is usually not progressive in these adult bucks and appears to be much more mature and smaller than fur blockage that is seen in animals of other age. As indicated, the cause is not entirely known; but, when one has older bucks that are reluctant to eat, oftentimes this situation can be corrected by treating the animal for fur blockage. An older buck that does not eat well will usually remain in pretty good shape if they are not utilized heavily as a breeder. The reason for this is the fact that the actual number of calories for an older male to maintain himself is relatively few. I thank you for this interesting question. If you have any further comments, questions or concerns, please advise.

## IONIZATION LAMPS by Robert Nicoll Nat & Bob's Rabbitry/Brooklyn, Ct.

We have experimented with the ion generators now for some time and have come to some conclusions that I would like to pass on.

Ion generators definitely work and any urine smell is reduced to a point where you can not smell it. Also, we haven't had any rabbits sneezing. This seems to be the case and we are thrilled to have prevented a lot of problems. You have to size your rabbitry building, then get the right amount of generators. In our rabbitry, we have four of them and this amount is required because of the building size. They are very inexpensive to operate and the cost of the generators are from \$50 to \$75 each. If you figure \$225 investment and we get the above results, then we are saving because we don't have sneezing or smell build up.

The theory of the generator is; it emits high negative ions into the air and the ions destroy unwanted positive ions that are present. The ion emitter is basically a generator. A negative ion is an atom or molecule that gained an electron. The ion generator is a generator that places high voltage on an alloy emitter which creates a corona discharge. When this happens, the ions are discharged into the air and collide with the molecules of oxygen, hydrogen, and other gases, then these change to a negative and the results is cleaner air.

Any dust that is present attracts the negative ions and this acts like a ground and the dust is destroyed and falls to the floor like ashes. All negative ions seek out a path to electrical ground. A positive ion does not seek ground and floats in the air doing nothing.

Negative ion more than 1000 ions per cubic centimeter cause the air to be fresher and the rabbits seem livelier. There is

also one other advantage, with the air cleaner and no dust or smell, the does want to breed more and the conception rate improves to a much higher rate. Each of these generators put out almost a half million negative ions per second so you can see that these units do their job.

All you need to install this unit is a plug as they come with a cord. After plugging it in, you will see results the next day.

## FALL SHOWS by Robert Nicoll Nat & Bob's Rabbitry - Brooklyn, Ct.

Now is the time to be thinking of and getting ready for all the fall shows.

Fisrt of all the traveling cages should be cleaned out. Burn all hair then wash the cages out with a good strong disinfectant, then rinse real well and get a can of unscented lysol and spray them. Don't forget to clean out all water bottles. After rinsing the bottles, dip them into a 1/4 cup of Clorox to 1 gallon of water then let them dry.

When you put your rabtbs into nice clean and sterile cages, this will prevent any old diseases from cropping up.

When you go to a show, don't take rabbits that are sneezing or that have other problems. You don't want your rabbits getting sick from others at a show, and others don't want your rabbit problems.

I have found that GATOR-AID in place of water is better for rabbits at shows. The extra electrolites and minerals of Gator-Aid seem to keep the stress of moving, traveling, people, noise, and handling down to a

minimum and the rabbits are perky  
and bright. Also, when returned to  
their own regular cage, there is  
no diarrhea problems.

To answer her question, I would say that at the Board meeting in Seattle, the Board passed the motion that from now on, \$3.00 would be given for Best of Breed, and \$2.00 given for Best Opposite Sex. These specials REPLACED the required \$1.00 for Best of Each Variety. Naturally, if an award of equal value (rosette, trophy, plaque, etc.) is given instead of the \$3.00 or \$2.00, this is sufficient.

Remember, this was just passed at Seattle, and there are many sanctions that have already been issued before this change could be put on the sanction papers. If someone still gives the Variety special only, don't get all upset. Just explain the situation to them, and if it doesn't do any good, let it go until the next show. Their next sanction papers will have the new required specials on it. Besides, you would have only been getting the \$1.00 special anyway, had it not been changed.

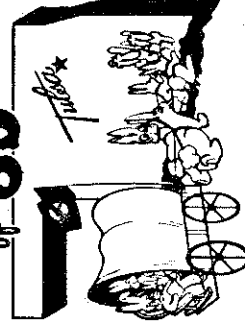

## History of the Dutch Rabbit

There can be little doubt that the Dutch rabbits is the oldest breed of rabbits known—certainly the oldest of the "fancy" breeds. The English Lop is perhaps the only other breed that had been shown prior to the Dutch. The Dutch is given credit as being the forebear of many of our present-day breeds, the Black and Tans, Polish, Havanas and Japanese. To state dogmatically just how old the Dutch breed is would be difficult. It is a safe guess to say that it is over 125 years old, as there are definite records of its having been shown in the 1860's. There is reference to this in an article published in the British Dutch Club yearbook of 1948, written by E. M. Snyder, in which he makes reference to a publication of 1865, "Manuals for Many," in which only eight breeds of rabbits are mentioned.

Quoting from this publication: "This pretty and useful breed is known in France under the name of Nicard. They are much liked in Old Provence on account of their prolific and hardy nature and they are very largely bred there. They are very useful as nurses to bring up the young of fancy rabbits, being such good milkers. It is astonishing to see one of these little creatures bring up five or six young in better condition than would be effected by another doe four or five times her own size." Apparently Dutch were being exported to England from Holland during the winter, skinned and dressed, but were shipped alive during the summer. The writer makes mention of the fact that he had picked up rabbits from these shipments that were good enough for exhibition. It is also interesting to note that the Dutch is not considered a "manufactured" breed and the author did not think it had been crossed for 20 years. This would take us back to 1840.

The first Dutch in this country were imported from English breeders of their very best strains, and many of these importers are still breeding and exhibiting them. Several of these importers are not now in the Dutch fancy. Among the importers (as I recall) such names as Gilbert, Williams, Rosemurgy, Strickland Brothers, Barnhart and Oliver, Jakobson, Seyfried, Lewis, Shufflebotham, Flude, Prudhomme; and among the imported strains are such names as Foorde, Thornton, Kepstorn, Tivey, Astley and Pychley. Charles O. Lewis and Forrest Jones were, I believe, the first importers of the Chocolate Dutch.

Although the first Dutch was of Gray origin, it has been developed to the point today where we have several recognized color varieties: Black, Blue, Tortoise, Chocolate, Gray and Steel Gray. No other breed offers such a diversified color range, and it is doubtful if there is anything more challenging and interesting in live small stock than the breeding and exhibiting of the Dutch. Our motto, "You can't beat the Dutch," becomes very evident!

### CLUB HISTORY

According to accepted history, the club was originated in 1919 or 1920—in fact, at that time there were two clubs, the International Dutch Club and the Federation of Dutch Breeders. There is no concrete record of which club became the parent organization of the present ADRC. The club as it now stands was organized in 1929 by Andrew Stodel and Albert Facy, with Mr. Stodel serving as secretary-treasurer and Mr. Facy as president.

Mr. Facy was succeeded by Robert M. Scott, who in turn was succeeded by John Furrer. Mr. Stodel served as secretary-treasurer until 1935, at which time he placed his resignation in the hands of John Furrer. At this time the club was barely functioning. Other officers appearing on the officers' roll at this time were Maurice Fitzsimmons, W. F. Gilbert (of California), Dr. H. Wood Ayres, William V. King, Al Heppwell, Clarence Meisner (Detroit), Russell Middleton, "Gillie" (H. C.) Gilbert, Chas. O. Lewis, "Pop" Sautters and Jim Blyth.

### OFFICIALLY CHARTERED IN 1930

On May 28, 1930, a charter was given the ADRC by the AR&CBA. This charter marks the first official date in the club history and was granted under the capable leadership of its Secretary, Andy Stodel. Membership had grown to 65.

In May of 1935, Matt Welling, secretary of the Michigan State Dutch Club, was induced by John Furrer to take over the secretary's duties in the ADRC. With a new slate of officers and the devoted work of Matt Welling, the ADRC made great progress. Officers serving at that time were John Furrer as president, Welling as secretary, and Chas. O. Lewis as vice-president. Directors were Blyth, Robert M. Scott, H. C. Gilbert, H. G. Puffer, Harold B. Brear and Tom Shufflebotham. It was at this time that the National Dutch Shows were inaugurated. They

were sponsored by the Michigan State Dutch Club and held annually for 7 consecutive years at the Michigan State Fair Grounds.

#### FIRST SPECIAL EDITION IN 1937

The first special edition of Small Stock Magazine was voted in 1936, and the editorial job was turned over to Tom Shufflebotham and wife. This special edition was published in May of 1937 and was the first such edition published by any specialty club. This promotion proved very worthwhile. Membership, interest and activities were very strong in Dutch circles until 1940, when Matt Welling lost interest. Robert Toth of Ohio (I believe) was appointed to fill the unexpired term of office. Shortly thereafter, Bob Strickland was appointed by the president, A. S. Gibbons, but proved to be a much better breeder and exhibitor than a good secretary, and the club affairs again floundered.

There was little activity among Dutch breeders and members until the annual meeting of the ADRC at the Ft. Wayne Convention of 1940. It was here that the club was given a real shot in the arm. Feelings among members present were not too cordial and many harsh things were said, but starting at that time the ADRC really began to grow and prosper. It was suggested that the president and board were to select a replacement for Strickland, and the name of R. L. Souers of St. Louis was presented by John Furrer. This replacement proved to be excellent, and under the work-horse tactics of Lou Souers, membership gained by leaps and bounds. It was at this time that the ADRC became one of the outstanding specialty clubs, and much credit must be given Souers and the board of directors.

It was under this regime that the club voted to put out its first Guide Book; a reprint was issued in 1946, a new Guide Book offered in 1947, and again in 1950 and 1955. A new edition is to be published in 1963.

#### MONTHLY BULLETIN INAUGURATED

It was at Indianapolis, in 1945, that the suggestion was presented to issue a monthly bulletin or magazine devoted exclusively to Dutch interests. The responsibility was given to Lou Souers and John B. Griffiths. The initial issue was printed in 1946 and proved very successful from a reader's point of view. However, it has been rather a burden financially.

On the resignation of Lou Souers as secretary, Mrs. Lyle Neubauer was appointed to fill the office. Mrs. Neubauer served faithfully and well, and upon her resignation the office was filled by the appointment of Madeleine Grables by president George Bayliss. During these years the club prospered very well—membership exceeded the 500 mark. However, the job of secretary seems to be a demanding one and too much for any one person, and again we had the resignation of Madeleine. The unexpired term was filled by appointment by George Bayliss of Mrs. Jessie Weinhardt, who has done a commendable job.

In 1948, while William Hawthorne was president, it was decided to put out another special edition of Small Stock, and the job of handling the issue was given to Tom Shufflebotham. As it should have, the second issue surpassed the first. In 1954 by the third special edition made its appearance, and it is succeeded by the present issue, which was handled by Mel Emery of Elyria, Ohio.

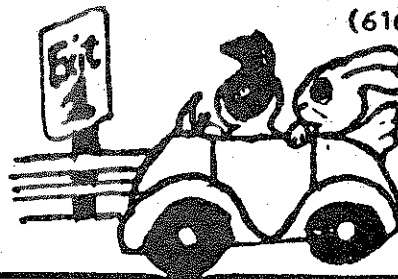

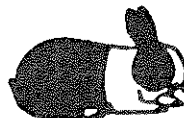

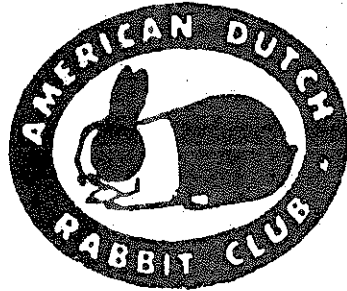
